WHO SHOT THEBARMAN WINS THE G1 SYDNEY CUP



Who Shot Thebarman wins the Sydney Cup at his fifth attempt (Bradley Photography)

Grand stayer **Who Shot Thebarman (NZ)** (Yamanin Vital) has finally had his day in the sun with a last-stride win in the \$2 million Sydney Cup at his fifth attempt.

Who Shot Thebarman finished strongly on the outside to beat Zacada (NZ) (Zabeel) by a nose in the time-honoured 3200m handicap at Randwick.

The nine-year-old's win gave premier Sydney trainer Chris Waller a third Group One win in successive races on Saturday.

Who Shot Thebarman had twice finished second in the Sydney Cup, including last year in the rescheduled race.

The first running of the 2017 Sydney Cup was declared a no-race when two horses fell, including Who Shot Thebarman,

amid safety concerns with the stricken Almoonqith (Dynaformer) still on the track.

Along with his Sydney Cup placings, the former New Zealand stayer, and 2014 Auckland Cup winner, has also finished third in one of his three Melbourne Cup appearances and fifth in another.

"He's been such a frustrating horse because he's run so many great seconds and thirds in Sydney Cups and Melbourne Cups," Waller said.

"He's given us one hell of a ride.

"He's nine years old and if Winx is not a pretty good advertisement on how to look after a horse I think Thebarman takes the cake.

"That's the best he's looked today as a nine-year-old. He was a test as a younger horse and we haven't given up on him and looked after him."

There was drama pre-race when Japanese visitor Pre Stwick (Daiwa Major) was scratched on veterinary advice behind the barriers.

The vet checks were prompted after jockey Joao Moreira was not happy with the horse's action.

Who Shot Thebarman, with Blake Shinn aboard,

settled back before working into the race around the field approaching the home turn.

Dean Holland saved ground on New Zealand stayer Zacada and raced through on the fence to hit the front at the 200m but Who Shot Thebarman got the bob of the head on the line.

Sir Charles Road (Myboycharlie) was another length away third.

Shinn said if ever a horse deserved a Sydney Cup, it was Who Shot Thebarman.

"I'm just rapt for the horse, and the owners," Shinn said.

"The horse deserves the recognition, to win a real big Group One."

UNFORGOTTEN WINS THE ATC AUSTRALIAN OAKS

Unforgotten's (Fastnet Rock) uneasy start to the autumn is now a distant memory.

Diagnosed with cardiac arrhythmia after running last in the Group One Surround Stakes last month, Chris Waller never lost faith in the three-year-old filly.

Sydney's premier trainer was also unfazed when Hiyaam (NZ) (High Chaparral) beat her in the Group One Vinery Stud Stakes (2000m) and a fortnight later Unforgotten turned

the tables in style at Randwick to claim the \$1 million ATC Australian Oaks (2400m) in record time.

The \$4 favourite levelled up to front runner Hiyaam at the 100m and cruised home by a length in 2:27.21, to eclipse Serenade Rose's (Stravinsky) 2006 mark of 2.28:80.

"She had the perfect run the way the race was run. We knew Hiyaam was the one to chase, she set about chasing and it was go to see the upper hand," Waller said.

"The first question was her stamina and whether it would hold up.

For a three-year-old filly it's quite a long way, you don't know about 2400 metres until you run it."

Waller, who won the Australian Oaks with Royal Descent (Redoute's Choice) in 2013, said he also comforted by Unforgotten having Galileo (Sadler's Wells) as her damsire.

"In Europe you've got Galileo and in Asia there's Deep Impact (Sunday Silence), there's no better staying blood than those two stallions at the moment," he said.

Hugh Bowman bided his time and has now won five Australian Oaks, and the last three in a row after previously saluting on New Zealand raiders Sofia Rosa (NZ) (Makfi) and Bonneval (NZ) (Makfi).

Waller reckoned he had an Oaks quality filly around Christmas before she struggled in the Surround Stakes.

"They can get a bit anxious first-up, that's what I was clinging to."

Unforgotten bounced back in the Group Two Phar Lap Stakes (1500m) on March 17 and made steady progress to this staying test.

Waller was looking forward to Unforgotten developing and insisted she would be given time to mature.

"We won't be rushing to step her up to a Caulfield Cup or a Melbourne Cup," he said.

"We'll keep our sights low and see how she comes back as a four-year-old," he said. –AAP

LINDSAY PARK QUINELLA GALILEE SERIES FINAL

Won Won Too (NZ) (Tavistock) has outplugged his stablemate Rezealient (Sebring) to claim the Galilee Series Final at Caulfield.

The 2400m Listed race on Saturday was a battle of wills up the straight as the Lindsay Park duo toughed it out with early leader Han Xin (Sepoy) on the downgraded soft rated track.

Despite winning his maiden over 1400m at Ballarat in February, Lindsay Park co-trainer Tom Dabernig said Won Won Too was purchased as a staying prospect.

Dabernig said the stable was now thinking of tackling tougher staying races with the three-year-old.

The VRC St Leger Stakes (2800m) at Flemington on Anzac Day along with the Group One South Australian Derby at Morphettville next month and the Queensland Derby at Doomben in June will now be considered.

Won Won Too was the victim of a wide draw when ninth behind Han Xin at Caulfield on March 31.

“We took the winkers off and changed his bridle and from the better draw he was closer in the run and importantly he’s handled that ground today,” Dabernig said.

“The sire (Tavistock) seems to get them over a trip and gets plenty of three-year-old classic winners so I think he could be an ideal Derby horse for one of those races.”

Dabernig said Rezealient could follow his stablemate either to the St Leger or onto an interstate Derby path.

“They’re both lightly raced and days like this can be testing on wet ground,

but it’s good to find out whether they handle it.

“The likelihood of St Legers or Derbies being run on wet ground is quite high.” –APP

CHAMPAGNE DAY FOR TRELAWNEY

Trelawney Stud enjoyed a stellar Saturday with a stakes double at Hastings following results to savour in Australia.

The Cambridge nursery bred and races the Listed Royston Hospital Hawke's Bay Cup (2200m) winner **Richie McHorse (NZ)** (Redoute's Choice) and they share in the ownership of **Indecision (NZ)** (Per Incanto), who boosted her value with victory in the Listed New Zealand Bloodstock Finance Sprint (1200m).

Stud graduates Ocean Knight (NZ) (Ocean Park) and Reilmartini (NZ) (O'Reilly) posted victories at Caulfield while Chequered Flag (NZ) (Raise The Flag) added to the winning tally at Morphettville.

"Chequered Flag is a horse we've got with a few others who we raced Solzhenitsyn (NZ) (St Petersburg) (a dual Group One winner) with," Trelawney's Cherry Taylor said. "It's been a great day."

Ocean Park colt Ocean Knight, a

grandson of the Gr.1 Mackinnon Stakes (2000m) winner La Bella Dama (NZ) (La Bella Dama), was sold through their Premier Sale draft at Karaka last year for \$115,000. He is trained by David and Ben Hayes and Tom Dabernig.

Reilmartini was also sold through the New Zealand Bloodstock auction by Trelawney, and was purchased in 2016 for \$250,000 by trainer Darren Weir and bloodstock agent John Foote.

Richie McHorse is a son of

Redoute's Choice and he emulated the feat of his mother Boundless (NZ) (Van Nistelrooy), a Gr.1 New Zealand Oaks (2400m) winner, who won the Cup in 2010.

"Richie went to the Ready to Run Sale, but nobody was interested in him," Taylor said. "We liked him and he's my favourite – (husband) Brent and I bred and raced his mother."

Richie McHorse was originally trained by Team Rogerson, but after surgery for knee issues Graeme Rogerson advised a change of environment.

"He said the only place to train him was on the sand," Taylor said.

The five-year-old has responded positively in the Ruakaka operation of Chris Gibbs and his win on Saturday

was his third this preparation.

Rider Jake Bayliss settled him at the tail of the field and they powered home down the outside to beat Our Abbadean (NZ) (Lookin At Lucky) and Hunta Pence (NZ) (No Exuse Needed).

Bayliss adopted contrasting tactics aboard the Tony Pike-trained Indecision, who jumped to the front and was never headed for the fourth win of her 14-start career. By Per Incanto, she is a half-sister to the dual Group One winner Viadana (NZ) (Towkay) and was a \$260,000 yearling purchase.

OCEAN KNIGHT EXPLOSIVE IN CAULFIELD DEBUT

Ocean Knight (NZ) (Ocean Park) defied a betting drift to register an impressive debut win at Caulfield.

Coming from back in the field, Ocean Knight stormed down the outside to take out the Wellington R.C Handicap (1200m) on Saturday.

Drifting from \$5 out to \$8.50, Ocean Knight, under Regan Bayliss, raced away over the final 100m to defeat Sizzleme (Sizzling) by 2-3/4 lengths with Dark Villain (I Am Invincible) a long-neck away third.

Lindsay Park co-trainer Tom Dabernig said he wasn't surprised by the win of Ocean Knight, a son of 2012 Cox Plate winner Ocean Park.

He said the plan was to let the speed go, get to the outside and run on.

Dabernig said he was impressed by the colt's turn of foot.

"We've always liked him and being by Ocean Park we didn't think he'd be a two-year-old," Dabernig said.

"But this preparation he's done very well in his jumpouts and this looked a nice race for him.

"We went in with medium expectation, thinking he'd hit the line, but he hit the line a bit stronger than all the others."

Dabernig said Ocean Knight was likely to have his next start in the Listed Anzac Day Stakes (1400m) at Flemington.

Ocean Knight's win completed an early two-state double for Lindsay Park after Futoooh won the China Horse Club Mile in Sydney.

G1 AUSTRALASIAN OAKS MISSION FOR SAVACOOOL

Savacool (NZ) (Savabeel) has booked herself a ticket to the Australasian Oaks with her victory on a rain-soaked track at Caulfield.

Sent south from trainer Chris Waller's Sydney stable, Savacool took out Saturday's Thomas North Handicap (1600m) to provide Regan Bayliss with an early double.

Sent off a \$4.80 chance, Savacool scored a half-length win over Sheezdashing (Myboycharlie) with Truly Discreet (Teofilo) 2-1/4 lengths away third.

Johanne Taylor, in charge of Waller's Flemington stable, said plans were to head to Adelaide.

Waller sent Egg Tart (Sebring) to Melbourne last year where she

was successful at Flemington before taking out the Australasian Oaks at Morphettville in May.

"She is on an Oaks path," Taylor said. "We wanted her to come here today, get a bit of confidence, hopefully not have too tough a run."

"She's settled in well and certainly put them away today."

Bayliss, who won the Newmarket Handicap on Redkirk Warrior (Notnowcato) last month before commencing an improper riding ban, returned to riding earlier this week.

Savacool's win was Bayliss's third winner back and he said Savacool was a nice staying filly in the making.

"After her 1400-metre run she was only going to improve up to the

mile today and she's still got some improvement to come," he said. –AAP

CAULFIELD RAIN A BLESSING FOR REILMARTINI

Trainer Darren Weir was happy to see the heavy showers rain down on Caulfield and soften the track for **Reilmartini (NZ)** (O'Reilly).

Starting the day in the good range, rain began falling before the meeting while a heavy downpour before race two pushed the track into the soft range, ideal ground for Reilmartini by the time Saturday's Walk For Phil Handicap was run.

Weir explained the three-year-old feels his knees and isn't suited by firm tracks.

Registering his third win from four starts, Weir described Reilmartini as an ideal winter horse.

With jockey Daniel Moor taking advantage of barrier one, Reilmartini scored a half-length win from William Thomas (Nicconi) with Moet Rose (Bel Esprit) 1-1/4 lengths away third.

Weir said training Reilmartini from his beachside base at Warrnambool was ideal for Reilmartini.

"If he was working on the synthetic track or galloping on the sand all the time he just wouldn't stand up," Weir said.

"But having him trained down at the beach, doing different work, it takes pressure off his knees."

Reilmartini is owned in Hong Kong by Peter Law who Weir said supplies him with as many as eight horses a

year to train.

"If they're any good they'll end up in Hong Kong, which is fine," Weir said.

GROUP ONE WINNER **BACK IN BUSINESS**

A return to Te Rapa has worked wonders for last season's Group One winner **Ugo Foscolo (NZ)** (Zacinto).

He has had his issues since his Gr.1 New Zealand 2000 Guineas (1600m) victory, but they were pushed to the background on Saturday when he beat his open sprint rivals in the Punters Challenge 5th May 1400m.

Ugo Foscolo is now unbeaten in three appearances on the Hamilton course having won the Listed Hamilton Vets Equine Stakes (1100m) as a juvenile and the Gr.2 Sarten Memorial (1400m) the following term during his first spell with Stephen Marsh.

He subsequently spent an unrewarded spell with Gai Waterhouse and Adrian Bott last winter before returning to Marsh's Cambridge stable.

Ugo Foscolo resumed his New Zealand career at Matamata in February, but tailed the field home and Marsh was prepared to accept the blame for that flawed performance.

"It was trainer error running him then after he had been off the scene for a fair while," he said.

Ugo Foscolo was

subsequently freshened and the son of Zacinto responded with a tidy win under jockey Danielle Johnson.

"We gave him a trial at Avondale and he dead-headed for first in good time," Marsh said. "He's really well now and he's a big improver from here."

Ugo Foscolo idled along in front and, after going clear at the top of the straight, he had enough in reserve to win by half a length.

Tomelilla (NZ) (Tavistock) boxed on well for second after racing outside the leader and a nose further back was next Saturday's Gr.2 Easter Handicap (1600m) hope Go Nicholas (NZ) (Danroad). – NZ Racing Desk.

TRAINER SEES **TOP FUTURE FOR FAWN**

Roger James is bullish about the future staying prospects of the lightly-ried **Fawn (NZ)** (Savabeel).

The Cambridge horseman had further reason to be upbeat about the four-year-old after she produced a strong performance to win the Red Cabs Hamilton Handicap (2200m) at Te Rapa on Saturday.

“That’s her first run over ground and it’s what she’s bred to do,” James said. “I’ve been lucky to have such patient owners.

“You don’t mind waiting when you know they’ve got the

ability. From here on in it should be quite exciting.”

A half-sister to the Group-winning millionaire galloper Precedence (NZ) (Zabeel), Fawn was bred by the Dowager Duchess of Bedford’s Bloomsbury Stud, who race the four-year-old with the Gerard Petersen-managed GG Syndicate

Fawn was well-handled by Alysha Collett, who settled midfield and one off the fence before they began to pick up ground three wide with cover 600m from home.

“The track was a bit of a concern, but it was a lovely ride by Alysha and she just out-stayed them in the end,” James said.

“I’d like to press on a little bit more, every win under her belt will set her up for her five-year-old season.”

Fawn’s sustained finish was rewarded with the third win of her six-start career and came at the expenses of Lovelight (NZ) (Zabeel), who raced close to the pace, and Brookbars (NZ) (Bullbars) was a gallant third after taking off from the back with 900m to run.

STAKES TRIAL PRODUCES THRILLING FINISH

The Gr.3 Cambridge Breeders' Stakes (1200m) promises to be a hot three-year-old feature judging by Saturday's dress rehearsal.

Malambo (NZ) (Duelled) narrowly prevailed in the Seafood Bazaar 3YO (1200m) at Te Rapa ahead of dead-heaters Merlini (I Am Invincible) and Paulownia (Fastnet Rock) with Sistabeel (Savabeel) and Prom Queen (NZ) (Super Easy) next to finish.

Less than a length separated the top five and they are all likely to return to the Hamilton track in a fortnight's time for the Breeders' Stakes.

Trained by Team Rogerson, Malambo has now won three times on the course and the daughter of Duelled capitalised on a cosy run behind the speed for her latest success.

"It was a tidy field of lovely three-year-olds and she was able to sit behind the pace and come over the top of them, it was a good ride," stable representative Garry Barlow said.

Malambo, who had finished fifth in a competitive age group at Awapuni in her lead-up outing, finished strongly in the closing 150m to claim major honours.

"We got a nice trail behind Prom Queen, which suited me down to the ground, and she got the job done,"

successful rider Ryan Elliot said.

"She's really come up well this preparation, she's a lot stronger now."

Merlini made the pace and he kicked on gallantly to share second with the last-start Gr.2 Wellington Guineas (1400m) runner-up Paulownia, who hit the line well.

Sistabeel came from last for fourth and Prom Queen gave a good sight to finish fifth in her first appearance since December.
