

# ELLERSLIE CONTENDERS ON TRIAL FOR QUEENSLAND



Exciting three-year-old Tavidream is one of the leading chances at Ellerslie tomorrow for the powerful Donna Logan & Chris Gibbs team

onna Logan will know more about her team for the Brisbane winter carnival following the premier meeting at Ellerslie tomorrow.

Logan and training partner Chris Gibbs will have five runners spread over the three black type races at Ellerslie, all of whom are potential candidates for the Brisbane carnival.

**All Roads (NZ)** (Road To Rock) will be Opie Bosson's mount in the Gr.2 Manco Easter Stakes (1600m) and the stable will provide three of the 13 runners – **Tavidream (NZ)** (Tavistock), **Comin'through (NZ)** (Bullbars) and **Jake The Muss (NZ)**  (Postponed) - for the Gr.2 Valachi Downs Championship Stakes (2100m).

Unbeaten two-year-old **Qiji Phoenix** (Not A Single Doubt) completes the black type team and is the only winner in the Listed Diamond Lodge Champagne Stakes (1600m).

Qiji Phoenix, a colt by Not A Single Doubt, has won his two race day outings and will be on trial for a tilt at the Gr.1 J.J. Atkins Stakes (1600m) in Brisbane, a race won last year by Sacred Elixir (NZ) (Pour Moi).

To be ridden by Leith Innes, he won a maiden two-yearold at Te Rapa first-up before winning decisively over 1300m at Ellerslie and beating his Champagne rival Weather With You (Teofilo) into second, with Aquamosa (NZ) (Alamosa), another contender, a further six lengths away in third place.

"He's a really grouse little horse and we expect him to get 1600m," Logan said.

The Ellerslie track has improved from a Heavy 10 earlier in the week and is expected to be a Slow 8 by race day.

"The better the track, the better our horses will go."

Tavidream and Comin'through are two of the leading prospects in a strong field for the Championship Stakes and the pair are likely to be aimed at the Gr.1 Queensland Derby on June 10.

Tavidream, a Tavistock gelding, is making his middle distance debut but has looked well above average when recording four wins and two seconds from six starts. He completed a hat-trick of wins when winning a rating 75 1600m at Ellerslie on April 1.

"He's still very green and there is so much upside in him," Logan said. "He's learning all the time and we haven't needed to try him over a middle distance until now because he's been very competitive over shorter distances.

"But his pedigree suggests he will stay and I can't see any reason why he won't."

There is no doubt over Comin'through's staying ability and he has already won three races at 2000m or further, including winning over 2100m at premier meetings at Ellerslie at his last two starts.

"He's beaten the older horses at his last two starts and that's not easy for a three-year-old," Logan said.

Jake The Muss, a brother to Group One winner Consensus (NZ) (Postponed), has been racing solidly at 1600m in rating 65 company. "He deserves his chance," Logan said.

Five-year-old All Roads won the Gr.2 Japan International Trophy (1600m) at Tauranga at his last start and was the runner-up in the Gr.2 Rich Hill Mile at Ellerslie in January.

"He's not as well off at the weights in the Easter as he was last time, but we are very happy with him," Logan said. "He's a definite possibility for Brisbane and there would be a lot of options for him over there."

# STABLEMATES THRIVING AHEAD OF ADELAIDE DEBUTS

**avvy Dreams (NZ)** (Savabeel) and **Lamborghini (NZ)** (Shinko King) have coped with the arduous trip to Adelaide like seasoned travellers, according to cotrainer Grant Cullen.

"It was a long trip – we left home last Tuesday and got here on Friday, but they both coped very well and I couldn't be happier with the pair of them," he said.

Savvy Dreams will make her Australian debut in Saturday's Gr.3 Schweppervescence Stakes (formerly the Auraria Stakes) at Morphettville while Lamborghini tackles the UBET SA Derby 13th May Handicap.

"Savvy Dreams lost a little bit of weight on the way over, but she's put it back on and she's the same weight now as when we left," said Cullen, who trains in partnership with Guy Lowry.

"She's settled in really well and taking a line through Bonneval we would be surprised if she's not competitive over here."

The lightly-tried Savvy Dreams finished third in the Gr.1 New Zealand Oaks behind Bonneval (NZ) (Makfi),

subsequently the runaway winner of the Gr.1 Australian Oaks.

"Obviously, she hasn't raced since the New Zealand Oaks, but she's raring to go and Paul Gatt, who rides her on Saturday, was aboard when she had a run along yesterday morning and he was extremely impressed with her," Cullen said.

Lamborghini has won two of his last three starts, including a most recent victory in the Waipukurau Cup and he will be partnered by Jason Holder.

"He jumped on and worked him this morning and he said the horse gave him a great feel," Cullen said.

"He's a progressive type of stayer who had foot issues earlier on, which he's well over now. He's up against open class horses on Saturday, but he would have been at home anyway and he likes the good tracks.

"There's another \$A100,000 race for him in a fortnight and after that is the Port Adelaide Cup over 2400 metres which will be his main goal, all going well."

# SOUTH ISLAND SALE ON TODAY

ew Zealand Bloodstock's South Island Sale will be held in Christchurch today at the Riding for the Disabled Building at the Canterbury Agricultural Park, commencing at 11am.

The South Island Sale has developed a reputation for offering incredible value for money, with a number of high-quality racetrack performers bought for relatively low prices.

Few horses fit that description better than one of this season's star New Zealand sprinters, Signify (NZ) (Perfectly Ready), who has earned more than 60 times his purchase price for Alex and Tracey Cowan.

Purchased for \$5,500 at the 2013 Sale, Signify has won nine of his 33 starts for prize-money in excess of \$330,000. This season the South Island speedster has raced to two brilliant black-type victories at Trentham – the Group 1 Telegraph (1200m) in late January and the Listed Lightning Handicap (1200m) two months later.

"We didn't pay a lot for him at the South Island Sale," Alex 'Snooky' Cowan said. "He's won more than \$330,000 for us now, which is amazing. He's done so well for us."

Another remarkable example is Natuzzi (NZ), who cost \$9000 at the 2010 Sale. The Coats Choice gelding has won 11 of his 43 starts and has earned more than \$560,000 in stakes – more than 62 times his purchase price. Meanwhile, Southern stallions continue to punch above their weight and are well represented amongst the 86 lots that will go under the hammer.

Berkley Stud's Highly Recommended sired recent Group placed filly Joyfilly (NZ), who ran third in the Gr.1 Manawatu Sires Produce Stakes in April and placed second in the Gr. 2 Matamata Breeders' Stakes in February, prior to her sale to the Waterhouse/ Bott stable. Highly Recommended is represented by 18 lots.

Inglewood Stud stallion Zacinto, sire of 2000 Guineas winner Ugo Foscolo, stakes winning filly Zigwig and South Australian Derby contender Odeon, is rep

contender Odeon, is represented by 10 lots.

White Robe Lodge stallion Gallant Guru, sire of recent stakes winners Tommy Tucker and Patrick Erin, is represented by 7 lots.

A total of 40 stallions are represented at this year's sale. The South Island Session of the

Mr Impatience (Hernando)

Mister Impatience to stay the distance Trainer Mike Moroney will be chasing a second Sydney Group One win in as many meetings when veteran stayer Mister Impatience (Hernando) lines up in the rescheduled Sydney Cup.

Tivaci (High Chaparral) gave Moroney his 49th Group One win in the All Aged Stakes at Randwick.

Seven-year-old gelding Mister Impatience will run in the Sydney Cup (3200m) which is being re-run after being declared a 'no-race' at Randwick on April 8 when two horses fell coming out of the home straight the first time.

"He came through it well and he's a tough old warrior now," Moroney said.

"Jay Ford thought he was travelling like he was going to run right in the finish."

The trainer will be happy if it's a genuinely run 3200m on Saturday as Mister Impatience is an experienced two miler having won twice at the distance in a Queensland Cup and a Wellington Cup.

"And if they get the rain they are supposed to be going to get, it wouldn't worry him either," Moroney said.

### **Reith on Kiwi Cup hope**

Sydney Jockey Christian Reith has picked up the ride on **Chance To Dance** (Teofilo) in Saturday's rerun of the \$A2 million Gr.1 Sydney Cup.

The stayer will make his first appearance at Randwick for trainers Stephen Autridge and Jamie Richards and Fortuna NZ.

"We had engaged Jason Collett to ride once Damian Lane had declared himself unavailable," Fortuna principal John Galvin said.

"Then Jason was suspended and we were left trying to chase down another lightweight rider. Christian answered the call and we are happy to have him aboard.

"He rode Chance To Dance in a 1200 metre gallop at Randwick on Tuesday morning, running good time and never off the bridle, according to his rider."

Wexford Stables trainers Lance O'Sullivan and Andrew Scott have the feature bases covered for Ellerslie this weekend.

The Matamata training partnership will seek to defend their Manco Easter Stakes title with **Sound Proposition (NZ)** (Savabeel) and will tackle the Gr.2 Valachi Downs Championship Stakes (2100m) with **Charles Road** (Myboycharlie) and the Listed Diamond Lodge Championship Stakes (1600m) with **Miss Foxy Gal** (Foxwedge).

Vadamos (Monsun) heads Rich Hill Stud's 2017 stallion roster with the international Group One-winning miler to stand at \$15,000 + GST.

Successful in the Gr.1 Prix Du Moulin, he is a son of Monsun who has sired three of the last four Melbourne Cup winners.

Dual Group One-winner Shocking will stand at \$12,500 + GST and he is already the sire of 10 stakes performers, including firstcrop Group winners Fanatic (NZ) (Gr.1 New Zealand Oaks), The Hassler (NZ) (Gr.2 ARC Championship Stakes) and Chocante (NZ) (Gr.3 Counties Cup).

Thorn Park's five-time Group One winning son Jimmy Choux, champion New Zealand first season sire of 2015-16, will stand at \$7000 + GST, as will Proisir who is a son of the international Group One winner and producer Choisir.

Foundation stallion Pentire, who is New Zealand's leading active sire of Group One winners with 15, will stand at \$10,000 + GST.

### Prize money injection for New Zealand racing

The New Zealand Racing Board's latest funding announcement is a no strings attached boost to stake money.

An additional \$24 million will be provided to the three codes - thoroughbreds, harness and greyhounds - over the next two years

"I raced her with Gerard Peterson and I've sold my half share," Lock said.

"She's a very good filly and I think she will be going right through the grades. Sometimes you have to sell for the money and I did so reluctantly."

Uber Cougar will be crossing the Tasman to join Michael Moroney's operation, who will be targeting three-year-old black type for the filly in Queensland.

Peterson has enjoyed a long and successful association with the stable, his highlight being as a part-owner of the Moroney-trained Brew (NZ) (Sir Tristram), winner of the Gr.1 Melbourne Cup in 2000.

## **Remembering our Hall Of Fame Heroes**

### Syd Brown

A dominant force over seven decades of racing. Syd gained his training license at 19 (when the legal age was 21) and went on to win two NZ premierships and was the most successful Aussie raider of his era making lucrative trips with the likes of Redcraze and Summersette, Sailing Away and Dark Smudge, Daryl's Joy (Cox Plate, VRC Derby) and Wood Court Inn, and Classic Mission (AJC and VRC Derbys). Brown eventually moved to Australia and trained successfully at Warwick Farm, Triton his best performer. He was also a great friend and often acted as a host to visiting Kiwis.
