GALLOP SHOWS WERTHER'S IN THE ZONE FOR APQEIL CUP DEFENCE



Werther will look to make it back-to-back victories in Sunday's HK\$20 million Gr.1 Audemars Piquet QEII Cup.

erther (NZ) (Tavistock) whisked through the mist at Sha Tin on Thursday morning with a business-like final gallop ahead of Sunday's HK\$20 million Audemars Piguet Queen Elizabeth II Cup (2000m) that reinforced John Moore's opinion that last year's winner is in the right zone to repeat the feat.

The trainer watched from beyond the winning post as the blinkered bay moved with assured strength down the turf

home straight to finish on top of his companion, one-time smart sprinter Leading City (Shamardal): "The best lead horse you could wish for," according to Moore.

Sam Clipperton filled the irons for the 6.30am hit-out, with big-race pilot Hugh Bowman due to fly in from Australia. Werther was clocked at 1m 20.0s (28.0, 29.1, 22.9) for the final 1200m of his work.

"I'm very pleased, we're going in with confidence," Moore said shortly afterwards. "Sam said he was really strong to the line here and very strong through the line. He said the horse wasn't going to pull-up, he was going on, so that's very indicative of what the feedback was at this time last year.

"We're going in with a very fit horse. He's bang on. Vincent, my English riding boy who rode him in the trotting ring this morning, he mentioned that he was very, very free."

Moore rates Japan's Neorealism (Neo Universe) and the local hype horse Pakistan Star (Shamardal) as Werther's two biggest dangers on Sunday.

"If Neorealism doesn't bring his 'A' game, Pakistan Star will be the horse to beat. But Werther's world class and they've all got to bring their very best to beat him," he said. "And he only has to walk from his box over there, to the track here and then he's back into his tucker in no time. Home advantage is a big factor."

Werther missed the first part of this season due to a suspensory injury to his off-hind, including December's G1

LONGINES Hong Kong Cup. The belligerent gelding returned to action in January's G1 Stewards' Cup (1600m), maintained his perfect course and distance record in the G1 Citi Hong Kong Gold Cup, and was a solid fourth behind Rapper Dragon (Street Boss) in the G2 Chairman's Trophy (1600m) earlier this month.

Moore is satisfied that Hong Kong's reigning Horse of the Year has benefitted from a light campaign.

"Sam said that that run at the mile last time has done him the world of good and really topped him off," he said. "Missing that first part of the season might not have been a bad thing because he's only really got going since the turn-of-the-year to now, so he's on a perfect prep.

"Last year he had a tough campaign, starting in December after import and taking in those tough four-year-old races, including the Derby, he really had to show us what he was made of. This time he's only been aiming at this race. Everything has been a prep to get to this race and it's only his fourth run of the season."

OUTSTANDING GALLOPER TURN ME LOOSE TO STAND IN NEW ZEALAND

riple Group One winner **Turn Me Loose (NZ)** (Iffraaj), one of Australasia's fastest and toughest milers, has been secured by Windsor Park Stud to stand at their Cambridge-based nursery this spring.

Windsor Park studmaster Rodney Schick is understandably excited to have Turn Me Loose join their stallion roster for 2017.

"I loved his outstanding looks and physicality when I first saw him and coupled with his cracking race performance, it just heightened my desire to have him in our stallion line-up".

"To have the speed and class to win a 1400m WFA Group One race in Australia requires exceptional talent which he had in spades", said Schick.

A classic winning three-year-old, Turn Me Loose cemented his position at the head of the best milers of his generation with formidable Gr.1 winning performances at Melbourne's highly acclaimed Spring and Autumn Racing Carnivals.

More highly rated than champion sires Savabeel (Zabeel) and Thorn Park (Spinning World), Turn Me Loose, together with Kermadec (NZ) (Teofilo), rated the equal highest colt of his generation in the Miling category by Timeform.

Turn Me Loose was crowned Champion Sprinter and Middle Distance performer at the completion of his 4YO season and retires to stud a triple Group One winner of seven races from 1200m to 1600m with his prizemoney earnings exceeding \$1.7 million.

A juvenile winner at two, Turn Me Loose showed himself to be a class above his three-year-old contemporaries with a dominant three length classic victory in the Gr.1 New Zealand 2000 Guineas.

Upon travelling to Australia for an Autumn 3YO campaign Turn Me Loose contracted travel sickness with the consequence that he was sidelined for the remainder of his 3YO season.

He returned to Australian racing as a 4YO at the Spring Carnival where he confirmed his class as an elite level performer with a trio of black-type victories culminating with success in the Gr.1 VRC Emirates Stakes over 1600m at Flemington.

The following Autumn in Melbourne Turn Me Loose transitioned to a Group One Weight-For-Age winner when successful in the MRC Futurity Stakes at Caulfield where he defeated eight other Group One winners.

Turn Me Loose was trained throughout his career by Murray Baker and Andrew Forsman. Baker, New Zealand's most successful trainer of Australian Gr.1 winners commented:

"Turn Me Loose is one of the few horses I've had good enough to beat Australia's best sprinter/milers. He's a big strong horse who can run very fast sectionals".

Turn Me Loose is the best performed galloper by internationally successful sire Iffraaj, whose 48 stakes

winners to date include this season's top Australasian 3YO's Gingernuts (New Zealand Derby, Rosehill Guineas) and Jon Snow (Australian Derby).

A leading global sire, Iffraaj's Gr.1 winning progeny also include champion European 2YO fillies Rizeena and Chriselliam as well as champion colts Ribchester and Wootton Bassett.

Iffraaj is also an emerging sire of sires with his son Wootton Bassett siring Europe's 2016 highest rated racehorse Almanzor in his first crop of runners.

From an internationally successful family, Turn Me Loose is the only colt to date produced by Indomitable, a daughter of the breed-shaping sire Danehill while his second dam Kwan, by

Sadler's Wells, is a half-sister to three Group winners including European Gr.1 winning 2YO Fairy Heights.

TRAVIS CHANCES TOO CLOSE TO CALL

tephen Marsh can't split **Sofia Rosa (NZ)** (Makfi) and **Thee Auld Floozie (NZ)** (Mastercraftsman)
in their chase for the stable's 10th
black type success of the season
tomorrow.

The Group One winners will clash in the Gr.2 Travis Stakes at Te Rapa.

"The Travis looks a lovely race for my mares and I like them both," Marsh said. "They will both be suited by the step up in distance."

Sofia Rosa has had two runs at 2000m this season, both at Group One level in Australia, and she has progressed well since her fifth placing in the Gr.1 New Zealand Thoroughbred Breeders' Stakes (1600m) at Te Rapa.

"She has gone ahead since the Breeders' Stakes and is right where we want her now," Marsh said.

Regular rider Danielle Johnson will partner Sofia Rosa, but Opie Bosson, who rode Thee Auld Floozie last start, is committed to Echezeaux (NZ) (Encosta De Lago) on Saturday and has been replaced by Vinnie Colgan.

Thee Auld Floozie was second in the Gr.1 NZ Thoroughbred Breeders' Stakes and this season she broke through at the top level with victory in the Gr.1 Thorndon Mile. "She's had a big campaign and we have had to peak her a few times," Marsh said. "She has done an incredible job and kept fronting up."

The Travis will be her first run past 1600m since she finished fourth in the 2016 edition of the feature.

"She was unlucky last year," Marsh said. "She got a long way back after being chopped out early and hit the line very well. It was an enormous run."

Thee Auld Floozie will also race in side-winkers for the first time on Saturday. "She's become very laid-back and it might lift her a touch more at the end of her campaign."

Verdi (NZ) (Zabeel)



Verdi (NZ) (Zabeel) will begin his stallion career this year at Long Acres Stud, the Canterbury operation of Myles Gordon and Deborah Clark.

The son of Zabeel will stand in association with Joe Smithies, of Monovale Farm who bred the well-related four-year-old.

Verdi won three of his eight starts before a tendon injury pre-maturely ended his career just as his connections were having thoughts of the Gr.1 Auckland Cup for the half-brother to the multiple Group One winners Sir Slick (NZ) (Volksraad) and Puccini (NZ) (Encosta De Lago).

"He is royally bred and Murray Baker and Andrew Forsman had extremely high hopes for him before his career was cut short," Smithies said.

"After his retirement, Long Acres Stud expressed interest and an agreement was put in place. I am really excited about what the future holds for him.

"I'm sure he will let down into a magnificent stallion and can't see a reason in the world that he won't be successful."

Smithies said that they were yet to set a service fee for Verdi and that a decision would be made at a later date.

"We are keen to meet the market and get as many foals on the ground as we can. I'm sure he will produce some lovely stock if he is given the opportunity."

Verdi will stand at Long Acres alongside Remind, who achieved Group One success this season when his daughter Aide Memoire (NZ) won the Captain Cook Stakes.

Tivaci's fee announced

Group One-winning sprinter **Tivaci** (High Chaparral) will stand his first season at Waikato Stud at \$20,000 + GST.

"His fee represents a fantastic opportunity to breed to one of Australasia's very best sprinters," Mark Chittick said.

"The way he won the Gr.1 All Aged Stakes at Randwick and coming home in 32.1 for

Showcasing's NZ service fee announced

Haunui Farm have announced that Group One producing stallion **Showcasing** will stand the 2017 Southern Hemisphere season at a fee of \$12,000 + GST.

Music Magnate in the mix for Victory

Despite concerns over the Eagle Farm track Bjorn Baker has confirmed **Music Magnate (NZ)** (Written Tycoon) will run in Saturday's Gr.2 Victory Stakes (1200m).

"I spoke to Jeff Lloyd and he's hopeful it will dry out a bit by Saturday, so we are going to run," Baker said. "You've got to be in it to win it."

Music Magnate has drawn the outside barrier in the small seven horse field and will use the A\$200,000 race as a final lead up to the Gr.1 Doomben 10000 on May 13, a race he won in 2016.

"I think he's going as good now as when he won the Doomben 10000 last year but the only thing is he doesn't like a shifty track," Baker said.

The Brisbane Racing Club has admitted that the Eagle Farm racing surface still hasn't settled down after a major reconstruction was completed twelve months ago.

Baker said that Music Magnate has freshened up well since his last start where he ran twelfth in the Gr.1 The Galaxy (1100m) and looked to be on his way back to his best with a six length win in an 803m barrier trial at Warwick Farm on April 21.

Vela pair chase Travis success

Sir Peter Vela will look forward to tomorrow's Gr.2 Travis Stakes with two chances of adding to his previous three wins in the weight-for-age fillies and mares' feature

Sir Peter and his late brother Philip first won the race, then known as the Dulcie Stakes, with Christiania Belle (NZ) (Sackford) in 1993 before adding success through Dolmabache (NZ) (Redoute's Choice) in 2012 and Rasa Lila (NZ) (Darci Brahma) last year.

Lincoln Blue (NZ) (Savabeel)

Lincoln Blue to make OZ debut

At the Hawkesbury stand-alone meeting 12-months ago Chris Waller ran quality galloper Mackintosh (NZ) (Pins) for the first time and this Saturday another ex-pat Kiwi will start his career under the master trainer at the same race day.

Lincoln Blue (NZ) (Savabeel) joined the Waller stable after his first 11 starts under the care of Lisa Latta reaped three wins which included both a Group III and Listed victory.

The three-year-old finished down the track at his last New Zealand run after throwing his chances away in the NZ Derby, bucking before being tailed off shortly after the start.

"There was a lack of options for the horse over there so they sent him over," Waller said.

"He's a very well-performed New Zealand horse and obviously that form has stood up very well in Sydney during the autumn."

Lincoln Blue will have his first Australian start in the A\$200,000 Gr.3 Hawkesbury Guineas (1400m).

"Mackintosh had a run for his New Zealand trainer in Sydney then came to me and he had his first run for me at this meeting. He won the 1500m race," Waller said.

"I would have liked to run this horse (Lincoln Blue) in that same race but his rating was too high so we have to run him in the set weights race.

"He's a good horse this. At the same stage he's a better performed horse than Mackintosh."

Lincoln Blue is being aimed at the Queensland Derby, the race Mackintosh failed in last year after winning the Rough Habit Plate and Grand Prix Stakes leading into the Group One contest.

"He's on a definite (Queensland) Derby path and he'll probably go second-up in the Rough Habit," Waller said.

Grand Chancellor a step away from Derby challenge

Port Adelaide Guineas winner **Grand Chancellor (NZ)** (Savabeel) is also among the standout entries for tomorrow's Gr.3 Chairman's Stakes (2030m) at Morphettville.

The Phillip Stokes-trained local is chasing a fourth win from seven career starts as he tracks a path to next month's South Australian Derby.

Grand Chancellor debuted in Victoria last year for Robert Smerdon before joining Stokes' Morphettville stable and he said the horse has impressed him with how quickly he has developed into a young stayer with plenty of potential.

"He surprised us a little bit when he won his maiden," Stokes said. "After he won at Balaklava I said, 'well, he's a Savabeel horse, so let's put him on the road to the Derby."

Grand Chancellor will jump from barrier four with Noel Callow aboard who will replace the injured Dom Tourneur.

Dunn says Beast could easily improve

Easy Beast (NZ) (Super Easy) faces a starkly different scenario heading into his second racetrack appearance than what he did at his first.

That debut came at Caulfield on Easter Saturday, when he was the subject of one of the better betting moves of the weekend.

The Richard Laming-trained two-year-old started as favourite, but could only manage third placing.

His second start comes in Saturday's A\$120,000 Listed Thoroughbred Club Cup (1200m).

Dwayne Dunn, who rode Easy Beast in that 1100m debut and is again engaged this weekend, has not given up on the colt and said the benefit of that outing will stand him in good stead.

"I think he'll take a lot of experience from it," Dunn said.

"He showed a lot at home before he went there, we just thought he would let down and win that day just on what he'd shown us, but I think he needed the race experience.

"I think the 1200 will suit him and we'll be happy to use his speed."



Zebulon (NZ) (All American)

Zebulon back from injury at Caulfield

Rising six-year-old **Zebulon (NZ)** (All American) will be having just his ninth career start when he lines up in Saturday's Listed Anniversary Vase (1440m) at Caulfield.

It will be the Peter Morgan-trained gelding's first start in 12 months with two tendon injuries restricting Zebulon to only two starts in the past 2-1/2 years.

Zebulon, who won the Listed City of Adelaide Handicap (1400m) last season, showed Morgan he was ready for his racetrack return with a second placing in a Cranbourne trial on April 21.

Morgan said a lot of work had gone into getting Zebulon back to the races.

"We used the water walker and the treadmill on and off over 12 months," Morgan said.

"He'd go out for a break and come back in, do a bit of work, and go back out again.

"It takes about 12 months to get them back.

"He's injured the same tendon twice but it looks all good now."

Morgan says if Zebulon comes through Saturday's race unscathed, the gelding is likely to be freshened for a shot at the A\$1 million Gr.1 Goodwood (1200m) at Morphettville on May 20.

"She's built like a colt," Cummings said. "She's got plenty of substance about her."

Cummings is looking at the Listed Gold Coast Bracelet (1800m) on May 6 as a stepping stone to Savvan's winter grand final, Cummings already putting a plan in motion to ensure she gets there.

"She'll be nominated for the Queensland Oaks when the time comes," Cummings said.

"She pulls hard. She's a very willing horse. Very giving and with bit of racing and a bit of work she'll come back to us."

The A\$500,000 Queensland Oaks (2400m) is scheduled for Eagle Farm on June 3.

Black-type assignment for Calligraphy

Cambridge trainer Ross McCarroll has black-type aims for his four-year-old mare Calligraphy (NZ) (Perfectly Ready) after she toyed with her rivals in a Benchmark 75 at Tauranga yesterday.

Returning from a brief let-up, Calligraphy was prominent throughout under apprentice Sam Weatherley and always travelling like the

Higher honours tipped for in-form mare

He served on the Auckland Racing Club's committee for 45 years, 23 of those were as the club's president. He also served for lengthy periods on the New Zealand Racing Conference, the Pakuranga Hunt, and the New Zealand Hunts Association.
