NZ-BREDS READY FOR STAKES TEST



Impressive debut winner Brutal will step up to stakes-company in Saturday's Listed McKenzie Stakes at Moonee Valley

trio of promising New Zealand-bred colts in **Brutal** (NZ) (O'Reilly), **Ocean Knight (NZ)** (Ocean Park) and **Tavisan (NZ)** (Tavistock) will tackle stakes company at Moonee Valley on Saturday, when they line up in the Listed McKenzie Stakes (1200m).

Outstanding debut winner Brutal is the \$1.80 favourite for the three-year-old contest and jockey Dwayne Dunn plans to stick to the same on-pace formula that netted the colt an impressive five-length victory at Caulfield last month.

A \$220,000 purchase from the Mapperley Stud draft at the 2017 New Zealand Bloodstock Premier Yearling Sale, Brutal is

a member of the final crop of Waikato Stud's champion sire O'Reilly, who died in late 2014.

The good-looking colt is out of the stakes-placed Golan mare Alberton Princess, a half-sister to Group Two winner Te Akau Rose and three-quarter sister to Group Three winner Lady Alberton.

Co-trainer Wayne Hawkes said there was a significant update in the colt's pedigree that was not in the catalogue when they purchased him as a yearling in New Zealand.

"The full-sister (Talaria) had won a Listed race at two," Hawkes said.

Dunn said that in Brutal's debut victory and his subsequent jumpout win at Flemington, the horse owned the speed and he said he did not want to tinker with what is working, especially with a young horse.

"First time at The Valley, you like to get them up near the lead and near the rail, just so they know where they are headed so it is an advantage for a young horse that is green," Dunn said.

"If he brings to the races what he did his first start, he's going to be mighty difficult to beat."

Meanwhile, the Lindsay Park team will be out to spoil the party with Ocean Knight also a highly-touted colt.

"There is a big boom on Brutal, but Ocean Knight was very impressive when he won on debut at Caulfield," Tom Dabernig, who trains in partnership with David and Ben Hayes, said.

"It will be an intriguing race. If things go to plan we'd like to head towards the Caulfield Guineas with him." Ocean Knight was purchased by Lindsay Park and Champion Thoroughbreds for \$115,000 from Trelawney Stud's 2017 New Zealand Bloodstock Premier Yearling Sale draft.

"We've always liked him and being by Ocean Park we didn't think he'd be a two-year-old," Dabernig said.

Caulfield trainer Mick Price is hoping Tavisan can emerge as a Caulfield Guineas contender as well.

Formerly raced in New Zealand, Tavisan won his only start for Price when successful at Cranbourne over 1200m last month.

The Tavistock colt is expected to appreciate getting out to a mile.

"I think he's a promising colt and he'll be better once he gets past 1200m," Price said.

Tavisan was purchased by Grant Morgan's On Track Thoroughbreds for \$135,000 from Hallmark Stud, from the same Karaka Premier Yearling Sale as Brutal and Ocean Knight.

OLE OLE UP FOR THE CHALLENGE

ndrew Forsman has a high opinion of **Ole Ole (NZ)** (Makfi) but he's holding off on his chants of approval ahead of the inaugural Platinum Homes Taranaki Challenge (1400m) at New Plymouth on Saturday.

The Cambridge trainer races the stakes-placed Makfi three-year-old gelding with Auckland breeder Brett Wilkinson and is excited to have a runner in New Zealand's richest special conditions maiden.

But Forsman, who trains in partnership with Murray Baker, doesn't share the confidence of TAB bookmakers who have installed Ole Ole a \$3.50 favourite for the race on the back of his comprehensive last-start maiden win at Woodville.

"He's on the way up and we really only gave him that run to have him ready for this race so he would have taken a lot of improvement from that," Forsman said.

"He scrambled around a bit and didn't really like the ground. I was impressed with it because it wasn't the weakest maiden you'd see either. But I'm not going into this race with high hopes.

"I just think the track will be too heavy for him especially against some of those older, more experienced ones."

Track conditions at Pukekura Raceway were rated as heavy 11 on Thursday morning and while Ole Ole

Promising three-year-old Ole Ole will start a favoured candidate in Saturday's inaugural Platinum Homes Taranaki Challenge has now won on a heavy track and run second in the Listed Champagne Stakes (1600m) at Pukekohe on a heavy 10 track, it's evident that he is a more potent racehorse on better footing.

"If he measured up here, we'd think about taking him to Sydney for races like the Gloaming Stakes and Spring Champion Stakes," Forsman said.

"We think he'll get up over ground and back to his own age group, he'll be competitive. But this opportunity came up and he's definitely worth having a go with."

Ole Ole will race in the slot of Sir Patrick and Justine, Lady Hogan, who offered Forsman and Wilkinson a partnership deal when they didn't have a horse of their own for the race, which is run under sweepstake-type conditions similar to Australia's The Everest but for horses who were still in maiden grade at the beginning of June.

"It's a good concept and to have a chance in it is exciting. The horse is in good form anyway and I'm looking forward to it," said Forsman, who came into the ownership after stable owner Wilkinson approached him about taking a share when Ole Ole was still a yearling.

"Brett wasn't taking him to the yearling sales and he asked me to come and have a look at him and it's worked out that I'm racing half with him. It's worked out well. We've had a lot of fun so far."

Waller hoping for rain with Liapari

Leading Sydney trainer Chris Waller is hopeful he can get New Zealand-bred gelding **Liapari (NZ)** (Nom du Jeu) back to his winning ways in the Premier's Cup (1900m) at Rosehill on Saturday.

The Nom du Jeu six-year-old won the Listed Civic Stakes (1350m) three starts ago but has been unplaced in his subsequent two starts.

"He's done a pretty good job this prep, winning a Listed race," Waller said. "I think he'll appreciate stepping up to the 1900m, albeit right at the edge of his distance range.

"There is some talk that we might get a bit of rain on the weekend, that will play to his benefit and he's got a good draw."

Liapari was formerly trained in New Zealand by Karen Zimmerman and won one of his nine starts in his homeland before transferring to Waller.



English Gambler (Casino Prince)

Brennan accepts Taranaki gamble

Lauren Brennan was only too happy to tweak the programme of emerging staying prospect **English Gambler** when the opportunity came to tackle New Zealand's richest special conditions maiden race.

An impressive last-start 10-length maiden winner over 1600m at Tauranga, English Gambler (Casino Prince) was preparing for his first start in Rating 65 company at New Plymouth on Saturday when Brennan received a call from New Plymouth's Jim Martin.

Martin bought a slot for Saturday's \$100,000 Platinum Homes Taranaki Challenge (1400m) when Taranaki Racing announced in February it would host a race for horses that had not won a race before June 1, a sweepstake-type race run along the lines of Sydney's A\$13 million The Everest. Shaun Fannin reckons he's timing his run perfectly on **The Big Opal (NZ)** (Storm Creek).

The Wanganui jumps jockey will team up

with the Kevin Myers-trained Storm Creek gelding in Saturday's Bridges Insurance Services Pakuranga Hunt Cup (4200m), which has belatedly been transferred to Te Aroha with Te Rapa not fit for racing.

It will be Fannin's first ride on The Big Opal since they finished fifth in the Waikato Steeples (3900m) at Te Rapa in May, unable to replicate their win in the same race in 2017. Full story here

Heavy track conditions at Te Aroha could help star Wairarapa hurdler **Zedeedudadeeko (NZ)** (Zed) shoot for two big prizes this weekend.

The Great Northern Hurdles (4190m) and Wellington Hurdles (3400m) winner is a finalist for jumper of the year at Sunday night's New Zealand Thoroughbred Racing Awards at Ellerslie and could vie for a racetrack win the previous day if conditions are right.

Tauherenikau trainer Jamie Phillips has the Zed 10-year-old entered for the Corzon Maize Open Hurdle (3100m) at Te Rapa but was looking for the jumper's preferred testing heavy conditions before confirming a start. Full story here

Nowyousee (NZ) (O'Reilly)

Moor confident Nowyousee can etch a more lasting impression on Friday

Daniel Moor is hoping it's the **Nowyousee** (NZ) (O'Reilly) he sat on at his nine-length barrier trial win who will show up when he takes his first race-ride aboard the exciting O'Reilly four-year-old today.

Following that impressive trial Nowyousee, who had then just been transferred to the Lee Freedman stable, ran second over 1000m under the guidance of Vlad Duric.

Moor is jumping on this time, and the Victorian jockey, is well intent on getting the Titanium Racing Stable-owned gelding back to winning ways.

"It'll be my first time riding him in a race. He's a very promising horse, he trialled brilliantly for me," Moor said.

"Unfortunately, I didn't get to ride him at his last start. He missed the kick a little and pulled two shoes, and got a bit stirred up.

"But his trackwork has been exemplary since. I galloped him this morning and he worked really well."

Moritz Eclipse returns after brave win while hurt

Off the radar since winning a race back in March despite suffering a bad leg injury in the running, **Moritz Eclipse (NZ)** (Darci Brahma) is making his racing comeback tonight (NZ time) at Kranji.

The son of Darci Brahma returned to the stables with a deep gash to the tendon sheath of his off-hind after winning the Class 3 Division 2 race over 1200m.

Five months later, Moritz Eclipse will be back racing in the S\$80,000 Class 3 race over 1100m and is looking and feeling as good as new. Trainer Steven Burridge is just hoping the six-year-old will come through that first run after his injury-enforced layoff without a hitch.

"He got galloped on during that race. He came back with the tendon sheath to his back leg badly cut," Burridge said.

"He raced through the pain to still win the race, which was pretty amazing. That to me is a sign of a good horse.

"He had a cast on the injured leg for six weeks and we've slowly brought him back after he fully recovered.

"It's going to be his first run this Friday, and Harry (A'Isisuhairi Kasim), who won on him at his last start, will ride him again. He knows the horse well as he rode him at all his four wins."

Winning return for Xpression

Showcasing filly **Xpression (NZ)** (Showcasing) made a winning return to the track at Taupo on Wednesday when taking out the NZB Insurance Pearl Series Race (1100m).

The last-start Gr.2 Wakefield Challenge Stakes (1200m) winner was handled patiently by jockey Sam Collett, sitting off the pace at the rear of the field for the majority of the race after jumping away fairly.



Xpression (NZ) (Showcasing)

Last season's premiership-winning jockey pulled Xpression wide on the turn, with the Guy Lowry and Grant Cullen-trained three-year-old letting down strongly over the closing stages to win by a long head over stakes winner Santa Catarina (NZ) (Savabeel), with a further half-length back to stablemate Mohaka (NZ) (Nadeem). Mile next for Charles Road

Trainer Lance O'Sullivan has reported quality stayer **Charles Road** (Myboycharlie) has come through his first-up effort in the Gr.2 Lisa Chittick Foxbridge Plate (1200m) in good fashion and will now head to Hastings for an open handicap over a mile on September 1.

The Gr.2 Chairman's Quality (2600m) winner finished tenth in the Foxbridge Plate where he made up good ground over the concluding stages.

"We were very pleased with him in the Foxbridge Plate," O'Sullivan, who trains in partnership with Andrew Scott, said.

"He is a stayer resuming and I was probably surprised that he finished as close as he did to them. He certainly finished a few lengths closer than what I expected.

"We will bypass the Tarzino Trophy and run him in the mile handicap on the same day at Hawke's Bay. It is the path we took with Willie Cazals a couple of years ago and it worked successfully for us with him winning the Livamol Classic."

Meads Trophy aim for Sir Nate

Group One-placed three-year-old **Sir Nate** (**NZ**) (Nadeem) is poised to make a splash when he resumes in Saturday week's Listed El Roca Sir Colin Meads Trophy (1200m) at Hastings.

A winner of three of his six starts at two, including the Listed Wellesley Stakes (1000m) at Trentham last spring, Nadeem colt Sir Nate went to the paddock after his third placing in the Gr.1 Manawatu Sires' Produce Stakes (1400m) at Awapuni in late March.

He resumed with a slashing trial win over 850m at Foxton earlier this month.

"He's come up enormous," trainer Lisa Latta said. "We've got a lovely team of young horses coming through for spring but he's at the top of the pile."

Grand Bouquet impressive at Hawkesbury

Newcastle trainer Kris Lees looks to have a promising filly on his hands after Savabeel three-year-old **Grand Bouquet** (NZ) broke her maiden status over 1300m at Hawkesbury on Thursday.

Having her second start and first run back from a spell following a fourth on debut at Wyong in March, Grand Bouquet was allowed to settle at the rear from a wide draw by Glyn Schofield and steamed home down the outside to score a narrow but impressive victory.

The filly is a daughter of triple Group One winner Daffodil (NZ) (No Excuse Needed) and is a half-sister to the stakes-placed Snowdrop (NZ) (Pins).

She is raced by the China Horse Club who purchased her out of the Waikato Stud draft for \$600,000 during the Premier session of the 2017 National Yearling Sale at Karaka.

Seabrook set for McNeil Stakes

Group One-winning filly **Seabrook** (**NZ**) (Hinchinbrook) pleased trainer Mick Price in her 800m trial at Cranbourne on Tuesday and will be set to kick-off her spring campaign next month in the Gr.3 McNeil Stakes (1200m).

The New Zealand-bred filly won the Gr.1 Champagne Stakes (1600m) in her last start as a two-year-old and will have the ultimate target of the Gr.1 Thousand Guineas (1600m) this spring.

"Seabrook was good (in her trial), it was her second trial at Cranbourne," Price said.

"She'll now go to the McNeil Stakes at Caulfield on Memsie Stakes Day to run against the boys, then she'll go to the Exford Plate at Flemington on September 15.

"Third-up will be either the Thousand Guineas Prelude on September 30, but I am giving consideration to the Golden Rose at Rosehill on September 22.

"The Thousand Guineas will be her main target race."



Grunt (NZ) (O'Reilly)

Memsie Stakes next target for Grunt

Quality four-year-old O'Reilly entire **Grunt** (**NZ**) will tackle the Gr.1 Memsie Stakes (1400m) on September 1 on his way to a tilt at the Gr.1 Cox Plate (2040m) in October.

Trainer Mick Price said the Gr.1 Australian Guineas (1600m) winner has pulled up well after his fifth-placing in the Gr.2 PB Lawrence Stakes (1400m) and believes his charge will need the run.

"I'm going to run Grunt in the Memsie Stakes," Price said. "He's pulled up very well and he's a four-year-old entire, he needs another run I think.

"Four weeks between the Lawrence and the Makybe Diva Stakes is just too long so I've decided to give him a run at Caulfield."



Authentic Paddy (NZ) (Howbaddouwantit)

Paddy returns the real deal

Perennial Group One performer **Authentic Paddy (NZ)** (Howbaddouwantit) has returned for his nine-year-old season better than ever before according to Awapuni trainer Lisa Latta.

She made the comments in the wake of the Gr.1 Zabeel Classic (2000m) winner's bold third placing to Melody Belle (NZ) (Commands) and Julius (NZ) (Swiss Ace) in the Gr.2 Foxbridge Plate (1200m) at Te Rapa on Saturday.

It was a mighty return from the Howbaddouwantit gelding over a distance much shorter than his favoured 2000m.

"I'm absolutely rapt with him," Latta said.

Despite his narrow defeat at the hands of Melody Belle (NZ) (Commands) in Saturday's Gr.2 Foxbridge Plate (1200m) at Te Rapa, Julius remained at 20th on the order of entry for the Group One race, and Bell has sent the seven-year-old for a brief let-up.

The Cambridge trainer was disappointed with the racing surface presented at Te Rapa on Saturday, with the Waikato Racing Club admitting that too much sand was applied to the track during maintenance work earlier in the year.

"His hind heels are red-raw from the sand from the track," Bell said. "There are horses out of that race and out of that race meeting that have had to have vet attention to flush eyes out."

Bell said Julius was only a 50/50 chance to gain a start in the Tarzino anyway, so he had elected to back off him.

"We didn't want another Mosse," Bell said. "He was favourite for the Railway and never got a start."

Pakuranga Meeting transferred

The Pakuranga Hunt meeting on Saturday, set to be held at Te Rapa, will now be run at Te Aroha.

New Zealand Thoroughbred Racing has cited heavy rain and prevailing track conditions for the change in venue.

The transfer has also resulted in the change in a number of race distances. All hurdle races will now be run over 3100m, the Maiden Chase will be run over 3500m (reduced from 3900m), while the Bridges Insurance Pakuranga Hunt Cup will now be run over 4200m (reduced from 4800m).

The Pakuranga Hunt meeting is historically held at Ellerslie, however, with the course closed for several months for track maintenance, Te Rapa was set to host the meeting before this week's transfer.


