ADDICTIVE NATURE TO RELISH STEP UP IN MING DYNASTY



Addictive Nature steps out over 1400 metres at Rosehill tomorrow

Born Baker is confident promising colt **Addictive Nature** (Savabeel) will be more suited with a step up in distance in Saturday's Gr.3 Ming Dynasty Quality (1400m) at Rosehill.

The son of Savabeel signalled he is a horse with serious talent when leading throughout on debut in July at Warwick Farm in the Pluck@Vinery Handicap (1100m) to break a 13-year-old class record held by multiple Group One-winner

Eremein (Timber Country).

The \$775,000 Karaka yearling purchase from Little Avondale Stud was then sent around as the favourite at Randwick in the www.walking2help.com.au Sprint (1200m) earlier this month where he led into a strong head-wind before tiring late to be beaten 1-1/4 lengths by Queensland visitor Shogun Sun (Written Tycoon).

Baker feels his colt is primed to excel stepping up in distance after the two strong performances over shorter trips.

"I think the 1400m should suit him, I'm really confident," Baker said.

"He's third-up so he's got a pretty good set-up to run well.

"I thought his last run was good, he did everything but win. There was a bit of a breeze that day and he had to do all the work and the track was a bit of a question mark as well."

After his most recent performance Baker has taken Addictive Nature back to the trials to bridge the gap between runs.

"He had a trial at Kembla Grange last Wednesday and he relaxed off them and finished off well," he said.

"Although he settled in behind them at the trial we'll just

put him where he's comfortable, we'll leave it up to Tim.

"He's drawn out a little bit so we'll just see how he jumps, he has got natural speed so we won't want to be giving away that."

Although the stable has a big opinion of Addictive Nature a decision on a spring target will be left until after the race on Saturday.

"He's shown a lot of ability, but regardless of what we think it's all irrelevant until race day comes around," Baker said.

"He's going well, I think 1400m will suit, he gets in with a good weight and Tim Clark knows him well so, we are definitely confident he'll run well. But we'll just wait until after the race to see what we'll do next."

WISE CALL COULD SEE LUPTON WIN SIXTH HUNT CUP

Isaac Lupton has revealed that he's only still riding because of **Wise Men Say (NZ)** (Yamanin Vital), his mount in tomorrow's The Tractor Centre Pakuranga Hunt Cup (4900m) at Ellerslie.

The affable jumps jockey will shoot for his sixth win in the feature steeplechase aboard a horse he describes as "potentially one of the best I've ridden", a statement that demands contemplation when you consider Lupton was the regular partner of champion jumper Hypnotize (NZ) (Yamanin Vital).

"He's the main reason I carried on riding after I had that bad fall a couple of years ago," Lupton said of Wise Men Say.

He broke a shoulder, wrist, ankle and some ribs in a horrific fall on Field Daze (NZ) (No Excuse Needed) at Te Aroha in September 2015.

"It took a lot longer to come right than I'd hoped. I was in hospital for a week afterwards and it all happened at the worst time," said Lupton, who milks 300 cows on his Waverley dairy farm.

"It was at the start of AB [artificial breeding] mating on the farm, which I do myself, so it ended up being a bit of a nightmare. That's probably why I don't ride as much now."

That Wise Men Say motivation to continue riding is approaching its denouement now as the Raymond Connors-trained Yamanin Vital eight-year-old gelding prepares to tackle the Ellerslie blue-riband steeplechase double of the Pakuranga Hunt Cup and Great Northern Steeplechase.

In 12 rides on Wise Men Say, Lupton has won three times and placed in a further four, among the triumphs a 16-length win in the appropriately-named Hypnotize Steeples (4000m) at Hawera in May and a breath-taking win in the McGregor Grant Steeples (4190m) at Ellerslie in June.

"He's different to Hypnotize, who was probably a bit classier, and Counter Punch had a bit more class as well," Lupton said.

"He's more of a one-batter, but you know the ability is there. I always thought he'd be a Northern horse. His win in the McGregor Grant was what I thought he'd do last year, but he might have still been a bit new.

"He had no luck in the Northern. He fell but it wasn't his fault [he landed awkwardly at the water jump]. A drying track probably doesn't suit him ideally on Saturday because he'd be more competitive if the track was more testing, but I still think he'll be hard to beat.

"You saw him finish like he did in the McGregor Grant and that was only 4000m. With him, the further they go, the better."

Lupton holds the record for most wins for a jockey in the Pakuranga Hunt Cup, having racked up his previous wins aboard Bart (NZ) (Silent Hunter) in 2005, Real Tonic (NZ) (Victory Dance) in 2006 and Hypnotize in 2007, 2008 and 2010.

"I did have a good run there for a while with Hypnotize, but it's been a few years now. That time has gone by pretty quickly."

Lupton has two other rides at Ellerslie on Saturday, on **Coolibah (NZ)** (Istidaad) in the Harrison Lane Hurdle and **Max (NZ)** (Gallant Guru) in the John Prangley & John Kloosterman Memorial Steeplechase.

Craig Williams will partner New Zealand Bloodstock graduate **Tulip (Pierro)** in Saturday's Johnny Walker Plate at Moonee Valley.

The 1200m event for three-year-old fillies is dripping with class and Williams will be aboard the Golden Slipper placegetter who was purchased for \$400,000 from the 2016 draft of Curraghmore Stud.

"I think she's quite special," Williams said of Tulip, who was scratched from last week's Gr.3 Quezette Stakes to be saved for this weekend's race.

"I think she's right up there with the best three-year-old fillies we have, she was definitely up there with the best two-year-old fillies we had.

"I did trial her before I went overseas and I was really happy with the feel that she gave me and she's won at the Valley too."

Tulip, who has not started since her fifth placing in the Gr.1 ATC Sires', is the current favourite ahead of Limestone (Helmet).

Bonny O'Reilly back better than ever

Bonny O'Reilly (NZ) (O'Reilly) is set to make her return to racing in Saturday's Fiig Handicap (1200m) at Rosehill and Bjorn Baker believes the filly is in even better condition than last preparation.

The Amberley trainer said the lightly-raced seven-year-old is his own worst enemy, but on his day capable of matching it in open company.

"You just wouldn't know with him, he's a quiet horse and can spook at anything," Harris said. "That's half the trouble and you don't really know what he's going to do."

Wise Move was in the right mood at his most recent appearance when he charged home to win on the closing day of the Christchurch winter carnival and Harris is hoping for a repeat in the Crombie and Price Oamaru Cup today. [Full story here](#)



El Don (NZ) (Don Eduardo)

Few options for in-form Kiwi galloper

Stephen Gray is being frustrated by the lack of staying opportunities in Singapore for his Kiwi-bred five-year-old **El Don (NZ)** (Don Eduardo).

The expatriate New Zealand trainer has produced the son of Don Eduardo to win

two of his last three starts over 2000m, but is being forced to drop his potential Singapore Gold Cup prospect back to 1400m at Kranji on Sunday.

"El Don is a good stayer. He's won a few good ones," Gray said. "The seven furlongs are not ideal, it's obviously too short for him. There is a 1800m race in three weeks' time, but he had to start somewhere if he needs to get in the Gold Cup at a light weight."

"The problem is we don't have many distance races in the lower divisions leading up to the Gold Cup. It can be a bit tricky, but I hope he can still make the cut."



Francescana (NZ) (Pins)

Familiar colours back in winning form

Memories of one of New Zealand's greatest performers of the 1990s were rekindled at Woodville yesterday when **Francescana (NZ)** (Pins) was successful.

Jockey Lisa Allpress donned the colours of the mighty Veandercross (NZ) (Crossways) when guiding the Fraser Auret-trained mare to win the Merrylees Hotel Maiden.

"She's a lovely big type who has taken some time," Auret said. "It's certainly a privilege to have those colours up."

Francescana is raced by Wanganui part-owners Chris and Helen Turner, who gained Australasian fame and fortune with their multiple Group One winner Veandercross.

The Crossways gelding, a New Zealand and Australian Horse of the Year, was successful eight times at the highest level and was runner-up in both the Caulfield and Melbourne Cups.

Filly gains well-earned win

Black type performer **Dreams Of Platinum** (Dream Ahead) has posted a deserved first victory at Woodville.

The Lisa Latta-trained filly performed well during a busy juvenile season with six placings from eight starts, including a third in the Listed Wellesley Stakes, before success in yesterday's Lowe Schollum & Jones 3YO for rider Lisa Allpress.

"It wasn't the intention to lead, but that's why you put Lisa on - she makes the right decisions," stable representative Andy Rennie said. "It took bad luck out of the equation."



Notabadcraftsman (NZ) (Mastercraftsman)

Trainer's judgement on the money

Craig Phelan has a healthy opinion of **Notabadcraftsman (NZ)** (Mastercraftsman) and the three-year-old showed exactly why with a debut victory at Tauranga on Wednesday.

"He could be a bit special," the Cambridge trainer said. "He'll go over more ground and who knows, he could be a Derby horse."

Notabadcraftsman was ridden by Jason Waddell, who was also aboard the gelding when second in a recent trial, and they won the STE Industrial Electrical 1200 in dominant fashion.

Overseas options under consideration for smart stayer

Roger James is looking at Australian options for his stakes-winning stayer **Von Tunzelman (NZ)** (Zabeel).

Time for Margot's luck to turn

The connections of the promising mare **Margot (NZ)** (Swiss Ace) are due a change of luck and a home track trial success might

be the sign of better things to come.

The Foxton filly won her 1000m open heat in Heavy 11 going on Tuesday in the hands of Rosie Myers and trainer Suzy Gordon is now hoping for the weather to come into play.

"Rosie said she hated the track, she definitely needs it Good to Dead," Gordon said.

"The reason I trialed her was that I'm hoping the Hawke's Bay track will come back to Dead on Saturday week and then she can run in the Rating 65 over 1400m. She's ready to go."

Margot gave a good account of herself on debut last season when she finished eighth and less than four lengths from the winner Honey Rider in the Gr.3 Gold Trail Stakes at Hastings.

Following a subsequent fifth she was found to be suffering from a virus and after a break she won a maiden at Woodville in February.

"We've had terrible problems with her feet and that's what's held us up for so long," Gordon said. "It's been frustrating, but she's finally right now."

Thomas excited about future training partnership

Cambridge horseman Graham Thomas will shortly be joined in a training partnership by the former champion jumps jockey Mathew Gillies.

"The application was posted on Monday so we're really looking forward to it," Thomas said.

"He's a very knowledgeable guy and he's going to help us a lot. I think we're in for a good season, we've got some nice young horses coming through."

Gillies, 31, won the jumps jockeys' premiership in 2013-14 and rode 85 winners during a career that featured a successful association with the powerful Kevin Myers stable. [Full story here](#)

Bart Cummings, the 'Melbourne Cup King', was the New Zealand Hall of Fame's first honorary inductee.

Bart Cummings never raced a horse in New Zealand, but no overseas trainer did more to promote the New Zealand stayer through the success he achieved with the New Zealand thoroughbred.

Bart saddled an astonishing 12 Melbourne Cup winners, with eight of these being New Zealand-bred. He also trained *So You Think* for five of his 10 Group One wins before he was transferred to Aidan O'Brien.

An astute judge, Bart was a major buyer at New Zealand yearling sales from the early 1960s.
