NZTR APPLAUDS MESSARA REPORT RECOMMENDATIONS



Deputy Prime Minister and Minister For Racing, the Right-Honourable Winston Peters

ew Zealand Thoroughbred Racing (NZTR) has welcomed the findings of the Messara Report into the state of thoroughbred racing in New Zealand.

"It's time for change. We believe this report will create a blueprint for a thriving thoroughbred industry," NZTR Chairman, Dr Alan Jackson, said.

"While our Board has yet to consider the report in detail, the major recommendations are in line with NZTR's views and it is reassuring to have those policies verified by an independent and expert voice. "But implementing the report will still require a considerable amount of work and investment," Jackson said. "We need to work with the Government, the New Zealand Racing Board (NZRB) and the Racing Industry Transition Agency to ensure that this opportunity is not wasted.

"We are confident that racing has a bright future in New Zealand but real change and brave leadership will be required if we are to achieve the report's target of doubling prize money.

"We are at the cross-roads in terms of sustainability and we need to move quickly. It's a heavily regulated industry and it is vital that any recommended changes to the Racing Act are put in place as soon as practicable, to allow each Code to achieve their potential.

"The current wagering business model is under severe competitive pressure, and we need additional income streams and reduced costs if thoroughbred racing's share is to grow."

NZTR endorsed the Messara Report recommendation that the NZRB outsources much of the TAB's commercial operations.

"This is something NZTR has been advocating for some time," Jackson said. Multiple pieces of work, which NZTR had been involved with or undertaken, had shown that an outsourcing arrangement would provide significant financial gains.

"This is one way of overcoming a lack of scale, which has made it increasingly difficult for the NZ TAB to operate in what is now a highly competitive wagering market."

The argument for outsourcing had also been strengthened by changes to the international regulatory environment, which had not been anticipated at the time of the NZRB's current strategy.

NZTR also welcomed the recommendations in the Messara Report on synthetic tracks and racing venues. "NZTR has been undertaking its own venue review and has come to similar conclusions," Jackson said.

"While there will always be a place for each club, it has been obvious for some time that the industry cannot sustain the current number of venues.

"Infrastructure spending needs to be lifted. Many of our strategic tracks require significant investment but if we attempt to retain the current number of venues, there is a risk that the infrastructure spending will be spread too thinly.

"Synthetic tracks will play a key role in providing consistent and reliable surfaces and will ease the pressure on the main turf tracks.

"The recommendations in the Messara report are a pathway to a major uplift in our sector's economic performance and contribution to New Zealand," Jackson said. "But there is a lot of detail to consider and we are pleased that the Government has pledged to consult further with the industry.

"Our sport has had a significant economic and social impact on New Zealand. It sustains more than 14,000 full-time equivalent jobs, has over 55,000 participants and generates more than \$1.6 billion in value-added contribution to the New Zealand economy.

"The thoroughbred code, alone, has 16,000 owners, 3700 breeders and 1000 trainers and generates more than 9000 FTE jobs, plus volunteers."

MAKYBE DIVA MAIN TARGET FOR GRUNT

rainer Mick Price has elected to run O'Reilly entire **Grunt (NZ)** in Saturday's Gr.1 New Zealand Bloodstock Memsie Stakes (1400m) at Caulfield after he grew concerned with the four-week gap between runs.

The Gr.1 Australian Guineas (1600m) winner pleased his trainer with his fresh-up fifth-placing in the Gr.2 PB Lawrence Stakes (1400m), but Price said he needs the run heading into the Gr.1 Makybe Diva Stakes (1600m) next month.

"He's done too well and it was going to be four weeks between runs into

the Makybe Diva, which is probably the case for a lot of these horses I guess,"
Price said.

"He's a four-year-old entire, he had a bit of a blow, and the four weeks between runs wasn't going to be enough work for him.

"The Makybe Diva is a Group One, so he'll be there to win it if he can and the Memsie is part of that plan."

Price is pleased with Grunt's inside barrier draw and believes PB Lawrence Stakes winner Showtime (Snitzel) will once again set the early pace.

"There was good pace on (in the PB

Lawrence) and there should be good pace on again," he said. "I see Showtime has drawn two, we have drawn barrier one, so we'll get a trail up."

Jockey Luke Currie will be aboard on Saturday and he gave a glowing report after riding Grunt in track work earlier this week, however, Price said he'll be suited over more ground.

"Currie came and rode him on Tuesday, the horse is going great," Price said.

"He's going to be that 2000m-type horse. He might be a Caulfield Cup-

Melbourne Cup type of horse, he might run in the Cox Plate. I've just got to get a feel for him on the run through, but the horse is going great and will give plenty of cheek if he gets a run at the right time, albeit 1400m.

"It might be a bit sharp for him, but he'll be chasing up behind them.

"He has taken a lot of improvement from that first-up run and each run he has he'll get better and I'll be looking forward to the Makybe Diva."

Meanwhile, Price rates juvenile Group One winner **Seabrook (NZ)** (Hinchinbrook) as his best winning chance on Saturday when she contests the Gr.3 HDF McNeil Stakes (1200m) first-up at Caulfield.

The New Zealand-bred filly won

the Gr.1 Champagne Stakes (1600m) at Randwick in her last-start and Price believes the three-year-old has a strong Classic season ahead of her.

"She's flying," Price said. "She had a soft trial at Cranbourne and then she had another trial where she went really well. She's looking for a race now, she's going great and she's our best chance for the day."

The three-year-old filly's main target for the spring will either be the Gr.1 Thousand Guineas (1600m) or Gr.1 Caulfield Guineas (1600m), and Price has two programmes in-mind depending on how Seabrook runs on Saturday.

"We have two choices with her," he said. "If she wins on Saturday I'd be tempted to go to the Golden Rose. She knows Rosehill, she knows Sydney, it's a \$1 million race and 1400m would suit.

"It would then be three weeks into the Thousand Guineas or Caulfield Guineas.

"Or she stays here (in Melbourne) and we would go to either the Danehill or the Exford in two weeks and then the Guineas Prelude and the Thousand Guineas or Caulfield Guineas.

"So they are two different programmes and we will make a decision after Saturday. But I think she will be a beautiful Thousand Guineas filly, a mile is great for her.

"But on Saturday, fresh-up over 1200m, she'll be motoring home and can win."

HENNESSY HOPING HISTORY REPEATS



Two impressive trial wins have Ocean Emperor on track for a good performance in the Gr.1 Tarzino Trophy at Hastings

atamata trainer Gary Hennessy sees a number of similarities in Gr.1 Tarzino Trophy (1400m) hopeful **Ocean Emperor (NZ)** (Zabeel) and his five-time Group One winning galloper Ocean Park (NZ) (Thorn Park).

It is six years since Hennessy prepared Ocean Park to win the Hastings Group One, then known as the Makfi Challenge Stakes, which was a pre-cursor to the entire winning three Group One races in Melbourne during the spring of 2012, including the Cox Plate (2040m).

A seven-year-old entire by Zabeel, Ocean Emperor missed much of his three and four-year-old seasons with a hoof injury, but the dual Group Two winner is making up for lost time.

Ocean Emperor prepared for Saturday's contest, for which

he is rated a \$12 chance, with two impressive trial victories at Te Teko and then Taupo, leaving a host of weight-for-age gallopers in his wake.

"He's right where we want him to be," Hennessy said.

"He's like where we were with Ocean Park when he won his trial by three-lengths going in to this race. This horse did it a lot easier and against a lot stronger opposition."

To be ridden by Shaun McKay, Ocean Emperor has lead in both trials, but Hennessy said the horse would not necessarily play pacemaker.

"The beauty of him is he's got good gate speed and he's able to take a posy and settle.

"If he gets a little bit of cover he's got a huge turn of foot,

he could really explode onto the scene like he did in the two Group Two races that he has won."

A 1400m Group One success would also go a long way to securing a future home at stud for the stallion, aiming to become the 47th individual Group One winner by his late sire Zabeel.

"That would be huge," Hennessy said. "That was in the back of my mind from the day we bought him. He is the most gorgeous looking horse.

"We've had a few little set-backs with him but I think he's come of age and the trip to Singapore earlier this year has probably been the making of him."

Ocean Emperor could embark on further travel, with Hennessy keen to replicate Ocean Park's successful Melbourne campaign.

"If he can run a really good race and run in the first three, I think we'll go straight to the Underwood like we did with Ocean Park.

"The step up to 1800m from 1400m will suit. He's always looked like he can get a trip.

"He's easy to train. He's very similar to Ocean Park, he's like a clone really. It's just unfortunate he missed his three-year-old

career and didn't get that racing experience that Ocean Park did at the same age.

"But being a Zabeel, they just get better with age and he's a lovely entire to work with."

While Hennessy is hoping to enhance a stallion's pedigree this weekend, he was savouring the stakes success of Caulfield Guineas favourite Brutal (NZ) (O'Reilly) in the Listed McKenzie Stakes (1200m) at Moonee Valley last Saturday, having acquired his dam Alberton Princess (NZ) (Golan) and another close relative just over two years ago.

"I bought both Alberton Princess and Lady Alberton at the 2016 New Zealand Bloodstock May Sale," Hennessy said.

"I paid \$75,000 for Alberton Princess and she was in foal to Sacred Falls. The subsequent foal made \$170,000 as a yearling earlier in the year, so she owes us nothing and Brutal looks very exciting."

Hennessy, who along with wife Jenny, operates Weowna Park in Matamata, has Ocean Park yearling colts out of both mares.

"We've just had New Zealand Bloodstock come and look at our yearlings this week and we've got 17 entered for the sales. We've got some really nice types with nice pedigrees."

PIKE LOOKS TO GO BACK-TO-BACK IN SIR COLIN MEADS

ambridge-based trainer Tony
Pike is well-armed to go back-toback in Saturday's Listed El Roca
– Sir Colin Meads Trophy (1200m) at
Hastings, a race he won with Bostonian
(NZ) (Jimmy Choux) last year.

Pike prepares equal second and third favourites for the three-year-old race in **Stella Noire (NZ)** (Showcasing) and **Cyber Attack (NZ)** (Shamexpress), a pair that he finds difficult to split.

"They're pretty evenly matched," he said. "Cyber Attack will handle any rain that happens to fall before Saturday, while Stella Noire's probably looking for a reasonable track surface.

"Stella Noire might have more natural ability but she's going in freshup and he's going to be a fit racehorse going into Saturday's race."

That natural ability has shown in

Stella Noire's unbeaten record in three trials and one race day appearance over 1100m at Ellerslie on Boxing Day, and Pike is happy with how she has progressed since then.

"She's grown into a very big and impressive looking filly," he said.

"That's part of the reason that we spelled her after her Boxing Day win.

"She just continued to grow and she's grown into a big scopey type so we're really happy with the way that she has developed from two to three."

Stella Noire has made two public appearances since spelling, winning a trial at Cambridge in early May and more recently winning another at Te Teko.

"It was a pretty soft trial at Te Teko," Pike said. "It followed a nice hit out on the course proper at Cambridge the week before that and she's going to be pretty forward going into Saturday's race.

"Her work on Tuesday morning was outstanding and she galloped again this morning. It was a lot quieter work on the pretty wet grass but I can't fault her work and I can't fault her condition."

The only concern Pike has with the promising filly is her barrier draw of 11, although he's leaving the race tactics in the capable hands of jockey Leith Innes who rode her on Boxing Day and in her most recent trial.

"Leith's got plenty of confidence in her and just depending on how she clears the barriers I'll leave it completely in his hands how he decides to ride her," Pike said.

Stella Noire's stablemate and race rival Cyber Attack fared much better in the barrier draw and he will jump from barrier three with Vinnie Colgan aboard.

"He's a very honest campaigner, he's going to be one of the fitter runners in the race," Pike said. "He's got a few runs under his belt and he's in good form.

"He was hampered in his last start at Te Rapa and he did a few things wrong after that but he finished the race off really well.

"I think 1400m would probably suit him better than 1200m but he's going to get a nice trip in transit and I'm sure he won't be too far away in the finish."

The talented duo had their final hit-out in preparation for Saturday's feature when working over 1200m in a gallop ahead of the trials at Foxton on Tuesday morning, with \$6 equal second-favourite Scott Base edging his stablemate.

Rusof has made a favourable impression since commencing his second stint in New Zealand in March this year.

Champion filly ready to resume

The Michael and Matthew Pitman-trained **Savvy Coup (NZ)** (Savabeel) was crowned New Zealand's Champion Three-Year-Old at Sunday's Horse of the Year Awards, and the daughter of Savabeel is pleasing her trainers ahead of her resumption in Saturday's Gr.1 Tarzino Trophy (1400m).

"She's working really well and she should be competitive, but I think the bookies have got it pretty right," Michael Pitman said of the \$31 chance.

"She is at good odds this week, she shortens in for the mile (Gr.1 Windsor Park Plate) and she's favourite for the 2000m (Gr.1 Livamol Classic).

"That's the path that we're taking and with the Livamol, I really believe that if we can get her right, it's a race that she will be capable of winning."

Savvy Coup has prepared for her first-up Group One assignment by working with race rival and stablemate Son Of Maher (Al Maher).

"We're not trial trainers. I hardly ever go to the trials.

"I am really relying on the work that Son Of Maher and Savvy Coup do together to get each other ready. Both horses are going really well."

Chris Johnson will ride Savvy Coup, while Sam Weatherly, who is back from Sydney for a week, will partner Group Two winner Son Of Maher.

Lanciato camp confident ahead of Tramway

Trainer Mark Newnham has plenty of confidence in **Lanciato (NZ)** (Per Incanto) heading into the Gr.2 Tramway Stakes (1400m) at Randwick on Saturday.

The stakes-winning Per Incanto six-year-

old finished fourth in his last-start in the Gr.2 Missile Stakes (1200m) and his trainer expects the gelding to run well in his final hit-out before the Gr.1 Epsom Handicap (1600m) at Randwick on September 29.

"Lanciato is terrific. Everything is going to plan," Newnham said. "He loves Randwick, so I will be disappointed if he is not in the first three on Saturday.

"He likes to race fresh, so the four weeks (in-between the Tramway and Epsom Handicap) is ideal."

Lanciato was bred by Little Avondale Stud in partnership with Lib Petagna, under his JML Bloodstock banner, and went on to win two races in New Zealand before joining Newnham's Randwick barn.

Chelmsford start important for Patrick Erin

Former New Zealand galloper **Patrick Erin (NZ)** (Gallant Guru) is on the cusp of starting in the Gr.2 Chelmsford Stakes (1600m) on Saturday but needs one scratching to make the field.

Trainer Chris Waller was pleased with his first-up performance over 1400m at Rosehill earlier this month where he made up late ground to finish sixth.

Star mare on song

Group One winner I Am A Star (NZ) (I Am Invincible) is on target for Saturday's Gr.3 Ladbrokes Cockram Stakes (1200m) at Caulfield.

I Am A Star will face a handy field but has drawn wide and has barrier 17 against her.

Trainer Shane Nichols reported his mare has come through the Gr.3 Aurie's Star (1200m) earlier this month well enough to try and contend on Saturday.

"She really needed the run in the Aurie's

Star. She was just a bit new and blew out a bit because she hadn't run since the autumn. She's tightened up nice," Nichols said.

Damien Oliver has been booked for the ride.

Randwick start likely for Another Dollar

Leading Sydney trainer Chris Waller will likely bypass the Listed Mona Lisa Stakes (1350m) at Wyong today with **Another Dollar (NZ)** (Ocean Park) in favour of the Heineken 3 Handicap (1400m) at Randwick on Saturday.

The New Zealand Racing Hall of Fame inductee has cited the Gr.1 Queensland Oaks (2400m) runner-up's rating as the main reason.

"First-up at Randwick is a nice starting point," Waller said.

"I'm a bit concerned if she won the Mona Lisa, yes it would be great, but it would just send her rating sky-high and she is only the winner of two races and she already has a rating up around the 89 mark.

"She just deserves to win a few more races before she gets handicapped out of it. I'm leaning towards Saturday, but wherever she goes she is a winning chance."

The Ocean Park mare, who was bred by Waikato Stud, will be looking to keep her terrific strike-rate intact, having never run out of the money in her seven career starts.



(Our) Libretto (NZ) (O'Reilly)

Flemington challenge ahead for Our Libretto

Promising O'Reilly mare **Our Libretto (NZ)** has kept her undefeated Australian record intact after storming home late to win the Ladbrokes Multiverse Handicap (1600m) by a length at Sandown on Wednesday.

The five-year-old's trainer Grahame Begg has a lot of time for the mare, but said she is still learning her craft.

"She is still learning and she's very untapped, she doesn't know what it's all

about yet," he said. "But she loves these big tracks." Full story here



Swing Note (Encosta De Lago)

Comfortable Ashburton win for Swing Note

Stakes-placed four-year-old mare **Swing Note** (Encosta De Lago) kicked-off her spring campaign in style at Ashburton on Thursday, making light work of her rivals in the Barneswood Farm Stakes Day 20th October (1400m).

The Jamie Richards-trained runner jumped away well from her outside barrier, settling at the tail of the field for apprentice jockey Nik Bakar.

The pair improved three-wide at the top of the straight before Bakar pulled Swing Note towards the outside of the track where she showed a good turn of foot to comfortably win by four lengths.

"She's going to develop into a staying mare," stable representative Paul Richards said. "She just got back and got home, which you like to see.

"She placed in a couple of fillies races last year, so she's above average."

Liquid Inspiration at Matamata

The Wayne Hillis-trained Liquid Inspiration (NZ) (Iffraaj) took full advantage of the wet conditions at Matamata on Wednesday to win the ADM Feeds Ltd 1200 on the heavy11 track.

The Iffraaj mare jumped away well and was pushed forward to take the early lead under apprentice jockey Darren Danis.

The pair did not relinquish their advantage, with Liquid Inspiration distancing her rivals in the straight to score by two and a half lengths over Saint Croix (NZ) (Nadeem) with Icing on the Cake (NZ) (Captain Rio) a further two lengths back in third.

Tavistock three-year-old filly **Thornery** (**NZ**) has been earmarked as one to watch by co-trainer Robert Wellwood after her 840m trial win at Te Teko earlier this month.

Wellwood, who trains the filly in partnership with Roger James, has been pleased with her progress and said she could be heading down an Oaks path later this season.

"She is a really nice classic type of filly and her trial win at Te Teko was massive," he said.

"She's definitely going to be a horse who is better with time. She is tagged for the later three-year-old filly's races, including the Oaks.

"We were pleased with her at home, but she probably needed the trial to develop her ringcraft. We were pleasantly surprised with just how well she did for a first outing."

Martin said he has taken particular enjoyment in mentoring younger generations in the industry, with the Sunline Trust scholarship being a pinnacle part of that.

"One of the most enjoyable parts of my role has been the mentoring of young people and the formation of the Sunline Trust, which is an educational trust that was formed after Sunline retired in 2002," he said.

"It has sent a lot of young people overseas to further their careers. I have had a lot of satisfaction in watching people grow into significant industry roles as a result."
