FEATURE FAVOURITES GIVE PARKES CHANCE TO SET ELLERSLIE RECORD STRAIGHT

Johnathan Parkes plans to set right the anomaly of him not yet having ridden a winner at Ellerslie with leading chances in rich feature races in the coming days.

The Wanganui jockey heads to Auckland for Boxing Day and New Year's Day to partner favourites **Volpe Veloce** (Foxwedge) in the Gr.2 Cambridge Stud Eight Carat Classic (1600m) on Monday and **Start Wondering (NZ)** (Eighth

Wonder) in the Gr.1 Sistema Railway Stakes (1200m) six days later.

"I've only really gone up there on the big days and for horses not with the same chance as Volpe Veloce on paper," Parkes said.

"I'm really looking forward to getting up there and riding her."

Parkes has ridden the Graham Richardson-trained filly Volpe Veloce four times for four wins, most recently when she stepped up to 1600m for the first time in this month's Gr.3 Eulogy Stakes at Awapuni.

"I rate her very highly. Her race on Boxing Day is a little bit stronger than the Eulogy but everything you ask of her, she gives more back in return," Parkes said.

"It took her a little while to wind up the other day. She's just really relaxed now. That was her first time over the mile and she settled very well. It's good to see she's got another nice barrier draw [barrier three] so we won't have to do too much early either."

Unbeaten in five starts, having scored on debut with Craig Grylls aboard, Volpe Veloce opened as a dominant \$1.80 favourite with TAB bookmakers for the Eight Carat Classic on Thursday.

Parkes has a handy book of rides for Ellerslie, also riding **Bel Sorisso (NZ)** (Keeper) in the Gr.1 Zabeel Classic (2000m), along with **Alamer (NZ)** (Alamosa) in the Dunstan Feeds Rising Stars Championship Final, **Ichiban (NZ)** (Swiss Ace) in the Conveyancing Shop Lawyers 3YO, and **Wannabe Royale (NZ)** (Mastercraftsman) in the Carter Bloodstock/Rising Romance Mile.

"Bel Sorisso's run was actually quite good in the Captain Cook Stakes - she just got held up. She'd probably be a better chance with a bit of rain," Parkes said.

Parkes will help tune up the Evan and JJ Rayner-trained Start Wondering for his tilt at the Railway with a jumpout at Wanganui on Friday morning.

"He's absolutely flying and I'm really looking forward to that race," Parkes said.

MCDONALD TO APPEAL LENGTHY BAN

Champion jockey James McDonald will appeal his 18-month suspension on a betting charge.

"I made an error of judgement betting on Astern when I rode it and broke a rule of racing. I accept full responsibility for that," he said in a statement following Thursday's hearing.

"But I am extremely disappointed with the penalty and I will be appealing. I will be back riding, and hopefully sooner than later. It is not appropriate that I say anything else until the appeal is over."

The New Zealander pleaded guilty to having an interest in a bet on Astern in December, 2015.

He won \$4000 from the \$1000 placed on the horse on his behalf by punter Anthony Gardiner, who profited by more than \$125,000 on the race and who did not respond to stewards' requests to be interviewed.

A mandatory minimum penalty of two years applies for the offence, but McDonald's lawyer Matthew Stirling argued

that his client's actions were not as serious as a jockey betting against his own mount, using Damien Oliver as an example.

Racing NSW stewards took stern action against McDonald and the ban, which was backdated to start on November 15 when he stood himself down from riding, will side-line him until May 15, 2018.

As a result, he has now lost the top riding job in Australia as Godolphin's principal jockey.

"Godolphin agrees that there must be zero tolerance of any breaches of the prohibition on betting by a jockey," the global breeding and racing powerhouse said in a statement.

"Godolphin has advised James McDonald that, as he is disqualified, he will be released from his current contract with immediate effect. This decision has been accepted by James.

"We will continue to support him throughout his suspension. His long term future with Godolphin will be reviewed in due course by His Highness Sheikh Mohammed."

Volkstok'n'barrell (NZ) (Tavistock)

Setback hasn't knocked confidence

Volkstok'n'barrell (NZ) (Tavistock) has had an interrupted lead-up to Monday's Gr.1 Zabeel Classic at Ellerslie, but co-trainer Donna Logan remains optimistic.

A stone bruise forced him to miss a race at Tauranga and when he did resume in the Gr.1 Captain Cook Stakes at Trentham he lost his footing at the start before running home for sixth.

"I thought it was a very encouraging run," said Logan, who trains in partnership with Chris Gibbs at Ruakaka.

"He will be well forward with that run under his belt and I think he's better than he's ever been. He's also drawn well, which is always a big help."

Hasselhoof due a change of luck

Donna Logan is looking forward to a time when **Hasselhoof (NZ)** (Tavistock) enjoys a trouble-free preparation into a target race.

The Ruakaka horsewoman and her training partner Chris Gibbs have been consistently frustrated by setbacks ahead of Group One starts for the talented gelding.

Hasselhoof loomed as a major contender for the Hawke's Bay Triple Crown series in the spring, only to be thwarted by rain-affected tracks.

A minor foot injury then ruled out the Gr.1 Captain Cook Stakes for Hasselhoof, who recovered to finish a bold last-start third in the Listed J. Swap Contractors at Te Rapa.

"One day it's all going to fall into place for him and he'll win his Group One," Logan said.

She is hoping their reward may come at Ellerslie on Boxing Day in the Zabeel Classic. "His preparation hasn't been ideal again, but I think he can do it," Logan said. "He pulled up well after Te Rapa, I was thrilled with his run there."



Coldplay (NZ) (Savabeel)

Rich Hill next for quality mare

In-form mare **Coldplay (NZ)** (Savabeel) will make her next appearance at Ellerslie on New Year's Day.

The decision was made to wait for the Gr.2 Rich Hill Stud Mile on the second day of the carnival after she drew the outside gate in the Gr.1 Zabeel Classic on Boxing Day.

Trained at Cambridge by Murray Baker and Andrew Forsman, Coldplay has won the Gr.2 Cal Isuzu Stakes and the Gr.3 Eagle Technology Stakes at her last two starts.

Super Trouper on black type quest

Super Trouper (NZ) (Darci Brahma) will have a wide gate to contend with in the Listed BP2GO Alco Mosgiel at Wingatui on Boxing Day.

"It's hard to see her beating First Serve, but you never know," trainer Kevin Hughes said. "Hopefully, she'll be able to tuck in and a bit of cut in the ground does suit her.

"She's in foal to Zacinto so we're trying to get some black type for her."

The last-start Gr.3 Concorde Handicap winner is a \$7 equal second favourite for the Gr.1 Sistema Railway Stakes (1200m).

"He's really well. If he gets a nice draw, they'll certainly know he's in the race. We couldn't be happier with him," Peter Williams said.

Among other runners for the stable at Ellerslie on January 1 are last-start Listed Murdoch Newell Stakes winner Talaria (NZ) (O'Reilly) in the Gr.3 Eclipse Stakes (1200m), Marciano (NZ) (Faltaat) in the Gr.3 City of Auckland Cup (2400m), Symphonic (NZ) (O'Reilly) in the Dunstan Feeds Stayers Championship Final and Gravano (NZ) (Roc de Cambes) in the Rating 75 1600m.

Cup beckons brave Maybe Miami

Maybe Miami (NZ) (Iffraaj) has returned home in good shape following his gallant last-start showing in difficult circumstances at Awapuni.

The Riccarton five-year-old finished fourth in last Sunday's Gr.2 Manawatu Challenge Stakes after being forced to race three wide without cover from the outside gate. He also copped a bump in the straight.

"There was nothing else up there for him so he's come back," said trainer Kevin Hughes who prepares the gelding with his wife Pam.

"He's best over 1400 metres, but there's nothing around to suit him so we'll probably run in the Timaru Cup next week. It's a softer mile over there.

"After that we might give him a break and wait for the autumn when there's a few weight-for-age options up north."



La Diosa (NZ) (So You Think)

Ride on Group One filly up for grabs

The connections of **La Diosa (NZ)** (So You Think) will be relying on local riding knowledge to further their chances of success in Sydney next year.

We haven't heard from any agents and we haven't made any contact yet either," said Matt Brown, who prepares the filly with his wife Mandy.

"She will be ridden by an Australian jockey - we'll just start at the top and work our way down."

Brown also confirmed that their Gr.1 New Zealand 1000 Guineas winner won't race in New Zealand before she heads to Australia for a four-start campaign that culminates in the \$A1 million Gr.1 ATC Australian Oaks on April 8.

Talented mare on a Group One path

Capella (NZ) (Rip Van Winkle) has at least one top-flight feature on her summer programme.

The mare showed she was approaching her best form again when she finished a close last-start second when resuming at Ellerslie earlier this month.

"I'm very happy with her, it was a good run and a bit of a relief really," trainer Danica Guy said.

"It was a nice effort going forward - we're looking at the Rich Hill Mile and maybe the Thorndon Mile and then the Herbie Dyke Stakes.

Successful in last season's Gr.1 J. J. Atkins at Eagle Farm, Sacred Elixir has this term added the Gr.2 Moonee Valley Vase and the Gr.3 Caulfield Guineas Prelude to his winning tally.

He also finished runner-up in the Gr.1 VRC Derby at Flemington before he signed off for the spring.

He has the \$1 million Gr.1 Vodafone New Zealand Derby as the final target of his classic season and he is likely to take in the Gr.2 Avondale Guineas a fortnight before the Ellerslie feature on March 4.

In-form youngster on target for Ellerslie

Tony Gollan is expecting **Unlikely Story (NZ)** (Star Witness) to bring winning form to Ellerslie next month.

The Eagle Farm trainer has the precocious son of Star Witness on target for a crack at the \$1 million Karaka Million on January 29.

Unlikely Story was put aside after the chestnut colt's debut second at Doomben and he is making good progress toward another appearance before he crosses the Tasman.

"It was a terrific run for second at his first start and he'll have a jump-out and a run about a fortnight before Ellerslie," said Jane Gollan, Tony's wife and his racing and administrative manager.



Opie Bosson

Bosson back with Te Akau

Opie Bosson has been confirmed as Te Akau Racing's number one jockey again.

"He will now have first choice of their rides," his manager Aidan Rodley said.

The 36-year-old, who will replace Matt Cameron as stable rider, has enjoyed previous spells with Te Akau and served part of his apprenticeship with Stephen Autridge, who now trains in partnership with Jamie Richards.

Reprieve for Tavi Bay

Tavi Bay (NZ) (Tavistock) has gone from first to last in her two starts this prep, but trainer Henry Dwyer is prepared to excuse the mare that will run at Sandown on Christmas Eve.

The four-year-old lugged 60kg to victory when fresh at Flemington over 1700m during Melbourne Cup week, but finished last at the same track/trip five weeks later on December 10 - with the firm track attributed to her failure.

Dwyer said Tavi Bay, a South Island Sale graduate bought for just \$7,000, can bounce back on Saturday, when she jumps from barrier 14 of 14 on the Hillside track.

"I'm hoping back on to a different track, with maybe more give in it, we'll see what happens - that's certainly her grade of race at the moment," Dwyer said.

Michelle Payne retains the ride, and Dwyer noted the mare is tricky to handle.

"She needs to be made to do it a bit. She's a recalcitrant mare," Dwyer added.

"By the same token, she doesn't like the whip. She's got to be kidded to a bit, but it's still got to be a strong ride."



Icehouse (NZ) (Swiss Ace)

Sharrock hot on Icehouse's prospects
New Plymouth trainer Allan Sharrock is

confident that **Icehouse (NZ)** (Swiss Ace) will go close to winning on her home track on Saturday.

"She's a good mare and I think she'll be a big chance," he said.

The five-year-old has been patiently handled by Sharrock and she will make just the sixth appearance of her career in the New Zealand Bloodstock Insurance Pearl Series Race.

Boxing Day blow for Manawatu

The annual Boxing Day meeting at Awapuni has been moved to Otaki with the Manawatu course deemed to be unsafe for racing following a meeting there on Wednesday and a track inspection by the RACE group with the Racing Integrity Unit (RIU) and New Zealand Thoroughbred Racing (NZTR), as well as jockeys and trainers.

Expert advice was also provided by the experienced Australian track manager John Jeffs and Jim Murphy from Turftech. Jeffs has been a track manager at both Rosehill and Randwick and in Hong Kong.

Following the track inspection, RIU officials and the NZ Jockeys' Association still held concerns about racing at Awapuni on Boxing Day and the decision was made to transfer the meeting to Otaki.

"The Marton Cup meeting on January 7 won't be held at Awapuni either and there will be an announcement on that in the next couple of days," NZTR's general manager of racing and handicapping Matt Hall said.

In the meantime, NZTR will work with the RACE Group on a suitable programme of work to allow racing to return to Awapuni.

Remembering our Hall Of Fame Heroes

Brent Thomson- International Jockey Star

Brent Thomson showed remarkable maturity as leading apprentice of his time.

He won the 1976 Auckland Cup on Perhaps when only 17, and finished third on Kythera in the Melbourne Cup in the same year.

Brent moved to Colin Hayes' stable in Australia and, over the next eight years, won just about every major Australian race, including four Cox Plates, except the Melbourne Cup.

Based in England for the next seven years

(and then in Hong Kong for four), Thomson wound up his international career the

winner of more than 3000 races, 53 of them at Group One level.
