lass was the word freely bandied around after **Savile Row (NZ)** (Makfi) beat his older opposition at Ellerslie yesterday.

The three-year-old was making a fresh start in Thursday's viva.co.nz 1200 and he returned in a blaze of glory, coming from off the pace to account for Cartell (NZ) (Colombia) and Latin Rose (NZ) (Mastercraftsman), with the latter coming off a runner-up finish in the Gr.3 Canterbury Breeders Stakes.

"We're getting him ready for the Group One at Wellington so he needed a good hit-out," said Mike Moroney, who prepares the son of Makfi with Pam Gerard.

"We weren't quite sure what to expect, but he's got class. He's quite casual on the track and he obviously saves it for race day."

Runner-up in the Gr.1 New Zealand 2000 Guineas, Savile Row has the Gr.1 Randwick Meats Levin Classic at Trentham on January 14 on his immediate programme.

Jockey Michael Coleman has now ridden Savile Row in both his career victories, having partnered him to a debut victory at Te Awamutu last season.

Coleman was also pleasantly taken aback by the colt's latest winning effort.

"He surprised me - I thought he might have been a bit outpaced over 1200 metres on a good track, but he's got class," he said.

"When the pace went on from the half mile it helped us and as soon as I got him to the outside I knew he was home."

awi's (NZ) (Savabeel) upcoming domestic summer campaign will revolve around a pair of Group One assignments before trainer Allan Sharrock looks further afield.

The six-year-old gelding will reappear in the NRM Sprint on February 11 with the Haunui Farm Weight-For-Age Classic to follow a fortnight later.

"He's in the paddock at the moment and he looks terrific," New Plymouth trainer Allan Sharrock said.

"He'll be ready to run fresh-up at Te Rapa and then he'll go to Otaki. We'll be looking to Brisbane with him now we know he's a relaxed traveller."

He was referring to Kawi's trip to Western Australia where he picked up \$A62,500 with fourth placings in the Gr.1 Kingston Town Classic and the Gr.2 Lee Steere Stakes and a

sixth in the Gr.1 Railway Stakes.

Sharrock was delighted with how Kawi coped with the long haul to Perth, but a little disappointed the six-year-old didn't finish closer in the Kingston Town.

"We copped it on the chin and we'll go again," he said.

The New Plymouth horseman is also excited about the prospects next year of the Darci Brahma mare Whispering (NZ), who is unbeaten in her last four starts.

"She'll run at the Marton meeting on January 7 and then back up at New Plymouth. After that I'll be working on bigger plans for her," Sharrock said.

"She's a quality mare who can run some phenomenal sectionals. She's just needed time and she's doing a fine job now."

Cylinder Beach to end summer on a high

Cylinder Beach (NZ) (Showcasing) has lived up to predictions that he would be a major player in the Brisbane summer but trainer Desleigh Forster believes the best is yet to come.

The Brisbane summer carnival ends on Saturday at Eagle Farm before action moves to the Gold Coast and the four-year-olds will again be centre stage.

Cylinder Beach will line up in the Listed Bernborough Stakes (1600m) where he will be seeking revenge for an unlucky last-start second in the Brisbane Handicap.

Forster said Cylinder Beach was likely to go for a spell after Saturday with no suitable races left for the son of Showcasing.

Forster believes there will be bigger things ahead for Cylinder Beach with the Sydney Autumn Carnival and the Brisbane Winter Carnival both possibilities.

"There are some races in Sydney which would suit around the 1600 metre range. Of course the Stradbroke Handicap here is in the back of my mind."

Injury-plagued mare's return imminent

Reminisce (NZ) (Roc de Cambes) has stretched the patience of her connections, but they are confident the lengthy wait will prove worthwhile.

Bred and raced by The Oaks Stud, the four-year-old hasn't raced since her juvenile season when she won twice for trainers Graeme and Debbie Rogerson and finished third in the Gr.1 Manawatu Sires' Produce Stakes.

"She went out after the Sires' Produce and when she came back for the spring she fractured her cannon bone and we got everything right with that before she got a stress fracture of her tibia," said Rick Williams, racing manager for the Cambridge farm's owner Dick Karreman. Full story here.

Lowry gets his favourite home again

It's easy to understand why the gallant eight-year-old **Tommy Tucker (NZ) (**Gallant Guru) is Jacob Lowry's pet horse.

They again successfully combined to defend their Listed The Craigmore Timaru Cup title at the Phar Lap Raceway on Wednesday with a typically spirited display.

Under topweight of 60kg, the tough as teak Tommy Tucker answered every call of his 18-year-old rider to get in the deciding stride and pip the front-runner Pepper Mill (NZ) (Patapan), who was in receipt of six kilos.

"He's been my favourite for some time - he might not be a top-liner, but he's not

Debutant impresses at Ellerslie

Fast And Furious (NZ) (Swiss Ace) justified his reputation and tote support when he won on debut at Ellerslie yesterday.

Successful in both of his lead-up trials, the son of Swiss Ace overcame an early buffeting to lengthen his stride along the fence for a comfortable victory.

"He's a really good colt and he showed that at the trials," trainer Tony Pike said. "He's more of a sprinter-miler and we're probably running out of options until the autumn, but we'll see if there's a three-year-old race for him somewhere."

Smart ride gets colt comfortably home

An aggressive ride from Opie Bosson brought out the best in the highly-regarded **Mongolian Legend** (Fastnet Rock) at Fllerslie.

The top jockey headed straight to the front from a potentially tricky barrier and the heavily-backed Fastnet Rock colt was untroubled to win in his second race day appearance.

"We were confident, but the draw was a little bit awkward," said Andrew Forsman, who trains in partnership with Murray Baker. "He's got a lot of scope and he'll only get better with more racing."

A son of the Group Three-winning mare Purde (NZ) (Bahhare), Mongolian Legend is raced by Mr Lang Lin of the Inner Mongolia Rider Horse Group and is currently rated a \$26 chance in the Gr.1 Vodafone New Zealand Derby in March.

Pike on Million watch with colt

Tony Pike will bide his time about a decision on another start for his Karaka Million-bound youngster **Felton Road (NZ)** (Pins).

The Cambridge trainer produced the two-year-old to win the Timeout 1200 at Ellerslie yesterday and, in his first attempt, the colt banked \$5,900 to sneak into the top 20 in order of entry for the country's richest juvenile event.

"We rolled the dice here with the Karaka Million coming around quickly and we weren't sure whether he could win from a wide gate," Pike said.

"We'll see how he pulls up and then have a look at the order to see if he needs to run again, there's a few options around."

Well-related filly impressing trainer

Chris Waller has no doubt that **Axiomatic** (O'Reilly) has inherited her family ability.

The Rosehill trainer has produced the half-sister by O'Reilly to Group One winner Xtravagant (NZ) (Pentire) and the multiple Group One placegetter He's Remarkable (NZ) (Pentire) to win two of her four starts.

Axiomatic recorded her latest success at Warwick Farm on Wednesday when she finished strongly from back in the field.

"The last 100 metres certainly showed her class," Waller said. "I think she's got the makings of a really nice middle-distance horse. She's got a lovely long, loping action, gets her head down low and I think that will see her stretch out to 2000 metres.

"He's (Xtravagant) obviously the pin-up boy from New Zealand at the moment and I think she's well on the way to doing some of those things herself."



Nucleonic (NZ) (Burgundy)

2YO delivers extra special result

David Ellis celebrated one of his most satisfying wins when **Nucleonic (NZ)** (Burgundy) posted an impressive debut victory at New Plymouth.

The Te Akau principal got a special kick out of the filly's success on Tuesday as he co-bred the two-year-old with Nearco Stud's Greg Tomlinson, who also remains in the ownership along with friends David and Matt Peacocke.

Ellis gained further enjoyment as Nucleonic is a daughter of the Group winner Burgundy, who he purchased as a yearling at Karaka in 2010 for \$1.3 million. Full story here.

Ellerslie outing for stablemates

Group One winners **Xtravagant (NZ)** (Pentire) and **Heroic Valour** (Fastnet Rock) enjoyed a spin around Ellerslie on Thursday to further their summer preparations.

The Stephen Autridge and Jamie Richardstrained stablemates worked over 1000 metres coming home their last 600 in 33.27.

Stable jockey Opie Bosson was aboard Xtravagant while Michael McNab rode Heroic Valour.

"We haven't been able to fault Xtravagant at home and he'll trial at Cambridge on January 10 and then go to the Telegraph," Richards said.

"Heroic Valour will run here (Ellerslie) on January 14 ahead of the Karaka Mile and he's in really good form as well."

Zabeel win timely

Consensus' (NZ) (Postponed) victory in the Gr.1 Zabeel Classic at Ellerslie provided a timely boost for her younger sibling.

Haunui Farm will offer a sister (Lot 1223) to the Postponed mare during the Festival Sale at Karaka next year.

Meanwhile, trainer Stephen McKee said the Gr.1 Herbie Dyke Stakes at Te Rapa on February 11 was now a logical target for Consensus.

HK results making good reading

Recent results from Hong Kong augur well for a Darci Brahma colt in The Oaks Stud's Premier Sale draft at Karaka next year.

The youngster (Lot 338) is out of the Group Three-winning Pins mare Pins 'N' Needles (NZ) and he is a brother to the rising star **D B Pin (NZ)**, who is unbeaten in his last three starts for trainer John Size.

"He was a beautiful horse and in a year when the Darci Brahmas didn't sell that well he still made \$200,000," The Oaks Stud's Rick Williams said.

"He looks to be the real deal and his younger brother isn't quite as big as D B Pin was at the same stage, but he's still a lovely horse."

Victory eases sale disappointment

A sale ring blow turned to a Boxing Day celebration for Little Avondale Stud and Awapuni horseman Stephen Mercer.

Together, they bred **Fibonacci (NZ)** (Per Incanto) who was all set to bring them a massive payday in Australia last year

before a scoping problem resulted in them bringing him home.

At his fourth race day appearance on Monday, the Mercer-trained three-year-old opened his winning account for them at Otaki.

"Stephen owned the mare Da Vinci Code and we went 50/50," Little Avondale's Sam Williams said. "The first foal by Per Incanto was one of four I took to the Sydney Classic Sale and she made \$A90,000 and Per Incanto was the second leading sire there.

Two Group One assignments await **Lincoln Blue (NZ)** (Savabeel) in the New Year.

The well-related colt has returned from a break following successive victories in the Gr.3 Wellington Stakes at Otaki and in the Listed 3YO Salver at Ellerslie.

"He's had 10 days off and we'll be getting him ready for the Levin Classic," Awapuni trainer Lisa Latta said.

"He doesn't need to do too much racing – that's why we took the softer option with him last time out to give him a run around Ellerslie. We'll probably look at the Waikato Guineas before the Derby." Full story here.

Improving filly **Storytime (NZ)** (Savabeel) is likely to make a return trip to Auckland next month.

The three-year-old finished runner-up to the unbeaten Volpe Veloce (Foxwedge) in the Gr.2 Eight Carat Classic in her first Ellerslie appearance on Boxing Day.

"She went a lovely race and she handled the track well so we'll have no fears about going back," said Evan Rayner, who prepares the filly with his daughter J. J.

"She's eligible for the Karaka 3YO Mile and that's worth \$250,000. We'll probably give her a freshen-up for that and her main aim is the Oaks."

Trainer confident best yet to come from 4YO

Nigel Tiley believes **The Justice League (NZ)** (I Am Invincible) can realise his full potential this preparation.

The Pukekohe trainer produced the fouryear-old to knock out his Boxing Day rivals at Ellerslie and he now has his sights firmly set on a Trentham feature.

"I've got him in the Thorndon at Wellington, we're going to have a crack at some decent races with him," Tiley said.

"I've always thought that he was a very good horse."

The Justice League won the Gr.2 Wellington Guineas at Trentham last season before he crossed the Tasman to join Darren Weir's stable. However, he failed to fire in two starts, both at Caulfield. Full story here.

Double strike for siblings

The Steven Ramsay and Julia Ritchietrained siblings **Sopraffina (NZ)** (High Chaparral) and **Moral Code (NZ)** (Makfi) added to their family record with victories at New Plymouth on Tuesday.

The pair are raced by Sir Peter Vela with the former a half-sister by High Chaparral to the Gr.3 Ethereal Stakes winner and Gr.1 VRC Oaks placegetter Eleonora (NZ) (Makfi) while Moral Code is a full-sister.

"It's a good staying family. Sopraffina is nominated for the Wellington Cup and the further she goes the better," Ramsay said.

Sopraffina has now won three of her nine starts while Moral Code broke his maiden at his third appearance.

Top result for stud

Cambridge Stud's first season sires combined to quinella the juvenile event at New Plymouth on Wednesday.

Burgundy's daughter **Nucleonic (NZ)** made the perfect debut with a front-running victory over 1000 metres for the stallion's third winner from as many runners.

Runner-up was another first-timer Mighty Power (NZ), a son of Power, whose brother (Lot 1032) will be offered at Karaka next year.

"She's not very big, but she is very strong," said Jamie Richards, who trains Nucleonic with Stephen Autridge. "Hopefully, she'll be a Matamata Breeders' Stakes type of filly."

Forced break for Hasselhoof

The summer campaign of the stakes winner **Hasselhoof (NZ)** (Tavistock) is over.

The son of Tavistock finished seventh in the Gr.1 Zabeel Classic at Ellerslie on Monday and a subsequent veterinary examination revealed the gelding had bled. Trained at Ruakaka by Donna Logan and Chris Gibbs, Hasselhoof has won six of his 13 starts including the Gr.2 Rich Hill Mile.

A filly from the last crop of champion sire O'Reilly attracted plenty of attention in the most recent gavelhouse.com New Zealand auction.

She and the Brighthill Farm O'Reilly colt at Lot 1 who fetched \$5,250 were bought by local buyers with Palmerston North-based Daniel Parry securing the filly.

Remembering our Hall Of Fame Heroes

Mainbrace- the chestnut thunderbolt whose career was short but outstanding. By a young sire named Admiral's Luck,

who sadly died after only four seasons at stud, from Maneroo, Mainbrace was raced in partnership by his dam's owner, Dr Thomas Fraser, and Bob Nolan at the end of the 1940s.

Beaten in his debut, Mainbrace won his next six starts as a two-year-old. Not fully wound up for his three-year-old debut, Mainbrace was beaten by The Unicorn in a sprint at Avondale before turning the tables in the Avondale Guineas.

Mainbrace won his next 15 starts as a threeyear-old, all the classics included (except the New Zealand Derby at Riccarton which, in his absence, The Unicorn won), and his first two starts as a four-year-old.

Then, with a winning sequence of 17 and the Desert Gold-Gloaming record at his mercy, he became so cramped and awkward in his action he had to be retired. Only after his death, following a pretty neglected stud career, did an autopsy reveal the all but

blocked hind-leg artery which had restricted the flow of blood.
