KARAKA-BASED VENDORS DOMINATE FIRST DAY OF BOOK 2

araka-based vendors vied for the top spot on the first day of selling at Book 2 of the National Yearling Sales Series, with Westbury Stud and Haunui Farm providing the four top lots.

The Reliable Man colt, out of Elusive Quality mare Quality Dream, went through the ring as Lot 872 in Westbury Stud's draft and set the benchmark at \$270,000.

He is set to return to New Zealand Bloodstock's Ready to Run Sale in November after being knocked down to the bid of former Melbourne Cup-winning trainer Brian Jenkins.

"He's for myself and a partner," Jenkins said. "He will probably go through the breeze-ups, we bought him to trade."

The farm also sold the second-equal highest priced yearling with a son of first season sire Kermadec (Lot 755) who made \$160,000, joining the stables of purchaser and Awapuni-based trainer Lisa Latta.

Two of Haunui Farm's yearlings reached that same figure of \$160,000. Both yearlings were by Showcasing with a colt out of Party Lights (Lot 854) secured by Queensland trainer Liam Birchley, and a colt out of Saheel (Lot 892) going to the bid of Hong Kong-based Upper Bloodstock.

A pleased Birchley commented about his purchase saying "I've had a couple of Showcasings – one won the Karaka Million a few years ago, and this colt is along the same lines as him."

As trading closed today (Thursday), Westbury Stud topped the leading vendor by average table with six lots sold for an average of \$87,917 and Haunui Farm have come out on top as the leading vendor by aggregate trading \$682,000 for 11 yearlings.

Little Avondale Stud, who sold a Per Incanto colt (Lot 875) to Hiwi Lodge for \$150,000, are the second leading vendor by average with five lots sold averaging a price of \$85,500.

Per Incanto, who heads the stallion roster at Little Avondale Stud, is the leading sire by average (three or more sold) with six of his progeny selling at an average of \$77,500.

Westbury Stud's resident sire Reliable Man has sold

five lots at an average of \$68,300, while Haunui Farm's Showcasing has sold 11 lots at an average of \$54,773.

NZB's Managing Director Andrew Seabrook commented on the day's trading.

"There was good competition at the higher end of Book 2's catalogue, with Westbury, Haunui and Little Avondale all getting top honours in the statistics.

"We have two more days of selling yet to come and there are still plenty of opportunities for buyers, especially pinhookers looking for Ready to Run horses."

127 of the day's 202 catalogued lots sold for receipts of \$5,056,500. The average closed at \$39,815, the median \$30,000 and the clearance rate 70%.

The second and final day of Book 2 selling commences tomorrow (Friday) at 11am with Lot 901 to Lot 1076 going under the hammer.

SAVABEEL COLT SETS RECORD FOR WAIKATO STUD

breathless Mark Chittick was struggling to find the right words to describe his thoughts just moments after a youngster from resident sire **Savabeel** (Zabeel) smashed the auction ring record for a Waikato Stud yearling.

Lot 192, the Savabeel colt out of Pins mare Make A Wish, held the Karaka audience spellbound as a brief but fierce bidding war erupted soon after the flashy brown juvenile made his way into the auditorium.

An opening bid of \$800,000 drew an audible gasp before the big guns rolled up their sleeves and went to war. When the dust settled in was Te Akau supremo David Ellis who outlasted international Bloodstock agent Rob McAnulty to secure the colt for \$1.4 million. That result smashed the 2018 record achieved by Waikato Stud when their Savabeel ex Posy filly sold for \$875,000.

A visibly affected Chittick was trying hard to keep a lid on his emotions when questioned about the sale.

"Phew, where do we start," Chittick said.

"He is probably one of the most outstanding horses we have ever brought to the sales.

"The comments we were getting said he was the nicest horse that people had seen at the sale.

"We didn't have a reserve (price) as I knew he would sell well. He has exceeded expectations.

"There was massive competition from all the big players.

"Te Akau do a wonderful job, bought a beautiful horse and bought a horse off us last year that they won the Karaka Million with.

"They are flying with the Savabeels, like anybody is, who have got them.

"It is just a huge thrill for us, for Savabeel and for New Zealand."

Chittick's confidence in the selling potential of the colt was backed up by the pre-auction inspections undertaken once he had arrived at the Karaka Complex.

"He's been out over 150 times, way over 150 times," he said. "He just has the best attitude and is so like his father.

"He will make us proud on the racetrack and when he goes and wins the Cox Plate for Te Akau, and New Zealand, we will be even more proud."

Ellis secured the colt as a foundation member of his 2019 Colts Breeding syndicate, a concept that has proven extremely successful for Te Akau over a number of years.

"I was hopeful I could buy him for a million dollars as he is probably the best athlete that I've seen at Karaka for ten years or more," Ellis said.

"He is an absolutely stunning horse and was on everyone's list, you didn't have to be a genius to work out that he was the most impressive athlete on the complex.

"We've done a stallion syndicate for the last few years and have seven stallions at stud here in New Zealand and Australia now. "We want to buy the best horses, as we are proud New Zealanders and we want to see the best horses that this great country breeds stay in New Zealand."

Ellis entered the bidding with an offer of \$1.2 million and admitted he was running on fumes at the conclusion of the action.

"I was on the ropes," he said.

"I might have had one more, but I just don't know.

"Everyone knows Te Akau has had huge success with the progeny of Savabeel and trained both of his Group One winning colts, Embellish and Hall Of Fame.

"We've won twelve group races with Savabeels in the last two seasons and he is a stallion that seems to suit the way we operate."

DE BURGH ENDS FOUR-DAY STINT WITH A BANG AT KARAKA

nternational Bloodstock Agent Hubie De Burgh kicked off the annual National Yearling Sale with a bang and he has ended his four-day visit to New Zealand on a similar note.

De Burgh outlaid \$500,000 for an I Am Invincible filly early on day one at Karaka and he matched that figure on day four when he purchased Lot 657, a Savabeel colt out of O'Reilly mare Cupid from the Waikato Stud draft.

The colt is a three-quarter brother to Waikato Stud's \$1.4 million saletopping Savabeel/Make A Wish colt, a fact that wasn't lost on De Burgh.

"He is closely related to the \$1.4million colt, who is a beautiful horse that we wanted to buy, but I didn't have that sort of cheque book," he said.

"If we were looking for a Cox Plate horse then I guess this guy (Lot 657) is what he is.

"He's a really athletic horse who is beautifully balanced and really walks – he just floats on air.

"He is by this great stallion, out of the great Savabeel/O'Reilly cross, and also has Pins in his next dam.

"When you package that up and he has also come from a great Stud who breeds so many group winners, you are reducing the level of risk."

As with the I Am Invincible filly, the colt is headed to Lindsay Park in Melbourne for Sheikh Hamdan Bin Rashid Al Maktoum and his Shadwell

Racing operation.

"We're done now, we've blown the chequebook," De Burgh said.

"We bought four for Sheikh Hamdan and tried to balance things up.

"The I Am Invincible filly should be an early two-year old with a lovely page (pedigree), where we gave what I thought was a fair price.

"I still go back and talk about the prizemoney you can win. It (the sale price) is a lot of money, so let's not be flippant about it, but if you have been lucky enough to buy a horse that can gallop then you can win that back.

"The problem is that you come here to this sale and when there is a nice horse, they don't hide. You can't just say I will wait as no-one else has seen it as they pick them out.

"It is the same in Europe and in Australia for the good horses. It is the same in property and art and in any commodity, the rules are the same."

De Burgh also purchased Lot 272, a Redoute's Choice filly from the Pencarrow Stud draft for \$200,000 along with Lot 275, an Iffraaj colt for \$360,000 from Haunui Farm for Sheikh Hamdan plus Lot 411, a Savabeel colt from Waikato Stud for \$150,000 for another client.

Lot 854 – Showcasing ex Party Lights colt

Showcasing colt provides good news for Haunui Farm team

Queensland trainer Liam Birchley guaranteed himself all the hospitality he could ask for after he won an intense bidding war to secure a flashy Showcasing colt from the draft of Karaka-based Stud, Haunui Farm.

Birchley outlaid \$160,000 for Lot 854, the colt from Elusive City mare, Party Lights, who hails from the family of multiple stakes winner Party Queen and speedy Gr.3 Concorde Handicap (1200m) winner, Shezhardtocatch.

For the staff at Haunui Farm it provided a lucrative windfall after Stud boss Mark Chitty had instructed that any sale proceeds from the colt would be distributed amongst all permanent staff employed at the operation.

"The benefit is for all my permanent staff," Chitty said.

"From the gardener to the farmer to all the horse staff who have been in employment with me for eighteen months or more.

"This was their incentive. We sex-tested the mare and we knew she was having a colt and it has gone from there.

"It is all shared amongst them with the only one not involved being the boss (me)." Full story here.

"Bargain buy" tops sale

Bloodstock agent James Bester and Aquis Farm teamed up to secure the top lot on the opening day of New Zealand Bloodstock's Book 1 Sale on Sunday - lot 67, a Redoute's Choice colt out of Group One-winning mare Griante.

The partnership went to \$800,000 to secure the colt out of Cambridge Stud's draft and were pushed all the way by Cambridge trainer Tony Pike.

Bester was pleased with his purchase and

thought it was a bargain buy for what he has judged as the best Redoute's Choice colt he has seen at any sale this year.

"I think this colt at the Gold Coast, judging by what the Redoute's Choice colts sold there, would have made well over A\$1 million," Bester said.

"In my view he was better than any colt I saw by Redoute's Choice at the Magic Millions, and we got him for NZ\$800,000, I consider that value. **Full story here.**

Sales success for Windsor Park debutant

As the dust settled at the completion of the Book 1 catalogue at the National Yearling Sale, the results for sales debutant stallion **Mongolian Khan** have brought a wide smile to the faces at his Windsor Park Stud base.

The three-time Group One winner and dual New Zealand Horse of the Year had eighteen of his 24 catalogued yearlings sell during the Book 1 session at an average price of \$107,778 off the back of his \$10,000 service fee.

Lot 296, a colt from Encosta de Lago mare Phocis, was knocked down to the \$200,000 bid of Chris Waller Racing while he had another ten individuals fetch \$100,000 or more. Full story here

Lot 577 – Frankel ex Assume filly Cambridge Stud set early pace on day four at Karaka

Amongst the high achievers from the vendor ranks over the first three days of the New Zealand Bloodstock National Yearling Sale, Brendan and Jo Lindsay's Cambridge Stud operation made the biggest splash in a buying role early on day four at Karaka.

Following a prolonged battle over several minutes it was Cambridge Stud who emerged victorious when Lot 577, a royallybred Frankel filly from the Pencarrow Stud draft was knocked down to their \$500,000 offer.

From Irish-bred Fastnet Rock mare Assume, the filly features numerous European stakes winners throughout her extended pedigree, a feature that Brendan Lindsay believed would see her amongst the more expensive offerings at the sale. Full story here

This time it was a member of the fairer sex who set the day's benchmark when Lot 388, the filly out of Galileo mare Scintillula, was knocked down to the \$800,000 bid of Bloodstock agent Dean Hawthorne on behalf of Jonathan Munz and his GSA Bloodstock operation.

Hawthorne beat out a host of challengers, including Te Akau Racing principal David Ellis, for the filly who traces back to an extended family chock full of European stakes performers and was on offer through Sir Peter Vela's Pencarrow Stud draft. <u>Full</u> story here.

International buyers to the fore at Karaka The variety and strength of the

international buying bench in attendance at the National Yearling Sale at Karaka this year was in evidence throughout the opening day of the Book 1 sale.

While Te Akau Racing boss David Ellis, the King of Karaka, lead the charge for the locals it was the internationals who took home the three top-priced lots from the boutique Sunday session.

Amongst those was Lot 90, a chestnut Zoustar filly from More Than Ready mare, Imanana, who fell to the \$600,000 bid of Godolphin Australia's Managing Director, Vin Cox.

Cox was fulsome in his praise for the filly who was offered out of the Cambridge Stud draft.

"She's by a superstar stallion in Zoustar, who couldn't be doing any better," he said. Full story here.



Hubie de Burgh Exchange rate plays in favour of international agent

Some quick mental arithmetic was enough to convince International Bloodstock Agent Hubie De Burgh to soldier on as he waged war in the auction ring during the early action on Day One at Karaka. De Burgh had his sights set on Lot 19, an I Am Invincible filly from the Little Avondale Stud draft. As the bidding built steadily from the \$80,000 opening offer for the elegant brown filly, he was confident he had the firepower to see off the immediate challenges.

A raid-fire burst of action that saw her purchase price race past the \$400,000 mark had De Burgh sweating as he approached the limit of his budget. A final bid of \$500,000 saw him sign for the filly on behalf of his client, Sheikh Hamdan Bin Rashid Al Maktoum and his Shadwell Racing operation. **Full story here.**

Locals strike early on day two at Karaka

A pair of local buyers raised the stakes early on day two of the National Yearling Sale at Karaka as they secured a trio of royally-bred youngsters.

Lot 121, a Savabeel filly from O'Reilly mare Kashmir brought plenty of attention during her time in the auction ring. When the dust settled it was Cambridge trainer Roger James who produced the winning bid as he secured the daughter of classy racemare Vedodara for \$400,000 from the Waikato Stud draft.

"I like a lot about the filly obviously," James said. "I have a long-standing client that wanted a Savabeel filly and I thought she was clearly the best of them.

"It is the sort of money we thought we would have to pay. I don't say it's good value, but hopefully in two years' time we are saying it's wonderful value. <u>Full story</u> here.

Jakkalbomb (NZ) (Jakkalberry)

Classic contender favoured at home

Three-year-old Jakkalberry filly Jakkalbomb (NZ) asserted herself as a Classic contender this season after her impressive runner-up performance behind Secret Allure (NZ) (Zacinto) in the Gr.3 Desert Gold Stakes (1600m) at Trentham on January 19.

The Janelle Millar-trained runner is being set for a tilt at the Gr.1 Al Basti Equiworld Dubai New Zealand Oaks (2400m) in March and will take her next step on that path when she competes in the Listed Fasttrack Insurance Oaks Prelude (1800m) at New Plymouth on Saturday.

"I was very happy with her (run at Trentham)," Millar said. "Apart from her just about falling at the start and running greenly at the end, she didn't get a great trip. She's improving every time and she's come on really well since then.

"She is just one of those horses that every time I throw something at her she takes it in and she improves on it." **Full story here.**

Wide draws frustrate Marsh ahead of Classic

Cambridge trainer Stephen Marsh is thrilled with his Gr.3 Woburn Farm Classic contenders **Scotch** (I Am Invincible) and **Chiaretta (NZ)** (Makfi) but less than pleased with their draws for Saturday's 1200m New Plymouth two-year-old feature.

Chiaretta drew barrier 10 of 11, while last-start course winner Scotch drew only marginally better in eight.

"The draws are horrible. I couldn't believe they both drew wide," Marsh said.

"Chiaretta will go back from out there and hopefully she can be hitting the line strongly but Scotch has more tactical speed and can take up a handy position, but the draw won't make that easy." Despite the awkward draws, TAB bookmakers have installed Scotch and Chiaretta as the third and fourth favourites for the Woburn Farm Classic at \$4.80 and \$6 respectively in a market headed by the Jamie Richards-trained debutante Folk Dress (Pierro) at \$4 and the Roger James-trained Hasstobegood (NZ) (Per Incanto) at \$4.50. Lanciato in tough Expressway test

Former New Zealand-trained galloper Lanciato (NZ) (Per Incanto) will face a stern test in Saturday's Gr.2 Expressway Sprint (1200m) at Rosehill.

Group One winners Trapeze Artist (Snitzel), Hartnell (Authorized), Le Romain (Hard Spun) and Alizee (Sepoy) are among the six-horse field.

Even though the numbers are small, Lanciato's trainer Mark Newnham admits it will still be tough for the dual stakes winner who is headed on a sprinting path this campaign.

His past two preparations have been geared towards 1600m-races but after his unplaced runs in the Epsom Handicap and Doncaster Mile, his trainer will keep him to slightly shorter races.

"I'm not sure he runs out a strong mile," Newnham said.

"The Expressway is the right race to start him off in but with horses like Trapeze Artist and Alizee in it, it certainly won't be easy.

"After the Expressway we will look at races like the Liverpool City Cup and the Canterbury Stakes."

The Gr.3 Liverpool City Cup on March 2 and Gr.1 Canterbury Stakes a week later are both over 1300m.

Lanciato finished third in a Warwick Farm barrier trial last week in preparation for his return.
