Multiple Group One winner Turn Me Loose will look to turn up the heat at Caulfield tomorrow

 ormer first-class leg spin bowler Murray Baker will attempt
a hat-trick of Group One wins on the racetrack this weekend.

Baker, who played 17 first-class games of cricket between 1966 and 1975, will produce **Turn Me Loose (NZ)** (Iffraaj) in Saturday's Gr.1 CF Orr Stakes (1400m) at Caulfield as well as **Saint Emilion (NZ)** (Mastercraftsman) and **Jon Snow (NZ)** (Iffraaj) in the Gr.1 Herbie Dyke Stakes (2000m) at Te Rapa and Luna Rossa (NZ) (Written Tycoon) and Saracino (NZ) (Per Incanto) in the Gr.1 NRM Sprint (1400m), also at Te Rapa.

Baker, who trains in partnership with Andrew Forsman at Cambridge, was upbeat about his prospects in all three races, especially with five-year-old Iffraaj entire Turn Me Loose, who

was fourth in last year's Orr Stakes resuming before he claimed his third Group One win in the Futurity Stakes (1400m) at Caulfield a fortnight later.

"He's got a good record at Caulfield and we're very happy with his work leading into this race," Baker said.

"The race the other day [Australian Stakes over 1200m] was too short for him. We knew that but we had to get a race into him to fit him for the 1400m this week. They equalled the track record at Moonee Valley that night and just went too fast for him.

"But at Caulfield they have to race uphill and it's a bit more of a test over 1400m. He won the Futurity there last year and we're happy with him. He'll run a good race."

Closer to home, Baker and Forsman have live chances in both weight-for-age features at Te Rapa with Jon Snow rated a \$6.80 fourth favourite for the Herbie Dyke and Saint Emilion at \$16 for the same race.

"Jon Snow has got to prove he can get the trip but he does tough it out to the line. He has been narrowly beaten in his last three races, not more than a length from the winner in any of them, and three-year-olds do have a good record in this race," Baker said.

"Saint Emilion has been freshened up since Auckland and we're happy with him. He really is a 2000m horse and he's proven at weight-for-age." In the NRM Sprint, the stable will saddle three-year-olds Saracino (\$9.50) and Luna Rossa (\$25), though Baker was hoping for easing of track conditions to fuel his confidence.

"We would have liked to have seen the rain that was forecast for Luna Rossa and Saracino - and for Jon Snow - but it didn't come. We just hope there's plenty of water going on," Baker said.

"Saracino is a good horse. His first-up run was a bit of a write-off but he's improved a ton. Luna Rossa just got outpaced at Wellington last time. They just ran that quick that she couldn't pick them up.

"She was 4 1/2 lengths from the winner in 11th place and she'll be better suited to the 1400m on Saturday."

Luna Rossa won the Gr.1 Manawatu Sires' Produce Stakes over 1400m at Awapuni last season, beating Saracino, who finished third.

Both ran well in Melbourne during the spring with Luna Rossa finishing a close second in the Gr.2 Tranquil Star Stakes (1400m) at Caulfield, while Saracino won the Gr.2 Danehill Stakes (1200m) at Flemington.

Baker and Forsman have several other runners at Te Rapa, including last-start Gr.3 Desert Gold Stakes winner Nicoletta (NZ) (Savabeel) and Desert Gold-placed Bonneval (NZ) (Makfi) in the Gr.2 Cambridge Stud Sir Tristram Fillies Classic (2000m).

COLGAN HOPING TO LOCK IN FEATURE WIN

innie Colgan is relishing his opportunity to get back aboard one of his Group One favourites -**Volkstok'n'barrell (NZ)** (Tavistock) - at Te Rapa tomorrow.

The six-time New Zealand Derby-winning jockey hasn't ridden Volkstok'n'barrell in New Zealand since his back-toback Group One double of the Haunui Farm WFA Classic (1600m) at Otaki and New Zealand Stakes (2000m) at Ellerslie last autumn.

"I'm happy to be back on the old fella," Colgan said.

"He's won some good races and it's worked out well with Matt Cameron happy to stick with Jon Snow for this race."

Saturday's race is the Gr.1 Herbie Dyke Stakes (2000m), for which Volkstok'n'barrell is the TAB's \$5.50 third favourite behind three-year-old Savile Row (NZ) (Makfi) at \$3.70 and Gr.1 Zabeel Classic winner Consensus (NZ) (Postponed) at \$4.50.

"The two three-year-olds [Savile Row and Jon Snow] will be tough to beat and Consensus is racing well but my horse is a good, fit horse and he'll run a strong race," Colgan said. "He can get off the bridle from the 600m to the 400 when they quicken but as long as you don't miss that, he'll get to the line strongly. If everything goes right to that point, he'll be dangerous up the straight."

Colgan could shoot for a Group One double later in the card when he rides Natuzzi (NZ) (Coats Choice) in the NRM Sprint (1400m).

He has ridden the eight-year-old in his past two starts - a win in the Gr.3 Concorde Handicap (1200m) at Ellerslie and fourth in the Gr.1 Railway Stakes (1200m) at the same track.

"His Concorde win was pretty good but he felt like he needed the Railway run. The step up to 1400m will really suit him. With the pace to suit, he's got a deadly finish. He's drawn two but I won't be pushing him too much early. I'll be keeping my hands down."

Natuzzi is on the seventh line of betting with TAB bookmakers at \$11 in a market headed by five-time Group One winner Kawi (NZ) (Savabeel) at \$3.90 and Railway winner Start Wondering (NZ) (Eighth Wonder) at \$5.

"With Saint Emilion, Authentic Paddy and Jon Snow in there, there should be a strong pace in the race and my bloke drawing three is ideal, especially over 2000m at Te Rapa.

"We'll jump and hold our ground for half a furlong to hold a position but that's a lot better than having to race three wide and try and get in."

Colgan has ridden the five-yearold gelding on four occasions and that inside knowledge of the horse could prove the difference between winning and defeat.

"Everything has to go right for him. He can be a bit flat-footed going for home so you have to be ready for that," Colgan said.

Ecuador (NZ) (High Chaparral) In-form team faces stiff test in CF Orr Stakes

The flourishing partnership between jockey Adam Hyeronimus and smart galloper **Ecuador (NZ)** (High Chaparral) will face its toughest test in Saturday's Gr.1 CF Orr Stakes (1400m) at Caulfield.

Hyeronimus and Ecuador have combined seven times for five wins but the pair have teamed up in terrific fashion in recent months with their reunion yielding four wins from five attempts.

Ecuador will return to Group One racing for the first time since he failed in last year's Doncaster Mile when he steps out in the A\$400,000 feature.

"He's racing in career-best form. He has probably beaten mediocre fields but has beaten them with big weights and done it quite convincingly," Hyeronimus said.

"I know he's seven but at the same time, even at trackwork, he knows how to look after himself and I just try to do the right things to keep him happy," Hyeronimus said.

"I ride him how he comes to me and not push him or pull him to do things he's not meant to do and just ride the race as it comes and it has worked out perfectly in recent times."

"At the end of the day, I've drawn an awkward alley but I'll just ride how the race comes to me and make my decision from there," Hyeronimus said.

Matamata jockey on a stakes roll

Michael Coleman has an enviable black type strike rate this season.

While he may not feature in the top 10 in the jockeys' premiership, as far as feature events go he's riding high.

Almost a quarter of Coleman's 30 wins this term have come in stakes races with the chance of further success at Te Rapa tomorrow.

"I've been getting support from Murray Baker and Andrew Forsman and Stephen Marsh and it's a big help to have their

backing," Coleman said.

His mounts at Te Rapa include **Savile Row** (NZ) (Makfi) in the Gr.1 Herbie Dyke Stakes, **Perfect Fit (NZ)** (Elusive City) in the Gr.1 NRM Sprint and **Nicoletta (NZ)** (Savabeel) in the Gr.2 Cambridge Stud Sir Tristram Fillies' Classic. **Full story here.**

Practice hopefully makes perfect for Ronchi

Ronchi (NZ) (Stravinsky) performed well in his Te Rapa dress rehearsal ahead of a step up to the main stage in Hamilton tomorrow.

The capable four-year-old will make his second bid for Group One honours in the Herbie Dyke Stakes after he was unplaced in the weight-for-age event last season.

Shillelagh to debut for star stable

Former New Zealand galloper **Shillelagh** (NZ) (Savabeel) will make her debut for the Chris Waller stable in Saturday's Gr.3 Triscay Stakes (1200m) at Randwick.

Owned by Christopher and Susanna Grace, Shillelagh was a winner of four races in New Zealand for Stephen Autridge and Jamie Richards before a Melbourne campaign late last year which resulted in a win at Caulfield and a second in the Gr.3 Hong Kong Jockey Club Stakes at Flemington.

Shillelagh has drawn wide in the A\$150,000 race and will be partnered by Brenton Avdulla in a field which is headed by the Ron Quinton-trained Dixie Blossoms (Street Sense).

Walker confirmed for Kawi

Michael Walker has got the nod to continue his association with **Kawi (NZ)** (Savabeel) in Saturday's Gr.1 NRM Sprint at Te Rapa.

"It was a hard one and it was discussed by the syndicate – Leith (Innes) has got a good record on the horse, but Michael has the knack of settling him in his races," trainer Allan Sharrock said.

Walker rode Kawi during the Savabeel gelding's three-start campaign last year in Perth, after which Kawi was given a break and Sharrock is happy with the six-yearold's recent progress.

"He's had two jump-outs and a trial," Sharrock said. "He's still quite big, but he'll be hard to beat."

"He'll run at Te Rapa and then in the weight-for-age mile at Otaki and then we come to the fork in the road – there's the New Zealand Stakes at Ellerslie or we could be looking at Sydney or Brisbane."



I Am A Star (NZ) (I Am Invincible)

Trainer content with I Am A Star's trial

Group One winner **I Am A Star (NZ)** (I Am Invincible) was given a soft barrier trial at Cranbourne on Tuesday which her trainer says is all she needs ahead of her first-up run at Caulfield.

The Shane Nichols-trained filly finished fourth of five runners in an 800m-heat on and showed she is ready for her first-up tilt at the Rubiton Stakes tomorrow.

"Even though she is fresh, she is compliant in that measure and she's pulled up beautiful," Nichols said.

Nichols said the trip from his Mornington base to Cranbourne was about getting I Am A Star's game face back on.

"It was about leaving the gates, travel clean and to make sure everything is right for starting her prep," he said.

"We've got a long prep ahead of us, whether that's in Melbourne or Sydney.

After Saturday, I Am A Star will progress to the Angus Armanasco Stakes at Caulfield on February 25.

Stablemates to take on Australia's best racehorse in Apollo

Preferment (NZ) (Zabeel) and **Sacred Master (NZ)** (Mastercraftsman) have a tough challenge ahead of them as they tackle stablemate Winx (Street Cry) in Saturday's Gr.2 Apollo Stakes (1400m) at Randwick.

Chris Waller will saddle five runners in the A\$250,000 race, including Winx who has not raced since winning last year's Cox Plate and is looking to stretch her winning streak to 14.

Both horses will be resuming after being turned out following unplaced runs in the 2016 Gr.1 Caulfield Cup. Preferment has drawn barrier eight and will be ridden by Jason Collett, with Sacred Master and Glyn Schofield allocated gate five.

Leebaz (NZ) (Zabeel) rounds out the New Zealand bred contenders with the Hawkes Racing galloper to be partnered by Tommy Berry from gate 11.



Gauguin (NZ) (Dalghar)

High hopes for Gauguin

The highly regarded **Gauguin (NZ)** (Dalghar) is one of three New Zealand bred runners to contest Saturday's Gr.3 Spring Stakes at Randwick.

The James Cummings-trained three-yearold just missed at Warwick Farm on debut before going one better at his next start on January 18. Glyn Schofield will again pick up the ride and the pair will jump from barrier five.

The Mark Newnham-trained **Righteous Mate (NZ)** (Savabeel) is resuming after being placed in a recent Rosehill trial and was stakes placed in his last start.

Meanwhile John Thompson's **The Grandson (NZ)** (Savabeel) is looking to capitalise on a strong run of form when stepping up in class. To be ridden by Jason Collett, The Grandson has won his last two starts and has only run out of the money once in his four career starts.

Humidor well supported in Group Three

Australian cup hope **Humidor (NZ)** (Teofilo) will contest the Gr.3 TS Carlyon Cup (1600m) at Caulfield tomorrow.

Damian Lane rides the progressive Darren Weir-trained four-year-old who will be second-up following the galloper's close fourth when under a length off the winner in the Listed Barton Stakes (1400m) at the track on January 26.

He gets the weight advantage in this week's Group 3 coming back from 59.5kg to 57kg.



Alaskan Rose (NZ) (Encosta De Lago) Class mare makes return

Mike Moroney's four-year-old mare Alaskan Rose (NZ) (Encosta De Lago) is set to resume in Saturday's Gr.3 Bellmaine Stakes (1200m) at Caulfield.

Not seen since November last year, Alaskan Rose is being readied to contest some of the top mares races in Sydney over the autumn.

Regular rider Patrick Moloney will partner the Westbury Stud graduate who was purchased for \$150,000 from the 2014 NZB Premier Sale.

Navagio out to build on record

Colin Little's last start winner **Navagio** (**NZ**) (Zacinto) will take on a thirteen-strong field in tomorrow's Gr.3 Kevin Hayes Stakes (1200m) at Caulfield.

Navagio impressed in her January win at Flemington where she beat fellow Kevin



Hayes Stakes contender Jennifer Lynn (High Chaparral).

Michael Dee will continue his association with the promising three-year-old filly who has won twice from five starts, both times when guided by the New Zealand born rider.

Navagio, a daughter of promising young sire Zacinto, was purchased by Colin Little for \$40,000 from the Inglewood Stud draft at the 2015 New Zealand Bloodstock Select Yearling Sale.



Soldier Field (NZ) (Rip Van Winkle)

Highly-regarded 3YO in Group One contention

Derby options for **Soldier Field (NZ)** (Rip Van Winkle) will become clearer after his next couple of starts.

The promising three-year-old is considered a genuine staying prospect by his trainer and part-owner Finbarr Leahy, who will head south with the Rip Van Winkle gelding for today's Taranaki meeting.

Soldier Field will step out in the Pukekura Motor Lodge Maiden, in which he will be ridden by Samantha Collett.

Group One candidate **Leading Role** (NZ) (Darci Brahma) did his Vodafone New Zealand Derby hopes no harm with his last-start effort against the older horses at Tauherenikau.

The three-year-old finished fifth under Chris Johnson in the Wairarapa Cup behind the stakes winner All In Vogue (NZ) (Pins).

"I was very, very happy with his run," trainer Gary Vile said. "He was beaten by some good, tough stayers and Chris was rapt and said he really put in the last bit."

Johnson is booked for the Derby ride, but commitments at Ascot Park on Saturday week will see him miss the ride on Leading Role in the Gr.2 Retina Specialists Avondale Guineas.

"It's the Southland Guineas and the Invercargill Gold Cup and Chris has got a full book there," Vile said. "That's fair enough, we don't expect him to go north for one ride."

Sir Tristram's arrival in New Zealand in 1975 wasn't greeted with the enthusiasm Sir Patrick Hogan had hoped for as despite impeccable bloodlines, his conformation was far from perfect.

Shareholders in the horse were quick to let Hogan know exactly what they thought and had he listened we may never have seen the phenomenal successes that the horse

High-profile three-year-old Hall Of Fame (NZ) (Savabeel) is out of classic contention.
