JOCKEY INDEBTED TO FELLOW RIDER FOR GROUP ONE CHANCE

amantha Wynne will have a fellow jockey to thank if she strikes the jackpot at Hastings on Saturday.

She has picked up the ride on Kevin Myers' **Scapolo**(NZ) (Bachelor Duke) in the Gr.1 Haunui Farm WFA Classic (1600m), courtesy of the trainer's niece Rosie Myers who will be aboard race rival Beefeater (NZ) (Alamosa).

"I was speaking to Rosie earlier this week and she told me to ring Kevin, but I couldn't get him and then she let me know later that night that I had the ride," Wynne said.

"I'm very excited and I know the horse so that takes a lot of worry out of it. The beauty of him is that regardless of the conditions he can win, he's very versatile.

"He's got a good chance at weight-for-age, he's used to carrying huge weights."

The Irish-born Wynne has ridden Scapolo on four previous occasions for two open handicap wins and a couple of minor placings.

"I usually help out Kevin when he comes down to the South Island and I've ridden Scapolo a fair bit in trackwork over the years," she said.

"It's a great opportunity and Kevin has been very good to me since I started riding here."

In the meantime, Wynne has six rides at Riccarton today and said Opihi Jade (NZ) (Cecconi) (Hororata Racing Supporters 2000m) and Mahana (NZ) (No Excuse Needed) (New Zealand Bloodstock Insurance Pearl Series Race) were two of her best.

"Opihi Jade looks well enough in and it's not a strong field and I don't mind Mahana's chances. She's been going okay and she should really enjoy the track conditions."

TE AKAU SHOOTING FOR SUCCESSIVE BREEDERS' STAKES

e Akau Racing trainers Stephen Autridge and Jamie Richards believe they have valid claims to win their second successive Gr.2 J Swap Contractors Matamata Breeders' Stakes (1200m) on their home track on Saturday.

The training duo produced Gold Fever (NZ) (Savabeel) to win last year's two-year-old fillies' feature under stable rider Opie Bosson and earlier this week got talking about how Savabeel filly **The Real Beel (NZ)** measured up for this year's event.

"I asked Stephen the other day how he reckoned this filly compared to Gold Fever and he said not quite as strong, but certainly with as much ability," Richards said. "She's won well on debut and then had things go against her in the Karaka Million last time. She jumped a shade slow and had to use a lot of petrol to get there.

"The way she goes about her races means she'll be somewhere near them in running and she's an improving filly and working well.

"She might have to do a bit of work to get in from barrier eight but that's where you put your faith in Opie to slot her in somewhere. We expect her to run well."

TAB bookmakers opened The Real Beel at \$11.50, but early money has seen her shorten into \$9 in a market headed by

She's A Thief (NZ) (Showcasing) at \$3, Spanish Whisper (Lope de Vega) at \$3.30 and Platinum Mam'selle (NZ) (Perfectly Ready) at \$6.80.

According to markets, Te Akau Racing has a stronger hand in the Gr.3 Reid & Harrison Slipper (1200m) for two-year-old colts and geldings, with **Sword Of Osman (NZ)** (Savabeel) a \$2.90 favourite and **Handsome Rebel** (Denman) an \$8.20 fifth favourite.

"Opie had the choice and chose Sword Of Osman and that's probably the way we expected him to go. He's drawn three which is ideal. He can jump and be in the first four or five," Richards said.

"His work has been good and back left-handed is a big help."

Sword Of Osman was an impressive three-length debut winner at Awapuni in December, beating Platinum Mam'selle, before finishing eighth in the Karaka Million (1200m) at Ellerslie last month.

"Bocce is the horse to beat. He was very good in the Karaka Million and our two would have to be at their absolute best to beat him," Richards said.

"Handsome Rebel isn't far off Sword Of Osman and he continues to come to hand well. We've put the visor blinkers on to sharpen him up and Danielle [Johnson, jockey] knows the horse, having ridden him at the trials."

Rounding out the Te Akau runners in stakes company on

Saturday is Savabeel five-year-old **Splurge (NZ)** (Savabeel), who contests the Gr.1 Haunui Farm WFA Group One Classic (1600m) at Hastings.

He defeated race rival Scapolo (NZ) (Bachelor Duke) in the Gr.2 Manawatu Challenge Stakes (1400m) in December before finishing eighth in the Gr.1 Thorndon Mile at Trentham last start.

"You've almost got to put a line through the Thorndon run because he got cluttered up on the fence and didn't really get a crack at them. He's a horse who's best in open space and rolling," Richards said.

"He's been purposefully targeted at this race. We had talked about stepping him up to 2000m [in this month's Gr.1 Herbie Dyke Stakes at Te Rapa] but we got together with Opie and decided that he would be better served at 1600m in this race.

"He's well and he'll be hitting the line strongly. He's drawn out a bit but that will mean he can make his run when we want rather than being boxed up and waiting for gaps to open."

Michael McNab rides Splurge, an equal \$11 fourth favourite with Consensus (NZ) (Postponed) for the weightfor-age feature behind Bonneval (NZ) (Makfi) at \$3.50, Start Wondering (NZ) (Eighth Wonder) at \$4.50 and Devise (NZ) (Darci Brahma) at \$6.

Mighty Boss (Not A Single Doubt)

Mighty Boss to take on older horses again

Caulfield Guineas-winning colt Mighty Boss (Not A Single Doubt) has taken no harm from his luckless Gr.1 C.F. Orr Stakes (1400m) run and is flying ahead of the Gr.1 Futurity Stakes (1400m).

Trainer Mick Price opted to work Mighty Boss on the Polytrack at Caulfield on Tuesday morning and he was delighted with how the colt had come through the Orr Stakes.

"I wasn't going to run him if he was a bit jaded but he's a tough colt and he can run for sure," Price said. "He'll be in the money on Saturday."

Price also has Mighty Boss in line to back up seven days after the Futurity in the Gr.1 Australian Guineas (1600m) at Flemington against his own age.

"Although if he doesn't have a good week, the Randwick Guineas is the week later," he said.



Pingwu Spark (NZ) (Mastercraftsman)

Leung eager for Spark in Queen's Silver **Jubilee Cup**

Jockey Derek Leung is hopeful that giant grey Pingwu Spark (NZ) (Mastercraftsman) can graduate to Group One company when he faces his first true heavyweight test in Sunday's Queen's Silver Jubilee Cup (1400m) at Sha Tin.

"He's very honest and he's had a fantastic season," Leung said.

"He's just kept improving and now he's earned his chance at a Group One. It's a big gap and he has to prove himself, but he's a horse with potential."

For 29-year-old Leung it has been Pingwu Spark's versatility this season that has allowed him to progress to Group company. He said that it has been most clear at his last two starts, when he has carried big weights to victory in Class 2 handicaps over 1400m.

"He can challenge from the front, he can chase from behind, he's got plenty of fight and will fight back, but he can also sprint. That's where he has improved and that's something very important for a horse when they are meeting the best horses around," Leung said.



Bonneval (NZ) (Makfi)

Rethink puts NZ Group Ones on Bonneval's programme

A change of plans will see New Zealand's top mare Bonneval (NZ) (Makfi) make two domestic appearances before her Sydney autumn campaign.

The high-class daughter of Makfi was originally to have headed straight to Australia to resume in Saturday week's Gr.1 Chipping Norton Stakes (1600m).

The Randwick mile will also mark the reappearance of Winx (Street Cry), but Bonneval's connections said her presence didn't influence their programming.

"No, not at all. It's more of a matter of getting the groundwork into her with what's to come later on," said Andrew Forsman, who trains with Murray Baker.

Bonneval will instead run in the Gr.1 Haunui Farm WFA Classic (1600m) at Hawke's Bay this Saturday with the Gr.1 Bonecrusher New Zealand Stakes (2000m) to follow a fortnight later. Full story here

Brisbane beckons Awapuni stablemates Beefeater (NZ) (Alamosa) and Lubaya (NZ) (Rip Van Winkle) have been short listed for the Queensland winter carnival.

Trainer Roydon Bergerson is keen on a trip to Brisbane and plans will firm up if the pair run up to expectations in their next few appearances.

Last-start Gr.3 Taranaki Cup (1800m) winner Beefeater will have the first opportunity to bank travel expenses when he steps up to Group One company for the first time in Saturday's Haunui Farm WFA Classic (1600m) at Hawke's Bay. Full story



Luvaluva (NZ) (Mastercraftsman)

Luvaluva to start Oaks bid in Hobartville

John Sargent insists he has no qualms about challenging Luvaluva (NZ) (Mastercraftsman) to open her autumn campaign in the Gr.2 Hobartville Stakes (1400m) at Rosehill.

The Randwick trainer had the option to start the three-year-old filly against her own age-group in the Gr.1 Surround Stakes (1400m) on her home track on Saturday week, but Sargent said the Hobartville fitted in better with his plans.

"She is kicking off there because it suits her program. I didn't want to wait another week," he said.

Sargent said Luvaluva would go secondup into the Gr.3 Keith Nolan Classic (1600m) at Kembla Grange then tackle the Gr.1 Vinery Stud Stakes (2000m) at Rosehill.

Rangipo (Stryker) will strip in top order for Saturday's Listed Marks Ewen & Associates Kaimai Stakes (2000m).

"He's very well and it's a step back in grade for him and a big drop in weight," trainer Tony Pike said. "It would be nice to get a win on the board, he's been solid in all his runs this time in."

Rangipo has finished fourth in each of his last four appearances, including a strong last-start effort under 59kg in the Gr.1 Herbie Dyke Stakes (2000m) and he will carry 54.5kg at Matamata.



Age Of Fire (Fastnet Rock)

Randwick Guineas start on the line for **Age Of Fire**

A start in next month's A\$1 million Gr.1 Randwick Guineas (1600m) beckons Age Of Fire (Fastnet Rock), should he perform to expectations at Matamata on Saturday.

The Stephen Autridge and Jamie Richardstrained last-start Gr.1 Levin Classic (1600m) winner tackles Saturday's The Proisir 1400 at Matamata and victory would see the Fastnet Rock colt locked in for a trip to Sydney.

"We've just been held up with a couple of niggling things with him but Opie [Bosson] rode him this morning at three-quarter pace and was happy with him," Richards said.

"We had initially hoped he'd be running in the Hobartville Stakes at Rosehill this weekend, but hopefully he'll be winning at Matamata instead and give us the confidence to head to the Randwick Guineas."

Age Of Fire has won three of his six starts and was also second in the Gr.1 New Zealand 2000 Guineas (1600m) at Riccarton

Chris Waller duo aimed at Rosehill Guineas

Stablemates So You Win (So You Think) and Tangmere (NZ) (Frankel) took an encouraging step towards the Gr.1 Rosehill Guineas (2000m) after engineering a onetwo finish at Canterbury on Wednesday.

"I've no doubt that's the right race for them, we just have to work out how to get them there," trainer Chris Waller said.

Waller was particularly impressed with So You Win, the \$3.60 favourite, and jockey Glyn Schofield after he extricated the threeyear-old gelding from a tricky situation.

"He was in an awkward spot and he had a horse hard up against him at the 600m so he had to go back around him to get clear running," Waller said.

"That's not easy to do at Canterbury so it was good to see him finish off as well as he did.

"The second horse was pretty brave as well. He's still learning what it's about. It was good to see him rally at the finish."

So You Win was purchased by Waller for \$220,00 from the 2016 New Zealand Bloodstock draft of Hallmark Stud, while the Pencarrow Stud consigned Tangmere was the top priced lot that year when knocked down for NZ\$1.3 million.

Bright future tipped for 3YO Mongolian Marshal (NZ) (High

Chaparral) might be a future classic contender, but it's unlikely to be at home.

The Murray Baker and Andrew Forsmantrained son of High Chaparral, who broke his maiden over a mile at Avondale on Wednesday, isn't in Gr.1 Vodafone New Zealand Derby (2400m) contention.

"That might come up a bit soon, but there

are other Derby's," Forsman said. "He's always showed a lot and as he matures he can only get better."

He also indicated the three-year-old is likely to wear blinkers next time out.

Mongolian Marshal completed a hattrick for the stable at Avondale following earlier wins from Trudeau (NZ) (Pins) and Konstantina (NZ) (Mastercraftsman).



Embellish (NZ) (Savabeel)

Embellish to strip in top order for Guineas

A bolder showing is expected from the leading New Zealand three-year-old Embellish (NZ) (Savabeel) in the Gr.1 Australian Guineas (1600m).

The Savabeel colt has taken significant benefit from his lead-up run for sixth in the Gr.3 C.S. Hayes Stakes (1400m) at Flemington last Saturday.

"He's come through the run really well and we couldn't be happier with him," Te Akau principal David Ellis said.

There is quite a lot of improvement in him, it was his first run in Australia and he will definitely appreciate the step up to a mile." Full story here

The Bjorn Baker-trained six-year-old, who won a 900m trial at Rosehill on Monday, has been set for the US\$1 million Al Quoz Sprint (1000m) at Meydan in Dubai on March 31.

"He's going really, really well. He's

definitely on target," Baker said. "We are probably going to give him another trial at Randwick in a couple of weeks as we try to get him on the plane in the best possible order for what's in front of him."

Purchased by Baker for NZ\$45,000 at the New Zealand Bloodstock National Yearling Sales, Music Magnate has won nine races including the Gr.1 Doomben 10,000 (1350m) and nearly A\$1.2 million in prizemoney.



Rondinella (NZ) (Ocean Park)

Rondinella ruled out of Oaks

Highly-regarded filly **Rondinella (NZ)** (Ocean Park) is the latest defection from next month's Gr.1 Al Basti Equiworld Dubai New Zealand Oaks (2400m).

Her classic hopes were dashed after suffering a foot injury in a stable mishap.

"It's just one of those things that can happen," said Haunui Farm's Mark Chitty, who co-bred and part-owns the three-yearold

Trained by Roger James, the daughter of Ocean Park was an impressive maiden winner at Tauranga last month before she suffered from cardiac arrhythmia when unplaced in the Gr.3 Desert Gold Stakes (1600m) at Trentham.

Rondinella then finished strongly for fourth in the Gr.2 Sir Tristram Fillies' Classic (2000m) at Te Rapa before her latest setback.

"It's disappointing, but you have to take the good with the bad," Chitty said.

Bowman on Melody Belle

Top Sydney jockey Hugh Bowman has been booked to ride **Melody Belle (NZ)** (Commands) in the Gr.1 Surround Stakes (1400m) at Randwick on Saturday week.

"We had originally approached Hugh to ride Melody Belle in the Light Fingers, but he was unavailable and subsequently suspended anyway, so we engaged Blake Shinn, but he was then also suspended," Fortuna Syndications director John Galvin

"In the end, Rory Hutchings stepped into

the breach and did a good job for us in the Light Fingers.

We were approached by Hugh Bowman's agent seeking the ride on the filly in the
