## MADISON COUNTY TOO TOUGH IN LEVIN CLASSIC

**T**ough-as-teak three-year-old **Madison County (NZ)** (Pins) became a dual Group One winner when he overcame some home-straight difficulties to take out the Gr.1 Fusion Electrical Levin Classic (1600m) at Trentham.

The Murray Baker and Andrew Forsman-trained Pins gelding had been unsighted on a race-track since his barn-storming finish to claim the Gr.1 New Zealand Two Thousand Guineas (1600m) at Riccarton back in November.

Carrying the familiar colours of owner, the China Horse Club, Madison County was sent out a short-odds favourite to claim his second elite-level victory despite his two-month absence from competitive action.

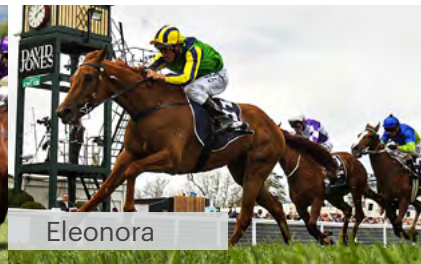

His supporters were on good terms with themselves as rider Matt Cameron settled his charge on the rail in midfield on a good speed set up by stablemate Espresso Martini (NZ) (High Chaparral).

Although saving plenty of ground, that inner position started to become a trap as the pair found themselves behind a wall of horses entering the home straight.

Cameron finally found a clear path at the 250m mark that Madison County took full advantage of, as he dove between runners with a powerful sprint to claim the front and victory from fellow Cambridge visitors Hypnos (NZ) (Reliable Man) and Vernanme (NZ) (O'Reilly), who dead-heated for second.

"He's not very big but he's all heart," Forsman said.

"He was four-back the fence and, in reality, that was always where he was going to be.

"I sort of wanted to walk away half-way through the race as I thought he had too much to do.

"He was a horse who hadn't raced for awhile and probably just felt the pinch at the end, but he was very brave."

Forsman indicated Madison County would now be aimed at the Listed Karaka Million 3YO Classic (1600m) at Ellerslie in a fortnight.

"Provided he comes through this well there is no reason he wouldn't (go to Ellerslie)," he said.

"He will improve a lot fitness-wise, so hopefully he will be competitive there."

Madison County also holds a nomination for the Gr.1 Vodafone New Zealand Derby (2400m) at Ellerslie on March 2 while he may tackle the older horses under weight-for-age conditions before then in the Gr.1 Herbie Dyke Stakes (2000m) at Te Rapa on February 9.

Bred by Garry Chittick, Madison County was a \$36,000 purchase by Michael Wallace on behalf of the China Horse Club from Waikato Stud's Select Sale draft at the 2017 National Yearling Sale at Karaka.

He has now won four of his 7 starts and over \$530,000 in prizemoney.

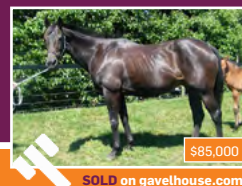
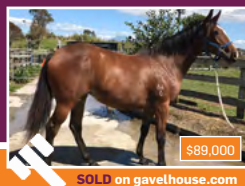

# EXCITING TALENT NOTCHES FIRST STAKES VICTORY AT TRENTHAM

Promising mare **Supera (NZ)** (Savabeel) added some significant value to any potential broodmare career she may have, when she captured her first black-type success in Saturday's Gr.3 Tui-Backing A Winner Since 1889 Anniversary Handicap (1600m) at Trentham.

The royally-bred Savabeel four-year-old had produced a career-best effort when finishing third in the Gr.2 Cal Isuzu Stakes (1600m) back in December but bettered that result with Saturday's victory.

Rider Rosie Myers had Supera travelling nicely throughout the race but a clear margin off a hot speed set up by the flying Cambridge visitor Ugo Foscolo (NZ) (Zacinto). Myers picked a path hard up against the rail in the home straight as Supera dashed past her rivals in the closing stages to score by two lengths from the well favoured Wyndspelle (NZ) (Iffraaj), who stormed home out wide.

"I sort of looked at the jockeys around me and I didn't think they were going to give me much room, so I stayed on the inside," Myers said.

"I hoped for a bit of luck and luckily I had the horse underneath me.

"She's a serious horse."

Co-trainer Mark Donoghue, who prepares the Supera in partnership with Ken and Bev Kelso at Matamata, acknowledged the stable had high hopes before a race that held plenty of importance for the mare's future

breeding prospects.

"We came in with a bit of confidence," he said

"It looks great (the win) on her (pedigree) page.

"She is obviously going to go on with it, so fingers crossed she gets to where she should."

Supera was bred by her owner Sir Peter Vela under his Pencarrow Thoroughbreds banner and is a half-sister to dual Group Three winner Eleonora (NZ) (Makfi) who finished third in the 2016 Gr.1 VRC Oaks (2500m) at Flemington.

Her dam *Sopra Tutto* (NZ) (Van Nistelrooy) is a daughter of Vela's outstanding racemare *Ethereal* (NZ) (Rhythm) who won four times at Group

One level including the 2001 Caulfield Cup (2400m)/Melbourne Cup (3200m) double.

Pencarrow Stud will offer a half-sister to Supera by Makfi as Lot 421 during Book 1 at the New Zealand Bloodstock National Yearling Sale that commences at Karaka on January 27.

# QUALITY MARE BACK TO HER BEST AT TRENTHAM

Elite-level performer **Consensus (NZ)** (Postponed) reminded racegoers about her genuine class when she dominated her rivals in the Gr.3 Barneswood Farm Trentham Stakes (2100m) on Saturday.

The Postponed mare had hinted she was approaching her best form with a fighting run for sixth at Ellerslie in the Gr.2 Rich Hill Mile (1600m) on New Year's Day and she backed that up with a class performance in the hands of rider Chris Johnson.

Carrying a luxurious 53kg under the set weights and penalties conditions of the traditional Trentham feature, Johnson took Consensus straight to the front from barrier rise as he set a moderate speed throughout.

Challenged by race favourite Chance To Dance (Teofilo) at the top of the straight, Johnson had the mare travelling sweetly as she eased away from her opponents at the 200m mark to record a decisive victory.

Trainer Stephen McKee revealed he had been confident he had Consensus back to her best for the race after she had missed a run at Ellerslie on Boxing Day due to a wet track.

"She just raced a bit fresh last time as she had missed a run in the Zabeel Classic due to the heavy track," he said.

"It was D-day today with the 53kgs on her back.

"She had been putting herself handy enough so she could run forward today, which you had to be, as they have been winning on the speed.

"It was a good win."

McKee admitted the mare has been lightly raced of late as a deliberate ploy to keep her fresh for an Australian autumn campaign.

"We brought her in later this year as we wanted to try Sydney again in the autumn," he said.

"We just wanted to keep her lighter through the summer.

"Based on today she was happy enough at the 2100m so

we might look at a race like the Ranvet with her."

Consensus finished fourth in the 2018 edition of the Gr.1 Ranvet Stakes (2000m) at Rosehill in a three-start Australian campaign that also saw her finish a creditable sixth behind Winx (Street Cry) in the Gr.1 Queen Elizabeth Stakes (2000m) at Randwick.

The seven-year-old has now won nine of 51 career starts with over \$590,00 in stakes earnings. Numbered amongst her victories is the 2016 Gr.1 Zabeel Classic along with a further three black-type successes.

# MANOLO BLAHNIQ SCORES IN CHESTER MANIFOLD

**T**rainer Tony Noonan is hoping the first Australian stakes win for **Manolo Blahniq (NZ)** (Jimmy Choux) in the Listed Chester Manifold Stakes (1400m) at Flemington can go some way to garnering the gelding some votes for the rich All-Star Mile at the same track.

Five-year-old Manolo Blahniq was a Group Three winner at his second start in New Zealand as a two-year-old and he added his first Australian stakes win in Saturday's 1400m race at his 24th career start.

Noonan plans to chase more stakes wins with Manolo Blahniq in the next month, while he has thrown the gelding into the entries for the inaugural A\$5 million All-Star Mile at Flemington in March.

Ten of the 14 spots in the All-Star Mile will be decided by public vote and a host of high-profile horses from across the country have already been nominated for the race.

"All the girls who like shoes, he's the horse to vote for," Noonan said.

A son of Rich Hill Stud stallion Jimmy Choux, Manolo Blahniq is named for another high-end shoe manufacturer

Manolo Blahnik.

Manolo Blahniq won twice in town during 2018 and Noonan believes the best is still to come from the sprinter-miler after three encouraging performances so far this preparation for a win and two placings.

"He's been going well for a while now," Noonan said.

"He's now getting to the stage where he's a bit stronger and more confident.

"He was a colt for a while and he struggled with that.

"We had to alter his race pattern a bit because he used to over-race and want to race a lot on nervous energy. But now he's lovely and relaxed and he's a consistent horse.

"He's just in the right place at the right time now."

Manolo Blahniq (\$5.50) had to race three-wide from a deep barrier draw but Noonan praised the ride of Dwayne Dunn to get the gelding home by three-quarters of a length.

# LOUIS STRENGTHENS RICHARDS' MILLION HAND

Debutante **Louis Luck** strengthened the Karaka Million (1200m) hand for Te Akau trainer Jamie Richards when winning the Wellington Cup Day Next Saturday 2YO (1200m) on Saturday at Trentham.

Richards is already likely to be well represented in the Karaka Million at Ellerslie on January 26, with a further five two-year-olds qualified for the feature including Aotea Lad, Yourdeel, Challa, Probabeel and Puysegur.

Having trialled well for two seconds in November, Louis Luck took advantage of the coveted one draw to

drive through in front under rider Opie Bosson.

With favourite The Fugitive to his outer, a match race ensued but first starter Louis Luck proved too strong.

"He jumped and put himself in the race, and travelled nicely," Bosson said. "He got a little bit lost before we turned in. He got on the wrong leg a few times but he kept up a good gallop.

"When The Fugitive first came up beside me I was a little bit worried, but once mine balanced up he came up underneath me, so I was pretty confident."

Winning trainer Jamie Richards was confident of a good showing by Louis Luck, who is raced by Cambridge Stud proprietors Brendon and Jo Lindsay.

"It was a good effort by the team to get him to the races in such good order," Richards said.

"He's had a few little immaturity holdups, but he's really stepped up. He's eaten well, worked well, and we were quietly confident he'd give a good account of himself after the way he worked with Probabeel on Tuesday morning.

"I'd like to thank Brendan and Jo for their continued support, and Henry (Plumptre) lets us take our time and nothing is ever a problem. We can pick and choose where we want to head which makes it a lot easier from a training perspective and we can let the horses tell us when they're ready."

Louis Luck is the first winner for five-time Group One winner Dissident and was sold by Masterton's Little Avondale Stud for \$105,000 to the Lindsays.

"Jamie (Richards) has done a great job with the horses that Brendan and Jo Lindsay have given us to train," Te Akau

principal David Ellis said. "They gave us two this year and they've both qualified for the Karaka Million.

"What Brendan and Jo are doing at Cambridge Stud is just so exciting for everybody in the industry, with the good bloodlines they've got and the stallions they've introduced.

"Jamie has now qualified six horses for the Karaka Million and that's an unbelievable achievement for a young guy in his first season as sole trainer," Ellis said.

The win in the 1800m benchmark 78 race completed a winning treble for apprentice Robbie Dolan.

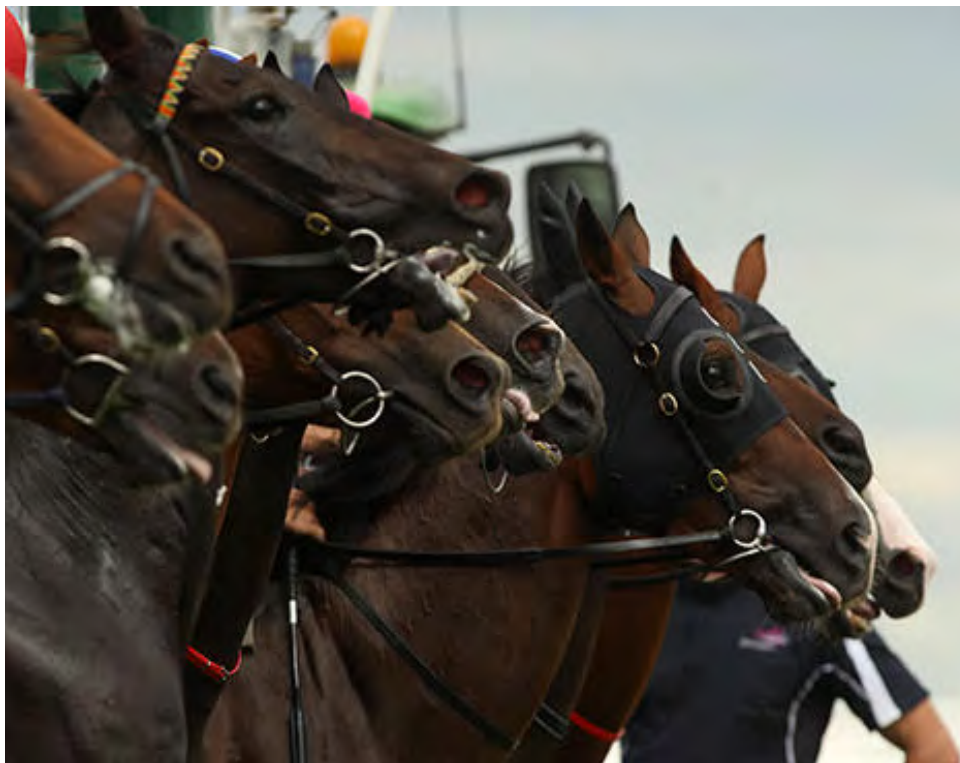
"I can't do it without the horses so I'm very happy," Dolan said

# WECANDO DOES IT FROM START TO FINISH

**T**rainer Stephen Gray was not on hand at Kranji on Friday night, but the yard was right on target with their first 2019 winner - the aptly-named **Wecando (NZ)** (Per Incanto).

With the Kiwi handler only flying back from the Gold Coast Yearling Sale on Saturday, it was his racing manager Craig Geehman who did the honours at the Champagne Room, along with Wecando's owners, Mr and Mrs Chen.

"Stephen only flies in tomorrow. He'll be pretty rapt with that first win for the year," said Geehman.

"It's also a big thrill to have another winner for Mr and Mrs Chen. They have some nice horses with us, they love their racing and they're always very happy when their horses win.

"From the wide barrier, it was always the plan to roll forward even if we didn't think he would lead – he actually led very well.

"He was able to stack up the speed. The tempo was not too silly and Amirul (Ismadi, jockey) rode him to instructions.

"It was a great tempo ride from Amirul on a horse who's always shown good ability. He exceeded expectations first-up, and we'll just take him through his grades going forward."

The Per Incanto four-year-old was at his first race since his unplaced run in a Class 4 Premier race over 1200m on December 2.

Drawn out the widest in 12, Wecando had the race pretty much in his keeping from a long way out once Amirul got away with some cheap sectionals upfront.

Turning for home, the chances Wecando could indeed do it was not a remote possibility anymore with \$11 favourite Centenary Diamiond (Kitten's Joy) the only one within striking distance while the rest had been clearly caught napping.

After first electing for the inner route, Centenary Diamond switched to the outside for his final assault, but either way, Wecando could not be pegged back.

"The other horses were a touch slow at the start. I had to make a quick decision to go forward," said Amirul who was at his first 2019 win.

"He settled very well for me and in the last 300m I still had plenty of horse under me."

Wecando has now taken his race record to two wins and two seconds from six starts for stakes money that have tipped over the S\$100,000 mark for the Elaine Chen Stable.

A perfect hold-up run behind the speed saw **Decreto** going home the best in the S\$50,000 Class 4 race over 1100m on Friday.

The Young Keah Yong-trained gelding always travelled like a sound \$11 investment after taking the drop behind the leading duo of Pioneer Seven and Cerdan.

Once Troy See angled Decreto out for his run at the top of the straight, it would have taken a brave man to tip against the Red Giant five-year-old landing his fourth career win.

Young said he thought Decreto's chances would be enhanced after the original 12-horse field was reduced to nine.

"After the three scratchings, it

became a small field, I had more confidence he could win," said the Singaporean trainer.

"This horse is competitive in Class 4. That's his third win for me, he's been a useful horse to us and the owners."

With that fourth win (first win came under the care of Kuah Cheng Tee at his debut in February 2017), Decreto's total earnings have now swollen past the S\$155,000 mark for the Synthetic Stable.

See, who has now been aboard at three of Decreto's four wins, played down his input in the latest win.

"He was too good. He jumped so well and was in the box seat the whole way," said the 2018 Singapore champion apprentice jockey who has

graduated to the senior ranks since the turn of the year.

"He just puts himself there, I was pretty confident he would be right in the finish. Anyone would have won on him."
