Flying filly Avantage heads the Te Akau Racing challenge for Saturday's Karaka Million (1200m)

avid Ellis' business model continues to perform to Group One standards as the Te Akau principal's favourite time of the year approaches.

He is New Zealand's biggest buyer of yearlings and his Karaka purchases have delivered outstanding race track success with more than 20 Group or Listed winners in the last year, including seven at the highest level. Confidence and excitement levels are understandably high in the Te Akau camp ahead of the opening of New Zealand Bloodstock's National Yearling Sale series on Sunday. A day before, Ellis' tangerine troops will be out in force at Ellerslie with trainers Stephen Autridge and Jamie Richards to saddle five runners in the Karaka Million (1200m) and their

Gr.1 New Zealand 2000 Guineas (1600m) winner **Embellish** (NZ) (Savabeel) a leading chance in the Karaka 3YO Classic (1600m).

"It's been really satisfying and it certainly shows that the whole business is working well," he said.

"We don't try and buy early two-year-olds, these are horses that have just showed a lot of natural ability and we haven't pushed them. They have taken their opportunities to qualify in a very even field."

The unbeaten **Avantage** (Fastnet Rock), who has drawn ideally in gate five, will be joined by **Al Hasa (NZ)** (Exceed And Excel), **Sword Of Osman (NZ)** (Savabeel), **Pinot Grey (NZ)** (Burgundy) and **The Real Beel (NZ)** (Savabeel) in the Karaka Million.

"Avantage has been working particularly well and she probably deserves to be the favourite," Ellis said.

"Opie (Bosson) has proved how good he is judging horses, he's a freak, and he pretty much always chooses the right one. He has been riding all these horses in work and he has chosen Avantage.

"He did tell me it was narrowly over Al Hasa, who has improved a lot since his last race at Ellerslie and one of the strongest workers has been Sword Of Osman. "The draw for Avantage will give Opie options, it's just perfect really."

Top colt Embellish has won three of his five starts and in his first appearance since his New Zealand 2000 Guineas victory in November he finished fourth.

"He needed the run at Ellerslie at his last start and he will be stripping at his peak on Saturday," Ellis said.

"His work has been of the highest standard and Opie is very happy. They will take a lot of beating."

Ellis' confidence in Embellish hasn't been dented by barrier 13 either.

"The draw doesn't really mean a lot over the mile at Ellerslie," he said. "The horse rolls forward so I don't think it's too bad."

Ellis has been inspecting hundreds of yearlings ahead of the sale at Karaka.

"Book 1 is now 700 as opposed to 430 or 440 so there's been a lot of horses to look at and we've finished looking at all of them now," he said.

"There will be 140 yearlings that we will be going back to have a second look at. I do it with Jamie Richards and Mark Walker, it's a team effort that works really, really well."

KAPOOR CHASES KARAKA RICHES

ambridge trainer John Bell has a formidable hand to play at Saturday's Karaka Million meeting at Ellerslie.

Bell will produce exciting filly **Kapoor (NZ)** (Reliable Man) in the \$1 million Karaka Million 3YO Classic (1600m) and talented sprinter **Julius (NZ)** (Swiss Ace) in the Gr.3 Brighthill Farm Concorde Handicap (1200m), convinced that both are winning chances.

In Kapoor's case, Bell has found a million-dollar race that fits her Gr.1 Al Basti Equiworld Dubai New Zealand Oaks (2400m) preparation in terms of timing and distance.

"Her whole campaign is about having her at fever pitch for the Oaks, but this race fitted her programme

and she's eligible so we're having a run," Bell said.

"She's fit and well - and with any luck she might give them a fright."

Kapoor has had nine starts for just the one win, but has finished second on five occasions, including in her last two starts in the Listed Trevor Eagle Memorial (1500m) at Ellerslie and the Gr.2 Eight Carat Classic (1600m) at the same track.

"Her second placings could easily have been wins. She keeps getting forced out wider by her opponents," Bell said.

"Danielle [Johnson, jockey] has suggested riding her a couple of places further back and that way she can run at them rather than them running at us.

"At the barrier draw function, a lot of her rival's trainers were saying they were going to push forward early so rather than follow the crowd, we'll probably try and tuck in behind."

TAB bookmakers have Kapoor at \$16 in a market headed by Gr.1 New Zealand 2000 Guineas (1600m) winner Embellish at \$3.30.

"She's a filly that's a true professional," Bell said. "She's got no issues and she just goes and gets the job done - the kind of female you'd like to be married to." Safely through Saturday's race, Kapoor will step up in distance to either the Gr.2 Cambridge Stud Sir Tristram Fillies Classic (2000m) at Te Rapa on February 10 or the Listed Fasttrack Insurance Oaks Prelude (1800m) at New Plymouth a week earlier.

Earlier on Saturday's card, Julius will start favourite in the Concorde, having resumed with a brilliant 3 1/2-length win at Ellerslie a fortnight ago.

"He's improved. He's a big boy and he worked up nicely on his own this week. Jake Bayliss has shed the weight to ride him at 53 kilos so that's a good sign," Bell said.

"He's a six-year-old, but he's still immature and still very much a big kid. Big horses have their issues more than little ones, especially the really competitive ones so we've had to be patient with him.

"This horse has muscle upon muscle and he takes plenty of massaging with coconut oil but he loves that too. There's some good horses in there, but on his run the other day, he's got to be the horse to beat."

FILLY IMPROVING RACING MANNERS

alented three-year-old Astor (NZ) (Iffraaj) is proving to be a willing, if impatient, student. "She can be guite fierce and likes to do everything a million miles an hour so we're trying to get her to settle down and get to the line a bit stronger," trainer Cody Cole said.

"She's a very intelligent filly who wants to learn, it's all about improving her racing manners."

The Gary Harding-owned Astor will make her first appearance for Cole in Saturday's Gr.3 Mongolian Khan Trophy (1200m) at Ellerslie after beginning her career at Matamata with

Danica Guy.

"I've had Havoc for Gary, he's been a bit of a difficult horse as well, and he was happy with what I was doing so he asked me to take this filly and try and improve her behaviour - she's settled in really well and suits a smaller stable," Cole said.

The winner of two of her five starts, Astor relocated in early November and trialled twice last month. "They probably

didn't look that great, but she was there for a reason – just to teach her that she's not one dimensional and she doesn't have to lead and can take a sit," Cole said.

"It's all about her manners, that's the guery with her and we've done as much groundwork with her as we can without having raced her."

Cole is hoping for plenty of early pace in Saturday's race to bring out the best in Astor, who will be ridden by Samantha Collett.

"Gift of Power is drawn outside so hopefully she goes forward and it would be nice to get on the back of her, it's all up to Sam now," he said.

He is happy to take it a race at a time with Astor, although he has an eye on a longer-term target.

"There's the Mufhasa Stakes coming up, but it might be a stretch at 1300m," Cole said. "There's a few set weight and penalties races around and the Cambridge Breeders' Stakes later on for a bit of black type."

Fifty Fifty (NZ) (Thorn Park) **Fifty Fifty's ready for his Group One test Fifty Fifty (NZ)** (Thorn Park) has been one of this season's stellar performers, progressing from the middle of Class 3 at the start of the term into a leading player in Sunday's Gr.1 Stewards' Cup (1600m) at Sha Tin. Regular rider Karis Teetan believes the Peter Ho-trained grey's biggest challenge to date can announce his arrival amongst the Hong Kong elite.

"Peter and I were speaking the other day, and we were just saying how everything we ask of this horse, he does," Teetan said. "All of the pressure we have put him under, he has come out and performed so well. This will obviously be his real test now as he meets the top horses in Hong Kong on a level playing field."

Fifty Fifty was a last start winner of the Gr.3 Chinese Club Challenge Cup Handicap (1400m) on New Year's Day where he beat the likes of Group One winners Helene Paragon (Polan) and Beauty Only (Holy Roman Emperor).

Fifty Fifty has only been to the mile once for a win in the Class 1 Chevalier Cup Handicap two starts ago. Teetan feels that, in time, the 1600m will be seen as the fiveyear-old's best trip.

"I think this season, we've started to see that the 1400 (metres) is a little bit quick for him," he said. "He's a fairly easy horse to ride, he doesn't pull and he races pretty generously, so I am excited to see him back out to 1600 (metres) again. Honestly, I think the more he sits and is allowed to fall asleep and relax, the better he is when he starts to build his momentum, which is why I think the mile is perfect."

Lanciato to continue winning ways

Lanciato (NZ) (Per Incanto) has been a constant in Mark Newnham's short training career and the five-year-old will be given his chance in Listed company in the Carrington Stakes.

The gelding was Newnham's first runner

when he took out his licence 18 months ago after many years at Tulloch Lodge as Gai Waterhouse's senior foreman.

Newnham has now added a stable at Randwick while retaining his original boxes at Warwick Farm where Lanciato is trained.

The former New Zealander was Newnham's first runner in June 2016, and although he ran second, he helped put the trainer on the map.

Since his first Sydney campaign, Lanciato has won four races and has earned his chance in Saturday's Listed Carrington Stakes (1400m) at Rosehill with Rachel King to ride at 53kg.

The pair combined to win over 1400 metres at Randwick on January 6.

"He's going terrific and he gets in well with 53 kilos," Newnham said.

"Rachel rode him well last time and she can ride the weight. There are not many who can.

"I think he will go well. I would be disappointed if he didn't finish in the first three.



Long Leaf (Fastnet Rock)

Long Leaf to begin Diamond campaign

Lindsay Park trainers David and Ben Hayes and Tom Dabernig have a number of youngsters in Blue Diamond contention this year including stakes-winning colt **Long Leaf** (Fastnet Rock) who resumes in Saturday's colts and geldings Preview at Caulfield (1000m).

Long Leaf, a \$750,000 purchase out of Curraghmore's 2017 New Zealand Bloodstock Premier draft, chased down La Pomme De Pin (I Am Invincible) to win on debut in Adelaide before taking out the Listed Merson Cooper Stakes at Sandown in November.

"He's probably going to be better at 1200 metres than 1000 metres but he's fresh heading into the Preview and then we've got the option whether he runs in the Prelude or whether we just wait and go into the Blue Diamond," Dabernig said.

Damien Oliver will ride Long Leaf in the Preview.



Music Magnate (NZ) (Written Tycoon)

Baker Dubai bound with Music Magnate Ex-pat kiwi Bjorn Baker is embarking on an overseas campaign with Group Onewinning sprinter Music Magnate (NZ) (Written Tycoon).

The six-year-old gelding is heading to Dubai in March for the Gr. 1 Al Quoz Sprint (!200m).

Music Magnate, who has won nine of his 20 starts and more than \$1.1 million in prize money, returned from a long spell with a dominant win in the Listed Christmas Classic (1200m) at Randwick on 30 December.

The emphatic victory by the Gr. 1 Doomben 10,000 (1350m) winner saw Baker immediately turn his attention to the Al Quoz Sprint, the same race champion Queensland-trained sprinter Buffering (Mossman) won in 2016 when the race was run over 1000m.

Music Magnate, who made his successful return from injury in the \$150,000 Listed race at Randwick, is being kept fresh for the Al Quoz sprint, with the Written Tycoon gelding to not race again before the Dubai race on March 31.

"It is a straight 1200 metre race on turf and most likely on a good track that will suit him," Baker said. "The race is worth pretty good money as well and I think the race will suit him."

He is set to travel to Dubai on about March 19. "It will be great to travel there and compete against horses, trainers and jockeys from all around the world," said Baker. "It will be an experience I am looking forward to and certainly hoping for the best."



She's A Thief (NZ) (Showcasing)

She's A Thief gets the nod

Successful Karaka purchaser Paul Moroney has tipped **She's A Thief (NZ**) (Showcasing) as Ballymore Stables' best chance in Saturday's Karaka Million (1200m) at Ellerslie.

Moroney's brother Michael and his Matamata training partner Pam Gerard will also saddle Bocce (Foxwedge) and Scorch (NZ) (Sizzling) in the juvenile feature.

"We're proud to have three in there," he said. "A good barrier is a big help in a twoyear-old dash and She's A Thief is probably the best of ours."

Moroney bought She's A Thief, Bocce and Scorch at Karaka last year.

Ever Loyal's draw no concern

Tony Pike is happy enough with **Ever Loyal's** (Sebring) barrier draw of 10 in this weekend's Karaka Million 3YO Classic (1600m) at Ellerslie.

"There should be plenty of speed on Saturday evening, so we'll ride him where he's comfortable," the Cambridge trainer said.

"With Jason (Waddell) suspended, Leith Innes will ride him."

The connections of the Gr.1 New Zealand 1000 Guineas (1600m) winner Hasahalo (NZ) (Savabeel) weren't so happy when they were handed gate 15.

"The draw makes it tough and we'll probably get further back than we would



have wanted to," said Matt Allnutt, racing manager for syndication company Go Racing.

Filly pleasing trainers

David and Emma-Lee Browne are more than happy with their Karaka Million (1200m) hope **Hattie Bee** (Bernardini) ahead of Saturday's event.

The Bernardini filly has returned a cheque in each of her three lead-up outings to the big money feature at Ellerslie.

["]She's done everything right all along and we're just hoping it goes our way on Saturday," Emma-Lee Browne said.

Hattie Bee will have plenty of support on track at Ellerslie on Saturday, with a syndicate of 64 women and one man who race under the Fun and Fascinators syndicate hoping their filly shocks the field and takes home the big prize.

Derby hope to Pukekohe

Endowment (NZ) (Savabeel) will take another step toward the Gr.1 Vodafone New Zealand Derby (2400m) at Counties today.

"He'll run over a mile at the Counties meeting and then go to the Avondale Guineas," said Chris Gibbs, who trains with Donna Logan.

The Savabeel three-year-old, who has been the subject of buyer interest, finished runner-up behind Demonetization (All Too Hard) in the Gr.2 Auckland Guineas (1600m) at Ellerslie at his latest appearance to earn a \$16 quote for the Derby.

Kiwi stakes winner strikes

Former New Zealand galloper **Showboy** (**NZ**) (Showcasing), who claimed the Gr.2 Wakefield Challenge Stakes (1200m) from Nigel Tiley's stable, has won for the second time in Hong Kong.

Now racing as Jade Fortune, the son of Showcasing was successful over 1650m at Sha Tin on Wednesday for trainer Manfred Man and rider Neil Callan.

A half-brother (Lot 566) to Jade Fortune by

Atlante will be offered by Mapperley Stud at the Book 1 Sale at Karaka next Wednesday.



Matauri (NZ) (Ocean Park)

Well-bred filly's price surprises

Impressive debut winner **Matauri (NZ)** (Ocean Park) raced up to expectations at Avondale, despite being ignored in the betting market.

The daughter of Group One winners Ocean Park and Calveen (NZ) (Canny Lad) slipped under punters' guards when she was successful on Thursday at odds of 28-1.

"She's a promising filly and we rate her quite highly," co-trainer Murray Baker said. "We thought she would go close, she's well-bred and we couldn't believe the price."

A half-brother (Lot 85) by Shooting To Win will be offered by Haunui Farm at the Book 1 Sale at Karaka on Sunday evening.

Baker was also pleased with the first-up effort of Rhinestone Cowboy (Teofilo) to finish third behind Matauri.

"He's a good horse and he'll improve a lot," he said.

Four days of Karaka televised

The Alamosa mare, who is in foal to Tavistock, signed off in perfect fashion when she triumphed in Saturday's Gr.1 Thorndon Mile (1600m) at Trentham.

"She went off this morning," Baker said. "It was a really satisfying win, she's a valuable broodmare now."

While there was joy in the Stolen Dance camp, there was disappointment for the connections of Love Affair (NZ) (Savabeel), who beat only one runner home in the Thorndon.

"We can't find anything wrong with her," Baker said. "She's gone back to Waikato Stud for a break, she's a very good horse."

The winner of four of her seven starts, Love Affair had finished runner-up in the Gr.2 Cal Isuzu Stakes (1600m) at Te Rapa at her previous start.

Break for talented Hiflyer

The connections of **Hiflyer (NZ)** (Tavistock) have resisted the temptation to extend the dual Group Three winner's preparation.

"He's been very, very good to me and the owners so we've decided to give him a nice spell and he'll come back bigger and stronger," trainer Peter Lock said.

"We've got to look after him, he's still a little bit immature. He's been raced sparingly and puts in 110 per cent every time."

The decision to give Hiflyer a break was made following his latest run for third in the Gr.1 Thorndon Mile (1600m).



Age Of Fire (Fastnet Rock)

Set-back for Derby hope A fall back plan is in place for the Group One winner **Age Of Fire** (Fastnet Rock) following an injury.

"He got cast in his box and gave his tendon a whack," Te Akau principal David Ellis said.

"After four days at the vet clinic he's now 100 per cent so it's onwards and upwards with him, but whether we get to the New Zealand Derby we're not 100 per cent certain.

"We think if we can get him to the Avondale Guineas we can make the Derby, otherwise there's the Group One mile at Otaki (Haunui Farm WFA Classic), the Rosehill Guineas and then the ATC Derby."

The Stephen Autridge and Jamie Richardstrained Age Of Fire enhanced his future stallion value at his last appearance when the Fastnet Rock colt triumphed in the Gr.1 Levin Classic (1600m), his third win from six appearances.

Hallmark Stud will offer a sister (Lot 172) to Age Of Fire at the Book 1 Sale at Karaka on January 28.

No decision yet on Rondinella's next start

Roger James is pondering his next move with his highly-regarded filly **Rondinella** (NZ) (Ocean Park) after she suffered a cardiac arrhythmia when tailing the field home in Saturday's Gr.3 Desert Gold Stakes (1600m) at Trentham.

"She did fibrillate and it hadn't converted back when she left the races, but she was vetted at six o'clock the next morning at Otaki and it was back to normal," the Cambridge trainer said.

"I'm not sure if she will run in the Sir

Tristram next, we're working through that process."

Meanwhile, James confirmed his last-start Gr.3 Trentham Stakes (2100m) winner Von Tunzelman (NZ) (Zabeel) will step out next in Saturday's Gr.3 Windsor Park Stud City of Auckland Cup (2400m) at Ellerslie.

Smart Kiwi-bred colt trials well

Talented New Zealand-bred three-year-old **Addictive Nature (NZ)** (Savabeel) is closing in on a return to racing.

The Bjorn Baker-trained son of Savabeel was an impressive 900m trial winner at Rosehill on Monday morning.

Addictive Nature has won two of his four starts, including success in the Gr.3 Ming Dynasty Quality (1400m) and he finished third in the Gr.2 Stan Fox Stakes (1500m).

Michael Moroney and Pam Gerard are to add further Australian flavour to their Matamata stable.

Jake Bayliss is currently enjoying a successful riding stint with them and now another Victorian-based jockey in apprentice Jordan Grob, 22, is to join the operation.

Group One performer **Sacred Master** (NZ) (Mastercraftsman) is heading back to a familiar environment.



Key appointment to Cambridge Stud


