TOP TRAINERS **TO THE FORE**



Te Akau Racing's Avantage is one of the nominees for Champion Two-Year-old at the upcoming New Zealand Thoroughbred Horse of the Year Awards

New Zealand's leading stables dominate the first batch of finalists for the 2018 New Zealand Thoroughbred Horse of the Year Awards.

New Zealand Thoroughbred Racing (NZTR) has announced the finalists for five of the six racehorse categories, with the finalists for Jumper of the Year to be determined later this month.

Half of the 22 flat finalists are trained by either the Cambridge partnership of Murray Baker and Andrew Forsman or the Te Akau team of Stephen Autridge and Jamie Richards.

All finalists are eligible for the Horse of the Year title, which

will be announced at a gala dinner in Auckland, at Ellerslie Racecourse, on Sunday, August 26.

Baker and Forsman, who have established a record tally in the trainers' premiership this term, prepare all four finalists in the middle-distance category – reigning Horse of the Year Bonneval (NZ) (Makfi), Jon Snow (NZ) (Iffraaj), Lizzie L'Amour (NZ) (Zabeel) and Saint Emilion (NZ) (Mastercraftsman) – and will also be represented by Gr.1 New Zealand Derby (2400m) winner Vin De Dance (NZ) (Roc De Cambes) and Gr.1 Sydney Cup (3200m) placegetter Zacada (NZ) (Zabeel).

RHYTHM TO SPARE HOPING THIRD TIME'S A CHARM



Rhythm To Spare will attempt to land Saturday's Winter Championship Series Final at Flemington at his third attempt at the race.

Eight-year-old **Rhythm To Spare (NZ)** (Pins) will be trying for the third time to win a Winter Championship Series Final at Flemington.

Rhythm To Spare has finished fifth in the past two editions of the Listed 1600m race at Flemington which is one of the highlights of winter racing in Melbourne.

The Mike Moroney-trained gelding goes into this Saturday's race having been unplaced in his past three starts but Moroney's racing manager Anthony Feroce believes the gelding is going better than the form card reads.

"We think he's going as good as ever. It's just unfortunate

he's had no luck in his last two runs in Adelaide and at Moonee Valley," Feroce said.

Rhythm To Spare finished fifth in the Group Three R A Lee Stakes (1600m) in Adelaide two starts ago when he had difficulty obtaining clear running around the 200m mark.

Last start in the Travis Harrison Cup (1600m) at Moonee Valley he was held up from the 400m to the 200m before finishing fourth, just over nine lengths off dominant winner Magic Consol (Consolidator).

Damien Oliver takes the ride on Rhythm To Spare who has drawn barrier 11.

Freedman tries for Stakes success

Kiwi-bred filly **Gregorian Chant (NZ)** (Echoes of Heaven) could give emerging trainer Mitchell Freedman his first stakes success when she lines up in the Listed Taj Rossi Series Final (1600m) at Flemington on Saturday.

Ballarat based Freedman caught the eye of OTI supremo Terry Henderson who decided to give the young trainer a horse - Gregorian Chant.

Freedman said that while the filly, who is by SA Derby runner-up Echoes Of Heaven, has not yet fully matured, the opportunity to gain black type as a two-year-old was too hard to resist, especially after winning her maiden so convincingly at Bendigo last month.

"She seems to have taken good improvement from Bendigo," Freedman said on Wednesday. "She's still pretty raw and not physically or mentally at her best yet but she's got a good constitution - she's handling her work really well - so we thought we'd try our chances over a mile.

Henderson was a little more upbeat about the filly's chances.

"She's a big Kiwi filly and Mitch has done a terrific job," he said.

"He's had her for six months now and he's brought her along slowly. She won very well at Bendigo and I think she'll give it a shake."



Plymouth Road (NZ) (Tavistock)

Easier option for in-form NZ-bred

Trainer Matthew Smith is happy to keep his progressive New Zealand-bred **Plymouth Road (NZ)** (Tavistock) in his own grade.

The Warwick Farm conditioner produced the son of Tavistock to win over 2400m at Randwick last time out and will sidestep Saturday's Listed Winter Cup (2400m) in favour of a softer Rosehill option over the same trip.

"He likes wet tracks which it seems he will get again," Smith said. "He loves to get out and into his own rhythm.

"He is ideally suited to winter tracks and 2400m and maybe even further so we will keep going through the grades and see where it takes us."

Hatton unveils a new star

Pukekohe trainer Jim Hatton might have unearthed a filly to provide him with a first stakes win.

Hatton produced Jimmy Choux two-year-old filly **Choux A Star (NZ)** for an eye-catching debut second to the highly-regarded Botti (NZ) (Jakkalberry) at Pukekohe last month and another bold performance in Saturday's Majestic Horse Floats 1200 at Te Rapa could earn her a shot at this month's Listed Courtesy Ford Ryder Stakes (1200m) at Awapuni.

"If they timed their last 400m from Pukekohe, you'd probably find she went quicker than (Botti) that day," Hatton said.

Dez (NZ) (Zed)

Dez an outside show for Riccarton

Comeback galloper **Dez (NZ)** (Zed) is an outside chance to head south for a stakes feature.

Lightly-raced due to injury, the six-year-old holds a nomination for the Gr.3 Winter Cup (1600m) at Riccarton on August 4.

"It's a longshot, he needs to get some more rating points," part-owner and trainer Simon Wilson said.

Dez's cause would be aided by further success in the J & J Walters Handicap (1550m) at Awapuni on Saturday.

"Obviously, he broke down a couple of years ago with a tendon issue but he has

come back well," Wilson said. "At this stage a mile suits him pretty well and being by Zed he likes the heavier tracks."

Dez returned from a lengthy lay-off for a first-up win, the third of his career, at Waipukurau and he has subsequently placed at Wanganui and Trentham.



Taurus (NZ) (No Excuse Needed)

Winter stalwart on Cup path again

Durable galloper **Taurus (NZ)** (No Excuse Needed) has become a permanent fixture in two winter black type events and he's on target to continue that trend.

The Evan and JJ Rayner-trained gelding has run in six consecutive editions of the Listed Ag Challenge Stakes (1600m) on his home track at Wanganui, winning the event in 2016 and finishing in the money in his other five attempts.

Taurus was third in this year's edition at his most recent start and he's now preparing for a fifth crack at a Listed event at New Plymouth.

"He's doing well and he'll run at Awapuni on Saturday, there's no claims so Jonathan Riddell will ride him and his main aim is the Opunake Cup," Evan Rayner said.

Taurus finished runner-up in the Cup in 2013, sixth the following year and third and fourth respectively in the last two runnings.

Well-bred filly wins maiden

The Dean Binaisse-trained **Triscilla (NZ)** (Exceed and Excel), a half-sister to three-time Group One winner Lucia Valentina (NZ) (Savabeel), recorded her maiden victory in her seventh start on the synthetic surface at Geelong on Tuesday.

Ridden by regular track rider Remi Tremsal, the Exceed and Excel filly was slow away from her outside barrier in the five-horse field.

Tremsal pushed forward to sit outside the leader before pressing on to take the lead at the turn of the straight and drew clear at the 150m mark to win by two lengths. [Full story here](#)

Jumping career planned for flat winner

An emphatic flat victory at Wanganui won't change plans for the five-year-old **Donardo (NZ)** (Don Eduardo).

The Don Eduardo gelding was a runaway winner of Thursday's Palamountains Nutrition Highweight (2060m) under rider Will Gordon.

"Hopefully, he'll be jumping soon," said part-owner and trainer Lucy de Lautour, who also prepares the Hawke's Bay Hurdle (3100m) winner Kipkeino (NZ) (Sunray).

Donardo finished runner-up three runs back before he was unplaced at Wanganui last month.

"It was late in the day and the track was a bit too cut up," de Lautour said.

Tyler's team hit form at right time

Kelvin Tyler's hopes of a second Group success during the Grand National carnival at Riccarton have been boosted.

The Riverton trainer had three representatives in the main event at Ashburton on Wednesday and they dominated the finish as the trio furthered their path to the Gr.3 Winter Cup (1600m) on August 4.

Flying Sardine (NZ) (Flying Spur) won the RD Petroleum Winter Cup Trial (1400m) with stablemates **Timy Tyler (NZ)** (No Excuse Needed), who won the Cup at Riccarton in

2015, and **Lochan Ora (NZ)** (Towkay) third and fourth respectively with Bevan Wilson's Zawhip (NZ) (Zacinto) spoiling the clean sweep with his effort for second. [Full story here](#)

Mare strikes for new trainers

Ishinktaatledo (NZ) (Shinko King) has opened her account from her new southern quarters.

The Shinko King mare won twice for Taranaki trainer Allan Sharrock before transferring to Riccarton conditioners Les and Richard Didham and she won Wednesday's South Rakaia Hotel 1200m at her third appearance for them.

"Allan sent her down to us and said she had ability," Les Didham said. "The blinkers were on, but I don't think they made the difference, it was the better track that helped her."

The stable was also delighted with the Ashburton effort of **Twoznotenough (NZ)** (Sakhee's Secret), also formerly with part-owner Sharrock, for third in the JJ Ltd Open 2100m.

"It was a top run with 60kg, not many mares win with that weight," Didham said.

Hot southern form continues

Prince Oz (NZ) (O'Reilly) has maintained his unbeaten record in the South Island with his fifth consecutive win.

The son of O'Reilly broke his maiden for Raymond Connors and he hasn't looked back since the Wanganui trainer, whose family own the strapping gelding, sent him to Neill Ridley's stable.

Prince Oz carried 61kg to a comfortable victory in Wednesday's Rural Transport Handicap (1200m) at Ashburton where he is undefeated in three appearances.



Beauty Generation (NZ) (Road To Rock)

NZ-Breds well represented in Hong Kong Awards

New Zealand-breds have had a great season in Hong Kong, recording victories

in six of the 24 stakes races, and have been rewarded with nominations in every category in the Hong Kong Champion awards.

New Zealand-breds hold four nomination spots for the prestigious Hong Kong Horse of the Year title.

They include three-time Group One winner **Beauty Generation (NZ)** (Road To Rock), quality sprinter **D B Pin (NZ)** (Darci Brahma), Hong Kong Derby winner **Ping Hai Star (NZ)** (Nom Du Jeu), and 2015-16 Hong Kong Horse of the Year **Werther (NZ)** (Tavistock).

Meanwhile, **Pick Number One (NZ)** (Darci Brahma) and **Ugly Warrior (NZ)** (Swiss Ace) are both nominees for Champion Griffin and **Fifty Fifty (NZ)** (Thorn Park) joins Ping Hai Star and **Pingwu Spark (NZ)** (Mastercraftsman) as New Zealand-bred nominees for Most Improved Horse.

Winners of the Champion Awards will be announced at The Hong Kong Jockey Club Champion Awards 2017/2018 presentation ceremony which will be held on July 13 at the Ritz-Carlton Hotel, Hong Kong.
