WALLER SADDLES THREE IN WINTER CHALLENGE



Sacred Master will have his first start for the Chris Waller stable at Rosehill tomorrow

t will be a fitting reminder of the strength of Sydney's premier stable when Chris Waller saddles up three chances in the final stakes race of the season.

Waller has Tales Of Grimm (Distorted Humor), Marenostro (NZ) (Duelled) and Group One placed New Zealander Sacred Master (NZ) (Mastercraftsman) making his Australian debut in the 1500m Listed Winter Challenge at Rosehill on Saturday. Sacred Master has recently transferred to Waller for an Australian campaign from the stable of Tony Pike.

Chris Waller's remarkable season will come to an end on Saturday and the race will be his last chance to add to 56 stakes wins across Australia in 2015/16.

Marenostro finished fourth in the Winter Stakes and has

drawn well in barrier three this time.

"The last 100 metres of his race the other day was good. He was closing," Waller said.

"Hopefully in this race it will be similar."

At Sacred Master's last start he finished third in the Auckland Cup (3200m), indicating he is one of a slew of horses in Saturday's race who will appreciate longer races.

Waller said the Wyong and Newcastle Cups would be a longer-term target for Sacred Master.

The Kiwi conditioner has taken Sydney by storm in the last decade and needs two wins to break his own Sydney training record.

AUSTRALIAN ADVENTURE SET TO BEGIN FOR CAMBRIDGE COUPLE

hat was once a dream has quickly become reality for Cambridge couple Trent Busuttin and Natalie Young as their move to establish a training base in Australia enters its final phase.

Busuttin flew out of Auckland on Wednesday night with a team of 15 horses to meet up with his partner and young family at the new Cranbourne base they will call home from now on. Young and their two children have been at Cranbourne for the past three weeks settling into a new house, school and routine with Busuttin reporting they are all loving the new location.

"Natalie has been running around getting things ready and looking after the five horses we already have at the stable which includes Tavago and (El) Sicario." Busuttin said.

"There will be another 10 to come in about a month. That will fill 30 of the 45 boxes we have so the hard work starts now on trying to fill them up through our performance from here on."

Despite the excitement and anticipation of the move Busuttin did admit to a few pangs of sorrow over the past days.

"We both have a touch of sadness as Cambridge has been a wonderful place to live and work and we have so many friends in the area that we're leaving behind. It's a great community and we will miss it but the opportunity we have in front of us now is one that

you could never turn down."

Busuttin is excited about the prospects for his new stable with ATC Derby winner **Tavago (NZ)** (Tavistock) set to step out at the trials shortly.

"He has come back in superb order and he is nearly ready to go to the trials," he reported.

"At this stage he will trial on the 15th of August with his first run planned for the Memsie Stakes at Caulfield on the 27th. His major target is the Caulfield Cup so as long as he comes through that first run well he will go to the Makybe Diva Stakes after that and then the Turnbull Stakes as his final lead-up.

"I think (EI) Sicario is up to Group One level so he is another we're really looking forward to getting back to the track. He will trial next week and then we will look for a race in the provincials somewhere just to make sure he has his ringcraft right after a disappointing effort at Randwick to wind up his two-year-old season."

While Busuttin or Young won't be on hand at Avondale on Friday they will sign off their New Zealand stable with maiden galloper **Magnificent Time (NZ)** (Savabeel) in the first race on the day's programme.

"Magnificent Time will be our last runner and it would be great to go out on a winning note," he remarked.

"Michael Kneebone manages the horse and he has been a tremendous supporter of ours for a number of years. To get a win for him would be a great way to finish off things here."









BROWN HAS FAITH IN HIS'BIG GIRL'

eading jockey Corey Brown believes Sunday's \$200,000 Group 3 Juvenile Championship (1200m) will be the true test from which this year's best two-year-old will be revealed.

Without taking anything away from Steven Burridge's combative filly Lim's Racer (NZ) (Red Giant), whom the Australian hoop said he was impressed with her bottomless reserve in going all the way in the Group 2 Aushorse Golden Horseshoe (1200m) on July 8, he said his filly Athena (NZ) (Nom Du Jeu) had excuses in the same race despite a fastfinishing third.

To Brown, the Nom Du Jeu filly's scrappy start cost her the race. Upon dispatch, she was seen copping a bump from stablemate Sir Isaac (Dream Ahead) before dropping at the rear in the bumper 15-horse field.

Upon straightening, the massive (she weighs 538kgs) bay tried to take the shortest route home along the fence, running on boldly to finish only 1 ¾ lengths behind Lim's Racer.

Brown is not the sort to whinge about any luckless run, but was certainly looking forward to a rematch.

"She had to be taken out at the start when she was

knocked over. I had to drag her back and I certainly didn't want that option," said Brown.

"She was shuffled back and had to come back another two spots. I should have been two pairs closer in the run."

The Melbourne Cup-winning jockey fell short of saying whether the Cliff Brown-trained and Olympian Stable-owned filly would have won, but is adamant she would have finished

"I felt she was unlucky as she was the only horse who made ground and was beaten only 1 3/4 lengths off the winner," he said.

"Not saying she would have won, but she could have made it more interesting. The Juvenile Championship will be a chance for her to make amends as it's a smaller but select field

"I think they will have more time to sort themselves out. It will make for a more level-playing field.

"There will be less chance of interference and she's also drawn a good barrier (three). They're some of the best twoyear-olds in Singapore this year and we'll know for sure who's the best on Sunday."

In three starts, Athena has thus far amassed a handy

record of two seconds and one third. Brown also rode her to a close second to Macarthur (who is also in the Juvenile Championship) in the fourth Leg of the Singapore Golden Horseshoe series, the **IRT Juvenile Stakes** (1200m).

Perfect Start (NZ) (Perfectly Ready)

Mare makes timely return to form

The clock is ticking on stakes winner **Perfect Start (NZ)** (Perfectly Ready), who will have another opportunity to add to her black type record this weekend.

The rising seven-year-old, who will go to stud in the spring, will back up in Saturday's Listed Woods Contracting Taumarunui Gold Cup at Arawa Park after a much-improved performance at her last start.

Perfect Start's connections were beginning to wonder if they would have to make an earlier than intended retirement call before she finished runner-up at New Plymouth.

"It was 50-50 how much longer she went on until then," said Wayne Hillis, who trains the daughter of Perfectly Ready with Shaun Kesner. Full story here.

Bruce Arthur aims to be king

Connections of pint-sized Showcasing two-year-old **Bruce Arthur (NZ)** are taking a step into the unknown in Saturday's Listed Courtesy Ford Ryder Stakes (1200m) at Otaki but believe the trip south is worth the punt.

Prepared by Ruakaka trainers Donna Logan and Chris Gibbs for owner Kevin Hickman, Bruce Arthur has placed in two starts to date, running second at Avondale on debut before a last-start third at Ruakaka

Both runs were on dead tracks and how Bruce Arthur handles a heavy track at Otaki is Gibbs' only concern leading into his first stakes test. Full story here.

Birchley looking at Gr.1 for O'Reilly Cyrus

O'Reilly Cyrus (NZ) (O'Reilly) is back in Brisbane from a long break in New Zealand and trainer Liam Birchley is hoping the filly can earn a start in the Group One Golden Rose.

She won her only Australian start at Doomben in December and Birchley then took her to New Zealand for the Karaka Million on January 24.

The filly wasn't at her best and finished seventh after having a troubled run.

O'Reilly Cyrus will begin her Golden Rose campaign in Saturday's Two-Year-Old (1050m) at Doomben.

Birchley said the 1400 metres of the Golden Rose over 1400m at Rosehill in September would be perfect for O'Reilly Cyrus.

"She has a fair way to go before we start talking seriously about Group One races but I have always had an opinion of her and we have been very patient," he said.

The filly's stablemate **Beckham (NZ)** (Pins) will probably tackle the Smirnoff Open (1350m) on Saturday despite barrier 12.

"There is nothing for him next week and he has shown he can lead or come from behind so we have a few options," Birchley said

Brave Ali can delay retirement at Doomben

The racing future of veteran **Brave Ali** (NZ) (O'Reilly) goes on the line when he

races at Doomben.

The rising 10-year-old runs in Saturday's Open Handicap (2200m) with trainer Tony Gollan saying he may not be ready to retire just yet.

But Gollan admits Brave Ali has to improve on his last-start 12th in the Listed Grafton Cup at his most recent start on July 14.

"I was happy with his previous form. His fifth in the Tatt's Cup was a nice run and his runs at his two previous starts at unsuitable distances were handy," Gollan said.

"He needs a softish track and hopefully it won't be too hard for him on Saturday. It does look a nice race for him and it is a typical end of season staying race in Brisbane."

Brave Ali, who won the 2014 Ipswich Cup, will be having his 50th start on Saturday and is aiming for his 13th win.

Hutchings creates apprentice history

He may have just made history but Sydney-based Kiwi jockey Rory Hutchings' focus is firmly fixed on the road ahead.

With just one meeting

remaining of the Sydney metropolitan season, Hutchings cannot be caught in the race to be champion apprentice for the season.

Hutchings, who completed his apprenticeship at the beginning of June with 32 wins for the season, has a 10-win buffer on Koby Jennings, meaning he becomes the first New Zealand jockey to win apprentice titles in two countries.

Awake In Grinzing shines in wet track win

Danny O'Brien has the upcoming spring carnival on his mind after the debut win of **Awake In Grinzing (NZ)** (Rip Van Winkle) at Sandown.

Ridden by Ben Melham, Awake In Grinzing charged from back in the field to score by a length from Los Cabos (More Than Ready).

O'Brien says Awake In Grinzing has the pedigree to be competitive over 2000 to 2400 metres and he intends to give the gelding the chance to get to the Victoria Derby.

"We'll give him a run in three or four week's time and see where he's at," O'Brien said.

"It is a long-range plan with a horse of his pedigree to give them a chance when the Derby is run but there's Derbys and good three-year-old races in the autumn if it all comes too soon.

"It's still a long way off but quite often horses that run well on Derby day have a run or two during the winter and he got a big tick today."

Memsie ideal starting point

The Memsie Stakes at Caulfield on August 27 is a likely starting point for the spring campaigns of the New Zealand-bred Group One winners **Tarzino (NZ)** (Tavistock) and **Tavago (NZ)** (Tavistock).

The former's trainer Mick Price said he didn't want his colt to have a testing first-up run over a mile so he has opted for the 1400 metres of the Memsie for the VRC Derby and Rosehill Guineas winner.

Tarzino will then have Group One runs in the Makybe Diva Stakes and the Underwood Stakes before the Turnbull

Stakes, after which Price will decide between a Caulfield Cup or Cox Plate start.

Meanwhile, Trent Busuttin and Natalie Young's Australian Derby winner Tavago will trial ahead of the Memsie, which will kick off his Caulfield Cup campaign. He is one of 15 horses they have transferred to their new training base at Cranbourne.



Heroic Valour (Fastnet Rock)

Guineas focus for top colt

All roads will lead to Christchurch in the spring for the unbeaten colt **Heroic Valour** (Fastnet Rock).

The exciting son of Fastnet Rock is making good progress toward a return to racing and is regarded by Te Akau Stables as their leading classic hope for next season.

"He's our number one horse for the 2000 Guineas," said Stephen Autridge, who prepares the rising three-year-old with Jamie Richards.

"He's grown and matured and we think he has improved, but he was always going to get better with more time.

"He will trial at Te Teko next Tuesday and first off he will be going down for the Hawke's Bay Guineas." Full story here.

Guineas goal for highly-regarded filly Fortaleza (NZ) (Darci Brahma) is back

The Michael Moroney and Pam Gerardprepared rising three-year-old made only

"We've always had a very high opinion of her," Ballymore Stables racing manager Nick Fairweather said.

"We will be looking at a New Zealand 1000 Guineas programme for her and first she will go to the Te Teko trials on August 2.

"She could then head to the Gold Trail Stakes or she could go straight to the South Island, a lot of her owners are down there, for a lead-up race like the Canterbury Belle Stakes." Full story here.

Memsie first for Sofia Rosa

Sofia Rosa (NZ) (Makfi) will race exclusively in Group One company in the spring.

Trainer Stephen Marsh has outlined plans for a four race Melbourne campaign for his Gr.1 Australian Oaks winner.

"She'll fly to Melbourne where she'll stay at Russell Cameron's at Flemington and she'll run fresh-up in the Memsie Stakes," Marsh said.

"Obviously there's a lot of water to go under the bridge but all going well, she'll then go to the Makybe Diva Stakes, Turnbull Stakes and the Caulfield Cup."

Marsh said Sofia Rosa had spelled exceptionally well and he was confident of a bold first-up showing from the daughter of Makfi.

"Without doubt she's strengthened up, she's still got a little bit of furnishing to do, but she looks a lot better than she did in the autumn," he said. "I think she's going to run a boomer in the Memsie over 1400m. She's not dour at all and has a good turn of foot."



Sacred Elixir (NZ) (Pour Moi)

Cox Plate in the mix for Kiwi star

Rising three-year-old **Sacred Elixir (NZ)** (Pour Moi) could earn himself a crack at the best weight-for-age performers in Australasia in the spring.

Cambridge trainer Tony Pike hasn't ruled out the Group One winner taking on the older horses if his form warranted it.

"He will kick off in the Caulfield Guineas Prelude on September 24, that's obviously a nice race to get him ready for the Caulfield Guineas," the Cambridge trainer said.

"Then we will decide what path we take – the VRC Derby or if he was to be really dominant in the Caulfield Guineas we could consider the Cox Plate, it will just depend how he is going." Full story here.

McDonald bags Group Two

Champion New Zealand jockey James McDonald played a starring role on the opening day of the Goodwood festival in England.

He combined with the Godolphin runner **Dutch Connection** (Dutch Art), trained by Charlie Hills, to land the Gr.2 Lennox Stakes and the 17th winner of his current European stint.

"I can't believe I've won a big race for Charlie Hills," McDonald said. "He's an absolute brother of mine and he's had so much faith in me and I can't thank him enough

"It's been brilliant (riding in England). I head home on Saturday, but hope I can get a few more wins under my belt before I go"

Dee appeal dismissed

Dylan Dunn will be crowned champion Melbourne apprentice after Michael Dee's appeal against a careless riding suspension was dismissed on Wednesday morning.

Dee was challenging a 10-meeting suspension he incurred at Flemington on Saturday, hoping to ride in the last two metro meetings in a bid to cut down Dunn's two-win lead.

But the appeal didn't get much traction at the Racing Appeals and Disciplinary Board, deputy chairman Brian Forrest siding with the stewards' original decision.

Dee, who will take a quick break before relaunching for the spring, finishes the season with 31 metropolitan wins in Victoria and in the top 10 in the jockeys' premiership.



Jayla Monet (NZ) (Any Suggestion)

Proven approach wins Ropiha over

Ben Ropiha is hoping to replicate the success of a fellow Cambridge trainer.

He has set his promising staying mare **Jayla Monet (NZ)** (Any Suggestion) on a programme followed last spring by Tony Pike with his Gr.1 Auckland Cup placegetter Sacred Master (NZ) (Mastercraftsman).

Pike produced the four-year-old for two wins during the Hawke's Bay carnival, success in a Dunstan Feeds Qualifier and the Gr.2 Avondale Cup before he finished third in the Ellerslie feature.

"I'm going to try and take the same path as Sacred Master did," Ropiha said.

"I went through and had a good look at what he did and I think that will suit my mare as well. Ideally, we would like to look at the Auckland Cup as her long-term grand final."

"I think the 1200m might be a bit too short for her but I'm hoping she'll balance up with Michael Walker on board, find her feet and run home strong and we can push forward from there.

Prepared by James Cummings, three year-old gelding **Rockafella (NZ)** might be somewhat of a late starter having only recently made his debut with a Wyong win on July 12, but patience may ultimately pay off for connections.

Stepping up into a Benchmark 67 event over 1100 metres against some handy three year-olds, Rockafella proved up to the task, finding the line strongly to win over Loverboy Charlie (Myboycharlie).

"It was a good effort to come here and show that sort of improvement from a maiden win into smart midweek company," said James Cummings.

A \$280,000 NZB Premier purchase from the Cambridge Stud draft for DGR Thoroughbreds, Rockafella is the first winner for Group Three winning Thorn Park mare Glamorous Girl.

Remembering our Hall Of Fame Heroes Balmerino- Globetrotter who took the NZ thoroughbred to the world

Bred and raced by Waikato dairy farmer Ralph Stuart, Balmerino was by Trictrac from the grand broodmare Dulcie.

He was the outstanding three-year-old of 1975-76, a season that embraced 18 starts and netted 14 wins and three seconds.

After a truncated four-year-old season which provided wins in the Air New Zealand Stakes, Awapuni Gold Cup, Sydney Autumn Stakes and Hastings Ormond Memorial, Balmerino headed for Europe. Stopping off on the way in California he notched a win. He won the Valdoe Stakes at Goodwood

first up in England and ran a rather unlucky second in the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe.

Balmerino then went to Italy, where he won the Gran Premio del Jockey Club but was relegated to second.

As a six-year-old stallion Balmerino had one more campaign and managed a win in the Clive Graham Stakes at Goodwood and seconds in the Coronation Cup at Epsom and the Eclipse Stakes at Sandown.

He returned home to stand at Middlepark Stud, Cambridge.
