## CHAMPIONSHIP FEATURES BECKON LIZZIE L'AMOUR



Lizzie L'Amour will attempt to add a further Group One title to her record at Ellerslie tomorrow

start in one of the showpiece races of Sydney's The Championships awaits **Lizzie L'Amour (NZ)** (Zabeel) if she races up to expectations in Saturday's Gr.1 Bonecrusher New Zealand Stakes (2000m) at Ellerslie.

But just which showpiece event that is hasn't yet been decided, with Cambridge trainers Murray Baker and Andrew Forsman covering their bases with entries for the Gr.1 Doncaster Mile (1600m) at Randwick on April 7 and both the

Gr.1 Queen Elizabeth Stakes (2000m) and the Gr.1 Sydney Cup (3200m) at the same track a week later.

TAB bookmakers have installed the Zabeel five-year-old as a prohibitive \$2 favourite for Saturday's weight-for-age feature, in which she defends her title after her half-head win over Benzini (Tale of the Cat) last year, again with Matt Cameron in the saddle.

She added her second Group One win with success in last month's Herbie Dyke Stakes (2000m) at Te Rapa and has given her trainers no cause for concern since.

"She's going well, but I just hope the track isn't too hard for her because there's been no rain," Baker said.

"I am happy with her. She seems a happy horse and she's fit."

Ellerslie was rated a good 2 earlier this week and track staff applied 10mm of irrigation on Thursday after only 1mm of rain arrived, despite a forecast predicting several wet days leading into Saturday's Gr.1 Barfoot & Thompson Auckland Cup (3200m) meeting.

Baker said the Lorna and Gary Moore-raced Lizzie L'Amour's Sydney programme would depend on how she ran on Saturday.

"She's in the Sydney Cup and she can stay. She's won her only start at 2400m," Baker said.

"She's probably at her best at 2000m but we think she can stay well."

Lizzie L'Amour has been allotted 53kg in the Sydney Cup and 52.5kg in the Doncaster.

Race rival and stablemate **Nicoletta (NZ)** (Savabeel) also holds an entry for the Queen Elizabeth Stakes and for the

Gr.1 Coolmore Legacy Stakes (formerly the Queen of the Turf, 1600m) on the same day.

The Savabeel four-year-old placed in the Herbie Dyke Stakes and has since finished fourth in the Listed Kaimai Stakes (2000m) at Matamata.

"She's an improving horse. We are happy with the way she's going and we think she can figure in Saturday's race," Baker said.

Rounding out the stable's hand in the New Zealand Stakes is last-start Ellerslie winner **Saint Emilion (NZ)** (Mastercraftsman), who has twice finished fourth in Group One weight-for-age company and won the Gr.3 OMF Stakes (2000m) under weight-for-age conditions at Ellerslie last November.

"He's won four of his 10 starts at Ellerslie and though he's second-up, he's pretty fit," Baker said.

"He's betwixt and between with weight-for-age racing because under handicaps he gets too much weight and at weight-for-age, he's up against the top ones."

Leith Innes rides Saint Emilion, who is on the third line of betting at \$7.50, with Opie Bosson taking the ride on \$12 shot Nicoletta.

## TILEY SERIOUS ABOUT SYDNEY FOR YOUNG STAR

elt's (NZ) (Iffraaj) unbeaten record isn't all that's going on the line at Ellerslie on Saturday.

The precocious daughter of Iffraaj will attempt to stretch her winning sequence to three in the Gr.1 Sistema Stakes (1200m) and Sydney beckons if she can successfully complete her hat-trick.

"If she won and was reasonably dominant, and came through it well, that's a serious option," trainer Nigel Tiley said.

"I've nominated her for the Sires' Produce Stakes at Randwick, it's a \$1 million race and that would be the last run of her campaign."

Melt won the Listed Ashford Lodge Stakes (1100m) at Pukekohe on debut before she claimed the Gr.3 Eclipse Stakes (1200m) at Ellerslie on New Year's Day.

She was then given a break and returned for a quiet trial over 1000m at Avondale last month.

"I'm very happy with her, she's spot on," Tiley said.

"Everything has gone well and her bodyweight is right where I want it to be."

He also can't fault the condition of **Brighton (NZ)** (Buffalo Man), who runs in the Gr.1 Bonecrusher New Zealand Stakes (2000m). "He's never been better, his work this week has been the best it's ever been," Tiley said.

"He's run in four Group One races and apart from the Derby, when distance-wise it was a step too far, he's gone very good races.

"He went a slashing race when he was fourth in the Guineas at Christchurch, he got home really well when he was eighth in the Railway and he did the same in the Telegraph (seventh) and the NRM Sprint (eighth).

"He's only a little horse and weight-for-age isn't perfect for him, but he deserves his chance. He just needs the speed on."

Brighton was a winner over a mile at Pukekohe two runs back and then finished fourth in the Gr.3 Taranaki Cup (1800m).

#### **Australian Cup for Devise**

Last-start Group One winner **Devise (NZ)** (Darci Brahma) will be given her chance to add black type honours across the Tasman to her record.

The Shaune Ritchie-trained mare left for Melbourne on Wednesday night ahead of Saturday's Gr.1 Australian Cup (2000m) at Flemington with Chad Schofield booked for the ride.

"I watched her work on Tuesday morning and she has improved and gone to another level since she won the Haunui Farm WFA Classic and 2000m is definitely her best trip," said Rick Williams, who manages The Oaks Stud for Devise's breeder-owner Dick Karreman.

"There's also the option of the Mornington Cup, that's worth \$A300,000, in three weeks and the winner of that qualifies for the Caulfield Cup," Williams said.



Age Of Fire (Fastnet Rock)

#### Distance a concern for Kiwi hope

Jamie Richards believes **Age Of Fire** (Fastnet Rock) could be vulnerable over a mile when he makes his Australian debut in Saturday's Gr.1 Randwick Guineas (1600m).

"He's been getting back and finding the line a bit, he might be run off his feet a bit early. Once he gets out to 2000m we could ride him a bit handier," said Richards, who trains in partnership with Stephen Autridge.

Richards believes Age Of Fire, who has drawn 13, is a better horse on top of the ground and is hoping to see the Randwick track improve from its Soft 7 rating on Wednesday.

"We are under no illusions as to how hard a task this is, running against Kementari and Pierata and those sorts of horses, but we think he is a pretty serious horse when he gets out to a mile and a-quarter and a mile and a-half."

Richards is hoping those points will be proved when Age Of Fire progresses to the Gr.1 Rosehill Guineas (2000m) and the Gr.1 Australian Derby (2400m).



Araldo Junior (Medicean)

#### **Newcomer on target for Cup**

Life in New Zealand is agreeing with the well-travelled stayer **Araldo Junior** (Medicean).

He hasn't missed a beat since arriving at the Matamata stable of trainers Michael Moroney and Pam Gerard to prepare for New Zealand's premier distance test.

Araldo Junior drew serious attention to his prospects in Saturday's Gr.1 Barfoot & Thompson Auckland Cup (3200m) when he ran third in the Nathan's Memorial (2400m) in his Kiwi debut last month.

"I'm really happy with him and he's settled in very well since coming over from Melbourne," Gerard said. Full story here

#### Weight determines Bosson's Sistema ride

Opie Bosson's Group One hopes in the two-year-old feature at Ellerslie will rest with **Sword Of Osman (NZ)** (Savabeel), although it's not strictly by choice.

The top jockey will partner the laststart winner in Saturday's Sistema Stakes (1200m), in which he will be opposed by his unbeaten stablemate **Avantage** (Fastnet Rock) and **The Real Beel (NZ)** (Savabeel).

"Opie's struggling a bit with his weight so he'll ride the boy, Matt Cameron will be on Avantage and Danielle Johnson will ride The Real Beel," said Jamie Richards, who trains with Stephen Autridge. Full story here

Damian Browne will return home to chase another Ellerslie feature this Saturday.

The expatriate Kiwi jockey has answered the call from Cambridge trainer Tony Pike to ride **Magic Chai** (Magic Albert) in the Gr.1 Barfoot & Thompson Auckland Cup (3200m).

"It was getting a bit tricky for a rider here and I've known Damian for some time," Pike said. "He rode Sacred Elixir for me when he had his first start in Queensland.

"He's very keen to come over and he knows Ellerslie pretty well, he's won a Karaka Million (on Hardline in 2015) there."

Magic Chai returned a sound trial on Saturday when he finished strongly from the tail of the field in a slowly run race to run fourth behind cup favourite Ladies First (NZ) (Dylan Thomas).

#### Shillelagh to return to scene of G1 win

Jockey Michael Dee's assessment of **Shillelagh (NZ)** (Savabeel) will be put to the test when the Group One-winning mare steps up to 1600 metres for the first time this campaign in the Gr.3 Matron Stakes at the scene of her biggest win.

Shillelagh won the Group One Cantala Stakes over the 1600m at Flemington during last year's spring carnival with Dee aboard.

The six-year-old, who is stabled at Flemington, has finished unplaced in her two starts this campaign but both have been over 1400m in weight-for-age Group One races at Caulfield.

Dee's comment after Shillelagh's last-start seventh in the Futurity could be telling heading into Saturday's Matron.

"She's just crying out for the mile," Dee said.

Being a Group One winner, Shillelagh has top weight of 58.5kg under the set weights plus penalties conditions on Saturday but she is dropping in class in the Group Three race against her own sex.

"She hasn't had any luck in the two races she's had so far this preparation, both have been Group Ones," trainer Chris Waller said.

"It's a set weights and penalties so she's not too badly in under that scale but she does still have to carry a big weight".

#### Cup goal for Kiwi stayer

Champion trainer Chris Waller has set the well-performed New Zealand stayer **Patrick** 

**Erin (NZ)** (Gallant Guru) on a path toward the Gr.1 Sydney Cup (3200m) at Randwick on April 14.

He has taken charge of the Gallant Guru gelding, who hasn't raced since he finished fourth in the Gr.3 Wellington Cup (3200m) for Wingatui-horsemen Brian and Shane Anderton.

Patrick Erin will make his first appearance for Waller in Saturday's Listed Randwick City Stakes (2000m) with Hugh Bowman taking the ride.

"He has won 10 starts, two of them on soft tracks. He's a class stayer, but 2000 metres is going to be a bit short for him," Waller said.

"He never got on the bridle in a short trial last week, but he has come on since then. He's a very fit horse, but look out for him when he gets closer to the Sydney Cup."

#### Guineas target for talented Tiley runner

Talented three-year-old gelding **The Ice Knight (NZ)** (Iffraaj) has booked his ticket south to compete in the Gr.2 Phill Cataldo Bloodstock Wellington Guineas (1400m) at Trentham next month after his tough win in the AJC Members 1200 at Avondale on Wednesday.

The Nigel Tiley-trained galloper sat midfield for the majority of the race before being set loose at the 500m mark by jockey Michael McNab.

The Iffraaj gelding went clear by twolengths at the 150m mark and held out a late challenge from the fast-finishing Sistabeel (Savabeel) to win by a nose. Full

Johnathan Parkes will ride in-form Hamilton filly **Contessa Vanessa (NZ)** (Bullbars) in Saturday week's Gr.1 Al Basti Equiworld Dubai New Zealand Oaks (2400m) at Trentham.

Co-trainer Graeme Rogerson confirmed Parkes would take over from Chris Johnson, who was aboard for last Saturday's Gr.3 Sunline Vase (2100m) win at Ellerslie, but has plumped for last-start Gr.3 Lowland Stakes (2100m) winner Savvy Coup (NZ) (Savabeel) for the Oaks.

Contessa Vanessa has won five of her 17 starts and finished a luckless third to Savvy Coup in the Gr.3 Eulogy Stakes (1600m) at Awapuni before winning the Gr.2 Eight Carat Classic (1600m) at Ellerslie and finishing second in the Gr.2 Royal Stakes (2000m) at the same track.

"She's come through Saturday's race in terrific order and she just keeps going from strength to strength. She's flying and I think she'll run super," Rogerson said.

#### Sydney Cup winner to join Team Rogerson

Graeme Rogerson has his eye on training a second Gr.1 Melbourne Cup (3200m) winner after securing a deal to buy ready-made stayers.

The New Zealand Racing Hall of Fame trainer has negotiated a deal to purchase five proven gallopers from leading Victorian owner Lloyd Williams, the majority owner of Rogerson's New Zealand-bred 2007 Melbourne Cup winner Efficient (NZ) (Zabeel).

Trainer Murray Baker said Francaletta had come through the race in excellent order and she was pressing on to Saturday week's Rosehill fillies and mares' feature.

"She's really improved so she'll run next week in the Coolmore."

Bred by Raffles Dancers and raced by Lib Petagna, the High Chaparral five-year-old has won six of her 10 starts up to Group Three level in New Zealand and has now been Group Two-placed on both sides of the Tasman.



Chocante (NZ) (Shocking)

#### **Brisbane focus for Chocante**

The well-performed stayer **Chocante (NZ)** (Shocking) is building up toward a return to the Queensland winter carnival.

The son of Shocking won the Gr.2 Brisbane Cup (2200m) last year and a subsequent Sydney campaign resulted in third placings in the Gr.1 The Metropolitan (2400m) and the Gr.2 Chelmsford Stakes (1600m).

"He's back up to three-quarter pace in his work and we'll be looking toward Brisbane again with him," trainer Stephen Marsh said. Full story here

#### **Smart 2YO set for CD feature**

Talented filly **She's A Thief (NZ)** (Showcasing) will make her last appearance for the season at Awapuni later this month.

"She's heading there for the Sires' Produce Stakes, we could have gone to Ellerslie for the Group One on Saturday but we want to give her a bit more time between runs," cotrainer Pam Gerard said.

"We initially thought she was just a twoyear-old type, but she's really grown and furnished so we can look forward to her as a three-year-old. In the meantime, she'll have just the one more run this time in."

The Showcasing filly has won two of her five starts and last time out she was narrowly beaten in the Gr.2 Matamata Breeders' Stakes (1200m) after drawing the outside gate.



Grunt (NZ) (O'Reilly)

#### Grunt spells ahead of lucrative spring

Talented three-year-old colt **Grunt (NZ)** (O'Reilly) will now head to the spelling paddock in preparation for the spring after securing his first Group One win when victorious in the Australian Guineas (1600m) at Flemington on Saturday.

After placing behind Aloisia (NZ) (Azamour) and Salsamor (NZ) (Tavistock) on debut as a two-year-old, Grunt has not been beaten in four subsequent starts.

The well-bred son of O'Reilly provided a preview of what was to come when winning the Gr.3 C.S. Hayes Stakes (1400m) a fortnight ago, and he has now proven he is one of the best of his generation with a strong Guineas victory. Full story here

#### **Time out for Wait A Sec**

Injury has ended an outstanding season for the Hawke's Bay galloper **Wait A Sec** (NZ) (Postponed).

"He's got a slight strain on the outside of his tendon," said Grant Cullen, who trains the Group One winner with Guy Lowry. "We've put him aside and hopefully we can have him back racing in the spring."

A last-start success in the Wairoa Cup (2100m) had boosted the confidence in Wait A Sec's Gr.1 Barfoot & Thompson Auckland Cup (3200m) hopes before he suffered the injury.

"He sure was going the right way, but that's the way it goes and he's done a great job for us," Cullen said.

Wait A Sec won five races this season, including the Gr.1 Livamol Classic (2040m) on his home track and the Gr.3 Anniversary (1600m) at Trentham.



Endean Rose (NZ) (Savabeel)

#### **Smart mare in new quarters**

Group One performer **Endean Rose (NZ)** (Savabeel) will round out her career from Tony Pike's Cambridge stable.

"She was purchased by some Australian clients, mainly as a broodmare proposition and they're going to give her one more preparation this autumn and early winter," he said.

No plans have been locked in yet for Endean Rose, who won six races from the Rotorua stable of her former trainer and part-owner lain Kennedy. The Savabeel mare also finished third in the Gr.1 Livamol Classic (2040m) last spring.



Sacred Star (Flying Spur)

#### Time called on top sprinter

Multiple Group One winner **Sacred Star** (Flying Spur) has run his last race.

The eight-year-old son of Flying Spur has been retired and will now enjoy life in a show hunter/sport horse role with Paxton Condor

Sacred Star won nine races and more than \$780,000 from Tony Pike's Cambridge stable with his career highlights being Group One successes in the Telegraph (1200m) and the NRM Sprint (1400m). He also won the Gr.2 QTC Cup (1300m) at Eagle Farm.

#### South Island Sale catalogue online

The 121-lot catalogue for the South Island session of New Zealand Bloodstock's National Yearling Sales Series is now available online and will be in the post late next week.

The Canterbury Agricultural Park in Christchurch will host the sale on Friday, April 20 with selling to start at 11am.

All yearlings entered are eligible to be nominated for the lucrative Karaka Million series, which comprises of two \$1 million races – the Karaka Million 2YO and the Karaka Million 3YO Classic – in addition to the \$100,000 Collinson Forex Karaka Cup.

The yearling section will be followed by the unraced stock section offering the final lot of the Sale.

#### **Jockey James McDonald to be relicensed**

James McDonald will be able to ride trackwork and trials ahead of his return to racing after a lengthy ban for a betting offence.

The former No.1 jockey for Godolphin in Australia, McDonald was outed after he admitted to placing a \$1000 bet on Astern (Medaglia D'Oro) before he rode the horse to victory at Randwick in December 2015.

His 18-month ban ends on May 15 and Racing NSW chief executive Peter V'landys has agreed to a recommendation from the Licensing Committee for McDonald to be relicensed.

He will be allowed to begin trackwork and trials from April 3 to help with the transition to race riding.

McDonald has won the Sydney premiership twice in 2013/14 and 2015/16.

#### Passing of internationally-successful New Zealand breeder

Respected New Zealand racing identity Jeanette Broome has died aged 81.

She achieved international success as the breeder of Seagram (NZ), a son of Balak (NZ) who won the 1991 Grand National Steeplechase (6900m) at Aintree, and the 1998 Gr.1 Melbourne Cup (3200m) winner Jezabeel (NZ), a daughter of Zabeel who also won the Gr.1 Auckland Cup (3200m).

The best horse she raced was her homebred Crested Wave mare Moire (NZ), who won eight races including the Gr.1 Easter Handicap (1600m) in 1993. Full story here

#### El Hermano dead

Well-related stallion **El Hermano** has lost a long battle with a hoof injury.

Cheval Stud's Frank Drummond confirmed on Thursday that the unraced brother to the Gr.1 Cox Plate (2040m) winner El Segundo (NZ) (Pins) had been humanely put down, aged 12.

El Hermano sired Group Two winners, Farm Boy (NZ) and Underthemoonlight (NZ), as well as Group One-placed El Pescado (NZ) and El Pistola (NZ) from a limited book of mares.

He suffered a life-threatening hoof injury while he was getting broken in as a two-year-old, but co-breeder and owner Philip Brown was insistent that the colt, which had made \$500,000 as a yearling in Sydney, be saved.

"Unfortunately those hoof problems finally caught up with him," Drummond said. That foot was always going to be his nemesis.

"It had just got to the point where it was affecting his quality of life and we didn't want to see him suffer so we did what we had to do."

El Hermano began his stud career at a service fee of \$500 + GST and such was the demand for his progeny that his fee rose to \$4000 + GST.

His demise also sees the end of Cheval Stud with Drummond and his wife Faye selling their Pukeatua property.
