John Wheeler won't be at Ellerslie when his talented pair of **Pentathlon (NZ)** (Pentire) and **Irish Flame (NZ)** (Zed) shoot for a Group One double on Saturday - but he has a fair excuse.

Wheeler and his wife Linda are playing tour guides for a trip of a lifetime to watch the world's best jumpers at the Cheltenham Festival in England and the Dubai World Cup

meeting at Meydan.

Rather than a trip of a lifetime, jockey Lisa Allpress, booked to ride the Wheeler pair at Ellerslie, will be happy with a trouble-free, economical trip in running in each of the features.

She rode Pentathlon in the Nathans Memorial (2200m)

at Ellerslie last Saturday and was delighted with the Pentire five-year-old's leadup effort ahead of Saturday's Gr.1 Barfoot & Thompson Auckland Cup (3200m).

"It was a pretty good run considering he carried 60 kilos. I really wanted to stay on the fence but managed to tack on to the back of Chenille and let her drag us into the race," Allpress said.

"With his big weight he couldn't stay with Chenille but it was a good run and dropping back to 55 kilos on Saturday, he should be a big chance.

"He's proven over 3200m. He went massive in the Melbourne Cup and in a couple of leadup races over there. I won the Chalmers [Handicap, 3200m] on him last year and he was close-up in the Wellington and Auckland Cups, so the distance won't be a problem."

Pentathlon is one of the most experienced horses in the field over 3200m, though he has yet to win in seven starts on tracks rated worse than dead.

"He's not as comfortable on a rain-affected track. He was all at sea on a rain-affected track in the Taranaki Cup. Either

way, I will just aim to kid to him all the way around and hopefully he can finish it off," Allpress said.

Allpress has also picked up the ride on stablemate Irish Flame for the Gr.1 Sistema Stakes (1200m), the Zed gelding looking for a repeat of his last-start win in the Gr.3 Phoenix Park 2YO Classic (1200m) at New Plymouth.

"I rode him in a jumpout on Monday in a heat they ran the reverse way [right-handed]. He jumped really well, settled in the trail and accelerated nicely," Allpress said.

"He hasn't raced right-handed but he's had that jumpout and Wheels has galloped him that way around at home.

"It's a strong race and it's always hard to beat those northern two-year-olds, especially the ones who have had a run around Ellerslie."

Allpress has five rides at Ellerslie on Saturday and was especially looking forward to riding New York Minute (NZ) (Iffraaj) first-up in her new preparation.

"She's come up really well. She's had a couple of jumpouts and in both of them she's bounced away and done everything right."

WAIKATO STUD MOVES FOR GROUP ONE CONTENDER

Matamata powerhouse Waikato Stud have delved back into the stallion market with their latest purchase having the potential for a bumper early return.

Farm principal Mark Chittick has secured a major interest in the Michael Moroney-trained **Tivaci** (High Chaparral), who on Saturday will chase his first Group One victory in the \$A1.25 million Newmarket Handicap at Flemington.

The four-year-old is the dual Group Three winner of the C.S. Hayes Stakes and the Sunshine Coast Guineas and he was also Group One-placed in the spring in the Cantala Stakes and the

Toorak Handicap.

"We've always got an eye out and the competition for stallions is fierce across Australasia," Chittick said.

"Before his latest Listed win (in the Kensington Stakes) we were very interested and the impressive times he ran got us motivated to get moving on a deal.

"He's by High Chaparral out of a Fastnet Rock mare and 1600 metres is his limit. As a three-year-old they tried to get him to a Derby, but it took a couple of races to learn that he wasn't effective beyond a mile.

"He's a fantastic specimen with a great turn of foot and his pedigree

will really suit our broodmare band. He'll cross so well with our mares by O'Reilly, Pins and Savabeel.

"We are very excited to have got the deal done and he will definitely be standing here at Waikato Stud later this year."

Purchased by agent Paul Moroney as a yearling for \$A250,000, Tivaci is out of the multiple winner Breccia (Fastnet Rock), who is a half-sister to the Gr.1 Toorak Handicap winner Allez Wonder (Redoute's Choice) and the Gr.3 Chairman's Handicap winner Pretty Pins (NZ) (Pins).

"He really is a big, strong and imposing horse and we're looking

forward to the rest of his racing career before he comes to Waikato Stud," Chittick said.

Tivaci will stand this spring alongside Savabeel, Pins, Ocean Park, Sacred Falls, Rock 'N' Pop and Rios.

Ecuador (NZ) (High Chaparral)

Ecuador aiming for G1 breakthrough

An unorthodox lead-in to the Australian Cup is no concern for the connections of **Ecuador (NZ)** (High Chaparral) who will be chasing his first Group One win in the weight-for-age race.

The Gai Waterhouse and Adrian Bott-trained seven-year-old has had four 1400m starts so far this campaign and now steps to 2000m in Saturday's A\$1.5 million feature at Flemington.

Bott admitted the original plan had been to head to the Australian Cup via the Gr.2 Peter Young Stakes (1800m) but instead the stable decided to give him his chance in the Gr.1 Futurity Stakes over 1400m where he finished third.

"We don't have any concerns stepping up in trip," Bott said. [Full story here.](#)

Bowman key to success

Trainer Bryce Heys is banking on the big race prowess of Hugh Bowman to find a winning path for his New Zealand-bred sprinter **Spieth (NZ)** (Thorn Park) in Saturday's Gr.1 Newmarket Handicap at Flemington.

Heys' talented son of Thorn Park has drawn the ace, which isn't seen as the ideal gate for the four-year-old.

"If I had the option of choosing a barrier for Spieth, the inside wouldn't be my top

choice," he said.

"He is a horse that needs room, but you never know how the race will unfold, it may work out on Saturday.

"Hughie will come up with a plan, he knows how to ride the straight course."



La Bella Diosa (NZ) (So You Think)

Coolmore for Kiwi filly

Top New Zealand filly **La Bella Diosa (NZ)** (So You Think) will be out to score her second Group One win in tomorrow's A\$600,000 Coolmore Classic at Rosehill.

Jay Ford is booked for the ride and the pair have done favourably in the barrier draw and will start from gate three.

The Gr.1 New Zealand 1000 Guineas winner was successful in her Australian debut in the Gr.2 Surround Stakes at Randwick where she beat Saturday's race rivals Omei Sword (High Chaparral) and Global Glamour (Star Witness).

La Bella Diosa's main autumn aim is the \$A1 million Gr.1 ATC Oaks at Randwick on April 8.



Kawi (NZ) (Savabeel)

Sharrock banking on class factor

Allan Sharrock will be relying on **Kawi's (NZ)** (Savabeel) quality to overcome a potentially testing track on Saturday.

The Taranaki trainer will be hoping his star six-year-old can post his seventh Group One success in the Bonecrusher New Zealand

Stakes at Ellerslie.

"A heavy track would put me in a bit of a quandary," Sharrock said. "But what else is there for him?"

"It's still basically a summer track and it won't be as testing as a heavy track at Ellerslie in June and the race won't hurt him. His class gets him a long way and that Savabeel toughness will also help."

Kawi has recorded three Group One wins and a fifth from his four New Zealand starts this term with his most recent success in the Haunui Farm WFA Classic.

"I couldn't be happier with him," Sharrock said. "I thought he was pretty dominant over the last four strides at Otaki and he has trained on exceptionally well. I think he has improved again."



Mister Impatience (Hernando)

Distance expert in fine fettle for Cup tilt

Marathon man **Mister Impatience (Hernando)** is in prime order to turn his stable's Group One fortunes around at the Ellerslie carnival.

The two-mile specialist will strip at the top of his game for tomorrow's Barfoot & Thompson Auckland Cup for trainers Mike Moroney and Pam Gerard, who were out of luck last weekend.

The Matamata trainers had been confident of top level success with Savile Row (NZ) (Makfi) in the Gr.1 New Zealand Derby, but he colt raced ungenerously and failed to threaten. [Full story here.](#)

Myer Classic winner **I Am a Star (NZ)** (I Am Invincible) is a dominant early favourite in tomorrow's Gr.2 Kewney Stakes (1400m).

I Am A Star has had two Caulfield runs this preparation for a brave first-up second to Super Cash (Written Tycoon) in the Gr.2 Rubiton Stakes (1100m) and last start seventh to Sheidel (Holy Roman Emperor) in the Gr.1 Oakleigh Plate (1100m).

Going up from 50kg that run, where she did it tough from barrier 16 of 17, I Am A Star carries 55.5kg under the set weights conditions of the Kewney Stakes and has drawn barrier four with Dean Yendall.

The A\$200,000 feature has attracted a final field of fifteen three-year-old fillies which also includes Navagio (NZ) (Zacinto) and Savaju (NZ) (Savabeel).

Marsh bullish about Eilerslie prospects

Waller duo aim high

Chris Waller's **Antonio Giuseppe (NZ)** (Shocking) has been installed as the odds on favourite for Saturday's Gr.3 Sky High Stakes (2000m) at Rosehill.

The four-year-old gelding has drawn barrier five for the Group Three which features a trio of his stablemates in Grand Marshall (Dansili), **Who Shot Thebarman (NZ)** (Yamanin Vital) and Libran (Lawman).

The Trent Busuttin/Natalie Young-trained Tavago (NZ) (Tavistock) is considered one of Antonio Giuseppe's closest rivals and will jump from barrier three.

Antonio Giuseppe has won five of his six starts this season, the other being a Group One second in the Metropolitan where he stepped up to 2400m.

St Leger hope on a winning roll

Napoleon (NZ) (Shinko King) is in career-best form as he continues to win his way toward his first black type challenge.

The Otaki stayer has been set for the Listed Lincoln Farms New Zealand St Leger on Saturday week and Rachael Frost is confident the four-year-old will relish the 2500 metre distance of the Trentham feature.

"We'll see whether he's up to that class, but at least I know that he'll stay," the Otaki trainer said. [Full story here.](#)

Abscess ends Auckland Cup hopes

A foot issue prevented the Darren Weir-trained **Lord Van Percy** (Sir Percy) from crossing the Tasman for tomorrow's Gr.1 Barfoot & Thompson Auckland Cup.

"He had a foot abscess, it was nothing serious but it was a long way to go with him not quite being 100 per cent," Weir's racing manager Jeremy Rogers said.

Meanwhile, the stable is bullish about the prospects of the former New Zealand-trained **Humidor (NZ)** (Teofilo) in Saturday's Gr.1 Australian Cup.

"He's really well and he's a seriously good horse," Rogers said.

Humidor has finished in the money in all three of his starts since joining Weir's stable, including a most recent second in the Gr.2 Peter Young Stakes at Caulfield.

Riddell booked for Oaks hope

Jonathan Riddell will partner **Devise (NZ)** (Darci Brahma) in the Gr.1 Wellfield New Zealand Oaks at Trentham on Saturday week.

"Jason was also narrowly beaten on Zurella when Artistic won. It's a shame the way it's worked out, but Jonathan isn't lacking strength or quality when it comes to Group One races."



Sacred Elixir (NZ) (Pour Moi)

Elixir to bypass Guineas

Group One winner **Sacred Elixir (NZ)** (Pour Moi) will not contest the Gr.1 Rosehill Guineas on Saturday week and will head towards the Gr.1 Australian Derby on April 1 without another run.

Trainer Tony Pike was pleased with the run of Sacred Elixir when fifth in last Saturday's Gr.1 New Zealand Derby.

"He's bounced through the race really well," Pike said. "Obviously, we had a few question marks going into the race as to whether he'd come up quite as well as he had in Brisbane and Melbourne, but I couldn't fault him after the race."

"He got a long way back in a slowly run race, after two of the on-speed runners did things wrong coming out of the barriers,

but his sectionals were very good, with the fastest last 600 metres and 400 metres of the race.

"He's on the way back up and if he pleases us in the next couple of weeks then he'll go straight to the ATC Derby.

"We probably won't run in the Rosehill Guineas. He's got plenty of mileage in his legs. We will give him an exhibition gallop or two and if we're happy he will fly to Sydney on the Monday before the Derby."



Gingernuts (NZ) (Iffraaj)

Odds shortening on Sydney trip

Sydney is the favoured next destination for the Gr.1 New Zealand Derby winner

"He has come through the race unbelievably well," Te Akau principal David Ellis said.

Easter mile target for Natuzzi

Top-line sprinter **Natuzzi (NZ)** (Coats Choice) will step up in distance at his next appearance in the Gr.2 Manco Easter Stakes.

"The Easter is at set-weights and penalties and not a handicap so we'll aim him toward that," trainer Paul Richards said.

"He won over a mile as a three-year-old and he was just beaten in the Haunui Farm Classic a couple of years ago.

"The statistics say his best distance is 1200 metres, but now he is older he has lost that bit of zip."

Runner-up in the Gr.1 NRM Sprint two runs back, Natuzzi came from the outside gate to finish a last-start fifth in the Gr.3 Darley Plate.

"When he has to go right back it's tough on him if they don't go hard up front," Richards said.

Transfer on the cards

Lincoln Blue's (NZ) (Savabeel) connections are mulling over a change of

The stakes winning son of Savabeel blotted his copybook when he finished well back in the Gr.1 New Zealand Derby after bucking out of the gates.

"It was very disappointing and we don't know what caused that, we're still guessing," trainer Lisa Latta said.

"We're looking at Sydney for him and he may transfer to another stable, we're looking at all the options at the moment."

A brother to the Gr.1 Queensland Derby winner Brambles (NZ), Lincoln Blue won the Gr.3 Wellington Stakes and the Listed 3YO Salver earlier in the season.

Rising Red chasing more Derby spoils

Trent Busuttin is confident his Gr.1 New Zealand Derby runner-up **Rising Red (NZ)** (Redwood) can cope with his busy future schedule.

"He'll be in Sydney, he'll be in Brisbane, he'll be everywhere - they are only three once," he said.

"Whether we run in the Rosehill Guineas or not, we'll see if he needs it. But he'll certainly be running in the Derby all going well."

Rising Red was gallant in defeat at Ellerslie where he was forced to cover extra ground from a wide gate.

"The barrier beat him it's as simple as that," said Busuttin, who trains with his partner Natalie Young. "He drew 17 and he had to work for the first half of the race.

"He was three-deep doing it tough and the winner had the drop on him, but that's racing and that's barrier draws. He's done us

proud and we couldn't be happier with the horse."

Remembering our Hall Of Fame Heroes Kindergarten

During a career constantly impeded by unsoundness, Kindergarten raced to the age of nine but had just 35 starts. He won 25 of them, including three of the greatest weight-carrying performances of his or any era.

As a three-year-old, Kindergarten won ten of 13 races, with those ten coming in a row after starting the season with three minor placings. Among his victories as a

three-year-old were the Great Northern Derby, Wellington Cup and the first of his two victories in the ARC Easter Handicap, in which he carried 9 st 11 lb, the highest weight ever carried to victory in the race by a three-year-old.

His Auckland Cup victory in 1942 is regarded as his greatest performance. He carried 10st 2 lb (17 lb over Weight for Age) in a high-quality field and beat them by five lengths in a then track record time of 3 minutes 22 seconds.

Though Kindergarten never got the chance to prove his class in Australia due to the uncertainties of war, the opinion held of him by the Melbourne handicapper was apparent when he was accorded top

weight for three successive Melbourne Cups.
