## CUP VICTORY FUELS FLEMINGTON DREAM

A crack at this year's Gr.1 Melbourne Cup (3200m) edged a step closer for **Ladies First (NZ)** (Dylan Thomas) at Ellerslie where she passed the sternest test of her stamina with flying colours.

The mare overcame a torrid early trip to triumph in Saturday's Gr.1 Barfoot & Thompson Auckland Cup (3200m) with her never say die attitude leaving her New Plymouth trainer Allan Sharrock shaking his head.

"She was posted three wide around one bend and then

two bends and I said she can't win," he said.

"I'm rapt, but I did think she had got beaten on the line. I'm a bit shocked really – I thought she had run second.

"They all thought she was a wet-tracker, but her last three wins have been on firm tracks.

Ladies First prevailed by the barest of margins to successfully execute a long-term plan and thoughts are now turning to another Cup.

“We’ve pulled her out of the Sydney Cup and she’ll go to the paddock and then we’ll be looking at the Livamol Classic and the Melbourne Cup,” Sharrock said.

The daughter of Dylan Thomas may provide owners Humphrey and Fiona O’Leary with another crack at the famous Flemington race as they are also part-owners of Who Shot Thebarman (NZ) (Yamanin Vital), who ran third in the 2014 Cup behind Protectionist (Monsun).

After Ladies First was caught out on a limb early, rider Johnathan Parkes pressed forward to get one off the fence on the pace.

The five-year-old challenged early in the run home and rounded off a lionhearted effort to pip Five To Midnight (NZ) (Domesday) by a nose with Wildflower (NZ) (Keeper) a short neck back in third. Alinko Prince (NZ) (Alamosa) was just a long neck back in fourth.

“It was such a brave effort,” Parkes said. “I wanted to get handy, but she didn’t have the gate speed to get across and I got caught three wide.

“I thought I would let her roll and she fought so hard to the line. It was a very good performance.”

# TALENTED YOUNGSTER TOO SHARP IN SISTEMA

**S**word Of Osman (NZ) (Savabeel) has taken pole position in the race for this season's champion two-year-old honours.

The slick son of Savabeel went to the top of the juvenile rankings when he produced another powerful front-running performance to win Saturday's Gr.1 Sistema Stakes (1200m) at Ellerslie off the back of his runaway success in the Gr.3 Reid & Harrison Slipper (1200m).

Trained by Stephen Autridge and Jamie Richards, Sword of Osman has now won three of his four starts with his sole defeat coming in the Karaka Million (1200m).

Autridge said their pre-race Sistema plan was to let the gelding continue his customary pacemaking role and those instructions were perfectly executed by ride Opie Bosson, who

had labelled the youngster a special talent before he had raced.

"The whole race he relaxed beautifully in front," Bosson said. "He changed legs a few times, but he just kept running. He's very, very good."

Sword Of Osman had a length and a quarter to spare on stablemate Avantage (Fastnet Rock) at the post with Spanish Whisper (Lope De Vega) third ahead of Bocce (Foxwedge). The favourite Melt (NZ) (Iffraaj) ran sixth and looked to have her chance.

"He's amazing. He's like a three-year-old now," Bosson said. "I can't wait for his three-year-old career."

The Karaka Million (1200m) winner Avantage may have suffered the first

defeat of her five-start career, but she was far from disgraced.

By design, she was taken back to last by rider Matthew Cameron from her outside and the Fastnet Rock filly made ground strongly in the run home.

# GALLANT GREY IN LINE FOR OVERSEAS VENTURE

Murray Baker and Andrew Forsman are likely to be scouring Australian racing programmes for **Saint Emilion (NZ)** (Mastercraftsman) following the grand front-runner's success at Ellerslie.

The Cambridge trainers will be seriously tempted to look further afield after they produced the grey for a career-best performance in Saturday's Gr.1 Bonecrusher New Zealand Stakes (2000m) at Ellerslie.

"We'll see what's about and think about Sydney and Brisbane, we'll be looking at all the options," Forsman said.

Saint Emilion coasted along in his customary role in front under jockey Leith Innes and he held a strong gallop to the post for the 13th win of his

career.

"It worked out perfectly and Leith rode him a treat, in that mood he's hard to catch," Forsman said. "He was just cruising and he really deserved that."

Saint Emilion was one of three runners in the race for the stable, but Lizzie L'Amour (NZ) (Zabeel) and Nicoletta (NZ) (Savabeel) failed to run up to their best form and were unplaced.

"They were both disappointing and maybe victims of a tracks that has dried out," Forsman said.

By contrast, the going was ideal for Saint Emilion and Innes said the son of Mastercraftsman had the race sewn up a long way out.

"At the 1200m I felt pretty confident. He was enjoying his work. Murray and Andrew always have them very fit and it's great to pick up a Group One for them.

"He's a grand old horse and he horse deserved it."

The Wanganui mare Darscape Princess (NZ) (Darci Brahma) gave an outstanding account of herself in her first Group One outing with a strong finishing run earning her second money.

"I'm obviously very, very proud of her," trainer Fraser Auret said. "She's only a four-year-old and I'm looking forward to next season."

Authentic Paddy (NZ) (Howbaddouwantit) was on the pace all the way and he battled on bravely for third with Savvy Dreams (NZ) (Savabeel) getting home late for fourth.

# KARAVALI CLAIMS GROUP 3 ASPIRATION QUALITY

**T**rainer Kris Lees will approach the Group Three Epona Stakes with confidence after **Karavali (NZ)** (Nadeem) won at black-type level at the first attempt.

And Newcastle Lees expects the four-year-old mare to pose an even greater threat at Rosehill March 24 after she got the bob in to pip \$3 favourite The Pinnacle in the Group Three City Ford Aspiration Quality

(1600m) at Randwick.

Karavali claimed a tight finish under the in-form Jason Collett to win by a head while fast-finishing Nettoyer (Sebring) filled the minor placing, a half-head further back.

"She's come back in really good order and it's nice to get some black-type," Lees said.

He said the Epona Stakes over 1900m in a fortnight was the next goal

of this preparation.

"I think she's got more wins in store when she gets over a bit of ground. I think she'll be suited again at 1900 (metres)."

Karavali is in her third preparation since coming from New Zealand in 2016, and Lees noticed a key enhancement when this campaign started at Canterbury last month.

"Her manners have improved, that's the most important thing," he said.

"She always had a lot of ability, but she has been a bit of a handful on race day. She's getting race confidence, you can't beat winning."

# LANCIATO IN LAST-TO-FIRST WIN AT NEWCASTLE

**L**anciato (NZ) (Per Incanto) has staged a dramatic last-to-first performance to win the Newcastle Gr.3 Newmarket Handicap (1400m) and set himself up for a tilt at the Group One Doncaster Mile.

His trainer Mark Newnham admitted he was a hard horse to watch because of his racing pattern and his supporters who sent him out the \$3.80 favourite in Friday's Group Three 1400m-feature had some anxious moments.

But Rachel King didn't panic, steering the gelding to the outside when she couldn't find a run and he picked up under her urgings to beat Mister Sea Wolf (Amadeus) by more than a length.

"He is a hard horse to watch because he leaves you wondering

whether he will make it in time," Newnham told Sky Thoroughbred Central.

"It's a big advantage having someone like Rachel with the faith to ride him like that."

Newnham said the \$3 million Doncaster Mile at Randwick on April 7 was the target but Lanciato needed a few things to go his way, including a firm track.

"We don't get many dry Doncasters lately," he said.

"But yes it is an aim."

Newnham, who is in his second season as a trainer after many years at Tulloch Lodge with Gai Waterhouse, operates stables at Randwick and Warwick Farm where Lanciato is stabled.

King, who recently outrode her

apprentices' claim, thanked Newnham for sticking with her.

"I'm so lucky Mark is loyal to me," she said.

"Everything panned out.

"He (Lanciato) is unbelievable. His turn of foot is unreal."

Lanciato has 50kg in the Doncaster, a weight within King's range, and is now at \$26.

# MARE BACKS UP FOR ANOTHER ROYAL RESULT

**Rikki Tikki Tavi (NZ)** (Tavistock) continued a lucrative preparation with further success at Ellerslie on Saturday.

The Ruakaka-prepared mare had won by a narrow margin in Rating 75 company on the course seven days previously and she stepped up in grade to stage a repeat performance with a slender victory in the Winger Maserati 1200m.

The Donna Logan and Chris Gibbs -trained Tavistock four-year-old has been beaten just once in five appearances this campaign and had to overcome a wide barrier in her most recent success.

“She quickened up smartly as I had to go back from a wide barrier and the splits came in the straight,” regular rider Samantha Collett said.

“Full credit to the Logan and Gibbs camp, they wouldn’t have backed her up if she wasn’t up to it.”

Rikki Tikki Tavi was at the tail of the field on the home turn and she got home strongly to beat Ja Binks (NZ) (Falkirk) and Howbowdat (NZ) (Any Suggestion) in a driving finish.

“She was very brave, she’s not very big but she’s tough,” Gibbs said.

The stable had also won the previous event, the Crombie Lockwood 2100m with the consistent Richie McHorse (NZ) (Redoute’s Choice).

A winner at Ruakaka four runs back, he had finished runner-up in two subsequent appearances before further success at Ellerslie.

By Redoute’s Choice out of the Gr.1 New Zealand Oaks (2400m) winner Boundless (NZ) (Van

Nistelrooy), the five-year-old is raced by breeders Trelawney Stud.

Richie McHorse won his first two races from the stable of Team Rogerson before he transferred to his current quarters to take advantage of the Ruakaka environment and ease the load on his legs.

“We just work him on the beach in straight lines,” Gibbs said.

# KENT MAKES PRESENCE FELT

Group One-winning Australian trainer Mick Kent made his mark at Trentham on Saturday.

The Cranbourne-based conditioner is the part-owner of the Ocean Park filly **Miss Valencia (NZ)**, who was successful in the Crombie Lockwood NZ Ltd 2YO Maiden (1000m).

She raced on the pace for jockey Samantha Wynne and, after taking control 300m from home, she rounded off strongly to win at her second appearance after a solid debut third last month.

“She’s a filly we’ve got a lot of time for and a typical Ocean Park (NZ) (Thorn Park), she’s going to be much better at three,” said Hollie Wynyard, who trains with her partner Johno Benner.

“She went really well on debut and she’s got quite a long sprint so we told Sam to get her into the open and rolling.

“She could to go to the paddock now, but we’ll just wait and see how she comes through this race first.”

Miss Valencia was purchased out of Phoenix Park’s draft at Karaka in 2017 by Cambridge bloodstock agent Phill Cataldo for \$47,500. She is raced by Kent with Waikato Stud’s bloodstock manager Kerrie Cox and her husband

She is out of the Fastnet Rock mare Pastrana and the family of the Gr.1 T. J. Smith Stakes (1600m) winner Sizzling (Snitzel), now standing at Newgate Farm in New South Wales.

Miss Valencia was chased home by the Stephen Autridge and Jamie Richards-trained Byzantine (NZ) (Savabeel), who went close to giving jockey Shafiq Rusof a perfect start to his second riding spell in New Zealand. He has returned after a successful stint in Singapore where he was twice crowned champion apprentice.

Byzantine made the pace and kicked on bravely while another debutante in Allan Sharrock’s London

Express (NZ) (Shamexpress) made ground strongly from the back for third.
