# BAKER MARSHALLING SYDNEY TROOPS

hampion Kiwi trainer Murray Baker is sweating on a scratching to allow his emerging three-year-old Mongolian Marshal (NZ) (High Chaparral) his shot at Gr.1 Rosehill Guineas (2000m) glory on Saturday.

Baker and his training partner Andrew Forsman have made no secret of how highly they regard the two-win High Chaparral gelding, who races in the same colours as their 2015 Gr.1 Australian Derby (2400m) winner Mongolian Khan (Holy Roman Emperor).

Baker was rapt with barrier draws for his three Rosehill Guineas candidates - barrier three for Gr.1 New Zealand Derby (2400m) winner Vin De Dance (NZ) (Roc de Cambes), eight for Mission Hill (Teofilo) and barrier two for Mongolian Marshal - but his more pressing concern was seeing the latter promoted from one on the ballot to gaining a start.

"They're outstanding draws but I just hope Mongolian Marshal makes the field," Baker said.

"If it gets wet, things could change."

With rain forecast for Sydney over the next three days, Rosehill is likely to be rain-affected which could prompt some connections to scratch and tackle Saturday week's Gr.2 Tulloch Stakes (2000m) at Rosehill in the hope of superior track conditions.

"A rain-affected track shouldn't worry our three too much. They should all go on it," Baker said.

Baker, who produced Dundeel (NZ) (High Chaparral) to win the Rosehill Guineas-Australian Derby double in 2013, said Rosehill Guineas preparations for his trio had gone to the letter.

"Vin De Dance did win the New Zealand Derby and he goes in the wet. He's a good, strong horse and he's gone on well since his win at Ellerslie.

"Mission Hill hasn't had a lot of luck in his last two but he's a good stayer and he can make his mark with the right run, while Mongolian Marshal is our horse on the way up.

"We're happy with them. They're well and they'll have their chance. It's a strong race but a bit of rain could level it up."

TAB bookmakers have Vin De Dance, to be ridden by his Derby-winning jockey Jason Waddell, as a \$6 third favourite in a market headed by Gr.1 Spring Champion Stakes (2000m) and Gr.1 Victoria Derby (2500m) winner Ace High at \$4.80.

Should Mongolian Marshal not gain a start in the Rosehill Guineas, both he and **Weather With You** (Teofilo) will tackle the Tulloch Stakes with a view to backing up in the Gr.1 \$A2 million Australian Derby (2400m) at Randwick seven days later.

"The Derby is the race we target. It's a different race when you get to Randwick," Baker said.

Baker has won the Australian Derby on four occasions in the past 10 runnings - Nom Du Jeu (NZ) (Montjeu) in 2008, Dundeel in 2013, Mongolian Khan in 2015 and Jon Snow (NZ) (Iffraaj) last year.

He has won the Tulloch Stakes four times too, with (Our) Palliser (NZ) (Palatable) in 1987, The Bill (NZ) (Grosvenor) in 1993, Harris Tweed (NZ) (Montjeu) in 2009 and Jon Snow last year.

# SEABROOK FLYING KIWI FLAG IN SLIPPER

n inspired purchase has New Zealand interest in the world's richest two-year-old race centred on **Seabrook (NZ)** (Hinchinbrook).

The Mick Price-trained filly goes into Saturday's A\$3.5 million Gr.1 Golden Slipper (1200m) at Rosehill as a strong contender following her last-start win in the Gr.2 Sweet Embrace Stakes (1200m) at Randwick.

The Kiwi-bred youngster is out of Don Eduardo's unraced daughter Midnight Revels, who was purchased in foal to Hinchinbrook by Tauranga breeder Warwick Jeffries.

"I bought the mare through Brett Howard's Randwick Bloodstock Agency three years ago," he said.

"I liked the pedigree and at that

stage Hinchinbrook was unproven, but he was a Group winner and a half-brother to Snitzel by Fastnet Rock - I thought he was a good chance at stud.

"Seabrook always had a gorgeous temperament and she was a big, strong early-maturing filly.

"The mare's by Don Eduardo, who's got that blueblood, and the female side is all speed."

A half-sister to the Group Three-winning juvenile My Emotion (NZ) (Savabeel), Midnight Revels is from the family of the Group One-winning sprinter Malaguerra (Magnus) and the stakes-winning two-year-olds Tennessee Morn (Bletchingly) and Tennessee Midnight (Danehill).

"The Slipper's a tough 1200m and hopefully she gets a clear run and is challenging hard in the last 100m. It wouldn't be the worst thing if she drew out a bit," Jeffries said.

She will be bidding to become the first New Zealand-bred to win the Golden Slipper since Pompeii Court's daughter Courtza was successful in 1989.

Jeffries sold Seabrook for A\$85,000 at a Melbourne Sale and has subsequently sent Midnight Revels to Proisir.

"That's what I bought her for, I've got a share in the stallion," he said.

Jeffries sold a colt by the Rich Hill Stud resident at Karaka earlier this year for \$100,000.

"I've got the full-brother in the paddock and he's a beauty," he said. "The mare's empty and I'll have a think where she'll go later this year. Whatever happens on Saturday, Seabrook's done a good job with a Group Two win."

Hugh Bowman rode Seabrook to win the Sweet Embrace, but she will have a change of rider on Saturday with Damien Oliver booked.

Damien Oliver is one of only seven jockeys to have captured the four big races of the Australian calendar.

His bag includes two Cox Plates, three Melbourne Cups and four Caulfield Cups.

Success aboard Seabrook in Saturday's Golden Slipper Stakes at Rosehill would give him a second victory after Forensics (Flying Spur) won in 2007 and make him the first rider to win a double grand slam.

## Ranvet effort to decide Consensus' programme

The duration of **Consensus' (NZ)** (Postponed) Sydney stay will be decided by her performance on Saturday.

She will make her Australian debut in the Gr.1 Ranvet Stakes (2000m) at Rosehill, in which she will be ridden by expatriate Kiwi jockey Jason Collett.

"She's a six-year-old now in the autumn of her career so she deserves her chance over there," trainer Stephen McKee said.

"A lot depends on Saturday, but she'll probably only have a couple of runs and if she does run well then we'll have another go at a big one."

#### **Sydney Cup beckons Charles Road**

Well-performed stayer **Charles Road** (Myboycharlie) is pencilled in for The Championships.

A lucrative domestic campaign has the Matamata four-year-old on the verge of a trip across the Tasman in a quest for Group One honours.

"If he comes through the next couple of weeks well we're going to take him to Sydney," said Andrew Scott, who prepares the son of Myboycharlie with Lance O'Sullivan.

"He'll run in the Chairman's and all going well into the Sydney Cup."

#### Long Leaf over the odds: Hayes

Champion trainer David Hayes is convinced his Golden Slipper contenders are better chances than their odds suggest.

Hayes and the rest of the Lindsay Park training partnership has Blue Diamond Stakes runner-up Enbihaar (Magnus) and dual stakes winning colt **Long Leaf** (Fastnet Rock) in Saturday's \$3.5 million race at Rosehill, while Qafila (Not A Single Doubt) is first emergency.

Enbihaar was at \$41 on Thursday while Long Leaf was at \$81.

Long Leaf went into the Blue Diamond as one of the leading chances after winning his first three starts but the colt finished 12th.

He has blinkers replacing winkers for the first time on Saturday.

"He'll be a different horse come Slipper day," Hayes said.

"I've always thought about putting blinkers on him but he kept winning so I never changed."

Hayes anticipates the colt will settle back from a wide gate and hopefully run home strongly.

"His trial at home was outstanding in the blinkers," Hayes said.

"He's got a bad gate but we'll probably ride him patiently in the mould of Von Costa De Hero who just got beaten by an inch by Sebring (in 2008). He's huge each-way odds." AAP



Age Of Fire (Fastnet Rock)

#### Trip key to Age of Fire

A step up in distance is expected to bring an improved showing from **Age Of Fire** 

(Fastnet Rock) in Saturday's Gr.1 Rosehill Guineas (2000m).

He will be coming off an unplaced effort in his Australian debut in the Gr.1 Randwick Guineas (1600m), in which he found the competition too sharp over a mile.

"I thought he was okay. He drew awkwardly, and he's got another one (15) on Saturday, and had to go back in a quick race," said Jamie Richards, who trains with Stephen Autridge.

"His work since has been very good and 2000m is what he's looking for now. He's been out to the beach a couple of times and he's enjoyed that."

#### Valuable filly's future undecided

The connections of New Zealand Bloodstock Filly of the Year **Dijon Bleu (NZ)** (Burgundy) have yet to decide whether she will race again.

The multiple stakes winner is currently side-lined by a tendon strain that cut short her preparation for the Gr.1 New Zealand Oaks (2400m).

After an outstanding spring and summer campaign, Dijon Bleu had built up a commanding lead in the race for the fillies' title and could only have been denied the crown had the Trentham classic runner-up Contessa Vanessa gone one better on Saturday.

"We're very, very proud of her," Dijon Bleu's part-owner and trainer Lisa Latta said. "We're looking at all the options, she's worth a lot of money as a breeding proposition and she hasn't got anything left to prove."

#### 3YO earns second derby chance

**The Mayor's (NZ)** (Rock'n' Pop) luckless run in the Gr.1 New Zealand Derby (2400m) convinced his New Zealand connections to try their luck across the Tasman.

The three-year-old is now with champion Sydney trainer Chris Waller and will debut from his new quarters in Saturday's Gr.1 Rosehill Guineas (2000m) under the new name The Lord Mayor.

"His last two runs have had a lot of merit," part-owner and bloodstock agent Michael Hughes said. "He was trapped wide in the Avondale Guineas and then Plan A, B, C and D didn't work out in the Derby.

"By the time they got to the top of the straight I think Rory (Hutchings) was on to Plan E."

(Howbaddouwantit) will make his next appearance in a set weights and penalties feature on his home track at the end of the month.

"He's doing well and he'll go to the Awapuni Gold Cup, there's not a lot else for him," trainer Lisa Latta said.

Authentic Paddy won the Gr.1 Zabeel Classic (2000m) on Boxing Day and bounced back from three unplaced runs for a last-start third in the Gr.1 New Zealand Stakes (2000m).

"He had a few wide draws and a foot problem, but he's good now," Latta said.

#### Logan's Singapore squad taking shape

New Kranji trainer Donna Logan's budding yard grew further when the horse heralded as the one to spearhead her team, multiple-Group One winner **Volkstok'n'barrell (NZ)** (Tavistock), landed in Singapore on Thursday.

The 56-year-old New Zealander has in the meantime already begun the preparation of ten horses in earnest. They all hail from her former Ruakaka yard, which she used to share with training partner Chris Gibbs.

From the first arrivals on January 26 to the latest, two unnamed two-year-olds by Helmet and Dawn Approach, who just moved into their boxes on Monday (15 more are tagged to follow suit later), Logan couldn't be happier with the way things have evolved since her arrival with husband Peter Woods on February 7.

#### Scott Base heads for a spell

Quality three-year-old **Scott Base (NZ)** (Dalghar) has gone for a spell after his victory in the Gr.2 Wellington Guineas (1400m) on Saturday.

"He pulled up really well, but we have decided to put him in the paddock," said Hollie Wynyard, who trains the Dalghar gelding with partner Johno Benner.

"There's not really anything else for him in New Zealand to prove anymore. Just with the issues that we have had with him it's a bit risky to go to Australia so he's going to be back for the spring."

Scott Base was purchased out of Brighthill Farm's 2016 New Zealand Bloodstock Select Yearling Sale draft by co-owner Chris Rutten for \$70,000.

#### New stables development for Ellerslie

Auckland Racing Club has unveiled plans for a new stables development, further cementing its reputation as one of the best racecourses in the Southern Hemisphere – all whilst staying true to its history and heritage.

Building work worth in excess of \$6 million, which will see tie-up stalls for 126

horses created alongside a warm-up ring, veterinary boxes & office, function room and trainers' cafe, is due to start immediately and will be completed in time for November's Melbourne Cup meeting.

Seventy-per-cent of the current stable block will be demolished to make way for the development, comprising of four separate buildings built around the central parade ring.

#### **Passing of NZTBA stalwart**

New Zealand Thoroughbred Breeders' Association life member William Roberts (Robin) Archer, who died in Auckland recently aged 87, was also successful in business, active in the community and achieved fame in rugby and racing.

An Otago and Southland representative - he captained the latter province to a Ranfurly Shield victory against Taranaki in 1959 - he also gained test match honours with the All Blacks.

In 1957, Robin married Muriel Charleson, who supported and shared all his sporting

interests, especially thoroughbred racing and breeding.

Their major racing achievements stemmed from their 1981 purchase of a yearling filly by Alvaro out of Honey Carlyle. Named McAngus, she was trained in Gore by Alan Borthwick to a pair of metropolitan wins and a series of stakes placings. She was subsequently the dam of three-time New Zealand Broodmare of the Year Songline and grand-dam of Australian and New Zealand Hall of Fame champion Sunline.

Jordan Grob opened his winning account in New Zealand on Wednesday with success aboard the Tony Pike-trained **Sacredvista** (Fastnet Rock) at Te Teko.

The visiting Victorian apprentice, who is enjoying a spell with Michael Moroney and Pam Gerard's Matamata stable, made the running aboard the daughter of Fastnet Rock, who kicked strongly in the run home to break her maiden in the Ash & Oak Arborists 3YO 1200m.

"It's good to get the first one, it's taken a while," Grob said. "She's a nice filly going places and she's in the right yard."

Pike said Sacredvista, a sister to Long Leaf and from the family of Terravista (Captain Rio) and Tiger Tees (NZ) (Dubawi), had trialled well after a freshen-up since last

#### Stablemates target champion stakes

**Azaboy (NZ)** (Azamour) and **Time Lord (NZ)** (Guillotine) have been set for the Gr.2 Valachi Downs Champion Stakes (2100m) on their home track at Pukekohe on April 21.

Trainer Richard Collett said Azaboy was a gallant last-start sixth after being caught wide from an outside barrier while Time Lord was unplaced in the Gr.1 New Zealand Derby (2400m) at Ellerslie where he raced too keenly.

Meanwhile, stakes-winning stablemate Untamed Diamond (Snitzel) has been turned out to recover from a muscular issue.

#### Black type goal for mare

Promising five-year-old **Porcelain Princess (NZ)** (Sir Percy) has been set for the Gr.3 Manawatu Breeders' Stakes (2000m) at Awapuni on April 6.

"She's going well and it looks a nice race for her," said trainer Fraser Auret, who won the fillies and mares' event in 2012 with Mini Pearl (NZ) (Black Minnaloushe).

Quality mare **Montoya Star** (High Chaparral) has breezed through her impressive Gr.3 Cuddle Stakes (1600m) victory at Trentham and is on target for higher honours.

"Originally, we were going to run her in an \$80,000 here at Riccarton on Saturday, but she'll definitely be going to Te Aroha now," co-trainer Michael Pitman said.

The Gr.1 Fiber Fresh New Zealand Thoroughbred Breeders' Stakes (1600m) will be next on the list for the High Chaparral five-year-old.

"She's got an explosive turn of foot and I was very confident with her last Saturday," Pitman said.

#### Power relocated to Queensland

Group One winner **Power** has been relocated from Cambridge Stud to Oaklands Stud in Queensland.

The nine-year-old son of Oasis Dream's leading representatives include the Gr.2 Wakefield Challenge Stakes (1100m) winner Gift Of Power and the Gr.3 Anglesey Stakes (1200m) winner and Group One performer Peace Envoy.

Power was the leading first-season sire in New Zealand during the 2016-17 season.

## Strong demand in latest gavelhouse.com NZ auction

The latest gavelhouse.com New Zealand auction concluded on Monday night, with a pleasing total of \$266,200 worth of bloodstock traded and an 87% clearance rate.

With 54 Lots listed in the sale, 47 were successfully sold and the top price on the night was \$89,000 for a yearling Jakklaberry filly at Lot 11.

The turnover was the third highest since the site's launch in April 2016, sitting behind the launch auction's total of \$350,100 and last June's \$587,800 result which featured a dispersal sale where the top Lot fetched \$211,000.
