TAVAGO READY TO PEAK IN BMW

lake Shinn only needs to look at the last time Tavago (NZ) (Tavistock) raced over 2400 metres to know he is on the horse to beat in tomorrow's Gr.1 BMW Stakes (2400m) at Rosehill.

It was at Randwick last April when Tavago annihilated his opposition in the Gr.1 Australian Derby (2400m), defeating Saturday's combatant Jameka (Myboycharlie) by 3-1/4 lengths.

The Trent Busuttin and Natalie Young-trained four-year-old

was similarly dominant in the Gr.3 Sky High Stakes (2000m) at Rosehill last start and is ready to produce a peak performance on Saturday, according to Shinn.

"Third-up he's right at this top now and I expect him to be very hard to beat on Saturday," Shinn said.

"I galloped him on Tuesday and I think he's certainly made good improvement from his last run.

"Since coming to Sydney he's been thriving and his work

has been first class. He's a bit more switched on now as well and ready to run the best race of his preparation on Saturday."

As well as Jameka, Tavago is set to clash with last start Gr.1 winners Our Ivanhowe (Soldier Hollow) and Humidor (NZ) (Teofilo) but Busuttin believes his gelding is "in career best form" and will rise to the challenge.

Shinn is afforded options from barrier four and holds no concerns about the genuinely heavy Rosehill surface.

"I think the wetter the track, the better it's going to be for him," Shinn said.

LATE TAURANGA ENTRY DOES RANGIPO A MAJOR FAVOUR

ony Pike might owe a rival trainer a round or two if **Rangipo** (Stryker) lands the feature event at Tauranga this weekend.

His representative in the Gr.2 Windsor Park Stud Japan-New Zealand International Trophy found his task a whole lot easier when Kevin Myers made a late entry on Wednesday for Scapolo (NZ) (Bachelor Duke).

"He was going to have to carry 58.5kg and now Scapolo is in he's only going to carry 52.5kg," Pike said.

"That will make it a lot easier and as the class horse in the field I would expect Rangipo to race accordingly."

Pike enjoyed an outstanding three-year-old campaign with Rangipo, who won the Gr.2 Great Northern Guineas, the Gr.2 Waikato Guineas and the Gr.2 Avondale Guineas before victory in the Gr.1 New Zealand Derby.

The gelding was out of the money in one subsequent Queensland appearance and two Melbourne starts in the spring, but he has returned in good order from a break.

Rangipo resumed his domestic career in the Gr.3 Darley Plate where he finished strongly for third behind the race fit pair of Splurge (NZ) (Savabeel) and Volks Lightning (NZ) (Volksraad).

"His run at Ellerslie was super and I would have preferred a 1400 metre race before stepping straight up to a mile, but he's been working well and he's up to it," Pike said.

Safely through Tauranga, Rangipo will target the Gr.2 Manco Easter Stakes on April 22, after which he will be sent for a spell ahead of the Hawke's Bay spring carnival.

AMAZING KIDS TARGETS DUBAI FEATURE

ohn Size is a remarkable racehorse trainer, his achievements attest to that. In 2001, the Australian arrived in Hong Kong from Sydney and shook the tough circuit to its core, winning the premiership in his debut season – a feat unprecedented in Hong Kong's ultra-competitive modern era.

His patient, no-nonsense approach has seen him add seven more titles since then while in February, he became only the third handler to notch 1000 wins in Hong Kong.

But for all of that, Size, 62, has not tasted success away from home. In fact, his only forays away from Hong Kong have been to Tokyo in June for the G1 Yasuda Kinen (1600m). Seven times Size has made that journey and yet the first attempt remains his best, Armada's (NZ) (Towkay) second to the champion mare Vodka (Tanino Gimlet) in 2008.

Now he is taking aim at a new target. On Saturday, the trainer's talented five-year-old **Amazing Kids** (NZ) (Falkirk) will become his first starter in Dubai, in the G1 Al Quoz Sprint. It is an unusual break from normality for Size, who puts a lot of store by things being normal. So, why this first departure westward: why now and why this horse?

"His two runs down the Sha Tin straight, he won them both," Size offered. "That's all I've got to cling to, really. It's just his straight track form has been really good and he struggles to win a Group 1 around a bend in Hong Kong. It looks like it's a futile exercise there. This might be his chance."

Amazing Kids has won a brace of Group 3 handicaps down Sha Tin's 1000m straight, and, despite four wins around the track's turning 1200m, the Falkirk gelding has not been able to snare a big race win at that trip and track. That despite some smart efforts in elite company that ensure he will line up at the top of Meydan's 1200m turf straight as the joint secondhighest rated horse in the 12-runner field, off a mark of 119.

"I think it's all about whether he's good at the straight because if he can run well in a straight line, maybe he can run well that way at two distances," Size continued. "I'm not going to find that out in Hong Kong. I have to come to Dubai to find out.

It's not complicated, it's that simple. Sadly, we've got to take all the risks of travelling to find out, but that's life!"

The New Zealand-bred is nonetheless hale and hearty heading into his maiden overseas test. During trackwork on Thursday morning the big bay appeared to be in good condition as he jogged around a lap of the dirt track at a slow gait under regular rider David Mo.

"Generally, the horse is okay," Size said. "Performance on the day is an unknown to us at this stage because of so many different factors here. The horse appears to be good enough and his condition appears to be good enough – it's now just about what happens on race day."

La Bella Diosa (NZ) (So You Think)

Kiwi filly set to bounce back in Vinery La Bella Diosa (NZ) (So You Think) will be out to resurrect her Sydney campaign tomorrow.

Connections of the leading New Zealand filly were on a high after her debut Australian victory in the Gr.2 Surround Stakes at Randwick, but they were brought down to earth with a thud by her next performance at Rosehill.

The daughter of So You Think failed to beat a runner home in the Gr.1 Coolmore Classic, after which a scope revealed a small amount of mucus. She was also suffering from mild lower airway inflammation.

La Bella Diosa will now look to turn her form around in the Gr.1 Vinery Stud Stakes at Rosehill. Full story here.

Nurse Kitchen heading to Sydney for Vinery

The David Brideoake-trained **Nurse Kitchen (NZ**) (Savabeel) will make her Group One debut in Saturday's Vinery Stud Stakes (2000m) for fillies at Rosehill.

It will be the Group Two winner's first time over further than 1600m.

Nurse Kitchen was an impressive winner of the Group Two Fillies Classic over 1600m at Moonee Valley last spring at just her third career start.

After a pass mark in her return when seventh in the Group Three Vanity (1400m) at Flemington, Nurse Kitchen beat only one runner home in the Group Three Matron Stakes (1600m) at the same track on March 11.

"Her first-up run was good and then her second-up run was not much good but she did jar up," Brideoake said.

"Now we're in pretty good shape I think." Blake Shinn will ride Nurse Kitchen in the Vinery and Brideoake said the three-yearold worked well on Tuesday in preparation for her trip north.

Nurse Kitchen also holds a nomination for the Australian Oaks (2400m), two weeks after The Vinery.

Baker chasing further Tulloch spoils

Cambridge three-year-old **Jon Snow (NZ)** (Iffraaj) will make his Australian debut in Saturday's Gr.2 Tulloch Stakes, a Rosehill feature that co-trainer Murray Baker has fond memories of.

He first won the race 30 years ago with Palliser (NZ) (Palatable) and was then successful with The Bill (NZ) (Grosvenor) (1993) and Harris Tweed (NZ) (Montjeu) (2009), while Rios (NZ) (Hussonet) also finished runner-up (2008).

Jon Snow booked his trip across the Tasman with his last-start third in the Gr.1 New Zealand Derby behind Gingernuts (NZ) (Iffraaj) and Rising Red (NZ) (Redwood). Full story here.

Sunline Stakes For I Am A Star

Shane Nichols has opted against tackling the William Reid Stakes with I Am A Star (NZ) (I Am Invincible) and will instead run the filly in the Gr.2 Sunline Stakes (1600m) at the Moonee Valley meeting tonight.

The trainer feels the A\$200,000 race for fillies and mares fits into I Am A Star's program better than the 1200 metre feature.

"If we run in the Sunline and she's good enough to win and the weather clears up in

the Sydney then we've still got the option to go to the Doncaster or the Coolmore Legacy Stakes," Nichols said.

I Am A Star has drawn awkwardly in barrier nine, and was most recently seen winning the Gr.2 Kewney Stakes (1400m) on 11 March.

Righteous Mate on Target

Training on his own for less than 12 months, former jockey and right hand man to Gai Waterhouse, Mark Newnham has had an immediate impact on the Sydney scene and saddles up Gr.2 Tulloch Stakes hopeful **Righteous Mate (NZ)** (Savabeel).

"Righteous Mate is on track for the Derby. He has needed the two runs at a mile and needs to run on Saturday to get the miles in his legs," Newnham said.

"His work is terrific but I'm not sure about him on these heavy tracks. The 2000-metres will suit."

Sakhee to soldier on at Doomben

Group One winner **Sakhee's Soldier (NZ)** (Sakhee's Secret) has missed two barrier trials but is still expected to perform solidly on his return from an injury-enforced break at Doomben.

Sakhee's Soldier runs in Saturday's Open Handicap (1350m), his first start since finishing 11th in the Gr.2 Hollindale Stakes at the Gold Coast in May last year.

The former Kiwi was trained by Murray Baker and Andrew Forsman to win the Gr.1 New Zealand Stakes at Ellerslie in March 2015.

He was brought to Australia last year for the Brisbane winter carnival but was injured in the Hollindale Stakes and Baker and Forsman elected to leave him in Queensland.

The now six-year-old has been with Gold Coast trainer David Kelly for the past two months.

"He had a small bone chip removed from a knee. He has had three months on a water walker before coming to me and he looks well," Kelly said.

But Sakhee's Soldier's preparation for his return to racing hasn't gone completely smoothly.

"I wanted to give him a trial," Kelly said.

"But the wet weather has mucked us about. It means he might be a bit underdone for Saturday but he has had a jump-out. I would expect him to go OK on Saturday and he has a bit of class on some of these."



Pacorus (NZ) (Tavistock)

Pacorus out to enhance chances of Sydney Cup start

A Sydney Cup berth is starting to look a longshot for Cambridge stayer **Pacorus (NZ)** (Tavistock) but his odds of making the trans-Tasman trip could shorten with an emphatic win in Saturday's Drymix Cement Bay of Plenty Cup (2100m) at Tauranga.

Trainer Chris Wood had long believed the Tavistock five-year-old was an ideal prospect for the Gr.1 Sydney Cup (3200m) at Randwick on April 8.

However, the galloper has failed to improve his rating in two runs back from a summer break, leaving him in equal 28th on the order of entry for the \$A2 million feature. Full story here.



Let Me Roar (NZ) (Rip Van Winkle)

Time forces hand with quality mare Let Me Roar (NZ) (Rip Van Winkle) will have to overcome a minor set-back in her lead-up preparation if she is to successfully defend her unbeaten record this weekend.

"She went to the trials at Rotorua, but a horse went off in the barrier next to her and hit her in the eye," said Andrew Forsman, who prepares the well-related mare with Murray Baker.

"Not having a trial after a long break isn't ideal, but we need to get her rolling." Full story here.

Flamingo an impressive debutante

Pins three-year-old **Flamingo (NZ)** made the perfect start to her career at Waipukurau on Thursday with a stylish winning debut.

"We haven't put a lot of pressure on her yet and from her work we were pretty confident," said Emma Haworth, who trains the filly with her father David. "It's really pleasing and we've always thought a lot of her."

Flamingo settled toward the tail of the field and she finished well down the outside under a soft ride from Sam Weatherley.

"She got squeezed up out of the gates, but she was always travelling well and she had it won a long way out," he said.

Flamingo is owned by Waikato Stud, who also raced her stakes winning dam Bird (NZ) (Danasinga).

Racing Act to be amended

Racing Minister Nathan Guy has announced plans to amend the Racing Act 2003 and enable the introduction of charges for offshore betting operators.

"These changes will help create a more level playing field for the TAB in the face of offshore competition, and ensure that offshore operators pay their fair share back to our communities," he said.

"By law, the New Zealand Racing Board (NZRB) is the only New Zealand-based provider of racing and sports betting via the TAB.

"This system ensures any proceeds from gambling go back to the local sporting and racing activities that make that gambling possible in the first place, and that punters operate within a regulatory framework that minimises gambling harm.

"However, a growing number of New Zealanders are now gambling through offshore betting agencies who make no contribution back to our communities.

"Having consulted with the public, the Government is now preparing a Bill to amend the Racing Act 2003 to help keep the TAB competitive and retain New Zealand customers, and ensure that offshore operators pay their fair share back to our communities."



Sacred Elixir (NZ) (Pour Moi)

Gallop to decide Derby fate

Sacred Elixir's (NZ) (Pour Moi) chances of a crack at Saturday week's \$A2 million Gr.1 Australian Derby at Randwick will be decided this weekend.

"He's going to have an exhibition gallop at Tauranga on Saturday and if I am happy with his work then he will fly out to Sydney on Monday," trainer Tony Pike said.

Runner-up in the Gr.1 VRC Derby in the spring, Sacred Elixir was a last-start fifth in the Gr.1 New Zealand Derby.

"His sectionals were fantastic. I knew he wasn't going as well as he was in Brisbane or Melbourne, but in saying that he got back further than I had hoped for," Pike said.



Antonio Giuseppe (NZ) (Shocking)

Drop back in trip for Antonio

The \$A3 million Gr.1 Doncaster Handicap has become the main autumn aim for **Antonio Giuseppe (NZ)** (Shocking).

Trainer Chris Waller has changed tack and prefers Saturday week's feature to his original plan of the \$A2 million Gr.1 Sydney Cup for the New Zealand-bred son of Shocking.

Antonio Giuseppe has finished in the money over 2000 metres at his last two starts, but Waller said the four-year-old was better off over a mile in the short term.

"While it will be at some stage my intention to go back to 2400 and beyond, I don't feel that he has had the right preparation to do so this autumn.

"I therefore feel at this stage of his career, he is better suited being kept at the shorter distances. We will also endeavour to put blinkers on him in the Doncaster providing he works well in them."



Pentathlon (NZ) (Pentire)

Kiwi stayer for Sydney

Pentathion (NZ) (Pentire) is almost certain to make two appearances during The Championships in Sydney.

The John Wheeler-trained stayer is likely to use Saturday week's Gr.2 Chairman's Handicap as a lead in to the \$A2 million Sydney Cup at Randwick a week later.

A winner over 3200 metres and a commendable ninth in the Gr.1 Melbourne Cup in the spring, Pentathlon finished a last-start eighth in the Gr.1 Auckland Cup after being forced to race three wide.



Bonneval (NZ) (Makfi)

Kiwi fillies looking good for Sydney

Bonneval (NZ) (Makfi) and **Devise (NZ)** (Darci Brahma) are likely to continue their rivalry on Australian soil.

While trips to Sydney have yet to be committed 100 per cent to, the odds of the pair clashing again in the \$A1 million Gr.1 Australian Oaks at Randwick on April 8 are shortening.

"The owners are keen and we've got a few more days yet – if she goes over it will be next Monday," said Andrew Forsman, who prepares Saturday's Gr.1 New Zealand Oaks winner Bonneval with Murray Baker. <u>Full</u> story here.



Start Wondering (NZ) (Eighth Wonder)

Overseas prizes among options for Start Wondering

Hong Kong is among the options the connections of the multiple Group One winner **Start Wondering (NZ)** (Eighth Wonder) are mulling over.

Volpe Veloce (Foxwedge)

Long spell for gun filly

Star three-year-old filly **Volpe Veloce** (Foxwedge) won't be seen out again this season, trainer Graham Richardson has confirmed.

A winner of seven of her eight starts, Volpe Veloce won the Gr.3 Eulogy Stakes (1600m) at Awapuni, the Gr.2 Eight Carat Classic (1600m) and Listed Karaka 3YO Mile (1600m), both at Ellerslie, before tasting her first defeat when a gallant fourth in last month's Gr.2 Sir Tristram Fillies Classic (2000m) at Te Rapa.

"I am leaving her out until the spring," Richardson said.

"She'll probably come back and trial at Te Teko in early August and then we'll start making spring plans for her."



Aloisia (NZ) (Azamour)

Filly poised to follow family lead

A case of like mother, like daughter may play out in the coming weeks with **Aloisia** (**NZ**) (Azamour) in contention for a Group One start.

The connections of the lightly-tried filly are giving serious consideration to a crack at the Courtesy Ford Manawatu Sires' Produce Stakes at Awapuni on Saturday week.

The latest win in Australia for former New Zealand galloper **Lautaro (NZ)** (Don Eduardo) has forced a change of plans.

The son of Don Eduardo was to have run in the Wagga Cup, but he will instead go to Randwick for the Country Championship Final after winning his regional heat at Albury on Sunday.

Lautaro is trained by Andrew Dale, who inherited the horse from his friend, Wanganui trainer Kevin Myers.

"I need to thank Kevin. He's been tremendous to me. I owe it to him with this horse," Dale said.

Smart filly on easy list after Oaks placing

A decision has yet to be made as to whether **Savvy Dreams (NZ)** (Savabeel) will race again this season.

The Group One performer is currently taking it easy in the wake of her third placing in the New Zealand Oaks at Trentham at just her fifth race day appearance.

"We're very happy with her and she'll be back at the track next week," said Guy Lowry,

who trains the daughter of Savabeel with Grant Cullen.

While it is a longshot, they have considered a trip to Australia for Savvy Dreams.

"It's a wild thought, but we may look at Adelaide," Lowry said. "There's the Auraria Stakes, the Australasian Oaks and the SA Oaks.

"She is only a lightly-framed filly and if she shows any signs of tiredness when we get her back next week then she will go out for a good spell."

Tempting prize for Kiwi stayers

Connections of New Zealand-bred horses deep on stamina will have a lucrative Australian target to aim at next year.

The Jericho Cup has been revived in its centenary year and will be run over 4600 metres at Warrnambool in November, 2018, for a stake of \$A300,000.

The event is the brainchild of Melbourne racing enthusiast Bill Gibbins and is dedicated to the Australian Light Horse and their Middle East contribution during World War I. Full story here.

Remembering our Hall Of Fame Heroes Ray Verner

Ray Verner took up training reluctantly to help his aging father but became a master trainer, renowned for his conditioning of horses as he trained over 1000 winners.

Named NZ Racing Personality of the Year in 1978, Ray trained top stayers like Good Lord (two Wellington Cups, Sydney Cup), sprinters like Blue Blood and Gold Hope, and weight-for-age horses like Prince Majestic and The Gentry.

Ray Verner's winning percentage in major

Australian races through the 70s and 80s will probably never be matched. At a time when Kiwis had to be ever vigilant to beat a gang-up syndrome by Australians, Verner's exploits were the stuff of legends.

When Prince Majestic and David Peake won the Spring Champion Stakes at Randwick in the late 1970s, so hard had the opposition tried to put Prince Majestic over the running rail on the home bend, it took hours to remove the white paint from the rail spread down the horse's right-hand side.
