KARAKA MILLION 3YO COULD BE NEXT TARGET FOR 2000 GUINEAS WINNER

A tilt at the equal richest three-year-old race in the country could be on the cards for impressive Gr.1 Al Basti Equiworld Dubai New Zealand 2000 Guineas (1600m) winner, **Madison County (NZ)** (Pins).

That was the initial thought of trainer Murray Baker as he took stock of the results for all three of the runners that he and training partner Andrew Forsman lined-up in Saturday's Group One feature at Riccarton.

A \$36,000 purchase during the Select session of the 2017 New Zealand Bloodstock National Yearling Sale, Madison County is eligible to contest the \$1m Karaka Million 3YO Classic (1600) at Ellerslie in January.

"He's a very talented individual, who put in a top performance to win on Saturday," Baker said.

"It's never easy to travel them all the way down there and

have them produce their best, so I was delighted with what he produced.

"We will have the chance to give him a little break after he completes the trip home during the week and, depending on how he comes through it all, we might take a look at the three-year-old race at Ellerslie.

"That's a mile as well, which will suit him and is the logical target for him I would think."

Baker will also assess the recovery of stablemates The Chosen One (NZ) (Savabeel) and Qiji Express (NZ) (Shamexpress) upon their return to Cambridge, with both likely to spend a brief period in the spelling paddock.

"Nothing panned out for The Chosen One as he was caught wide throughout," he said.

"He's also very talented, but has come a long way in a very short time, so a little freshen-up will do him the world of good.

"Qiji Express was very brave and battled on nicely without really threatening. We will freshen him as well and it might be that he drops back a little in distance for his next campaign."

A strong finishing burst for third by Mental Telepathy (NZ) (Shocking) in Saturday's Listed Redwood Metropolitan Trophy (2500m) has Baker confident of a bold showing by the gelded son of Shocking in the Gr.3 Christchurch Casino New Zealand Cup (3200m) on the last day of the Riccarton carnival.

"I thought he made up nice ground after getting well out of it in the early stages," he said.

"He's by Shocking out of a Galileo mare, so his breeding suggests he will get two miles, as does his racing pattern.

"If we could strike a similar track to what we had on Saturday then he would have to be a contender."

The Baker/Forsman team will also have the chance to make it a double in the Riccarton three-year-old features with Valalie (Snitzel) set to take her place in the Gr.1 Gavelhouse. com New Zealand 1000 Guineas (1600m).

"Valalie will go to the 1000 Guineas in good shape," Baker said.

"The mile and the big roomy track will suit her. Her work of late has been very good and she has been building nicely for the race."

Walker captures Singapore feature

Two-time Singapore champion trainer Mark Walker came up trumps at Kranji on Sunday when he produced former European galloper **Elite Invincible** (Archarcharch) to take out the rich S\$1.35m Dester Singapore Gold Cup (2000m).

Superbly handled by Benny Woodworth, the four-year-old gelding capitalised on a dream rails run in the home straight to dash clear before holding out the gallant challenge of topweight Circuit Land (Mizzen Mast) by a head in a desperate finish.

Walker was quick to praise the effort of both horse and rider although he admitted that Woodworth had ignored his pre-race instructions.

"You've got to take your hat off to Benny as I had said to him we're going to go back from the draw," Walker said.

"The next thing he was up outside the leader.

"You need a bit of luck though as he hasn't had the best of preparations. He's had a temperature and missed his first run.

"I said (to his owners) we can still get here but you just have to trust and believe what the stable does.

"We had nothing to lose and plenty to gain."

It was the sixth win in Singapore and seventh overall for Elite Invincible who began his career in Europe under the name Qatar Man. He has now won twice at the elite level after taking out the S\$1m Charity Bowl (1600m) back in June.

BOSTONIAN BACK FOR SUMMER SPRINT FEATURES

One of last season's best three-year-olds showed he has come back from a winter break in fine fettle with a dashing performance at the Cambridge trials last Thursday.

The Tony Pike-trained **Bostonian (NZ)** (Jimmy Choux) completed a hat-trick of wins in Queensland during the winter with victory in the Gr.3 Sunshine Coast Guineas (1600m) capping an outstanding campaign.

The Jimmy Choux gelding was having his first serious hit-out in a new preparation when he easily accounted for his seven rivals over 935m on Thursday.

Allowed to lob along under his own steam by rider Vinnie Colgan, Bostonian was never out of second gear as he cruised to the line under a strong hold.

"He's come back nicely after his

break and I was pleased to see how he did things in his trial," Pike said.

"Vinnie never had him off the bridle and he was strong to the line, so it was a satisfying work-out.

"He's never been that big, but he has filled out nicely over the winter, so we're excited about his prospects for the summer."

Pike has several options in mind for his charge including a possible Group One target during the Ellerslie Christmas carnival.

"As long as he does things right over the next few days, I think we might kick him off in the Counties Bowl at Pukekohe in a fortnight.

"If he goes well there then the Railway at Ellerslie on New Year's day is definitely an option."

The Listed Haunui Farm Counties

Bowl (1100m) is one of the highlights during Counties Cup day at Pukekohe on November 24, where another Pike runner could make an appearance in the day's headline event.

Like Bostonian, stablemate **Terra Sancta (NZ)** (Pierro) enjoyed success during the Queensland winter and looks a fine staying prospect after finishing powerfully to run an unlucky sixth in the Gr.1 Queensland Oaks (2200m).

The Pierro four-year-old has had two runs back in a new campaign and caught the eye with a powerful finish for second behind the promising Mongolian Marshal (NZ) (High Chaparral) over 1600m at Ellerslie on Melbourne Cup day.

"Terra Sancta was very good at Ellerslie and is making excellent progress this time in," Pike said.

"She went a nice race first-up at Rotorua and then stepped up nicely at Ellerslie behind a pretty promising type.

"She will be at her best when she gets out over a middle-distance, so we have been looking at the options for her.

"She could contest the Counties Cup where she will get into the field on a nice light weight.

"After that there are a number of other options in those summer cup races as I think she can be very competitive from her place in the weights."

LOCAL TALENT PREVAILS IN JUVENILE DASH AT TE RAPA

A gear adjustment and a positive ride from jockey Lynsey Satherley paved the way for the locally trained **Maybeashowoff (NZ)** (Showcasing) to open his winning account with a victory at Te Rapa on Saturday.

The Showcasing two-year-old looked a natural improver following a tidy first-up effort that saw him run a cheeky race over 800m at Pukekohe in September.

Satherley took the initiative from barrier rise this time as she hunted Maybeashowoff straight to the lead before controlling the pace throughout.

Hugging the rail, the pair kicked clear early in the run home before holding out a strong challenge from the heavily

favoured Probabeel (NZ) (Savabeel) to secure the victory by a head in a slick 58.53 for the 1000m journey.

Trainer David Greene had given his charge plenty of time to get over his debut run and was quietly confident that the addition of pacifiers, plus some raceday experience, would stand him in good stead for his assignment.

“He’s got a lot of speed but he was just too busy last time and didn’t breathe,” Greene said.

“We’ve done a lot of work over the last five weeks to get him relaxing and the pacifiers seemed to have really switched him off.

“He did the work in the early stages here, switched off in the middle and was fast enough to kick on with it at the end.”

Greene praised the ride of Satherley who completed the day with a winning treble after guiding home Sahar and Polzeath later in the programme.

“It was a nice ride from Lynsey,” he said.

“It’s a huge advantage running on your home track for a two-year-old and when they get the rail, they can follow it.

“He was smart enough to do that and hopefully he can kick on with it.”

Runner-up Probabeel lost no admirers after chasing gamely in the home straight with rider Leith Innes reporting

the filly would be better for the experience after she was hampered briefly passing the 700m mark.

TAVISTOCK PROMINENT AGAIN IN DIAMOND LODGE DRAFT

Cambridge Stud's headline stallion Tavistock played a significant role in the successful Diamond Lodge draft at last year's Ready to Run Sale, and he is set to feature prominently again in 2018.

Diamond Lodge has forged a reputation as one of the leading vendors at the annual Karaka two-year-old sale, and last year was no different. Jeremy Whale's operation finished second on the vendors' list by aggregate, having sold 16 horses for a total of NZ\$2.519 million.

Three of their draft fetched NZ\$300,000 or more, with another two above NZ\$200,000 and five at

NZ\$145,000 or more.

A colt by Tavistock fetched the top price in Diamond Lodge's class of 2017. Lot 407, out of the Volksraad mare Tristraad, sold to Hong Kong for NZ\$370,000 – the equal fifth-highest price of the sale.

For good measure another son of Tavistock, Lot 343 (out of the Centaine mare Shartziz), was bought by Phill Cataldo for NZ\$145,000.

Diamond Lodge will offer 24 two-year-olds at the 2018 Ready to Run Sale, including three well-bred sons of Tavistock.

"We had a Tavistock colt that sold really well last year, and our three by

that stallion in this year's draft are all really nice horses," Whale said.

"A couple of them are out of Zabeel mares, and obviously that's a proven cross. The other one is a half-brother to the New Zealand Derby winner Habibi."

The famed cross of Tavistock with Zabeel mares has produced Group One winners Tarzino and Werther, along with the other black-type performers Hasselhoof, Pacorus, Gobstopper, Milseain, Imperial Lass, Diamond Valores and Tessastock.

Diamond Lodge's draft also features the progeny of Shooting To Win, Rubick, Atlante, Hallowed Crown, Rip Van Winkle, Savabeel, Dawn Approach,

Sacred Falls, Ocean Park, Pins, Deep Field, Mossman, Reliable Man, Ferlax, Darci Brahma, Wandjina and Jimmy Choux.

"I'm really happy with our draft this year," Whale said.

"It's a nice spread of horses – a really good range, from sprinting types to stayers. There should be a bit of something for everyone."

RIVERSLEY RETURNS TO DEFEND LEADING RTR VENDOR TITLE

After celebrating a landmark Ready to Run Sale result in 2017, Sam Beatson's Riversley Park will return to Karaka this month with another strong draft.

Riversley topped the vendors' list by aggregate last year, selling 22 horses for a total of NZ\$3.425 million. Their average price was NZ\$155,682, and a colt by I Am Invincible was among the five highest prices of the sale at NZ\$370,000.

It was a remarkable result for a vendor whose Ready to Run Sale debut came only two years earlier.

"It was a very good result last year, topping the vendors' list and selling horses at a really good clearance rate as well," Beatson said. "We were very happy.

"We'd been selling at the Ready to Run Sale for a few years under the name of Beatson Stables, but it was only the third year for Riversley. To get Riversley up to that sort of level so quickly was great."

The Ohaupo farm will be represented this year by another bumper draft of 29 two-year-olds. In addition to quantity, Beatson believes

that the Riversley Park draft also offers quality and variety.

"I'm happy with how it's shaping up," he said. "We've got some pretty good-quality horses, and I really like the range of stallions – first season sires, proven sires and everything in between.

"We're selling some horses who look like real two-year-old types, plus some who look like they'll be good milers, and even some stayers. It's a good mix and we're hoping the buyers

will find plenty to like."

The young sires in Riversley's draft include The Brothers War, Declaration Of War, Deep Field and Sidestep, who sit alongside familiar names such as Savabeel, Per Incanto, Written Tycoon, Tavistock, More Than Ready, Exceed And Excel, Sebring and Swiss Ace.

WAIKATO STUD CONNECTION KEY FOR OHUKIA LODGE

Jamie Beatson and Chanel Archer's Ohukia Lodge will offer a quality draft at next month's Ready to Run Sale at Karaka, including a select group of two-year-olds from powerhouse nursery Waikato Stud.

"We're selling some beautiful two-year-olds for Waikato," Archer said. "It's a great relationship for us to have – they're lovely horses, and lovely people to work with."

Two of the Waikato Stud contingent, both Savabeel colts, recorded the fastest breeze-up times in the catalogue at 10.07 and 10.09.

"Jamie and Chanel from Ohukia Lodge have done an excellent job

with our horses and we were rapt that two of our Savabeel colts breezed in the two overall fastest times," Waikato Stud's Mark Chittick said.

A total of six sons of Savabeel feature in Ohukia Lodge's draft, which numbers 30 overall. The other stallions represented are Proisir, Pins, Shamexpress, Ocean Park, Dawn Approach, Ocean Park, Tavistock, Sacred Falls, Smart Missile, Jakkalberry, Written Tycoon, Dundeel,

Ohukia Lodge's pair of Savabeel colts, Lots 127 and 180, breeze up in slick time.

Iffraaj, Rock 'N' Pop, Saperavi, So You Think and Deep Field.

"It's a lovely range of stallions in our draft this year," Archer said. "It's great to have those Savabeels in there, they're a great asset for any sale. We've got some nice Aussie stallions as well, which is great for a sale like this.

"Overall, we're really happy with our draft this year. It's a great group of horses. They all breezed up really well and have come through it in great order. We couldn't be happier."

Ohukia Lodge has only featured at the Ready to Run Sale since 2015, when offering 12 horses and fetching a total of NZ\$303,000. That debut offering

included multiple stakes winner Ferrando (NZ) (Fast 'N' Famous), who was purchased for NZ\$40,000.

Ohukia Lodge also offered Gr.1 New Zealand Derby (2400m) winner Vin De Dance (NZ) in their 2016 draft. The Roc de Cambes gelding sold to Phill Cataldo Bloodstock for NZ\$70,000.

Ohukia Lodge continued their upward trajectory at last year's Ready to Run Sale, soaring to an aggregate of NZ\$1.939 million and a fourth-place finish on the vendors' list. They averaged NZ\$107,722 and had a top price of NZ\$350,000 for an O'Reilly colt out of Metropolitan.

ARARAT LADY SHOWS GREAT PROMISE SECOND-UP

Battle Paint filly **Ararat Lady (NZ)** franked her debut second form with a brilliant win in the \$85,000 Ocean Park Stakes, a Restricted Maiden race over 1200m on Dester Singapore Gold Cup day at Kranji.

Ridden by Michael Rodd, who was also aboard at her first Singapore outing in a Polytrack race over 1100m for Restricted Maidens as well on October 7, Ararat Lady lived up to her second favourite (\$15) tag after a decisive move at the 300m quickly put paid to her 13 rivals.

The winning time was 1min 10.36secs for the 1200m on the Short Course.

Winning trainer Cliff Brown's assistant-trainer Tim Fitzsimmons said Ararat Lady had made significant headway since her baptism of fire a little over a month ago.

"She ran fantastic. It was also a great ride by Michael, who tucked her in behind," said the Australian horseman.

"She has improved in her trackwork after the last run, and she's also put on weight.

"We'll see how she pulls up before deciding if she runs again or if we bring her back next year."

With the win, Rodd ties with reigning Singapore champion jockey Vlad Duric (returns from suspension next Friday) at the top of the premiership ladder on 63 winners but remains in second place on a countback for seconds.

"Tim probably said how she has come a long way, and I couldn't agree more," said Rodd.

"I remember a couple of months ago when I did pace-work on her, I thought she would be a Class 4 type.

"But at her first start, she showed she had really come on physically and mentally. She was very impressive today.

"There was some scrimmaging in the race, but she

composed herself, put her head down and got the job done.

"She's got a nice turn of foot and she will come back next year a better filly. I can't see why she shouldn't go for the 3YO series even if she still has a long way to go.

"Today, she beat a very good Restricted Maiden field as you normally get on those big days. She put it away nicely."

Champion trainer Mark Walker saddled the quinella in the \$45,000 Victoria Peak Stakes, a Class 4 Non-Premier race over 1400m when longshot **Alamosa Express (NZ)** (Alamosa) just outlasted his better-fancied stablemate Lim's Reform (NZ) (O'Reilly) on Sunday.

It may not have been the order the Kiwi handler or most punters had expected, but winners are grinners, as they say.

Walker was for one glad a horse he had been keen to see turn the corner finally come through - and for winning apprentice jockey Mohd Firdaus, who was riding his first winner for him after

nearly one year under his tutelage.

"MM is a lovely young man to have at the stable. He is on time every day and works hard," said Walker.

"He doesn't get as many rides, but he makes the most of what he gets. He rode this horse very well today.

"We thought there would not be much speed in the race, and I told MM to roll forward if he can.

"They tried to run him down from all over the place, but he held on. Lim's Reform ran super, but that's just racing.

"Alamosa Express got left alone, he carried only 49kgs and he went all the way. It took a while for him to acclimatise, but I think he might be

right from now on."

Alamosa Express and Lim's Reform had a head separating them with King's Speech (NZ) (Darci Brahma) closing in late for third place to form the New Zealand-bred trifecta.
