RECORD BREAKING BEAUTY GENERATION IN A DIFFERENT LEAGUE TO HIS RIVALS



Beauty Generation proves he is the best miler in Hong Kong with another stunning victory

It's not often the highest praise for a major race winner comes from the trainer of the runner-up. But that was the case after Beauty Generation's course record breaking win in the Gr.2 BOCHK Wealth Management Jockey Club Mile, with Caspar Fownes describing the winner as becoming "Winx-like."

Mind you, winning trainer John Moore wasn't short of glowing endorsements either and without reservation mentioned **Beauty Generation (NZ)** (Road To Rock) in the same breath as his former champion Able Friend (Shamardal),

the 2014/15 Hong Kong Horse of the Year - a title Beauty Generation claimed last season.

"He was like Able Friend. He reminded me of Able Friend, making the big run and scooting clear from the turn. He's proved he's a champion. He had to make two runs out there after it was like the charge of the Light Brigade early and people around the world now will stand up and take notice that there is a very good miler here in Hong Kong," Moore said.

Fownes, whose charge Southern Legend (Not A Single Doubt) was beaten three lengths into second, is all but conceding December's Gr.1 LONGINES Hong Kong Mile to last year's winner and the world's highest rated specialist miler who well and truly ratified that lofty international rating of 126 as he bettered Good Ba Ba's (Lear Fan) near ten-year-old track record (running a blistering 1m 32.64s).

"The winner is absolutely incredible," said Fownes, "to shatter a record like that – and to do it the way he did, drifting out like that. He did it the hard way. He's becoming Winx-like and in a different league to these horses he's beaten today."

Beauty Generation hasn't quite matched the 29 straight wins of Australian champion Winx (Street Cry) but is now looking almost as invincible with eight wins from his past 11 starts, this season and last, and now four on the trot.

"His ratings go through the roof each time he steps out," Fownes said of Beauty Generation who sustained a three-length margin despite laying out badly in the straight.

So, if Moore's rival trainer is already despairing about his or anybody else's hope of usurping the Patrick Kwok-owned gelding in December's LONGINES Hong Kong Mile then the news only gets worse. "He had a few shoeing issues coming into this race," Moore said, "but we have three weeks to sort them out, which we will."

Winning jockey Zac Purton, who was entitled to a few

plaudits of his own for a clever tactical ride, was also effusive in his praise for the winner. "He's obviously a very good horse who continues to turn out in better and better shape every time," he said.

Purton elected to ease out of the early speed battle on a horse who generally goes forward. "They ran the first half mile (800 metres) ridiculously fast and I was happy to let them burn themselves out and then to roll forward around them when they backed it off," he said.

Beauty Generation was bred by Greg Tomlinson's Nearco Stud and has now won ten times from 18 starts in Hong Kong, including three at Group One level. He is a graduate of Highden Park's 2014 Select Yearling draft at the New Zealand Bloodstock National Yearling Sale where he was purchased by Kylie Bax' Hermes Syndications for \$60,000.

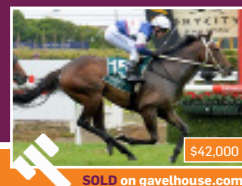
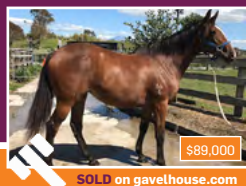
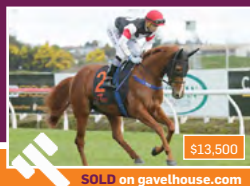

ACE FILLY SERVES UP SUCCESS AT RICCARTON

Promising two-year-old **Miss Federer (NZ)** (Swiss Ace) overcame some anxious moments prior to the running of the Listed Barneswood Farm Welcome Stakes (1000m) to claim her first stakes success at Riccarton on Saturday.

The Swiss Ace filly was race favourite for the juvenile feature

following an impressive victory at the venue back in October.

The Andrew Carston-trained runner proved reluctant to enter the barriers but once settled was the first to clear the gates from barrier four. Kept to the middle of the track by rider Matt Cameron, Miss Federer looked beaten at the 200m but rallied bravely to pip

Challa (Dissident) and Diva Express (NZ) (Shamexpress) at the post.

"I was a bit concerned at the furlong, but I knew she'd lift when Matt Cameron asked her," Carston said.

"There's not a lot of her but she's got natural ability and as we just saw, she's a racehorse.

“She’s only a \$10,000 filly, and this is an awesome result for the whole team.”

It was a milestone win for the 2018 Gavelhouse.com Newcomer To Training recipient as it was his first at stakes level.

Carston selected the Nearco Stud-bred filly out of Bradbury Park’s New Zealand Bloodstock Book Two Yearling Sale Draft for \$10,000 earlier this year.

“I thought she was just a nice, neat filly,” he said. “I knew a little bit about her mother from being a good mare down in the South Island and she was

cheap enough.

“I’ve had a pretty good run buying horses at Karaka without spending a lot of money.”

Miss Federer has now banked \$44,435 plus an \$8,000 Pearl Series Bonus for her large group of owners who were on hand to celebrate the victory.

Carston indicated the filly would now be sent for a spell before being set for a tilt at the Listed Karaka Million (1200m) at Ellerslie on January 26.

Hong Kong result may boost interest for Riversley

Last season’s leading vendor at the New Zealand Bloodstock Ready to Run Sale received a timely boost on Sunday with stylish Hong Kong winner **Styling City** (Starspangledbanner).

Riversley Park topped the vendors’ list by aggregate last year, selling 22 horses for a total of NZ\$3.425 million.

The Ohaupo farm will be represented this year by another bumper draft of 29 two-year-olds, including a half-brother to Styling City by Exceed And Excel.

The colt will go under the hammer as Lot 238 on the second day of the sale that commences at Karaka on Wednesday.

EARLY MORNING CALL BRINGS JOY FOR SATHERLEY

A phone call from the National Racing Bureau in the early hours of Saturday morning delivered an unexpected reward for Cambridge jockey Lynsey Satherley.

The hard-working horsewoman was enjoying having a quiet morning when the 6.30am call came through advising fellow jockey Dylan Turner was ill and would have to forego the mount on the well-fancied **Ocean Emperor (NZ)** (Zabeel) in the Gr.2 Gartshore Tauranga Stakes (1600m).

“The Bureau told me that Gary (Hennessy) was looking for a rider to replace Dylan so I gave him a call and we agreed I would ride the horse later that day,” Satherley said.

“I had ridden a little bit for Gary earlier on in my career, so I was delighted he had thought about me.

“We talked about how he wanted the horse ridden and I thought he was a massive chance based on his lead-up form.

“While I might have been having a little bit of a lie in as I had the morning off, I certainly don’t mind getting calls like that one.”

The rest, as they say, is history as Satherley produced a copybook ride to guide Ocean Emperor to victory over pacemaker Nicoletta (NZ) (Savabeel) and the late-finishing Darscape Princess (NZ) (Darci Brahma) in the Group Two Tauranga feature.

“Gary had said that he gets out of the gates well but will drop the bit and

take a trail which was how he wanted him ridden,” Satherley said.

“He jumped brilliantly but it took him a wee while to settle as they weren’t going that hard in front.

“He tugged a bit but once Anna Jones (Woodsman) came around and sat outside Nicoletta he dropped the bit and travelled nicely for me.”

Satherley admitted some inside knowledge on the Murray Baker and Andrew Forsman-trained Nicoletta had helped when making her decision on when to make her challenge on Ocean Emperor.

“I ride a lot of trackwork for Murray and Andrew and have been on Nicoletta before,” she said.

“She is a lovely mare on the way up

and I knew she wouldn’t give in without a fight. I just had to get the timing right on my horse so he would have the best shot at her.

“It was a decent struggle but I was always confident we would get there as he is a very good horse with an explosive sprint.”

The win continues a good vein of form for Satherley who has ridden eight winners so far this season.

“It was a thrill to get the chance on a nice horse like that in a big race so hopefully it might mean I get a few more rides from it,” she said.

“I work hard at my riding and enjoy the opportunities I do get so I will make the most of this and just keep doing the job that I love.” – NZ Racing Desk





MASETTO ON DERBY PATH AFTER TAURANGA VICTORY

Lightly raced three-year-old **Masetto (NZ)** (Cape Blanco) indicated he may have a bright future over more ground when he produced a strong finish to take out the opening event at Tauranga on Saturday.

The Team Rogerson-trained galloper had caught the eye when beating subsequent race-winner Sahar (NZ) (Iffraaj) over 1400m at Te Aroha last month.

Despite the nature of that victory, the Cape Blanco gelding wasn't amongst the major fancies in Saturday's contest over a similar distance.

Allowed to settle at the rear of the field after a tardy beginning, rider Trudy Thornton went in search of inside runs at the top of the straight but was unable to obtain clear-running until 100 metres from the post.

Once clear, Masetto found another gear to win impressively with well-regarded three-year-olds Hypnos (NZ) (Reliable Man) and Spirits Aubeer (Spirit Of Boom) filling the placings.

"If he had been beaten, he would have been desperately unlucky," Debbie Rogerson said after the race.

"He has the makings of a very good horse.

"You can ride him back or ride him forward as he is very adaptable.

"I've always had a Derby in the back of my mind for him although which one yet I don't know.

"He's come a long way and I have a lot of time for him."

Masetto is raced by David and Elizabeth Olsen who bred him from their talented stayer Passchendaele (NZ).

The Montjeu mare won five races, including the Gr.2 Waikato Gold Cup (2400m), while she was also placed on two

occasions in the Gr.1 International Stakes (2000m) at Te Rapa.

Rider Trudy Thornton said she was fearing the consequences when searching for a run on Masetto in the home straight.

"I was pretty lucky I won it as I may have had my throat cut if I didn't," she said.

"He was a little bit slow into stride but I thought I wouldn't panic, even though I got out late.

"He's a horse that is still learning about racing, he's raw and he's green but he has a lot of ability."

IRONSIDE BREAKS MAIDEN STATUS AT KRANJI

First-season trainer Donna Logan may not be in town, but her staff headed by foreman Graeme Forbes did a great job to keep the home fires burning on the Kranji front with another winner – their ninth - on Sunday.

In New Zealand to attend the Ready-To-Run sales, Logan won two races on Friday night and continued that winning momentum on Sunday.

An eye-catching second on debut, **Ironside (NZ)** (Jimmy Choux), a horse owned by Logan's good friend, Lars Pearson, landed his first victory with

a win in Sunday's \$85,000 Novice race over 1200m.

Settled at the rear after getting off to a slow start, the Jimmy Choux four-year-old came with a barnstorming run under jockey Erasmus Aslam to put paid to his 11 rivals in brilliant style.

Forbes said Ironside was no straightforward conveyance, highlighting Aslam's contribution in teaching him a few good manners.

"Aslam has done all the work on this horse. It's good for him to get the win today," said Forbes.

"I was a bit worried when he missed

the start, but he ran on well."

Long regarded as a journeyman who has been through the ups and downs of racing, Aslam was making his presence felt again since joining Logan's yard this year.

While jumping on fast horses helps any jockey, Aslam said his daredevil ways help him land a few handy rides as well.

"I see every horse as a challenge. I like to live on the edge," said Aslam.

"This horse is actually quite difficult. He's a bolter and will throw his head around.

"But he was good today, and we expected him to run well. He's a nice horse who will develop into a nice strong horse.

"Today, he was racing too keen early. It was actually a blessing in disguise that he missed the kick as he was able to run home strongly."
