TARZINO GIVES PRICE FIRST CAULFIELD CUP RUNNER



Tarzino will attempt to give trainer Mick Price his first Caulfield Cup winner tomorrow on his home track

Mick Price has won 28 Group One races and is considered among Australia's elite trainers.

He has prepared an Australian Horse of the Year in Lankan Rupee (Redoute's Choice) and has been close to winning Australasia's weight-for-age championship, the W S Cox Plate, when Pompeii Ruler (Genuine) was beaten in a three-way photo finish a decade ago.

On Saturday, Price will break new ground when he saddles up **Tarzino (NZ)** (Tavistock) in the A\$3 million Caulfield Cup.

The four-year-old will be Price's first starter in the biggest race on his home track.

Tarzino, the Victoria Derby and Rosehill Guineas winner, was the long-time favourite in early markets for the Caulfield Cup but has fallen down the pecking order and is at \$21 after four unplaced runs this spring.

Price admitted his confidence was dented when Tarzino finished sixth in the Turnbull Stakes in his final Cup lead-up when the trainer felt he was entitled to run into third.

But he maintains Tarzino is still capable of showing up in the Cup and hopes he gets the conditions to suit.

Price hopes the surface just has enough give in it that Tarzino

will let down like he knows he can at the end of 2400m.

"I was very happy with him until the Turnbull when he shaped up outside Tally and then got on one rein and hung in a bit. The track just started to find him out a bit," Price said.

"The horse looks good. He's an entire and I just thought that harder track, for the first time, he just started to feel it."

He said the horse worked well on the steeple grass at Caulfield on Tuesday.

"He looks great and is absolutely hard-fit," he said.

"I'd just love the track rating to be right for him but I'm really looking forward to the 2400 metres, and I want to progress to the Melbourne Cup but we'll make a decision after Saturday.

"The mile and a half is good. Barrier four is good. And if the track has just got some give in it, I think he'll run a really good race."

Jockey Craig Newitt, who like Price is chasing his first Caulfield Cup win, remains upbeat.

"These two races (Caulfield and Melbourne Cup) are the two races he's been set for the whole way along. He gets back to handicap conditions over a mile and a half," Newitt said.

Meanwhile, trainer Chris Waller will rely on **Preferment (NZ)** (Zabeel) and **Sacred Master (NZ)** (Mastercraftsman) in the Caulfield Cup with Antonio Giuseppe (NZ) (Shocking) sent to the spelling paddock.

Hugh Bowman will ride Preferment, while Tommy Berry will be aboard Sacred Master.

Ciaran Maher's **Pemberley (NZ)** (Darci Brahma), to be ridden by Ben Allen, rounds off the New Zealand bred contenders coming off a last start third placing in the Gr.2 Herbert Power Stakes.

LUCIA VALENTINA GETS FIRST LOOK AT VALLEY

The mare Kerrin McEvoy hopes can deliver him an elusive Cox Plate has pleased the jockey in her first experience at Moonee Valley.

McEvoy rode **Lucia Valentina (NZ)** (Savabeel) in a solid piece of work with grand campaigner Happy Trails (Good Journey) at Moonee Valley on Thursday morning, the Kris Lees-trained mare's first time at the unique Melbourne racetrack which hosts the Cox Plate on Saturday week.

"She got around here really well so that was pleasing. She was on her right lead and she seems really bright and well in her work," McEvoy said.

"It was good work. That was her main bit of work (going into the Cox Plate). Kris wanted a good work-out and that was what we got."

If McEvoy can win the Cox Plate on Lucia Valentina he will join an elite list of riders to have won a Melbourne Cup, Caulfield Cup, Cox Plate and Golden Slipper.

"It's a hard one to get," McEvoy said.

"So we'll be trying. A bit of rain around would suit her, but the forgiving surface of Moonee Valley should be perfect for her.

"Obviously Winx and Hartnell seem to be going really well, but she's a weight-for-age 2000 metre winner in her own right in the autumn so you can't dismiss her lightly, that's for sure."

Lucia Valentina sat just off Happy Trails early in the 1400m workout before joining him and the pair went to the line with Happy Trails marginally ahead.

They clocked a sharp 23.79sec for the final 400m.

"It was very nice work," Lees said.

"He's always a good yardstick because he's a really good worker, Happy Trails."

Lees believes Lucia Valentina is similar to how she was leading into her biggest win in the \$4 million the Queen Elizabeth Stakes in April but acknowledges it is a strong year with Winx (Street Cry) and Hartnell (Authorized) headlining the Cox Plate contenders.

Shillelagh (NZ) (Savabeel)

Step up for Shillelagh

After missing a start in Wednesday's Gr.3 Lady's Day Vase top Te Akau mare **Shillelagh (NZ)** (Savabeel) will step up to Group Two company in Saturday's Tristar Stakes (1400m).

The Stephen Autridge and Jamie Richards-trained five-year-old was impressive when winning at her Australian debut earlier this month but failed to gain a start on Wednesday as the second emergency.

"She's worked well since her victory at Caulfield a fortnight ago," said Te Akau's racing manager Brad Taylor.

"It was unfortunate not to get a run on Wednesday in the Group Three event. Saturday is certainly a step up in class against the likes of First Seal but we expect her to run a nice race."

Shillelagh, who has the services of Hong Kong-based Australian jockey Zac Purton, is a \$11 shot with last start Gr.2 Golden Pendant winner Tycoon Tara (Written Tycoon) the \$2.80 favourite.



Highlad (High Chaparral)

Wide gate a test for Oliver and Kiwi colt

Damien Oliver will need all his skill and guile to give **Highlad** (High Chaparral) his best possible chance at Caulfield on Saturday.

The champion jockey will guide the Murray Baker and Andrew Forsman-trained three-year-old from the outside gate against

a strong line-up in the Gr.3 Ladbrokes Classic.

Oliver and Highlad also drew wide when they combined to finish third last time out in the Listed UCI Stakes, but Baker won't be weighing the champion jockey down with pre-race instructions.

"We will leave it up to Ollie," Baker said.

"He's won 105 Group One races."

Highlad has had only three starts with his domestic form including a victory in the Listed Wanganui Guineas before heading to Melbourne. [Full story here.](#)



Eleonora (NZ) (Makfi)

Eleonora tackles Ethereal stakes

Kiwi filly **Eleonora (NZ)** (Makfi) is expected to bounce back, following her luckless run in the Gr.2 Edward Manifold Stakes (1600m) last start, in Saturday's Gr.3 New Zealand Bloodstock Ethereal Stakes (2000m) at Caulfield.

The Murray Baker and Andrew Forsman-trained mare has drawn barrier five and will again be partnered by Damien Oliver.

"We are pretty happy with her and we do think she's a stayer," Baker said.

Another expected to appreciate the step up in distance is **Savvan (NZ)** (Savabeel). The James Cummings-trained filly was a last start winner at Kembla Grange over 1600m.

SAAS the lign to take with Baertschiger duo

Trainer Shane Baertschiger hopes a drop back in trip will give **Best Tothelign (NZ)** (Align) a better shot at a second 'black type' win this Sunday.

The son of Align dead-heated with the Desmond Koh-trained Order Of The Sun (Encosta De Lago) in the SIN G3 Colonial Chief Stakes, which is a Polytrack event over 1700m, last year, but Baertschiger believes the 1400m of the SIN G3 Saas Fee Stakes is more up his alley.

The Australian handler actually has two bullets in the feature race, with the talented but erratic **Blue Swede (NZ)** (O'Reilly) also in the running.



Best Tothelign (NZ) (Align)

Baertschiger said he could not fault either runner's form, but at least, he knows the element of unpredictability is out of the equation for Best Tothelign, who will be ridden by John Powell who was aboard at his last start when last to Quechua (Pure Prize) in the SIN G2 Chairman's Trophy (1800m) on August 7. Nomisma (NZ) (Thorn Park)

Mare capable of staking a claim at Rotorua

Nomisma (NZ) (Thorn Park) may not be best suited to Rotorua, but trainer Tony Pike is still bullish about her prospects there on Saturday.

The progressive daughter of Thorn Park made an impressive opening to her five-year-old campaign last time out and she will shoot for further success when she steps up in class to the Gr.3 Sweynesse Stakes.

"Rotorua is not the ideal track for her, but she worked so well on Tuesday morning and it's a really nice chance for some black type for her," Pike said.

"She gets back a touch in her races, but with some pace on she is good enough to roll over the top of them."

A strong performance would also bring her a step closer to a start in the Gr.2 Coupland's Bakeries Mile, for which she is currently an \$18 chance. [Full story here.](#)

Brothers step out at Randwick

Bryce Heys will present exciting sprinter **Spieth (NZ)** (Thorn Park) and his little brother **Travancore (NZ)** (Savabeel) at Randwick on Saturday.

Spieth, who lines up in the Listed City Tattersall's Club (1100m), is having his first start since he was sent down the Flemington straight in a three-year-old open handicap in June with an eye to education.

He won despite making mistakes, flagging his future potential.

Inside Agent (NZ) (Stravinsky)

Inside Agent sets sights on Gothic Stakes

Trainer Nigel Blackiston is optimistic about success on Caulfield Cup day on Saturday with the lightly raced **Inside Agent (NZ)** (Stravinsky) lining up in the Listed Gothic Stakes for three-year-olds.

Inside Agent won the Listed Poseidon Stakes at Flemington at his second career start on October 2 and Blackiston rates him a potential Australian Guineas-type horse next autumn.

"His two runs have been excellent and he's trained on really nicely," Blackiston said.

"He's a very promising horse."

Inside Agent was knocked down to Blackiston for \$180,000 at last year's Karaka yearling sale from the draft of Cambridge Stud.

"I saw him in a paddock beforehand and picked him out with a group of people and targeted him," Blackiston said.

"He's just a beautiful colt. He's got a good pedigree, he's got the looks and he's got the ability."

Inside Agent has barrier one in the field of 14 on Saturday.



Gentil Tonton (Yeats)

Stayer's cup hopes on the line

Capable stayer **Gentil Tonton** (Yeats) can force his argument for a trip south with a strong performance at Rotorua on Saturday.

He is in the mix for the Gr.3 Christchurch Casino New Zealand Cup and a decent effort in the Listed Jakkalberry Classic will be required to keep him on target for Riccarton.

"We really need him to run well to continue on that path," said Andrew Scott, who trains the Irish-bred six-year-old with Lance O'Sullivan.

"He's benefitted from his two runs this preparation and while he's still on the way up, he is well enough to be competitive."

The winner of five races up to 2400 metres, Gentil Tonton finished runner-up in last season's Gr.3 Rotorua Cup before he was spelled.

He resumed with a fifth placing over a mile at Te Rapa and then ran eighth over ground at Hastings behind subsequent Group One performer Humidor (NZ) (Teofilo).

Blinkers for group one-bound colt

A new look **Heroic Valour** (Fastnet Rock) will complete his Group One preparation at Ashburton on Saturday.

The Fastnet Rock colt will sport headgear for the first time in the Listed Barneswood Farm Stakes, which will serve as his lead in to the Gr. 1 Sothys New Zealand 2000 Guineas.

"He's very well and he'll have the blinkers on," said Jamie Richards, who prepares the three-year-old with Stephen Autridge.

Heroic Valour lost his unbeaten record when third last time out in the Gr.2 Hawke's

Bay Guineas on an unsuitably slow track and on a day when his stablemate Hall Of Fame (NZ) (Savabeel) boosted his Group One prospects at Riccarton.

The son of Savabeel was an impressive winner there of the Inglewood Stud Guineas Trial and he will step out next over a mile in the Listed Zacinto Stakes on Saturday week.

Euro Angel increases in value

Euro Angel (NZ) (Rip Van Winkle) showed her class to win the Gr.3 Ladies' Day Vase at Caulfield on Wednesday, securing the black-type win to boost her broodmare value.

The Hawkes Racing-trained mare has had just six starts, but she's never been out of the placings - and Wednesday's mile race saw her let down dominantly under the riding of Dwayne Dunn.

Wayne Hawkes wasn't locking in any spring plans with Euro Angel just yet, but with plenty of mares features on offer during the upcoming Flemington Carnival worth top dollar, there's little doubt she'll step out again this spring all going well.

Euro Angel was a \$200,000 purchase from Windsor Park Stud's 2014 Premier Yearling draft and the 12th stakes winner for their resident stallion Rip Van Winkle.

No more appropriate mating could have transpired in the lead up to one of Australasia's iconic staying events.

Ahead of Saturday's \$A3 million Gr.1 Caulfield Cup, last year's winner and the dual New Zealand Horse of the Year **Mongolian Khan** (Holy Roman Emperor) served the former champion race mare **Ethereal (NZ)** (Rhythm), who triumphed in the 2001 edition of the 2400 metre feature.

Mongolian Khan, who was also the champion three-year-old of his year, was the chosen consort for Sir Peter Vela's **Ethereal**, who went on to complete an historic double for trainer Sheila Laxon by also claiming the Gr.1 Melbourne Cup. [Full story here.](#)

Sassy 'N' Smart's (Smart Missile) Gr.1 gavelhouse New Zealand 1000 Guineas hopes will be decided by her next performance on Saturday week.

"If she performs up to expectations in that then she's likely to go down to Christchurch."

Sassy 'N' Smart has won two of her six starts, including last season's Listed Welcome Stakes at Riccarton.

Cup winner on road to recovery

Prince Of Penzance (NZ) (Pentire) is

recovering from leg surgery, but he is unlikely to race again.

The New Zealand-bred Gr.1 Melbourne Cup winner had screws inserted in his off fore leg at the Ballarat Equine Clinic on Monday after suffering the injury when fourth in the Gr.2 Herbert Power Stakes.

"He's done his job so the main thing is that he has a long and happy life," said Sandy McGregor, who is part of the ownership group in the son of Pentire.

Earlier start time for breeze ups

The New Zealand Bloodstock Ready to Run Sale Breeze Ups will start at the earlier time of 9am on Monday 17 and Tuesday 18 October.
