BAKER PRAYING FOR RAIN



Jon Snow is likely to hold most kiwi hopes for victory in Saturday's Gr.1 Caulfield Cup

Melbourne has experienced a modicum of rain this week, but Cambridge trainers Murray Baker and Andrew Forsman are hoping the heavens will open before Saturday's Gr.1 Caulfield Cup (2400m).

There they will line-up Group One winner **Jon Snow (NZ)** (Iffraaj) and the training duo believe their charge will need a rain-affected track for him to feature in the Caulfield showpiece.

Jon Snow has pleased his connections with his first two runs in Australia, placing behind compatriot Grunt (NZ) (O'Reilly) in the Gr.1 Makybe Diva Stakes (1600m), while he finished unplaced in his only other run in the Gr.1 Turnbull Stakes (2000m).

"He's done well since he's been here (in Melbourne), he's only had the two starts, but he's fit," Baker said.

"We're looking for a bit of rain. That slows them up a bit and it's probably what he needs."

The five-year-old entire finished ninth in the Caulfield Cup last year and his connections are hoping he can get a bit more luck in this year's running of the race.

"I think that he's at about the same mark (as he was last year)," Baker said. "He got knocked out of it in the Caulfield Cup last year, but we're hopeful just to line-up and take our place."

Meanwhile, **Night's Watch (NZ)** (Redwood) will have to

overcome a wide barrier (18) but will appreciate getting back to handicap conditions according to jockey Ben Allen, who partnered the five-year-old into sixth in last weekend's Gr.1 Caulfield Stakes (2000m).

"At first I was a bit flat after seeing the barrier, but at the same time his racing pattern shouldn't be too greatly affected by it," Allen said. "He's a get back horse and we should be able to ride him conservatively and be part of that second wave coming into it.

Allen said that while it was a strong rendition of the race, it is also even.

"I thought he was good last week but he can be much

better than that. He was carrying a heavy weight and the track was firm and he didn't really give his all.

"With him coming down in the weights and hopefully Caulfield is getting some rain, a bit of cut out of the track will help him heaps. If he gets the right run, he will be a much better horse than he showed me last Saturday."

After racing at weight for age last week, Night's Watch will carry just 52kgs under handicap conditions on Saturday.

"I am hoping he has one more good run in him on Saturday. I think if he brings his best he will be right in the finish."

CHARLES ROAD LOVING MELBOURNE: O'SULLIVAN

A bright and content **Charles Road** (Myboycharlie) is poised to enhance his Gr.1 Melbourne Cup (3200m) claims with a bold run in Saturday's Gr.3 Coongy Cup (2000m), according to Matamata trainer Lance O'Sullivan.

O'Sullivan, who trains the five-year-old in partnership with Andrew Scott, flew to Melbourne on Thursday to oversee the final preparations for the Coongy, which could yet serve as the Gr.1 Sydney Cup (3200m) placed stayer's lead-up run into next month's Melbourne Cup at Flemington.

"We're happy with him. He's bright in himself and he's settled in well. He's really enjoying the place," O'Sullivan said.

"If he runs up to his best, he's going to be very competitive."

A winner of six of his 22 starts, including the Gr.3 City Of Auckland Cup (2400m) at Ellerslie and the Gr.2 Chairman's Handicap (2600m) at Randwick, Charles Road goes into the Coongy at the fourth start of his preparation.

After winning at Hastings over 1600m last month, the Myboycharlie five-year-old closed strongly for fourth in the Gr.3 Foundation Cup (2000m) at Caulfield last start.

"It was a really good run, first-up over ground this preparation," O'Sullivan said.

"It was his first run in three weeks and he had travelled to Melbourne so we were really happy with it. We did

have a bit of an issue afterwards, with a spike in temperature but that was only for a short time.

"He was hand-walked for two or three days but missed no fast work and he's eating well and bright and happy now. There's always a bit of caution with a horse coming back from something like that but looking at him, we've got no real concerns."

An \$8 chance for the Coongy with TAB bookmakers and at \$51 for the Melbourne Cup, Charles Road, who races as Sir Charles Road in Australia, sits at 32nd in the order of entry for the 24-horse Melbourne Cup on November 6 so the prospects of a start are bright.

But O'Sullivan said the final

decision on a Melbourne Cup start would rest with majority owner David Archer.

"He's not too far away from getting a start and with the natural attrition between now and then, there's every chance he'd make the field," O'Sullivan said.

"He's proven he can run two miles and there's the attraction for everyone of having a runner in the big race. We've seen a few of those Europeans stepping out lately and it's a bit scary but I don't think we'd pass up the opportunity to have a runner."

DA CRUZ PAIR **READY FOR SWEYNESSE**

Cambridge trainer Martin Da Cruz is taking a cautious approach with his talented sprinters **Packing Eagle (NZ)** (Pins) and **Elusive Treasure** (Northern Meteor) going into Saturday's Gr.3 Sweynesse Stakes (1215m) at Rotorua.

Da Cruz is happy with his duo but wasn't exuding confidence for the weight-for-age sprint, which has attracted Group One performers the likes of Close Up (NZ) (Shinko King), Volpe Veloce (Foxwedge) and Volks Lightning (NZ) (Volksraad) along with emerging stars Julius (NZ) (Swiss Ace) and Love Affair (NZ) (Savabeel).

"It looks a great race," Da Cruz said.

"We've drawn one (Packing Eagle) and 12 (Elusive Treasure) and (favourite) Julius has drawn 14 so hopefully we can get the right runs."

TAB bookmakers opened Julius a \$3.20 favourite ahead of Gr.1 Railway Stakes (1200m) winner Volpe Veloce at \$3.60, with Love Affair (\$5.50) and Packing Eagle (\$7.50) the next most favoured in the market.

Elusive Treasure opened at \$61.

Packing Eagle won the Sweynesse Stakes last year before he was freshened for a tilt at the Railway Stakes at Ellerslie, where he closed strongly for second, splitting Saturday's rivals Volpe Veloce and Volks Lightning.

He was then unplaced in the Gr.1 Telegraph (1200m)

at Trentham before a gallant second to Start Wondering (NZ) (Eighth Wonder) in the Gr.1 BCD Group Sprint (1400m) at Te Rapa, after which he was found to have suffered a tendon injury.

"He's slowly building up from that injury so we'll just be assessing him race by race," Da Cruz said.

"He did it after the Group One at Te Rapa. It was a small hole and he's strong now. He's coming up well. This is his first run back so we'll just see how he goes."

Da Cruz trialled Packing Eagle at Cambridge last month, the Pins eight-year-old was not pressured to finish fifth in behind Your Way (NZ) (Thewayouare), a defector on Thursday from the

Sweynesse Stakes.

"The trial was fair. It was 935m, so a bit short for him. But the 1200m should be good for him on Saturday," said Da Cruz, who will bandage Packing Eagle's legs for Saturday's race.

"It's just for safety. He could race without them but it's just to make sure he gives a good kick at the end."

Raced by Da Cruz's mother Angel, Packing Eagle won five straight races in class three and two company in Hong Kong and placed in the Gr.1 Champion's Mile (1600m) at Sha Tin in 2016 before he was sent to New Zealand.

With a rating of 104, Packing Eagle is one of the highest-rated gallopers in New Zealand, so Da Cruz is mindful of setting him for weight-for-age and set weights and penalties races, meaning another crack at the Railway Stakes is the gelding's likely summer target.

Da Cruz is happy to take his chance on Saturday with the lower-rated Elusive Treasure, who finished fifth of six runners in rating 82 company at Te Rapa last start in August.

"He should be fitter now. He ran on a heavy 11 track last time and he just sunk into the ground and couldn't kick on at all."

Elusive Treasure finished fifth behind Packing Eagle in the BCD Sprint last season.

MYER RETURN **FOR I AM A STAR**

New Zealand-bred mare **I Am A Star (NZ)** (I Am Invincible) will now be set for the Gr.1 Myer Classic next month after putting in a dominant performance to win the Gr.3 Ladies' Day Vase (1600m) at Caulfield on Wednesday.

The New Zealand Bloodstock Sales graduate jumped away well for jockey Ben Melham, who took the early lead with the mare and dictated terms throughout to win comfortably by half a length.

"Once they were happy for him to dictate the race it was going to take a lot to run her down," trainer Shane Nichols said.

"It was a dominant win, she won really well. She just does the job, Ben rated her really well in front and nothing really came to put pressure on her until late."

The five-year-old is in good form this spring, with Wednesday's victory coming off the back of Group Two wins in the Stocks Stakes (1600m) and

Let's Elope Stakes (1400m) in her two previous runs, while she also kicked-off her spring campaign with a placing in the Gr.3 Cockram Stakes (1200m).

I Am A Star is now set to chase a second Group One win in the Myer Classic (1600m) at Flemington on November 3, a race she won in 2016.

"Come the Myer, hopefully she stays in one piece and we can keep her happy and keep her racing like that," Nichols said.

Geelong or Moonee Valley options for Patrick Erin

New Zealand-owned stayer **Patrick Erin (NZ)** (Gallant Guru) looks likely to miss a run in Saturday's Gr.1 Caulfield Cup (2400m), for which he is first emergency.

Trainer Chris Waller reported the last start Gr.1 Metropolitan Handicap (2400m) winner has arrived safely into his Flemington stable.

"Unfortunately he is the first emergency in the Caulfield Cup on Saturday but if he does gain a start he certainly deserves his position there after winning the Metropolitan.

"His runs this preparation have all been very good – not just winning the Metropolitan but his run prior to that behind Avilius and Brimham Rocks which seems to be good form.

"It was certainly an eye-catching run and a tough 2400m is exactly what he is looking for.

"He is the winner of 11 races on varying tracks from good to soft, Corey Brown is booked to ride on Saturday from barrier 12 so we are just hoping to see him gain a start."

Should Patrick Erin not gain a Caulfield Cup berth, the Gr.3 Geelong Cup (2400m) on Wednesday or the Gr.2 Moonee Valley Gold Cup (2500m) next Saturday are possible plan b options.

Aloisia primed for Tristar

Group One winner **Aloisia (NZ)** (Azamour) will be looking to recapture her form of last spring when she lines-up in the Gr.2 Tristar Stakes (1400m) at Caulfield on Saturday.

The daughter of Azamour won the Gr.1 Thousand Guineas (1600m) and Gr.2 Moonee Valley Vase (2040m) last season but hasn't recorded a victory since then.

"You can pretty much put a pen through all of them (autumn runs) except for the

Vinery (where she finished third)," trainer Ciaran Maher said.

"She had a bit of a torrid time with barriers and just ended up in the wrong position."

Maher was pleased with her fresh-up unplaced run in the Gr.2 Blazer Stakes (1400m) at Flemington earlier this month and believes she should be right in the reckoning on Saturday.

"It was very nice," he said. "I think she has really come on and she has really brightened up in the coat and her work was nice today. If she sits a bit closer she should finish in the money.

"We have kept her really fresh this time around. Her aim is the Myer (Gr.1, 1600m). She ran really well first-up and I think she has improved. So she is on the right track."

Beauty Generation relishes the rain in final gallop for Oriental Watch Sha Tin Trophy

Beauty Generation (NZ) (Road To Rock) galloped on a dampened turf track at Sha Tin Thursday morning and relished every step taken as trainer John Moore kept his stable star ticking over into Sunday's Gr.2 Oriental Watch Sha Tin Trophy Handicap (1600m).

Hong Kong's Horse of the Year stretched out around Sha Tin's floodlit circuit pre-dawn with Zac Purton in the saddle. The powerful bay entered the track at about the 1800m mark, wound up off the turn and quickened to a cruising gallop down the home straight to clock 25.9s for the final 400m.

"Zac was really happy with the work," Moore said as he sheltered under a stable-liveried maroon and white umbrella. "He went through his paces really well and enjoyed the bit of cut in the ground this morning. I'm really pleased with the work

and we're going in with high hopes again." The champion jockey, meanwhile, was satisfied with his mount's wellbeing.

"The track is quite soggy with the drizzle we've had over-night so it's spongy and that was a good thing for him," Purton said. "He didn't want to tear around the track, he was happy just to cruise along and look after himself. He went through his gears nicely and worked up to the line without too much pressure. It was just a piece of work to tick him over and he enjoyed it.



Verry Elleegant (NZ) (Zed)

Kiwi filly well supported

Punters have wasted no time latching onto **Verry Elleegant (NZ)** (Zed) in Saturday's Gr.3 Ethereal Stakes (2000m) at Caulfield, making her the early favourite.

The former Nick Bishara-trained three-year-old didn't enjoy much luck in her Australian debut when third to her new stablemate, Amphitrite (Sebring), in the Gr.2 Edward Manifold Stakes (1600m) at Flemington. She was held up for much of the long straight before flashing late into third.

Verry Elleegant started her career in New Zealand, where she won two of her three starts.

Now in the care of Darren Weir, Verry Elleegant looks one of the more exciting three-year-old fillies heading toward the Gr.1 Kennedy Oaks over 2500m on November 8.

Final hit-out for Xpression ahead of Guineas

Group Two-winning filly **Xpression (NZ)** (Showcasing) will have one final hit-out at Ashburton on Saturday before she contests her main target of the spring, next month's Gr.1 Gavelhouse.com New Zealand 1000 Guineas (1600m).

Debt Collector ready for QE II

Last start Raffles Cup (1600m) winner **Debt Collector (NZ)** (Thorn Park) is on track for a repeat performance in Sunday's Queen Elizabeth II Cup (1800m) at Kranji.

The six-year-old gelding impressed in his track work earlier in the week with regular rider Michael Rodd in the saddle as he prepared for the second leg of the Singapore Triple Crown series.

Debt Collector has drawn gate 11 in a 14-horse field, half of which are New Zealand bred gallopers.

Donna Logan's former New Zealand galloper **Volkstok'n'barrell (NZ)** (Tavistock), will jump from barrier four, while Vlad Duric takes the reins on **Countofmontecristo (NZ)** (Echoes of Heaven) from gate five.

Grey heavyweights to duel in Sunday's Premier Bowl

Everyone loves a grey, they say, and Hong Kong's best of that hue will vie for affection in the Gr.2 Premier Bowl Handicap (1200m) at Sha Tin on Sunday.

Along with rising star Hot King Prawn (Denman), kiwi-breds **Fifty Fifty (NZ)** (Thorn Park) - placed in the Gr.1 Stewards' Cup (1600m) and Gr.1 Queen's Silver Jubilee Cup (1400m) last term - and the hulking **Pingwu Spark (NZ)** (Mastercraftsman) will mix it up in the 1200m feature.

And while trainer Benno Yung said that Pingwu Spark is most likely to revert to a longer distance after the weekend, Sunday's race could yet prove to be pivotal to Fifty Fifty's future direction

"I've entered him for the Hong Kong Sprint and the Hong Kong Mile in December, so if he runs well at 1200 (metres) we might go that way," trainer Peter Ho revealed.

"If he does run well, I'll look at 1200 and 1400, because the milers are very strong. This race is important to our plans.

Yung, meanwhile, echoed Ho's position that the strength of Sunday's mile feature was a factor in his grey star taking up the sprint option.

"This race looks a better starting point for Pingwu Spark than the mile race, which looks very strong," the handler said. "He hasn't raced for a long time; he's fresh and so the 1200 (metres) race looks suitable.

"The plan is to probably go to the mile trial (Jockey Club Mile) in November. If he runs very well on Sunday then we could look at the sprint races but more likely he will step back up to a mile."

Excalibur making progress towards staying features

Five-year-old gelding **Excalibur (NZ)**

(Tavistock) heads into Saturday's Listed Jakkalberry Classic (1950m) at Rotorua in fine fettle according to trainer Shaune Ritchie, but the wide draw of barrier 11 will ensure he is ridden conservatively once again.

The winner of six races, Excalibur has found the line well in his two runs this campaign, including a strong second in the Listed Haunui Farm Karaka Classic (1600m) last start and will relish the step up in distance.

"In both runs he drew wide and was ridden quietly and the situation will be the same on Saturday unfortunately," Ritchie said. [Full story here](#)



Igraine (Galileo)

First black-type test for Igraine

European import **Igraine (Galileo)** has hardly put a foot wrong since joining Robert Priscott's Te Awamutu barn earlier this year and she is set to tackle stakes company for the first time in the Listed Jakkalberry Classic (1950m) at Rotorua on Saturday.

The daughter of Galileo has won three of her four starts in New Zealand for Brent and Cherry Taylor of Trelawney Stud and Priscott believes she can continue that impressive strike-rate on Saturday.

Bocce (Foxwedge)

Bocce ready for return

Stakes-placed galloper **Bocce** (Foxwedge) is set to resume on Saturday in the Faulkner Drainage 3YO (1215m) at Rotorua and has won a trial to fit him for his return to racing.

Trained by Mike Moroney and Pam Gerard, Bocce was a debut winner before finishing third to Champion Two-Year-Old Avantage (Fastnet Rock) in the Listed Karaka Million (1200m) and fourth in the Gr.1 Sistema Stakes (1200m).

"He won his trial well recently at Cambridge and came on for it," Gerard said.

"He's coming back from a pretty hard two-year-old season, but we're happy with him and he's still got plenty of improvement in him."

Although quite tractable as a young colt, Bocce has been gelded since last racing.

"He seems to be doing everything right and is a bit more settled," Gerard said.

"Bolt From The Blue will probably lead on Saturday and he can position where he's comfortable. He's usually been quick out of the gates and landed in a position to be right there and he should run well!"

Te Akau Shark to Christchurch

Impressive last start winner **Te Akau Shark (NZ)** (Rip Van Winkle) will tackle the Gr.2 Coupland's Bakeries Mile (1600m) at Riccarton in preference to a trip across the Tasman.

The Jamie Richards-trained four-year-old toyed with his rivals in the Gr.3 Red Badge Sprint (1400m) on the final day of the Hawke's Bay Carnival and has subsequently spent time on the water walker before returning to the stable.

"We will look to give him a gallop somewhere before the Coupland's but he will go straight there without another race day start," Richards said.

"We did consider a Melbourne campaign, but there are plenty of options for the horse in Australia in autumn."

Te Akau Shark has won four of his five starts to date.



Who Shot Thebarman (NZ) (Yamanin Vital)

Melbourne Cup tilt in the balance

A fourth attempt at the Gr.1 Melbourne Cup (3200m) will hang in the balance at Moonee Valley on October 27 for **Who Shot Thebarman (NZ)** (Yamanin Vital).

The Gr.1 Sydney Cup (3200m) winner will line-up in the Gr.2 Moonee Valley Gold Cup (2500m) off the back of a disappointing ninth-placing in wet conditions to compatriot Moss 'n' Dale (NZ) (Castledale) in the Gr.3 Craven Plate (2000m) at Randwick on Saturday.

"He's a really good horse and he's won on heavy tracks before, but he wasn't at home at all in the going on Saturday, it was just as wet as it gets in Sydney," trainer Chris Waller said.

"We'll make sure he's come through the race well and at this stage it looks like he has, but we'll do some other checks as well to make sure he's 100 percent."

"We'll head to Moonee Valley for the Moonee Valley Gold Cup, which he won last year, and that will decide whether he progresses to the Melbourne Cup or not."



Pentathlon (NZ) (Pentire)

Surprise Cup also in mind for Pentathlon

Taranaki trainer John Wheeler hasn't given up hope of getting **Pentathlon (NZ)** (Pentire) into next month's Gr.1 A\$7 million Melbourne Cup, but he has come up with a left-field alternative if the talented stayer misses a start in the 3200m Flemington feature.

Pentathlon finished ninth in the 2016 Melbourne Cup and just failed in a last-ditch attempt to get a start in the race last year when third in the Gr.3 Lexus Stakes (2500m).

This year Pentathlon is currently sitting 58th in order of entry for the Melbourne Cup and Wheeler knows the seven-year-old son of Pentire has to lift his game in his next couple of starts to sneak into the big one.

The Dawn Approach gelding will bypass Monday's Gr.2 James and Annie Sarten Memorial Stakes (1400m) at Te Rapa and could head towards the trials in the lead-up to next month's Riccarton feature.

"We're still mulling over Christchurch, he's pulled up tremendously well (since his last-start)," Ritchie said.

"I haven't put him in the Sarten, I thought it might have been a bit soon, so we've got to find some way to give him another run, maybe only a trial."

The Gr.1 New Zealand Derby (2400m) winner had an interrupted campaign after suffering from back soreness and failed to fire in his two starts, including his tenth placing at Cranbourne.

"He didn't run up to expectations last week," co-trainer Murray Baker said.

"He's a good stayer but there is just something there that we can't pick up at the moment, so we will send him home to New Zealand and give him a spell.

Meanwhile, stablemate **Peaceful (NZ)** (Savabeel), who finished towards the rear in the Gr.1 Caulfield 1000 Guineas (1600m) was found to be heavily in season.

The daughter of Savabeel will likely contest the Listed Jim Beam Black Stakes (1400m) at Flemington on Melbourne Cup day.

racecourse in Singapore on Sunday.

Her charge, Drone, appeared to be squeezed in restricted room between Thunderstruck (Vlad Duric) and Racer King (Daniel Moor) when Collett fell at the 250m mark in a Class 4 Non Premier race over 1000m.

"It happened so quickly. I felt like I was being catapulted," Collett said.

"I was a bit worried as I was so close to the other two horses and I could get hurt more badly. It was really painful and I couldn't move much, especially around my back.

"But instinctively, the first thing I did was check if my head was okay, and I remember thinking I was good and then I checked if I could move my limbs, and they were fine.

"So, that was a relief. Still after the X-rays were done at the hospital, they found a fracture to my L1 (lumbar) vertebra and my right heel.

"They also did an MRI on my brain and it was clear. So, under the circumstances, I'm as good as I could possibly be – it could have been worse."
