BONNEVAL CLEARED TO START IN CAULFIELD CUP

After a dramatic few days, star New Zealand mare **Bonneval (NZ)** (Makfi) has been cleared to run in the Caulfield Cup as veteran trainer Murray Baker expected.

Racing Victoria vets inspected Bonneval on Wednesday and deemed the four-year-old was Grade 1 out of 5 lame in her right foreleg, an improvement on their previous Grade 2 assessment.

Stewards ordered another inspection 24 hours later and on Thursday afternoon two RV vets passed the multiple Group One winner fit to start in Saturday's A\$3 million 2400m-handicap.

Baker had insisted since Sunday there were no concerns with the mare despite a post-race veterinary report on last Saturday's Caulfield Stakes saying the mare, who finished sixth, was lame in the near foreleg and also had a laceration to a hind pastern.

"She's in excellent health and we're very happy with her this week," Baker said on Thursday morning.

"She's fit and seems good as gold."

The in-form Kerrin McEvoy, who is booked to ride Bonneval in a race for the first time in the Caulfield Cup, has been aboard the mare in trackwork on Wednesday and Thursday in preparation for Saturday.

"I had a canter on her yesterday and she felt fine and then this morning she just did some nice striding work over seven furlongs on the dirt and she seems free as a bell in my opinion, and happy coming off the track," McEvoy said.

"She's bouncing and full of herself and seems really bright."

Bonneval is out to \$8.50 after being as short as \$5.50 for the Caulfield Cup

The mare is unbeaten in two starts over 2400m in this year's New Zealand Oaks and Australian Oaks.

Baker said he had been surprised by the attention surrounding Bonneval's fitness.

"To be fair I am a little bit surprised because if she was sore we wouldn't be persevering with her," he said.

Baker, who trains in partnership with Andrew Forsman in New Zealand and won the 2015 Caulfield Cup with Mongolian Khan (Holy Roman Emperor), also has Australian Derby winner Jon Snow (NZ) (Iffraaj) in the race.

He would like some rain for both horses to enhance their chances.

"I can't really split them because Jon Snow's been going really well," Baker said.

"He's a Derby winner at 2400 metres which is the distance of the Caulfield Cup, so hopefully he's right there.

"They're both pretty laid-back horses. They don't do much on the (training) track. But they're race day horses and that's what counts."

LANE GIVES HUMIDOR GREAT CHANCE IN CUP

Damian Lane has made a flying start to the season and believes he has a great chance to land his biggest career win in the Caulfield Cup on one-time favourite **Humidor (NZ)** (Teofilo).

Lane leads the Melbourne and Victorian jockeys' premierships and has two Group One wins already this spring, including the Makybe Diva Stakes on Humidor.

That victory propelled the Darren Weir-trained Humidor to Caulfield Cup favouritism but he has since been relegated to equal second pick at \$8 behind international visitor Johannes Vermeer (Galileo) (\$4.20).

Humidor was soundly beaten by champion Winx (Street Cry) in the Turnbull Stakes (2000m) last start, finishing 7-1/4 lengths third.

Caulfield Cup rival Ventura Storm (Zoffany) finished three quarters of a length in front of Humidor.

"When Winx let go he got really left out of his comfort

zone and from where he was I thought he probably ran the best he could," Lane said.

"Ventura Storm probably had four or five lengths on him in the run and he only finished three-quarters of a length away from him. I thought he closed the race off well and ran like a horse probably looking for the 2400 metres.

"He's come through his Turnbull run really well and he's drawn a good gate (seven) which always helps.

"I'm very excited.

"The Caulfield Cup is the Caulfield Cup. There's a lot of great chances in the race so he's going to need luck in running.

"But if he gets the right run I'm sure he can run really well."

Weir considered applying blinkers to Humidor after the Turnbull but has instead opted to go with a tongue-tie and a near-side bubble cheeker.

"He did a lot of work last preparation with the near-side

bubble cheeker on and I was always happy with the way he was going in that," Lane said.

"We never used it on race day but because he hung in a little bit worse than normal last start, we're deciding to go with it on race day and I'm confident that will straighten him up a little bit."

Two of 23-year-old Lane's eight career Group One wins have been on Humidor with the pair combining in the Australian Cup in the autumn.

GROUP ONE GOAL FOR MOE CUP WINNER

Tasmanian based galloper **Count Da Vinci (NZ)** (Faltaat) continued trainer Scott Brunton's pillaging of country cups on the mainland, taking out the \$150,000 Moe Cup yesterday.

The seven-year-old Faltaat gelding held out the fast-finishing Pacodali (Paco Boy) and Tarquin (Hard Spun) to claim the big prize under David Pires' riding - Pires successful at his first ride at the Gippsland region track.

Pires was delighted with the effort from the seven-year-old who scored once in eighteen New Zealand starts under the name Faaltline from Jim Wallace's Opaki stable before being on-sold to Tasmania.

"It was great to be here today and to win the big race on the horse I won the Hobart Cup on is pretty special," he said.

"We were confident about our chances although we were a little bit worried about Darren Weir's horse (Pacodali). We thought we were well in the weights with 54.5kgs and it showed today.

"I think he will go home for a bit of a break now then come back here for a few selected races."

Count Da Vinci entered Brunton's stable in July 2016 after being sourced for owner Wayne Notman by Victorian agent Lenny Russo. Brunton confirmed he now has a Group One goal in mind for the ex-Kiwi galloper, who in his relatively short time in

Australia has claimed the Group 3 Hobart Cup among seven wins from 12 starts since crossing the Tasman.

Speaking to Racing.com post-race, Brunton said a long-term goal now with the stayer could be a race like the \$2.15 million Sydney Cup (3200m) in the autumn.

The victory took Count Da Vinci's career record to eight wins and 10 minor placings from 30 starts with prizemoney in excess of A\$342,000.

Wait A Sec (NZ) (Postponed)

Time is right for Wait A Sec

Timing was a key factor in the decision to back-up **Wait A Sec (NZ)** (Postponed) in Sunday's Gr.1 Livamol Classic (2040m) at Hastings.

The seven-year-old, who is on target for next month's Gr.3 Christchurch Casino New Zealand Cup (3200m), was successful in the Egmont Cup (2100m) last weekend, his sixth win from his last eight appearances.

"The Livamol fits in well and then we won't run him again before the Metropolitan on the first day at Riccarton and into the Cup," said Grant Cullen, who trains the Postponed gelding with Guy Lowry. [Full story here](#)

Stayer rocking on to Livamol

New Zealand and Australian stakes performer **Rock On (NZ)** (Road To Rock) will be at Hastings for take two of the Gr.1 Livamol Classic (2040m).

Trainer Gary Vile has confirmed the five-year-old will contest the weight-for-age feature, which has been rescheduled to run at Hawke's Bay this Sunday after its initial abandonment due to unsafe track conditions.

Moore Happy with Werther

John Moore said Hong Kong's former Horse of the Year **Werther (NZ)** (Tavistock) is "jumping out of his skin" ahead of Sunday's Gr.2 Oriental Watch Sha Tin Trophy Handicap (1600m).

The six-year-old snared a third career Group One win in his last race, the Standard Chartered Champions & Chater Cup (2400m). That was back in May but Moore believes he has his talented charge in fine shape for his first start this season and is expecting a positive outcome.

"Werther's very well," Moore said. "He's a live chance. The gate's important, of course, especially at the mile, but hopefully he can draw well so that he can just get a soft run in behind. We're going into Sunday with high hopes that he can repeat what he did two seasons ago when he won first-up."

That debut Sha Tin win came in the Class 2 mile handicap on the 2015 LONGINES Hong Kong International Race day. Victories in the BMW Hong Kong Derby (2000m) and Gr.1 QEII Cup (2000m) followed that season,

before injury forced the Tavistock gelding's absence through the first portion of last term, including the Hong Kong International Races. Moore has had a smooth run with his charge this time around.

"Everything's going to plan, we've had no setbacks," he said.

"He'll run Sunday and then he'll go into the Jockey Club Cup (2000m) next month and then the Hong Kong Cup (2000m), he's very clean-winded so that's all he needs."



Beauty Generation (NZ) (Road To Rock)

Leung's belief in Beauty ahead of Sha Tin Trophy

Jockey Derek Leung believes shock first-up winner **Beauty Generation (NZ)** (Road To Rock) is capable of adding the Gr.2 Oriental Watch Sha Tin Trophy Handicap (1600m) to his record on Sunday as the galloper continues his march towards December's LONGINES Hong Kong International Races.

Leung is aiming to score his first Group Two success aboard the John Moore-trained Beauty Generation, who formerly raced as Montaigne, after producing a well-judged front-running ride to take the Gr.3 Celebration Cup Handicap (1400m) aboard the five-year-old on October 1. It was the first time that Beauty Generation had led, a plan that Leung said was devised by his handler on race day.

"I think he should still have more improvement from that race," Leung said.

Untamed Diamond (Snitzel) will resume her New Zealand career for Richard Collett at Rotorua on Saturday.

The Snitzel mare won three races for the Pukekohe Park trainer, who subsequently campaigned her in Sydney where she doubled her winning tally and was runner-up in the Listed Bright Shadow Stakes (1200m) at Doomben.

Promising stayer **Social Element (NZ)** (Savabeel) will make an earlier-than-expected foray into stakes racing at Randwick on Saturday.

Co-trainer Adrian Bott admitted the Listed City Tattersalls Club Cup (2400m) wasn't originally on Social Element's schedule but a string of consistent performances have changed the stayer's spring timetable.

"He's continued to impress us with how much he's improved from each start so we keep raising the bar," Bott said.

Social Element has two wins and has never finished worse than third in his six-race career.

"Every time we've stepped it up with him he's responded really well but this is a big ask for him again to take that next step into Listed company," Bott said.

"He's still just learning how to race to tell you the truth but he keeps improving and next preparation you'll see a quality stayer, a really furnished horse."

Capable Riccarton sprinter **Kinagat** (Street Cry) could provide trainers Michael and Matthew Pitman with a guide on which Cup week feature to tackle at Ashburton tomorrow.

The Street Cry six-year-old will tackle the McCrea Painters & Decorators 1200m and his Riccarton feature assignment is likely to be determined by how he performs.

"Kinagat is a better horse this preparation than he was last time," Michael Pitman said.

"We turned him out with reverse shoes and it's done him the world of good. He had hoof issues last time and we would take him to the beach and soak his hooves in the sea, but he's a lot better this time.

"He's in the Stewards, but we've also nominated him for the Coupland's Mile and we could yet go that way. He's a lot more settled this time in."

The Gr.2 Coupland's Bakeries Mile (1600m) and the Gr.3 Lindauer Stewards' Stakes (1200m) are both run on November 15.

Debut winner ready to rock again

Promising four-year-old **Bevan Street (NZ)** (Road To Rock) is in fine fettle for his engagement at Tauranga today.

"It was a reasonably soft win in the end," said winning trainer Tony Pike. "Based on his form you'd expect that third-up today. He's a work in progress and he's only going to get better with racing. He settled nicely today.

The Waikato Stud-bred and owned sprinter was unbeaten in his first five appearances from the Sydney yard of John, Michael and Wayne Hawkes before his form tapered off and he returned home to join Moira and Kieran Murdoch's stable.

Group One sprints will be the focus of **Heroic Valour's** (Fastnet Rock) summer programme.

The son of Fastnet Rock has already tasted success at the top level having claimed the Sistema Stakes (1200m) during an unbeaten juvenile campaign and performed with credit during his three-year-old season.

The Stephen Autridge and Jamie Richards-trained Heroic Valour won the Listed Northland Breeders' Stakes (1200m), ran third in the Gr.1 New Zealand 2000 Guineas (1600m) and was fourth against the older horses in the Gr.1 NRM Sprint (1400m). [Full story here](#)
