RAFFLES HAS HIGH HOPES FOR SACRED ELIXIR



Sacred Elixir's victory in last Saturday's Moonee Valley Vase has him at peak for his Gr. 1 VRC Derby bid tomorrow

or a family syndicate formed for a bit of fun, Raffles Racing has enjoyed a considerable degree of Group One success. Its first purchase as a yearling was **Shamrocker (NZ)** (O'Reilly), who in 2011 became the first filly to complete the Australian Guineas-Australian Derby double.

The syndicate goes into its first \$1.5 million Victoria Derby with the favourite, **Sacred Elixir (NZ)** (Pour Moi).

The family has been pretty lucky since setting up Raffles Racing in 2010, racing manager Kyan Yap says.

"We're pretty blessed in terms of being able to win some

good races and also having horses like Sacred Falls who became a stallion and being involved with Press Statement who became a stallion as well."

Yap's father, Malaysian businessman Dato Yap, bought the Raffles Farm in New Zealand in 2008.

They continue to sell the horses they breed on the farm, initially set up in the 1990s by the brother of Singapore's founding leader Lee Kuan Yew, while buying horses separately to race.

"This racing arm is my dad, me and the family," Yap told AAP.

"We all got together to form a syndicate for a bit of fun.

"We have so far won about 18 Group Ones around the world. I think that's not too bad."

The syndicate has about 40 racehorses, and owns between 100 and 120 mares and yearlings.

Having their own farm in New Zealand has proven to be a good formula.

The horses who show potential usually start racing in New Zealand before branching out to run under the Raffles colours in Australia, Malaysia, Singapore, Macau, Japan and the UK.

Bruce Sherwin and Guy Mulcaster bought Sacred Elixir for Raffles at the NZB Premier Yearling Sale from the draft of Wentwood Grange for \$170,000, with his staying pedigree always putting him in line for a Derby.

The New Zealand three-year-old is by Epsom Derby winner Pour Moi and his great grandmother is Japan Cup winner Horlicks (NZ) (Three Legs), mother of Melbourne Cup winner Brew (NZ) (Sir Tristram).

"From day one we thought he's going to be a derby horse,"

Yap said.

"So I think it has vindicated our belief in him that he is racing in the Derby on Saturday.

"The family pedigree shows that he can stay. Being a New Zealand horse, they also have a very good success rate at winning the Derby over here."

Yap said Sacred Elixir - winner of the Group One J J Atkins Stakes in Brisbane as a two-year-old - goes into the Derby in very good form after taking out the LUCRF Vase at Moonee Valley on Saturday.

Taking the ride on the Tony Pike-trained Sacred Elixir on Saturday will be Hong Kong-based Australian jockey Zac Purton who rode him in the Atkins and steered Raffles' Sacred Falls (NZ) (O'Reilly) to his second consecutive Doncaster Mile win in 2014.

Yap rates Sacred Elixir as one of the best horses Raffles has racing at the moment.

"We believe that he is going to just get better as he grows older.

"We have high hopes for him, but he has to prove himself on Saturday first."

ROKKII PRIMED FOR SECOND GROUP ONE

our-year-old gelding **He's Our Rokkii (NZ)** (Roc de Cambes) will be out to maintain his impeccable record this preparation when he contests Saturday's Gr.1 Cantala Stakes (1600m) at Flemington.

The David and Ben Hayes and Tom Dabernig-trained galloper has been a first-class addition to the stable since crossing the Tasman, having originally been prepared by Cambridge horseman Mark Forbes.

He's Our Rokki has won his past five starts, including a last start victory in the Gr.1 Toorak Handicap (1600m).

"He's had the perfect preparation," David Hayes said. "It's a little bit of a sticky gate (11) but he will probably be relaxed early and charging home."

Another former New Zealandtrained galloper **Mackintosh (NZ)** (Pins) looms as one of the toughest rivals and has two factors in his favour when he chases his maiden Group One win

"I think the big plus with Mackintosh is that he's only had two races this preparation, so he's quite a fresh horse coming down to Victoria which I think is a big thing," trainer Chris Waller said.

"And his form is good. He was narrowly beaten in the Epsom. Joao Moreira rides him so that's obviously a plus in itself."

Mackintosh won the Gr.2 Theo Marks Stakes when resuming two runs back and the Pins gelding then finished third in the Gr.1 Epsom Handicap.

Meanwhile Kiwi raider **Humidor** (**NZ**) (Teofilo) will have to overcome an awkward draw in 15.

"We've got the visitor's draw, but we'll still go forward," said Johno Benner, who prepares Humidor with his partner Hollie Wynyard.

"We want to make use of his light weight (52.5kg) and give him every opportunity to be competitive."

I Am A Star (NZ) (I Am Invincible)



No three-year-old filly has won the Myer Classic since its inception in 1988 and only six have rolled the dice to take on the older mares in the mile event.

I Am A Star placed third to Nurse Kitchen (NZ) (Savabeel) in the Gr.2 Fillies Classic at Moonee Valley last Saturday and trainer Shane Nichols believes she will appreciate a firmer surface at Flemington.

"The inside barrier wasn't ideal and the sting out of the track wasn't to her liking so I was pleased with her performance," Nichols said.

"She is sound and has eaten up since running Saturday so the plan is to not do too much with her this week and have a throw at the stumps this weekend.

"The mile is the upper stretch of her distance range but she gets 49kg and her run in the Thousand Guineas was also good."

New Zealand bred mares Rising Romance (NZ) (Ekraar), Euro Angel (NZ) (Rip Van Winkle) and Pure Pride (NZ) (Shocking) also have strong chances in the competitive field.

Regally-bred Euro Angel has never finished out of the first three in her six career starts and enters Saturday's contest on the back of a good win in the Gr.3 Ladies' Day Vase (1600m) for Team Hawkes.

"Her coat is only coming right now and she is improving all the time," co-trainer Wayne Hawkes said. "She's going to be peaking on the right day."

Williams booked for Highlad

Craig Williams has been engaged to ride the Cambridge-trained three-year-old **Highlad** (High Chaparral) in Saturday's Gr.1 VRC Derby.

He will replace Damien Oliver, who lost his appeal to have his reckless riding ban reduced, on the Murray Baker and Andrew Forsman-trained runner at Flemington.

Stablemate **Saracino (NZ)** (Per Incanto) will be ridden by Mark Zahra in the Gr.1 Coolmore Stud Stakes.

Saracino won down the Flemington straight first-up in the Danehill Stakes before producing credible efforts in both the Caulfield Guineas Prelude and the Caulfield Guineas.

Zealand en route to Oaks

Michelle Payne will partner the former New Zealand galloper **Queen of Zealand** (NZ) (Savabeel) in the Gr.2 Mumm Wakeful Stakes on Saturday - the horse on a pathway to the A\$1 million Crown Oaks on Thursday week.

Kevin Myers identified the filly as a possible Oaks horse for Payne, having been placed in Stakes grade at her second start before being transferred from the Wayne Jones stable.

Despite only having the lone Warrnambool run under her belt since arriving in Australia, co-owner Brendan Tohill believes Queen Of Zealand has every chance of putting Payne's name up in lights yet again at Headquarters.

"There's a lot to like about her - a Savabeel filly going to 2000m for the first time.

"If we can get home and run a nice third or fourth - not saying we can't win - but that'll top her off for Thursday."

Pentathlon peaking at the right time

Pentathlon (NZ) (Pentire) might be at long odds in the \$A6 million Gr.1 Melbourne Cup, but John Wheeler's confidence is growing ahead of the Flemington feature.

The 50-1 shot has trimmed down with each of his Australian outings and further improvement is tipped from the Pentire five-year-old in Saturday's Gr.3 Lexus Stakes.

"He's coming to his peak - I was behind the eight ball a bit when we first got here, he was a bit fat but I've got it right now," Wheeler said.

"He'll be really competitive on Saturday and Mark Du Plessis will ride him and in the

Melbourne Cup, as long as he gets in.

Already a winner and Group placed at two miles, Pentathlon ran third behind Grand Marshal (Dansili) and Who Shot Thebarman (NZ) (Yamanin Vital) in the Gr.2 Moonee Valley Cup (2500m) last weekend.

Karaka graduates renew battle in Raffles Cup

The second leg of the Singapore triple crown series will be run on Sunday with six of the seven runners to contest the SIN G1 Raffles Cup (1800m) New Zealand bred horses

Amongst them are New Zealand Bloodstock Ready to Run graduates **Debt Collector (NZ)** (Thorn Park) and **Well Done (NZ)** (Falkirk), who will renew their rivalry after a stirring 1-2 finish in the SIN G1 Kranji Mile.

Well Done's rider Glen Boss believes his charge can turn the tables on Debt Collector.

"Debt Collector is a great horse and I have a lot of respect for him, but my bloke will go into the Raffles Cup a lot fitter, and it should be a great fight," Boss said.

"But it's not just Debt Collector I should worry about. There are five other horses who are all very good, and I think it will be a close contest."

Apprentice booked for Guineas favourite

Racha Cuneen is hoping to reward the faith of **La Diosa's (NZ)** (So You Think) connections with a Group One victory.

The Canterbury apprentice has retained the mount on the top South Island filly in the gavelhouse.com NZ 1000 Guineas at Riccarton on November 12.

"It's been confirmed that I'll be riding her and it's a great opportunity for me," Cuneen said.

The 24-year-old is no stranger to Group One pressure having finished runner-up in last season's Telegraph aboard Miss Seton Sands (Gonski).

Cuneen has guided the Mandy and Matt Brown-trained La Diosa to impressive Listed wins in the Canterbury Belle Stakes and the Barneswood Farm Stakes and he is confident the best is yet to come from the classic favourite.

"She's improving all the time and the further she goes the better she'll be," he said.

Sarten winner revives Guineas hopes

Ugo Foscolo (NZ) (Zacinto) bounced back to his best defeating a hot field of threeyear-olds and fellow Gr.1 New Zealand 2000 Guineas hopefuls in the Gr.2 James & Annie Sarten Memorial (1400m) on Monday.

Ugo Foscolo was unbeaten in his first three starts, but he lost his favouritism for next month's classic after racing erratically when sixth in the Gr.2 Hawke's Bay Guineas.

Ugo Foscolo beat Mongolian Falcon

(Fastnet Rock) by a short neck and the winner has now earned a \$7 quote for the 2000 Guineas with Mongolian Falcon, who won the Hawke's Bay Guineas, remaining the \$5 favourite.



Mystery Show (NZ) (Sakhee's Secret)

Trainer excited ahead of first southern venture

The fillies' classic at Riccarton next month can't roll around soon enough for James Bridge.

The source of the Byerley Park trainer's impatience is **Mystery Show (NZ)** (Sakhee's Secret), who ran a cracking trial for the Gr.1 gavelhouse.com New Zealand 1000 Guineas with her powerful finish for third in the Listed Soliloguy Stakes at Ellerslie.

"I've never travelled a horse south before and November 12 can't come quickly enough," Bridge said. "It's an exciting time." Full story here.

NZ stud career an option for Tarzino

Dual Group One winner **Tarzino (NZ)** (Tavistock) could return to the land of his birth to start his stallion career.

The Mick Price-trained stayer, who was being aimed at the Gr.1 Melbourne Cup, has been retired after a ligament injury.

Anthony Mithen of Rosemont Stud, who owns 30 per cent of the entire, told the Geelong Advertiser that they were exploring all of their options.

"Being a son of Tavistock, there is no hotter property in New Zealand at the

moment," he said. "We have spoken to a couple of New Zealand stud farms about whether they have any interest.

"We are not looking to sell any of our ownership in the horse. We are just working out whether we partner with a New Zealand farm to give the horse the best possible chance to be a success."



Honey Rider (NZ) (Pins)

Honey Rider to paddock

Talented filly **Honey Rider (NZ)** (Pins) is out of the Gr.1 gavelhouse NZ 1000 Guineas at Riccarton.

"She jarred up a bit in the Sarten so she's gone to the paddock to freshen-up," said Andrew Forsman, who prepares the Pins filly with Murray Baker.

Successful last season and runner-up in the Listed Castletown Stakes, Honey Rider was an impressive winner of the Gr.3 Gold Trail Stakes in her three-year-old debut.

She then failed to handle the testing track conditions at Hawera when unplaced against the older horses in the Gr.3 Taranaki Breeders' Stakes before she was out of the money in the Gr.2 James & Annie Sarten Memorial at Te Rapa.

Bella Gioia will now continue on to her main target – the Gr.1 gavelhouse.com NZ 1000 Guineas on November 12.

Remembering our Hall Of Fame Heroes

Tulloch- Tommy Smith's universal yardstick for equine excellence

Tulloch, the swampy-backed little colt who attracted the attention of top Sydney trainer Tommy Smith at the 1956 Trentham yearling sale, had that extra dimension, that near-freakish ability, which stamps the handful of greats.

He won 36 of his 53 starts, was only once out of the money and set a then Australasian stake-earning record of 108,293 pounds, a record for 11 years. Yet he lost nearly two years of his career through a debilitating and recurrent stomach illness which nearly killed him.

Tulloch had a fine record as a two-year-

old, and as a three-year-old he was almost invincible, winning 14 races, often in record time, including the AJC, Victorian and Queensland Derbys, the Rosehill and Caulfield Guineas, and the Caulfield Cup.

At the age of five and six he put together a further 15 wins including the Cox Plate, Mackinnon Stakes, Queen Elizabeth Stakes and the Brisbane Cup. The only unplaced run in his career was seventh in the 1960 Melbourne Cup when he carried 10st 1lbs (64kq).
