## HALE UP FOR THE CHALLENGE



Shelley Hale believes her Tarzino Trophy winner Close Up is primed for another big run in tomorrow's Gr. 1 Windsor Park Plate

o horse has ever won the Hawke's Bay weight-forage triple crown, but Cambridge trainer Shelley Hale is keen to keep the dream alive with upset first leg winner Close Up (NZ) (Shinko King).

The eight-year-old gelding was an \$18 outsider when he won the Gr.1 Tarzino Trophy (1400m) at Hastings three weeks ago under jockey Grant Cooksley, having only gained a start on race morning when connections of Stolen Dance (NZ) (Alamosa) decided to scratch in reaction to the heavy track.

As a Group One winner, Close Up was assured of a start in

Saturday's Gr.1 Windsor Park Plate (1600m) and success would almost certainly spur Hale and her co-owners into making a late entry payment for the Gr.1 Livamol Classic (2040m) at Hastings on October 7.

"We'd definitely have a look," Hale said.

"At nominations time, I thought 1600m might see him out, but if he runs a strong mile on Saturday, we'll definitely consider the last leg. It all depends on how he's hitting the line on Saturday."

Only Starcraft (NZ) (Soviet Star) and Seachange (NZ) (Cape

Cross) have contested the third leg of the triple crown having won the first two legs, with Starcraft outfinished by Balmuse (NZ) (Lord Ballina) in 2004 and Seachange finishing third in 2006 and fourth in 2007.

Kawi (NZ) (Savabeel) won the first two legs last year, but didn't contest the Livamol Classic, while Jimmy Choux (NZ) (Thorn Park), Wall Street (NZ) (Montjeu) and The Message (NZ) (Gold and Ivory) were others to win two of the three legs.

"He's in pretty good nick. He seems to be every bit as good going into this one as he was before the Tarzino Trophy," Hale said of Close Up.

"He's only had two goes at weight-for-age for a second in the Foxbridge Plate and his Group One win. You can't get much better than that.

"We have a little query with him at the mile, but I don't think it's going to be a problem. He's never got the opportunities over longer trips before because we've tended to give him light preps.

"He's jarred up on firm tracks so we'd always ease up on him. His family have all gone over 2000m so we'd like to think it won't be any issue." Despite his Tarzino Trophy win, Close Up remains an outsider with TAB bookmakers for the Windsor Park Plate, rated a \$15 equal seventh favourite in a market headed by Kawi and Gingernuts (NZ) (Iffraaf) at \$4.50 and Volpe Veloce (Foxwedge) at \$4.80.

"You've got to be realistic. It's a Group One race and they are blinking hard to win," Hale said.

"But I couldn't be any happier with him. His work this week has been super and he looks a treat. Everything is going 100 per cent with him. I don't get confident for any race, even a maiden, but I know he's in good order."

Hale said she was overwhelmed by the reaction to Close Up's Tarzino Trophy win.

"It's been pretty huge. I've been trying to get back to everyone who sent me a message and over the last couple of weeks I reckon I've talked myself silly," she said.

"Everyone was fantastic. They were quick with their congratulations and well-wishes."



### Gingernuts' Caulfield Cup campaign goes up another gear

Leading Caulfield Cup hope **Gingernuts** (NZ) (Iffraaj) is set to start favourite in Saturday's Gr.1 Windsor Park Plate (1600m) at Hastings.

The winner of the Gr.1 NZ Derby (2400m) and Gr.1 Rosehill Guineas (2000m) last season returned to racing as a four-year-old when finishing an eye-catching fifth in the Gr.1 Tarzino Trophy (1400m) at Hastings on September 4.

The Stephen Autridge and Jamie Richards-trained gelding rounded out his preparations for Saturday in a track gallop at Matamata on Tuesday morning.

Gingernuts is likely to remain in his homeland for his next two starts before crossing the Tasman for the A\$3 million Gr.1 Caulfield Cup (2400m) on October 21.

The chestnut's final lead-up to Caulfield is set to be the Gr.1 Livamol Classic (2040m) at Hastings on October 7.


Volkstok'n'barrell (NZ) (Tavistock)

Domestic Group One challenges await the well-performed Volkstok'n'barrell (NZ) (Tavistock), although a return to Australia hasn't been ruled out for the six-year-old.

The spring focus for the gelding is firstly on tomorrow's Gr.1 Windsor Park Plate (1600m) at Hastings, but it is the Gr.1 Livamol Classic (2000m) a fortnight later that he is tipped to be even more competitive in.

Charles Road won twice last season, including a victory in the Gr.3 Manawatu Classic (2000m) and was runner-up in both the Gr.2 Avondale Guineas (2100m) and in the Gr.2 Championship Stakes (2100m).

### Weight sways Munce with Cauthen's **Power**

A difference in weights enticed trainer Chris Munce to dodge yesterday's Lismore Cup with Cauthen's Power (NZ) (Road To Rock) in favour of running at Ipswich on

Cauthen's Power, who is part-owned by Australian cricket captain Steve Smith, has been gradually working into top form since joining Munce's stable from Sydney's Chris Waller five months ago.

Munce believes the City of Ipswich Spring Stayers Cup (2150m) will suit Cauthen's Power perfectly.

"He had 61 kilos in the Lismore Cup and with Matt McGillivray's claim at Ipswich he should carry 52.5 kilos," Munce said.

"It is a big difference and there wasn't that much between the two races," Munce said.

"I liked the way he hit the line last start and with a light weight he should give Saturday's race a good shake."

The New Zealand-bred Cauthen's Power was a Warwick Farm 1600m race winner in January and has been placed up to 2000m.

### Ciaron Maher aims for Oaks number three

Ciaron Maher knows how to train a VRC Oaks winner and reckons Aloisia (NZ)

(Azamour) has the galloping action and the determination to become his third winner of the 2500m Group One race.

Maher has won the Oaks with Set Square (Reset) (2014) and Jameka (Myboycharlie) (2015) and has set \$13 second favourite Aloisia for the November feature.

Aloisia will resume in Saturday's Aquis Farm Supports Pinchapoo Plate (1400m) in the first plank of a four-start spring campaign which will include the Thousand Guineas and culminate in the VRC Oaks.

It will be the first time Aloisia has been seen on race day since she ran a cracking second behind Capital Gain (Ad Valorem) in the Gr.1 JJ Atkins (1600m) during the Queensland winter carnival.

"She comes to hand pretty quickly and while she will take improvement out of this run, she has real quality about her and is drawn to get a nice run in a pocket just behind them," Maher said.

"She wintered really well in Queensland and has trialled up nicely for this.

"I wouldn't be at all surprised if she won."

### Impressive debut win for Naantali

The Ciaron Maher-trained Naantali (NZ) (Rip Van Winkle) defied a tough run to score in maiden company at Cranbourne on Wednesday and looks destined for better

The three-year-old daughter of Rip Van Winkle was no closer than four-wide throughout yet continued to find on debut over 1200m.

"I probably couldn't have had a worse run in the race, but today she's just won on class," rider Michael Dee said.

'She's still very new and got a lot of learning to do. I think she's got a lot of ability."

Out of the Zabeel mare Zaloot, Naantali was a \$180,000 purchase by Maher from Windsor Park Stud's draft at the 2016 New Zealand Bloodstock Premier Yearling Sale.

### Colt scores for notable owners

A high-profile Australasian ownership group have enjoyed success with a promising New Zealand-bred three-year-old prospect.

Higher honours now await Rellson (NZ) (O'Reilly) who, at his second appearance, was an impressive winner at Wangaratta on Tuesday over 1400m.

The son of O'Reilly, a \$580,000 Ready to Run Sale purchase, travelled easily and when rider Luke Nolen asked him for an effort on the turn he bolted clear to score a hollow victory.

The connections of **Mr Mor (NZ)** (Corrupt) have resisted the opportunity to give the well-performed jumper one more outing.

The 13-year-old has been a winter stalwart of Evan and J. J. Rayner's Wanganui stable for several seasons and his brave last-start fifth in the Great Northern Steeplechase (6400m) in testing conditions at Ellerslie closed out his career.

### **Group One target for Swampland**

Caulfield trainer Henry Dwyer is targeting the Gr.1 Myer Classic (1600m) with his talented mare **Swampland (NZ)** (Redwood).

The daughter of Redwood followed a hattrick of winter wins with luckless runner-up finishes behind Oregon's Day (Domesday) and Sword Of Light (New Approach)the latter in Saturday's Gr.2 Let's Elope Stakes (1400m) - to announce herself as a legitimate spring contender in mares' grade.

"She came out of the [Let's Elope] run in great order," Dwyer said.

Swampland, who has been in work for the best part of nine months, will now enjoy a brief freshen-up before a tilt at the Gr. 2 Tristarc Stakes (1400m) on October 21.

"We're lucky she's really clean-winded, we don't have to do much work between races. We can send her for a week in the paddock followed by two weeks on the water walker," Dwyer said.

"If she runs alright in the Tristarc, you're two weeks into the Myer, step her up to a mile, which I think she's probably looking for, and you just have to have a crack with these mares that are in form."



Sound Proposition (NZ) (Savabeel)

### **Epsom next for in-form Kiwi**

Former New Zealand galloper **Sound Proposition (NZ)** (Savabeel) will take his chance in Saturday week's \$A1 million Gr.1 Epsom Handicap (1600m).

Trainer Kris Lees confirmed a crack at the Randwick feature with the son of Savabeel in the wake of his runner-up finish in the Gr.3 Cameron Handicap (1500m).

Sound Proposition had won his previous two starts and he is in the Epsom with 53.5kg.

"It looks to be a weight that Sound Proposition can be very competitive with and he'll definitely line up in the Epsom," Lees said.



Gobstopper (NZ) (Tavistock)

Light Cup preparation to Gobstopper's liking

Gobstopper (NZ) (Tavistock) will make

just one more appearance before the Gr.3 Christchurch Casino New Zealand Cup (3200m).

The brother to the multiple international Group One winner Werther (NZ) is best served with his races well-spaced.

"He's such a clean-winded horse and he'll go to the Egmont Cup and then into the New Zealand Cup," trainer Andrew Campbell said. "He's needed to strengthen up and he's done that this year and 3200m will be right up his alley."

Gobstopper has won his last two races over ground at Tauherenikau and at Awapuni, both times with dominant frontrunning displays.

### Phelan side-lined after fall

Shaun Phelan is facing a lengthy period of recovery after a fall at Wanganui yesterday.

The leading jumps jockey suffered broken ribs and AC joint damage when he parted company with Joking (NZ) (Lucky Unicorn) with 700m to run in the Jolt Coffee House Open Steeplechase (4100m).

The race also saw the unfortunate demise of Nell's Belle (NZ) (Istidaad), who lost jockey Emily Farr when she went down on her nose at the penultimate jump. The Neil O'Dowdbred, owned and trained mare suffered injuries in the incident that resulted in her being humanely euthanised.

### High hopes for promising stayer

A trial at Foxton next week will be the launching pad to loftier heights for **Boxachocolates (NZ)** (Alamosa).

"He's doing well and hopefully we'll be looking at some cup races for him around Christmas time," Awapuni trainer Mike Breslin said.

The son of Alamosa won twice during the autumn and was spelled after an unplaced effort on an unsuitably heavy track at Tauranga in June.

Meanwhile, a bad barrier may count stablemate **King Cougar (NZ)** (Alamosa) out of Saturday's Trinity Hill 1300 at Hawke's Bay.

"He's doubtful – he drew wide on the first day and finished a game third, but I wouldn't do it again unless there was a lot of rain and the draw wouldn't matter so much," Breslin said.

### NZ First gets Hogan's tick of approval

Sir Patrick Hogan is urging racing participants to vote New Zealand First in reaction to the party's announcement that it is backing the establishment of an all-weather track.

New Zealand First's associate spokesperson for racing Clayton Mitchell announced the additional policy in a press release late last week, saying the racing industry was being "held back with too many meetings cancelled due to poor weather conditions".

"Each year more than 30 meetings are abandoned which is not only costly financially but it also hugely inconvenient for the public, trainers, jockeys and all those working in the industry," Mitchell said. Full story here

New Zealand jockey Robert Hannam has suffered a broken ankle following an incident at the starting gates in India over the weekend.

Hannam has been riding in India for trainer Vittal Reddy since early July and has ridden 17 winners to date.

The 50-year-old Group One-winning rider requires surgery on a broken fibula, but no decision has been made as yet regarding a return to New Zealand.

#### **Colt booked for Prelude**

**Summer Passage** (Snitzel) will make his next Australian appearance in the Gr.3 Caulfield Guineas Prelude (1400m) on October 1.

"After that we will make the decision as to whether he goes to the Caulfield Guineas or the Coolmore," said Lance O'Sullivan, who trains the Group One winner with Andrew Scott.

Summer Passage finished a close eighth in Saturday's Gr.2 Danehill Stakes (1200m) at Flemington.

"The run was a lot better than it looked," O'Sullivan said. "He was a bit lost down the straight and Mark Zahra had to take a hold of him when that other horse fell.

"He's come through the race very well and he will improve with it."

### Hurdle hero on easy list

The jumping find of the winter is now enjoying his time in the paddock.

**Monarch Chimes (NZ)** (Shinko King) won his first three starts over fences before he finished fourth in testing conditions in the Great Northern Hurdles (4190m).

"He struggled in the ground at Ellerslie," co-trainer Emma-Lee Browne said. "He came a long way in a short time though and did a super job."

### **Grylls bound for Melbourne**

Expatriate Kiwi jockey Bridget Grylls is trying her luck in Melbourne.

The 24-year-old was a leading apprentice in Brisbane following her move from New Zealand in 2014 and has since ridden 123 winners.

Grylls is from a well-known New Zealand racing family of jockeys, including her grandfather John Grylls, father Gary and brother Craig.

"A few of the horses I have been riding for John Meagher are in Victoria and he asked me to come down for a look," she said.


