

BAKER RACING TRIO OUT TO ENHANCE CUP CREDENTIALS



Bonneval tackles a quality field in Sunday's Gr. 1 Underwood Stakes at Caulfield

ew Zealand's Melbourne Cup influence will become more apparent this weekend.

In Sydney, Stephen Marsh's Brisbane Cup (2200m) winner **Chocante (NZ)** (Shocking) will lay his credentials on the table in Saturday's Gr.1 Metropolitan (2400m), while in Melbourne, Cambridge trainers Murray Baker and Andrew Forsman will produce **Bonneval (NZ)** (Makfi), **Jon Snow (NZ)** (Iffraaj) and **Lizzie L'Amour (NZ)** (Zabeel). Dual Oaks winner Bonneval remains the best supported New Zealand-trained Cups entry and the last-start Gr.2 Dato Tan Chin Nam Stakes (1600m) winner continues her build-up in Sunday's Gr.1 Underwood Stakes (1800m) at Caulfield.

Baker has won the Underwood on three previous occasions, with The Phantom (NZ) (Noble Bijou) in 1990, Lion Tamer (NZ) (Storming Home) in 2011 and Dundeel (NZ) (High

Chaparral) in 2013 and while he would dearly love to win another this weekend, he knows it won't be easy against the likes of Hartnell (Authorized) and Black Heart Bart (Blackfriars) and with more lucrative spoils to come later in her campaign.

"I'm very happy with her. She's doing everything right," Baker said.

"She's healthy and fit and still on the up. It's a good field on Sunday but you can't dodge anything at this stage. You've just got to front up. I'm sure she'll run another honest race."

A winner of six of her nine starts, the Makfi four-year-old mare will have the services of Sydney jockey Hugh Bowman for the first time since her Gr.1 Australian Oaks demolition in April.

Sunday's race will lead in to the Gr.1 A\$1 million Caulfield Stakes (2000m) on October 14, a week before the Gr.1 A\$3 million Caulfield Cup (2400m), with the Gr.1 A\$6.5 million Melbourne Cup (3200m) at Flemington 17 days after that.

As to the Cups, Baker said of Bonneval: "She's right on target."

Baker and Forsman will get an earlier guide to their stable's Cup chances when Jon Snow and Lizzie L'Amour race at Moonee Valley tonight.

Gr.1 Australian Derby winner Jon Snow tackles the Gr.3 JRA Cup (2040m), having finished sixth in the Gr.1 Memsie Stakes (1400m) and eighth in the Gr.1 Makybe Diva Stakes (1600m) in his first two runs of the spring.

"He's working well but he's back to handicap racing and he's got to give a lot of weight away. Up in distance though, he should go well," Baker said. 3

"We just need to get up into that distance racing. He'll probably go to the Herbert Power [Gr.2 2400m at Caulfield on October 14] then the Caulfield Cup. He's already assured of a start in the Cup."

Gr.1 New Zealand Stakes winner Lizzie L'Amour, however, sits further down the Caulfield Cup entry order and is likely to need to win either of her next two starts to jump up the order and secure a start.

"She's been going all right the whole way through. She had that fibrillation last start but she trialled at Flemington a week later and everything was fine," Baker said.

"She's as right as we can get her. She might be looking for a bit further than a mile. We just need to get her going but we're happy with her."

Baker rated favourite I Am A Star (NZ) (I Am Invincible) as the horse to beat in the Gr.2 Stock Stakes (1600m) but expected Lizzie L'Amour to run a bold race.

"She's working well and she's a good class mare," he said. "She's going to have to do things right to get in the Cups but there are plenty of suitable races for her at this carnival mares races, weight-for-age races and at distances she likes." - NZ Racing Desk

Smith hopes My Diamantine can defy odds

My Diamantine (NZ) (Eighth Wonder) might be the outsider in the field for the Metropolitan Handicap but that doesn't faze her veteran trainer Brian Smith.

An expat New Zealander who brought champion Balmerino (NZ) (Trictrac) to Australia in the mid 1970s, the 76-year-old has 20 in work at Eagle Farm in Brisbane after many years training at Warwick Farm.

Smith travelled the world with Balmerino who ran second in the 1977 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe.

My Diamantine will not reach those heights, and although she is at \$101 for Saturday's Metropolitan (2400m), Smith has been pleased with her campaign which includes seconds in the Listed Caloundra Cup (2400m) and Queensland Cup (3200m).

Smith planned to run My Diamantine in the Newcastle Gold Cup (3200m) on September 15, but revised those plans when she got 54kg.

Instead she returned to Queensland for a tune-up in the Ipswich Stayers' Cup (2150m) last weekend when she filled a minor placing.

"I was really happy with her. She's maintained her form so we'll have a crack," Smith said.

With the mare to carry 50kg, her regular jockey Andrew Spinks makes a rare appearance in Sydney.

My Diamantine is owned by Smith's longtime friend, John Wheeler who has enjoyed much success in Australia, notably with the popular Rough Habit (NZ) (Roughcast) who won three successive Doomben Cups, a Stradbroke Handicap and a Queensland Derby.

Lindsay Park has decided to keep **He's Our Rokkii (NZ)** (Roc De Cambes) on home soil in Melbourne for a Group One race instead of travelling to Sydney.

The five-year-old is set to run in Sunday's weight-for-age Underwood Stakes (1800m) at Caulfield instead of contesting the Gr.1 Epsom Handicap (1600m) at Randwick a day earlier.

Senior Lindsay Park trainer David Hayes said the decision was based on the gelding heading towards next month's Caulfield Cup.

He's Our Rokkii has had two runs this campaign, finishing a first-up fourth in the P B Lawrence Stakes at Caulfield last month before running sixth to Bonneval (NZ) (Makfi) in the Dato Tan Chin Nam Stakes at Moonee Valley on September 9.

"I play better at Caulfield," Hayes said.

"He's got a good barrier and I can forgive him for one bad run and it also keeps him on the Caulfield Cup path.

"He's in the (Cup) field so it was an easy decision to make."

He's Our Rokkii has drawn barrier two in Sunday's race and will be ridden by Regan Bayliss.

Tough NZ stayer thriving

Former Kiwi galloper **Broadside (NZ)** (Raise The Flag) is thriving on a heavy workload as he prepares for Saturday's Gr.1 The Metropolitan (2400m) at Randwick.

The Raise The Flag gelding will be making his third appearance this month when he steps out in the staying feature, in which he will again be ridden by Tim Clark.

"The back-up won't worry him," said Adrian Bott, who trains in partnership with Gai Waterhouse. "This is always the race we wanted to pick up with him because we think he's a really progressive type and those stayers get in down in the weights."

A two-time winner for Levin trainer Geoff Haigh, Broadside won the Gr.3 Newcastle Cup (2300m) on September 15 and last weekend he finished third in the Gr.3 Colin Stephen Quality (2400m) at Rosehill.

Countofmontecristo thriving

Assistant-trainer Michael White has a simple explanation for rising star

Countofmontecristo's (NZ) (Echoes of Heaven) will to win even when up in class – practice makes perfect.

"He's top class. He thrives on racing; the more he races, the more he shows," said White.

Countofmontecristo is running in the S\$700,000 Panasonic Kranji Mile (1600m) on Sunday.

"When he ran in the Singapore Guineas, he was nowhere near as good as he is now," he added.

"We were very happy with his gallop last Thursday and he will have

another gallop tomorrow (Wednesday)." Glen Boss will return on top of

Countofmontecristo after missing out on the winning ride in the Jumbo Jet Trophy (1400m) on September 10, when Alan Munro filled in for the day.

Whether the Joe Giovanni-owned gelding goes the whole hog through the Singapore Triple Crown series to the Dester Singapore Gold Cup (2200m) will depend on his performance in each Leg, said White, even if the clean sweep bid is not the be-all and end-all to the Clements yard.

"We'll see how he pulls up after the Mile, but we would think he would go for the Raffles Cup (1800m on October 22)," he said.

"We're not so sure about the Gold Cup, but I would say it's highly unlikely he would."

Gentleman Beckham set for racing return

Well-bred **Beckham (NZ)** (Pins) is set to again prove it was a wise move not to geld him when he returns to racing on Saturday in the Coolum Caprice Handicap (1200m) at the Sunshine Coast.

Beckham is raced by Gary and Mark Chittick of Waikato Stud and did his early racing in New Zealand with trainer Peter

McKay before being sent to Liam Birchley and has won six of his 20 starts for the Eagle Farm trainer.

There are few better-bred horses than Beckham who is by top kiwi sire Pins out of the Group One-winning mare Glamour Puss (NZ) (Tale of The Cat) who produced six winners before a fatal colic attack two years ago.

Birchley said there never had been a real reason to geld seven-year-old entire Beckham.

"He always tries hard in his races and he is a gentleman around the stables and easy to handle. So why geld him when he has that breeding?" Birchley said.

"Saturday's race might be a bit short for him but he is going well. We can step him up in distance in the coming weeks," Birchley said.

Beckham has one advantage on Saturday in that he loves the big Sunshine Coast circuit having won twice from his only two starts at the track.
