WALLER LOOKING FOR IMPROVEMENT FROM PREFERMENT IN TURNBULL



Preferment winning the 2015 edition of Sunday's Gr. 1 Turnbull Stakes

rainer Chris Waller is keen to see his multiple Group One winner Preferment (NZ) (Zabeel) take a step up in performance when he tackles the Gr. 1 Yellowglen Turnbull Stakes at Flemington on Sunday.

The five-year-old Zabeel gelding took out the 2015 edition of the event at his third run back in his spring campaign last year and has followed a similar path this season. Whereas last year the gelding was coming into the race off the back of a winning performance at Group Two level this year he hasn't shown the same dash in his first two runs, something that Waller is keen to see rectified on Sunday.

"I thought he was a touch one-paced at his second up run and would need to improve on that effort," he noted.

"However I'm not too concerned about that as he will love getting back to Flemington and the 2000 metres there.

"Obviously Hartnell is going terrific and he is the one to beat but I wouldn't say it is an overly strong field."

One of Preferment's main rivals will be last season's Victoria Derby winner in **Tarzino (NZ)** (Tavistock) who has trainer Mick Price looking to reverse his entire's fortunes of late.

Price's staying charge has struggled to figure in the finish in

each of the Memsie, Makybe Diva and Underwood Stakes this preparation.

Price whipped the blinkers off Tarzino in the Underwood, but he was caught too far back off an unsuitable tempo when they sprinted. The leading Caulfield trainer won't be letting that happen in the Turnbull –which will serve as Tarzino's final raceday tune-up for the Cups.

"Those weight-for-age races aren't suiting him," Price advised, with the Turnbull run at set-weights-and-penalties.

"Where he was in the Underwood, when they put the foot down ... with The Cleaner spreading them out, and Jacquinot Bay taking them up ... he's not making that ground and running those sectionals.

"But he's going well, and we're looking forward to Sunday." Tarzino will carry 58kg in the 2000m race, with only Preferment (59kg) lugging more. Kiwi trainer Stephen Marsh was hopeful of a good barrier draw for his classy mare **Sofia Rosa (NZ)** (Makfi) but that was dashed when the mare drew gate 10 of 13 for Sunday.

Last season's Gr.1 ATC Oaks winner has satisfied Stephen Marsh with both her recent runs in Melbourne, but the Cambridge trainer acknowledged she will need to go to another level on Sunday.

"She's at the crossroads – she needs to be really hitting the line well to warrant running in the Caulfield Cup and her work suggests she will go well," Marsh said.

"I've been happy with her, but it will be tough and I would have liked to see her get a good alley and then we could ride her a bit closer to the pace – they are all very good horses and you can't sit back last against them."

CHRIS WALLER LOOKING FOR EPSOM FOUR-PEAT

hris Waller will aim to tighten his stranglehold on the Epsom Handicap when he saddles up four live chances.

While McCreery (Big Bad Bob) is the most fancied of the quartet, Sydney's premier trainer can make a case for **Mackintosh (NZ)** (Pins), Vanbrugh (Encosta De Lago) and **Torgersen (NZ)** (Pins) to win Saturday's A\$1 million Group One race over the famous Randwick mile.

Waller has a remarkable 13 of 34 runners in Saturday's Group One races in Sydney, including almost a third of the 13-horse Epsom field as he looks

for his fourth consecutive win in the

He said Torgersen had followed a similar path to 2013 winner Boban (Bernardini), who the stable set as a light weight chance.

He said Torgersen ran brilliantly in the Bill Ritchie Handicap, the same race Boban used as a springboard to the Epsom.

"Torgersen was three wide, he had no luck and only got beaten a small margin," Waller said.

In the event of a dry track Vanbrugh may be the stable's forgotten runner, with Craig Newitt coming from Melbourne to ride him at 51kg.

"Vanbrugh gets into the race pretty well considering he's a Group One-winning colt," Waller said.

Vanbrugh is at \$18 while Torgesen is a \$23 chance.

McCreery is \$6 equal second favourite with the Darren Weir-trained Palentino (Teofilo).

He comes into the race after winning the Gr.3 Kingston Town Stakes (2000m) in his last appearance.

Waller said Mackintosh had an exhibition gallop at Rosehill on Saturday to mentally stimulate the horse between his Gr.2 Theo Marks Stakes win and the Epsom.

The New Zealand import is at \$11 to take his record to seven wins from 10 starts .

"I think people might be underestimating him a little bit," Waller said.

"If you forget his Derby run in Queensland his form is just impeccable."

He said Mackintosh had caught the stable off guard in the past with how well he had performed.

"You wouldn't have a bet on him on trials or trackwork but he just turns up on race day," Waller said.

DEE I CEE CHANCE TO GIVE GAI 9TH METROP

s Gai Waterhouse aims for her ninth Metropolitan Handicap win, **Dee I Cee (NZ)** (Istidaad) is one of three chances to give training partner Adrian Bott his first Group One success.

If Dee I Cee can win the A\$750,000 race at Randwick, Waterhouse will extend her record 24 years after she got her first elite level success with Te Akau Nick (NZ) (Grosvenor) in the 1992 Metropolitan.

The former Kiwi galloper is a "different horse" this preparation according to Bott who has based his opinion on two strong performances by the five-year-old.

"Nothing went to plan for him last preparation but he

hasn't missed a beat this time," Bott said.

At three, Dee I Cee finished third behind Australian Group One winners Mongolian Khan (Holy Roman Emperor) and Volkstok'n'barrell (NZ) (Tavistock) in the New Zealand Derby but prior to this campaign the son of Istidaad's best Australian effort was a second in a benchmark 82 handicap.

Dee I Cee showed he was back to his best last time out when a courageous second behind The Metropolitan second favourite Sacred Master (NZ) (Mastercraftsman) in the Gr.3 Newcastle Gold Cup.

"His run was huge at Newcastle in the cup," Bott said. "Second-up, three deep and he kept finding the line.

"He's come on again from that run. He'd had plenty of work going into the Newcastle Cup but he's come on again since that race.

"He was sensational on Tuesday, really strong work and he'll stay all day. He's an extremely tough horse.

"He's a genuine lightweight chance."

Dee I Cee is a \$15 chance in The Metropolitan, with Antonio Giuseppe (NZ) (Shocking) a \$4.60 favourite. Sacred Master is at \$7, Who Shot Thebarman (NZ) (Yamanin Vital) is at \$8 while Amexed (NZ) (Pentire) is the outsider of the field at \$71

Waller army marches towards Group 1 Metrop

While lightweight up-and-comer **Antonio Giuseppe (NZ)** (Shocking) is the clear Metropolitan Handicap favourite, Chris Waller believes stablemate **Who Shot Thebarman (NZ)** (Yamanin Vital) is just as attractively weighted.

Sydney's premier trainer has six runners in the 13-horse field for the Gr.1 Metropolitan (2400m) at Randwick on Saturday.

And Waller is having a hard time separating his army of challengers.

"I think you can make a case for most of our horses in it and that's the beauty of handicap racing," Waller said.

In Who Shot Thebarman's past two runs over 2400m, he was beaten a half-neck at weight-for-age level in the Gr.1 BMW and won the Gr.2 Zipping Classic by seven lengths. **Full story here.**



Awoke (NZ) (Rip Van Winkle)

Awoke a great chance in Flight Stakes

Trainer Chris Waller believes **Awoke (NZ)** (Rip Van Winkle) is a great chance in the Gr.1 Flight Stakes (1600m) at Randwick on Saturday.

The Henderson Racing and Cook Bloodstock-owned three-year-old is one of only six runners in the race after her stablemate and odds on favourite Omei Sword (High Chaparral) was scratched due to an infection on Thursday. "She was extremely unlucky behind a wall of horses last start," said Waller.

"She's a filly that looks like she'll get beyond a mile but I still think she's a great chance."

Awoke is currently rated a \$6 chance behind favourite Yankee Rose (\$1.90) and Global Glamour (\$4.20).



Mime (NZ) (Mastercraftsman)

Coleman has confidence in Mime

Michael Coleman likes his chances of adding to his record in the Gr.1 Livamol Classic at Hastings on Saturday.

He has previously won the event on Moss Downs (NZ) (Tom's Shu) (1997), Xcellent (NZ) (Pentire) (2005), Wall Street (NZ) (Montjeu) (2010) and Costume (NZ) (Savabeel) (2014).

This time around he will partner the Murray Baker and Andrew Forsman-trained **Mime (NZ)** (Mastercraftsman), runner-up to Kawi (NZ) (Savabeel) last time out in the Gr.1 Windsor Park Plate.

"She's flying and in the right form to be a big threat on Saturday," Coleman said. "She seems to have come up really well and felt really bouncy on the second day."

Mime broke her maiden on a heavy track and Coleman isn't overly concerned about the slow ground likely for tomorrow.

"I trialled her on a really off track at Te Teko and she wasn't the worst," he said. "I think she would probably be okay on a slow 7."

Stud due a change of fortune

Any success this week for Pencarrow Stud and their racing operation would be welcome, but a Group One victory would really boost the spirits of all concerned.

The Cambridge farm has been rocked by the deaths of prize broodmare Santagostino (Giant's Causeway) - the dam of the stakes performer Deliciano (NZ) (Darci Brahma) - and the multiple winner Belle Eclipse (NZ) (Darci Brahma), whose older sister Silver Eclipse (NZ) (Darci Brahma) has been retired.

"It's very unfortunate, but these things happen," racing manager Garry Cossey said.

"Santagostino was a very good mare and Belle Eclipse sadly had a heart attack. Silver Eclipse was disappointing last time out, but she's a black type winner so she's a very valuable mare."

However, Pencarrow are approaching Saturday's Hawke's Bay meeting in an optimistic frame of mind with the Steven Ramsay and Julia Ritchie-trained **Rasa Lila** (NZ) (Darci Brahma) a leading chance in the Gr.1 Livamol Classic.

Wet Track won't worry Humidor

Trainer Johno Benner is not concerned about a possiblity of a wet track for the Gr.1 Livamol Classic (2040m) at Hastings on Saturday.

The Otaki horseman prepares **Humidor** (NZ) (Teofilo) with partner Hollie Wynyard.

Humidor has won on good and dead ground in his short career but is unbeaten from two starts on wet tracks. He won the Gr.3 Manawatu Classic (2000m) on a heavy track at Awapuni in the autumn and was a runaway winner of a rating 75 1600m on a slow 7 track at Hastings last month.

"He's pretty versatile and any rain they get [at Hastings] won't worry me at all," Benner said. "He's proved he can go on any sort of track and a wet track might inconvenience a few of the others a bit." Full story here.

Mare chasing ticket to Melbourne spring carnival

Fanatic (NZ) (Shocking) will book her passage to Australia if she races up to expectations at Hawke's Bay on Saturday.

She hasn't been a player on either of the first two days at Hastings, but trainers Graeme Sanders and Debbie Sweeney have always had eyes for the Gr.1 Livamol Classic.

"This is the one we have set her for," Sweeney said. "She is really well, we're very happy and the only question mark will be the track."

The winner on protest of last season's Gr.1 New Zealand Oaks, Fanatic resumed on the opening day of the Hawke's Bay carnival and finished a satisfactory sixth over 1400 metres. She was then considered an unlucky runner when ninth behind Kawi (NZ) (Savabeel) in the Gr.1 Windsor Park Plate.

Drop in class for Rising Romance

New Zealand-owned mare **Rising Romance (NZ)** (Ekraar) will drop in class to contest the Gr.2 Stocks Stakes at Moonee Valley tonight.

The six-year-old's last six starts have been at Group One level including the New Zealand Bloodstock Memsie Stakes in which she finshed second two starts ago before finishing seventh in the Makybe Diva last start.

The David and Ben Hayes and Tom Dabernig-trained mare has drawn barrier

four and will be ridden by Damien Lane. "She's back in class with blinkers and she has a good barrier," said David Hayes.

"We've placed with her at Group One level four times and we'd just love to win a race with her."

Eleonora to press Oaks claims

Last-start Geelong winner **Eleonora (NZ)** (Makfi) will press her claims for a start in November's Gr.1 Victorian Oaks (2500m) when she tackles Sunday's Gr.2 Edward Manifold Stakes (1600m) at Flemington.

The Murray Baker and Andrew Forsmantrained Makfi filly will again have the services of leading Melbourne jockey Damien Oliver and has drawn favourably in barrier two.

"She's taken a lot of benefit out of that win at Geelong. We're hoping she can take the next step up again at Flemington," Baker said.

Should she race to Baker's satisfaction, the Lib Petagna and Dame Lowell Goddardraced Eleonora is likely to progress to the Gr.3 Ethereal Stakes (2000m) at Caulfield on October 15.

Ugo Foscolo chases Group Two

Stephen Marsh will face a busy weekend with stable runners at Hastings on Saturday headed by his unbeaten Gr.2 Sacred Falls Hawke's Bay Guineas contender **Ugo Foscolo (NZ)** (Zacinto).

"I'll be there and then fly to Melbourne the next morning – no rest for the wicked!" he said.

Currently at \$6 in the Gr.1 Sothys NZ 2000 Guineas market, Ugo Foscolo successfully started his three-year-old season with an age group win on the opening day of the Hawke's Bay carnival.

"We'll monitor him after this race, but it was always the plan to give him this run and then go down to Christchurch," Marsh said. "He might have a jump-out or a quiet trial somewhere."



Wyndspelle (NZ) (Iffraaj)

Logan thrilled with Guineas runners

Donna Logan can't split her Gr.2 Sacred Falls Hawke's Bay Guineas contenders.

The Ruakaka horsewoman said both **Wyndspelle (NZ)** (Iffraaj) and Mongolian Falcon (Fastnet Rock) had made excellent progress toward Saturday's event.

"Wyndspelle has worked up really well," said Logan, who prepares the duo with Chris Gibbs. "He's going to appreciate the extra distance and he'll be hitting the line well."

Wyndspelle will be having his first look at Hastings while Mongolian Falcon will be returning after his third placing on the opening day of the carnival.

"You have to be guided by what your riders tell you and Leith (Innes) said to go back – he was really happy with him," Logan said.

Pentathlon chasing Melbourne Cup berth

The John Wheeler-trained **Pentathlon (NZ)** (Pentire) will make his Australian debut at Flemington on Sunday.

The Pentire five-year-old will run in the Gr.3 The Bart Cummings with the winner of the 2500 metre handicap exempt from the ballot for the Gr.1 Melbourne Cup.

Runner-up in last season's Gr.2 Wellington Cup and fourth in the Gr.1 Auckland Cup, Pentathlon has had two recent runs at the Hawke's Bay carnival and he will be ridden this weekend by James McDonald.

Pentathlon rated a \$15 chance alongside Zanteca (NZ) (Zabeel) with Almandin (Court Of Jewels) a \$2.60 favourite and Pinstripe Lane (NZ) (Pins), who is also an acceptor in Saturday's Gr.3 Craven Plate (2000m) at Randwick, the outsider at \$31.

Baker team ready to Jive

Murray Baker believes **Get That Jive** (Street Sense) will be at his best at distances past 1400m but says there's no reason why he can't win Saturday's Gr.3 Red Badge Spring Sprint on the way through.

The Cambridge trainer was rapt with Get That Jive's first-up win at Hastings in the Rating 85 1400m race a fortnight ago and wasn't ruling out an Australian campaign for the Street Sense four-year-old gelding after this weekend.

"It was an outstanding run," Baker said of Get That Jive's win.

"He's been running in Group races right through and he was only once out of the money last year. We're having a go because it's a Listed race and it fits in with his programme - and it's good money as well."

Blinkers on Hessdalen

Trainer Michael Freedman will test the blinkers on last start winner **Hessdalen (NZ)** (Alamosa) when he steps out in Saturday's Listed Dulcify Quality at Randwick.

Hessdalen is coming off a Hawkesbury maiden win on September 22 when partnered by Glyn Schofield.

"We want to try him with the blinkers on because Glyn made the comment after Hawkesbury that he's a bit unsure of himself around other horses at the moment," Freedman said.

"It's only his first prep but Saturday looks to be a fairly even race."

Hessdalen faces nine opponents including the John Sargent-trained Not To Be Caught (NZ) (High Chaparral).



Highlad (High Chaparral)

Derby hope Highlad to run in UCI stakes

Murray Baker will unveil his latest Derby prospect when the unbeaten **Highlad** (High Chaparral) makes his Australian debut in the UCI Stakes at Flemington on Sunday.

Highlad won a maiden over 1200m in New Zealand in August before winning the Listed Wanganui Guineas (1340m) at his second start on September 3.

"We like him," Baker said. "He's unbeaten from his two starts. He's a nice horse.

"He's settled in well. He had a jump-out the other day (at Flemington), but he hasn't raced for a month."



Pearson Square (NZ) (Roc de Cambes)

Pike has another exciting Guineas prospect

Tony Pike unveiled another potential three-year-old star on Wednesday when **Pearson Square (NZ)** (Roc de Cambes) romped to a debut victory at Ruakaka.

The Cambridge trainer, who produced Sacred Elixir (NZ) (Pour Moi) to triumph in the Gr.3 Caulfield Guineas Prelude on Saturday, has the son of Roc de Cambes on a path to the Gr.1 Sothys NZ 2000 Guineas. His odds have been trimmed from \$81 to \$21 for the Riccarton feature.

"He's a big horse that was always going to benefit with a patient approach," Pike

said. "We'll have time for one more run and that's likely to be over 1400 metres. He'll appreciate the big roomy track at Riccarton and the step up to a mile on a good surface."

Pearson Square crossed the field from the outside gate to lead at Ruakaka and he coasted clear in the straight to score by three and a half lengths.

"We took all the bad luck out of the equation and went forward – he's a horse that's got plenty of ability," rider Vinnie Colgan said.

Perth-bound Kawi faces weighty challenge

Kawi's (NZ) (Savabeel) broad shoulders will be put to a formidable test if New Zealand's weight-for-age star makes one more appearance before chasing two massive paydays in Perth.

The Savabeel six-year-old has been set for the \$A1 million Railway Stakes (1600m) on November 19 and a return to the Ascot course a fortnight later for the \$A1 million Gr.1 Kingston Town Classic (1800m).

"He could have a run on October 29 at the Feilding meeting at Awapuni in the Redcraze Bowl," trainer Allan Sharrock said.

Kawi won the race last year with apprentice Dylan Mo's three kilo claim reducing his impost to 59kg.

"They ve told me that he'll be allotted the phenomenal weight of 67.5kg, which even with the claim of Alfred (Chan) means he'll have to carry 64.5kg," Sharrock said. "He has won five Group Ones, but even so.

"If I think the weight is far too much then I could trial him, but I'm trying to get him ready for million dollar races and can I do that on a trial? I'll have to have a think about it." Full story here.

Pins is hot to trot for Waikato Stud

It's been a great couple of weeks for the super consistent Waikato Stud stallion **Pins** (Snippets) with three Stakes winners on the board already this season.

That comes as no surprise to Waikato Stud General Manager Mark Chittick who maintains he is a great stallion.

"Pins consistently leaves Stakes winners, and winners. Each season he has around 10-12 Stakes winners, and always has a good horse on the go either here or in Australia or Hong Kong. Over the last ten years he has ranked in the top five stallions every year".

"Already this season he has had three group winners, including the two new three-year-old fillies Honey Rider and Legless Veuve, and Mackintosh has won a Group Two to add to the two Group Three events he won last season. It looks like Aerovelocity is back on track in Hong Kong as well." Full story here.

Triple Group One winner **Volkstok'n'barrell (NZ)** (Tavistock) is in outstanding order ahead of his upcoming weight-for-age campaign.

The Donna Logan and Chris Gibbs-trained

five-year-old has enjoyed a good break since the Queensland winter carnival where he finished third in the Gr.2 A. D. Hollindale Stakes before a fourth placing in the Gr.1 Doomben Cup.

"I've never had him any better than he is right now," Logan said. "Chris and I can't believe it – he looks incredible."

The Rosehill Guineas, Haunui Farm Classic and the New Zealand Stakes winner is scheduled to have an outing at the Ruakaka trials on October 4 before he resumes in the Gr.3 Lion Red Plate at Rotorua 11 days later.

"The handicapper has told us that he would be getting 63 or 64 kilos in a handicap and even a claim wouldn't help him so it will be all weight-for-age racing," Logan said.

"He'll run in the Tauranga Stakes on November 12 and then maybe the Captain Cook Stakes at Trentham before the Zabeel Classic at Ellerslie on Boxing Day."

gavelhouse.com continues to grow

Remembering our Hall Of Fame Heroes

Dick Mason, Outstanding trainer of the first 1/2 century of NZ racing

Richard Mason was regarded as the outstanding trainer of New Zealand racing's first epoch. His record in what would now be described as New Zealand's black-type races remains unmatched to this day and he made regular trips across the Tasman over a period of 20-plus years to beat the Australians on their home ground.

Mason trained for 22 years for George Stead. On Stead's death, Mason went

training for a new patron, George Dean Greenwood, and for him won a further 11 Derbies, 10 Jackson Plates, nine CJC Challenge Stakes... well, a further 58 races on either side of the Tasman which would these days carry black type.

He was credited at his death with having trained 30 Derby winners, on either side of the Tasman, and he won 57 races with the great Gloaming alone. Dick Mason died in 1932, in his 80th year, just a week after Gloaming died, aged 17, on George Greenwood's Teviotdale Station.
