LOGAN EYES TRANS-TASMAN GROUP ONE SPOILS



Group One performer Valley Girl is ready for her Australian Oaks challenge at Randwick tomorrow

Donna Logan is hoping to light up Group One racing on both sides of the Tasman this weekend.

The Northland trainer will shoot for her second Australian Oaks (2400m) in the space of two years when she saddles Gr.1 Herbie Dyke Stakes winner and last-start Gr.1 Vinery Stud Stakes runner-up **Valley Girl (NZ)** (Mastercraftsman) in the three-year-old fillies' Classic at Randwick.

Closer to home, Logan and co-trainer Chris Gibbs will produce **Candle In The Wind (NZ)** (Darci Brahma) in the Gr.1 Fiber Fresh New Zealand Thoroughbred Breeders' Stakes (1600m) at Te Aroha.

Logan was chuffed with Valley Girl's run in the Vinery Stud Stakes at Rosehill a fortnight ago and was expecting a similar effort in the Oaks.

"It was a super run and she's come through it really well. She's really taken that next step up, I feel," Logan said.

"She's settled into the place like she's been here forever and her work has been magnificent. She's eating, she's bright and she's really well. She had a good blow after that first run over here and she's indicated she's looking forward to getting over that extra 400m of the Oaks."

Valley Girl was aided by a superb Brett Prebble ride in the Vinery Stud Stakes,

the Hong Kong-based Australian hoop pushing forward before handing up and taking a trail before she went down three-quarters of a length to Single Gaze (Not A Single Doubt).

Prebble retains the mount for the Oaks, which features fellow Kiwi fillies Capella (NZ) (Rip Van Winkle), trained by Danica Guy and ridden by Opie Bosson, and Sofia Rosa (NZ) (Makfi), prepared by Stephen Marsh and to be ridden by Hugh Bowman.

“The Kiwis have got a big chance in this again. Jameka deserves to be favourite, but it’s not going to be easy for her backing up from the Derby last week,” Logan said, before comparing Valley Girl favourably to her 2014 Australian Oaks winner Rising Romance (NZ) (Ekraar).

“She’s right there with Rising Romance. Barring bad luck,

she’s got a huge chance of being right in this.”

Logan was happy with Darci Brahma mare Candle In The Wind ahead of the Te Aroha weight-for-age fillies and mares feature, saying that Gibbs had reported her to have trained on well since her first-up fourth in the Gr.2 Japan-New Zealand International Trophy (1600m) at Tauranga last month.

“The [heavy] track was against us and fitness told in the end,” Logan said.

“It’s unfortunate about the barrier for Saturday [barrier 12] but Chris says she has trained on well and he’s happy with where she’s at. It’s a pretty good lineup but she always puts in her best and if she could finish in the first three, the Group One black-type would be fantastic for her breeding career later on.”

KELSO SEEKS **PERFECT RESULT**

Ken Kelso has no doubt that his emerging mare **Perfect Fit (NZ)** (Elusive City) has what it takes to win Saturday's Gr.1 Fiber Fresh New Zealand Thoroughbred Breeders' Stakes (1600m) at Te Aroha.

But his one niggling doubt with the lightly-ried Elusive City four-year-old mare is the prospect of a step up to 1600m on a rain-affected track.

The Te Aroha track was rated a dead four on Thursday morning, though there was rain forecast for Friday afternoon.

Perfect Fit has won five of her 10 starts, though she has yet to race past 1400m and Kelso, who trains in partnership with his wife Bev, was keen to avoid conditions which would make her first start at a mile a sterner test than it would be on a good track.

"She hasn't been over a mile before and it would be a concern if we got the combination of 1600m for the first time and a heavy track," Kelso said.

"She's shown us that she does handle it wet in training and most Elusive Citys do handle it wet - Xanadu did - but the

question would be how she'd go in the wet over a mile."

The Kelsos are shooting for their second win in the weight-for-age fillies and mares feature, having produced Elusive City mare Xanadu (NZ) to win in 2013 on a slow eight track.

"They are complete opposites other than that they both possess top-class ability," Kelso said.

"Perfect Fit is a small, lightly-framed mare, whereas the other mare was huge. But she's going well and we're very happy with her."

Despite drawing barrier 15, Perfect Fit shares TAB favouritism at \$4 with last-start Gr.3 Cuddle Stakes winner Rasa Lila (NZ) (Darci Brahma), who also drew wide in barrier 13.

Perfect Fit was a last-start Group Three winner herself, claiming her first win past 1200m in the Westbury Classic (1400m) at Ellerslie last month under Matamata jockey Michael Coleman, who has been aboard for all her wins and all but one of her races so far.

"I'd like to think she'd be very competitive," Kelso said.

"But this is a Group One and they never just hand them to you. All the good mares are there, but all going well, I'd expect her to run a bold race."

3YO LOOKING TO UPSTAGE STAKES RIVALS AGAIN

Awapuni trainer Tony Bambray is plotting another upset black type win with his filly **Alcaldesa (NZ)** (Nom du Jeu).

He produced her to win the Listed Wanganui Guineas at odds of 50-1 earlier in the season and this time she will take on the older horses in the Gr.3 Swap Stockfoods Manawatu Breeders' Stakes on her home track today.

While her more recent form line may look patchy, she has an excuse for a last-start failure in the Gr.1 New

Zealand Oaks after an encouraging effort for sixth behind the high-class Sofia Rosa (NZ) (Makfi) in the Gr.3 Lowland Stakes.

"She got a good run to the turn in the Oaks and then Darryl (Bradley) just sat on her down the straight when they were blocked in all the way," trainer and part-owner Tony Bambray said.

"I thought after her run in the Lowland that she would be a good chance in the Oaks, at least for a place but we'll never know now.

"She's very well in herself. She worked on her own on Tuesday morning over 1200 metres and I was happy with the way she pulled up.

"Hopefully the weather forecast is right and there's some rain. A slow eight or nine track would help her."

Bambray will also be represented at Awapuni by Carnaby (NZ) (Danroad) in the Tru Test Handicap while Nicoshine (Starcraft) will contest the Waterforce Handicap.

"Carnaby over-raced at his last start so he's been freshened and dropped back to 1400 metres," he said. "There should be plenty of pace on and I think he'll be getting home well.

"Nicoshine is getting ready for a jumping career. He's been schooling for the last few weeks and he jumps well and seems to be enjoying it."

Suavito in frame for Champions Mile start

Suavito (NZ) (Thorn Park) will chase her third career Group One win in the Queen of the Turf Stakes at Randwick ahead of a possible overseas campaign.

The Nigel Blackiston-trained mare is one of 14 horses invited to run in the Group One Champions Mile in Hong Kong on May 1 and the Queen of the Turf looms as a pivotal race for any international plans.

"Let's get Saturday out of the way first," Blackiston said.

As a two-time Group One winner at weight-for-age in the 2014 Futurity Stakes and this year's CF Orr Stakes, Suavito is well credentialed for Saturday's race.

"She's rated the highest in the field for a reason," Blackiston said.

The five-year-old, who also boasts wins in the Blamey Stakes and the Matriarch Stakes among her eight victories, is back in distance after only beating one runner home in the Australian Cup (2000m) four weeks ago.

Wet track would suit Survived

Archie Alexander didn't know what to expect when former New Zealand galloper **Survived (NZ)** (Zed) stepped out for his first start from his new stable in the Bendigo Golden Mile.

But he was pleasantly surprised as the Group One winner, who hadn't won since 2013, finished third in the Listed race.

Six-year-old Survived, a winner of the 2013 Group One Makfi Challenge Stakes in heavy conditions in New Zealand, was bought early this year and sent to Alexander.

He has his second start for the trainer at Sandown on Saturday and Alexander wants to see what the gelding can produce again after his first run, although he admitted it was also a tough race.

"He likes a wet track so if it keeps on raining until the weekend it will be a good thing," Alexander said.

"We were delighted with third at Bendigo and a longer-term goal is the Warrnambool Cup or something."

Oliver reunites with Lucia in G1 QE Stakes

Damien Oliver reunites with the Kris Lees-trained **Lucia Valentina (NZ)** (Savabeel) in Saturday's \$4 million Queen Elizabeth Stakes at Randwick on Saturday.

He won the Matriarch Stakes on the mare last spring before partnering her to finish fifth in the Hong Kong International Cup in December.

With connections of Winx (Street Cry) opting not to back the six-time Group One winner up after her Doncaster Mile win on Saturday, Oliver says the weight-for-age showpiece of The Championships is now as wide open as it gets.

"It opens the race right up. Lucia Valentina's got great wet track form, she's been really set for the race coming into it second-up and she goes in with a good chance."

Lucia Valentina is on the fourth line of betting at \$7 with Ranvet Stakes winner The United States (Galileo) favourite at \$4.20 ahead of Preferment (NZ) (Zabeel) (\$5) and last year's winner Criterion (NZ) (Sebring) (\$6).

Wet Oaks won't worry Marsh's hope

The inclement Sydney weather hasn't put a dampener on Stephen Marsh's dream of a Group One win at Randwick on Saturday.

The Cambridge trainer can't fault the condition of his \$A1 million Australian Oaks contender **Sofia Rosa (NZ)** (Makfi), whose chances won't be compromised by the rain-affected going.

"There's been a fair bit of rain here so it's going to be an off track and she won't mind

that at all," said Marsh from the Australian Easter Yearling Sale.

"She travelled over here really well and got through a nice bit of work on Tuesday morning," Marsh said.

"She tightened up with the trip over here so she doesn't need to do a lot. I'm very happy with her and having Hugh Bowman booked for the ride is another big plus."

Faith in Kiwi sprinter's powers of recovery

Paul O'Sullivan is confident his New Zealand-bred sprinting ace **Aerovelocit** (NZ) (Pins) can bounce back to his best in time for next month's Gr.1 Chairman's Sprint Prize at Sha Tin.

"He is the type of horse that can put on weight very quickly though – we can stack it on him and we have nearly one month with the race on May 1," he said.

Aerovelocit has returned from Japan to Hong Kong after a bout of colic forced him to miss the Gr.1 Takamatsunomiya Kinen.

"He looks a little light but he will put it back on quickly," O'Sullivan said. "It's not so much the colic, it was a relatively mild case and we treated it and he recovered quickly, it was the travel. It's not going to be an ideal preparation by any means."

Smart mare set for Group One return

Abidewithme (NZ) (Redoute's Choice) was in excellent touch 12 months ago and she's back in a familiar environment to build on her domestic record.

Recently returned from Victoria, the New Zealand-bred daughter of Redoute's Choice will resume her domestic career in Saturday's Gr.1 Fiber Fresh NZ Thoroughbred Breeders' Stakes.

Abidewithme finished third behind Diademe (NZ) (Savabeel) in last year's Te Aroha feature, then ran a close sixth in the Gr.1 Easter Handicap and won the Gr.2 Travis Stakes before she crossed the Tasman.

She was a first-up winner from Peter Moody's Caulfield stable and while unplaced in her next three starts she didn't finish further than five lengths from the winner in consecutive Group One appearances. [Full story here.](#)

Melbourne the story for the spring

The connections of **What's The Story (NZ)** (Savabeel) are already looking forward to the spring and a return to Australia.

Runner-up in the Gr.1 New Zealand Derby, the Stephen McKee and Eddie Chippendale-trained Savabeel colt will return home for a break following his sixth placing behind fellow Kiwi Tavago (NZ) (Tavistock) in the Gr.1 Australian Derby at Randwick.

"He'll have a spell at Ascot Farm and then he'll get ready for a spring campaign – we're looking at Melbourne with him," Go Racing syndicate manager Albert Bosma said.

"Blake Shinn said when he went for the horse he couldn't sprint in the ground so he's going to the paddock now."

Bosma said the three-year-old handled his first trip away like a seasoned campaigner.

"He travelled perfectly and he was a dream horse to bring over here. The only thing we couldn't do anything about was the weather."

Davison bags a Group One double for Mapperley

Being in the right place at the right time has enabled Simms Davison's Mapperley Stud to double their involvement with a global thoroughbred giant.

The Matamata farm will this year launch the stallion careers of the Group One winners **Contributer** (High Chaparral) and **Complacent** (Authorized).

"It came down to having a good relationship with Darley and when I heard Complacent had been retired I got on a plane to go over and see him and the day I was there Contributer injured himself," Davison said.

"I was just Johnny on the spot so it's been a very busy last month getting everything together.

"Contributer will stand in a partnership between Mapperley and Darley and a group of New Zealand breeders while a partnership between Mapperley and Darley will stand Complacent. Darley will definitely be supporting both horses." [Full story here.](#)

Walker was also booked to partner Criterion's stablemate Almoonqith (Dynaformer) in the \$A1 million Gr.1 Sydney Cup and trainers David Hayes and Tom Dabernig have secured Hugh Bowman to ride the stayer.
