

TWO SPECIAL REASONS FOR PERRY TO CELEBRATE

he promise of a cool glass of champagne when he arrived home was a reminder for bloodstock agent Bruce Perry that sometimes, just sometimes, everything that you can wish for will come true in the racing game.

Perry had time to savour the events of the last 24 hours as he made the drive home from Wellington airport having arrived back in New Zealand the afternoon after he witnessed friend and client Lib Petagna experience

the ultimate thrill of dual Group One victories at Royal Randwick on Sydney's biggest day of the racing year.

The familiar green colours with the navy sash of Petagna were carried to victory in the Gr.1 Australian Oaks by the Stephen Marsh trained **Sofia Rosa (NZ)** (Makfi) while just under two hours later the Kris Lees trained **Lucia Valentina (NZ)** (Savabeel) downed a quality lineup in the Championships richest race, the Gr. 1 Queen Elizabeth Stakes.

Perry, who manages Petagna's thoroughbred portfolio, became involved with the Wellington based businessman after meeting him during the New Zealand Cup carnival at Riccarton back in 2004.

"I first met Lib when we ran second with a horse called Ambitious Owner to his filly Clean Sweep in the Two Thousand Guineas at Riccarton," he recalled.

"We got talking and from there it started both our business relationship and friendship.

"Things have progressed smoothly over the years and we are at the stage now where I buy about half a dozen yearlings for him each year. We have had some notable success along the way although nothing can compare to what happened on Saturday."

Sofia Rosa's victory made her the second elite level winner purchased by Perry (a \$65,000 buy) for Petagna at the 2014 New Zealand Bloodstock Yearling Sale Series after Dal Cielo (NZ) (Per Incanto) captured the 2015 Gr. 1 Diamond Stakes at Ellerslie. Perry was quick to point out that the Makfi filly also had a lot in common with Savabeel mare Lucia Valentina although one of those things wasn't a recommended feature.

"I paid similar money for them as Lucia Valentina was secured for \$60,000 at the 2012 Karaka sale," he noted.

"Both have done their early work with Stephen Marsh and both are named after members of Lib's family with Lucia

being his daughter and Sofia a great niece.

"Funnily enough both also fell over in exactly the same race, the Eight Carat Classic at Ellerslie, not that that's something I would like to see occur again."

While it is too early for concrete plans to be made for the pair Perry indicated Lucia Valentina could well become a Cox Plate contender in the spring while Sofia Rosa will head home this week

to enjoy a well earned break.

"We're mindful of the value attached to Lucia Valentina as a three time Group One winner but she is a mare who doesn't take a lot of racing to come to her peak so the initial thoughts are to perhaps set her for a Cox Plate attempt," he said.

"She could have a crack at the Cox Plate, another tilt at Hong Kong and then sign off at this carnival next year and still only have four or five runs. We will just see how she is at each step along the way and if things don't pan out then she will be off to the matron's paddock.

"Sofia Rosa will come back home and have a decent spell. She really furnished during her last break so if she can continue that pattern then we believe she could well be a Caulfield Cup type in the spring so that is where we will aim with her."

DREAM DAY FOR HAUNUI FARM AT TE AROHA

fter many years experience in the racing and breeding business Haunui Farm's Mark Chitty knows that results like the well known South Auckland Stud farm produced on Saturday at Te Aroha don't come around very often.

From four entrants on the day Haunui produced a quinella in the sixth race with **Nelson Park (NZ)** (Iffraaj) and **Chancery (NZ)** (Makfi) which was quickly followed by progressive mare **Triaction (NZ)**

(Elusive City) running a game third in her open class debut. Those results were then topped by **Perfect Fit (NZ)** (Elusive City) who led all the way in the day's feature event, the Gr. 1 Fiber Fresh New Zealand Thoroughbred Breeder's Stakes.

Chitty and his wife Sara were still coming to terms with the events of the day when contacted 24 hours later.

"It's hard to explain the feelings you have after a day like that," he admitted. "Sara woke up this morning and her first question was whether yesterday had actually happened or had it all been just a dream!

"We knew leading into the day we had four lovely horses going to the races in tip top condition but to come away with a Group One win, a race quinella and a superb third was just amazing. In fact I don't think we've ever quinellaed a race before so it was certainly a hell of a day."

Chitty was quick to pay tribute to

the many people involved in each of their runners.

"There are some wonderful stories behind each of the horses we had entered so we are just as thrilled for the people involved with us as we are for ourselves," he said.

"The syndicate who race Perfect Fit is a great example of how racing should be. Maureen Duncan and James Orten both raced Valpolicella with us and Gary Madill was involved with her dam Fayreform. The other group involved is the Provincial Club who have all been mates of mine for many years and just love being involved in racing a horse.

"The mare has been superbly handled by Ken and Bev Kelso so to be able to share that success with everyone made for a very special occasion."

Chitty was also delighted for Byerley Park conditioner Shane Hapeta who prepares Nelson Park for the Stud and her co-breeder Tim Dixon. "Shane has done a lot of work for us over the years so it is great to see him beginning to reap the rewards of that." he said.

"He was involved with Perfect Fit before she went to the Kelso's and did a superb job with her early education.

"Tim Dixon and I have been mates for over 25 years so you can imagine it was a great celebration. We actually bred Hardcase who won last week and race him with a large group so back to back winners is a hard act to top."

BONNIEGIRL BACK WITH A VENGEANCE AT TE AROHA

espite a wide draw and an absence from the racetrack of just on six months the enormous talent of four-year-old Darci Brahma mare **Bonniegirl (NZ)** shone through at Te Aroha on the weekend where she produced a devastating performance to score her fourth career victory.

The Murray Baker & Andrew Forsman trained mare hadn't been sighted since finishing fifth in stakes company at Hawera back in October but strong support on the tote indicated she was ready to produce a forward effort.

Taking on a handy field of rating 85 gallopers in the Pyramid Trucking sponsored 1200 metre contest, Bonniegirl was settled beyond midfield by rider Michael Coleman as the pacemaking Rich Billie Marsh (NZ) (Viking Ruler) set a solid tempo from the front. Pushed seven wide on the home corner the mare quickly bounded to the front and held out a stern challenge from runner-up Airlie House (NZ) (Tavistock) in a smart 1.09.43 for the journey.

Given the pattern of the day dictated that nearly all of the races were dominated by front runners with inside barrier draws, co-trainer Andrew Forsman was especially taken with the performance.

"I think four of the first five races were won by horses drawn the number one barrier and who led or were in the trail so to do what she did was a very good effort," he remarked.

"We knew she was forward to resume after a nice trial last month but that showed she certainly has a touch of real class."

Forsman mixed relief with the elation of the victory as the mare has had a number of issues that have curbed her racetrack appearances.

"She has taken a lot of work as she has had a number of muscular issues since jarring up badly in the One Thousand Guineas during her three-year-old campaign," he explained.

"We've had to be very patient with her and that's why she hasn't had that many starts since then.

"We do think she is well up to stakes company so the challenge will be to find something suitable for her while she is in peak health. Nothing has been identified as yet but Murray and I will sit down once the dust has settled and take a look at the programme over the next couple of months."

He's Our Rokkii to run in Packer Plate

He's Our Rokkii (NZ) (Roc De Cambes) will chase his second Group win of the Sydney autumn carnival in the Frank Packer Plate. The David Hayes and Tom Dabernig-trained gelding won the Group Three Carbine Club Stakes (1600m) on Day One of The Championships last Saturday week.

He will be tried beyond 1600m for the first time in Saturday's 2000m race for three-year-olds at Randwick, also at Group Three level. "He's had a great foundation for it," Dabernig said.

"He's very fit and the way he covered ground and was still strong on the line last start, you would think it wouldn't be a problem.

"He was bought with the intention of being a middle-distance horse."

He's Our Rokkii, who started his career in New Zealand, has won three of his 12 starts and Dabernig believes the best is ahead.

"I think whatever he does this preparation he'll benefit from going into the spring," he said.

CHIONG ESTABLISHES NEW MARK WITH SHA TIN FOUR-TIMER

pprentice jockey Kei Chiong landed four wins on Sunday at Sha Tin Racecourse, the most ever-recorded at one meeting by a female jockey in Hong Kong, and the most by any of Hong Kong's 10-pound claimers in at least the last decade.

Chiong's wins came in races two, four, six and eight, scoring winners for three different trainers. The day of success began with Friends Forever (NZ) (Alamosa) for trainer Manfred Man in the Dengshikou Handicap before Supreme Flight (Footstepsinthesand) obliged in the Dongcheng District Handicap, starting a double for trainer Tony Millard.

Chiong charted a lonely mid-course path aboard Gallant Rock (Fastnet Rock) down the straight 1000-metre track, earning her third of the day with a short-head win in the Dongzhimen Handicap. Her meeting was capped with a victory aboard Derek Cruz-trained McQueen (NZ) (Alamosa), breaking from barrier 14 in the featured affair, the Beijing Clubhouse Anniversary Cup (Handicap).

Chiong nearly earned a fifth win in race ten as her mount Enormous Honour (Encosta de Lago) reported in second, beaten a short head. By the end of a rainy afternoon, Chiong's seasonal win total jumped to 13. The 23-year-old rider began her local career in September after spending time in New Zealand where she was apprenticed to Taranaki based trainer Allan Sharrock. Her New Zealand experience included more than 500 rides which yielded 44 wins.

Current freelance jockey Keith Yeung was the last tenpound claimer to record a four-timer, accomplishing the task on 1 November 2009 at Happy Valley Racecourse.

WAITING TACTICS BETTER THAN GOING THE EARLY CROWE

r Crowe (NZ) (Alamosa) showed he was better off ridden quietly when he came from the rear to steam home at long odds in the \$65,000 Initiation race over 1400m at Kranji on Sunday.

The Oscar Racing Stable-owned Alamosa three-year-old led on debut in a Restricted Maiden race over 1200m a month ago but was gobbled up inside the last 300m to weaken to ninth place.

Jockey John Powell rode him for the first time in a barrier trial last week and reported to trainer Laurie Laxon the gelding could not quite keep up with the early pace, but the kickback was probably not to his liking.

Powell was then told to ride Mr Crowe more conservatively this time, especially from barrier No 1 which should allow them to enjoy a ground-saving run.

"We rode him upside down which was probably the wrong way to ride him," said assistant-trainer Shane Ellis.

"We went with the early speed he showed in his trials, but we made a blue. JP rode him in a trial and anchored him back and we decided to ride him back this time.

"The 1400m was his go today and he will probably get further, too."

Powell, who made a winning comeback on Friday after being

sidelined through a knee injury for a month, said Mr Crowe surprised him in the way he sat and sprinted on Sunday.

"I rode him in a trial and he dropped back but that was because he didn't like the kickback. We thought why not ride him colder today and it's paid off," said the Australian hoop.

"I was quite surprised how he was going so well on the corner. I didn't have to weave my way through as the gaps just came and he quickened through really well."

rainer Alwin Tan is bringing **Rich Fortune (NZ)** (Keeper) back on the Singapore Three-Year-Old Challenge trail following his gallant win on Sunday.

The son of Keeper dodged the first Leg, the Group 3 Dester Singapore Three-Year-Old Sprint (1200m) on March 27, in favour of an easier Benchmark 67 race over 1000m in which he ran second.

But from the way Rich Fortune out-battled his rivals in

Sunday's \$75,000 Royal Western India Turf Club Trophy, a Graduation race over 1100m, Tan could not possibly leave Mr Chua Kang Lim's horse out of the draft for the Group 2 Singapore Three-Year-Old Classic (1400m) on April 24.

"It was a tough field, but I wanted to put him in a stronger race if he were to run in the 3YO Challenge," said Tan.

"On today's run, I would think he can go for the 1400m leg though it is still hard to decide who will be my final team. At this stage, Conflight and Infantry are running, and you would have to join Rich Fortune to the list on today's run, while for Nova Strike, I still have to decide.

"At his (Rich Fortune) last start, he could have won but he was crowded a little and could not peg back the winner. Today, Manoel had him in a great spot and he had a clear run throughout."

Nunes said there was not much of Rich Fortune but his strong will to win did the job, even if his first impression of him in trackwork had left plenty to be desired.

> "He's not very big but he has a big heart, and he always tries 100%," said the Brazilian jockey.

"I worked him on Tuesday and I told Alwin he didn't show much but he told me not to worry as he's lazy and does his best on raceday."

The Hassler upsets at Pukekohe

A Roger James trained runner was confidently predicted to take out the main race at Pukekohe on Sunday and the Cambridge conditioner duly obliged however it wasn't with the punters elect.

James produced unbeaten mare Romantic Maid (High Chaparral) as the warm favourite in the Schlaepfer Shearing sponsored rating 75 contest however she could only manage to run fourth as stablemate **The Hassler (NZ)** (Shocking) produced a gritty effort to score his third career victory.

Fresh off the back of a two week break after finishing ninth in the Gr. 1 New Zealand Derby, The Hassler was expected by James to need the run however he belied his trainer's assessment as he sat one out on a solid speed before outfinishing pacemaker Nailed It (NZ) (Don Eduardo) in a driving finish to the event.

"He had two weeks off after finishing ninth in the Derby and his record suggests he needs a wet track," said James before the race.

"We're getting him ready for a \$100,000 2100 metre race at Ellerslie in a fortnight so we are hoping the tracks can soften before then."

The Hassler's form had been franked by the winning performance of Humidor (NZ) (Teofilo) in the Gr. 3 Manawatu Classic with The Hassler having beaten that runner at Te Rapa before finishing fifth in the Gr. 2 Avondale Guineas before his Derby effort.

Romantic Maid's rider Michael McNab was far from disappointed with his charge's run noting that she was awkwardly away from her barrier at the start and made good ground in the run home, suggesting she was ready for a middle distance assignment in the immediate future.— NZ Racing Desk
