# JAMES ROMANTICISES OVER IDEA OF SECOND OAKS WIN

ambridge trainer Roger James has no idea how

Romantic Maid (High Chaparral) might handle a wet
track for Saturday's Gr.1 Queensland Oaks but can list
few other negatives for the progressive High Chaparral filly.

Romantic Maid arrived in Brisbane earlier this week after a last-start Randwick Rating 70 win clinched her a spot in the three-year-old fillies Classic at Eagle Farm.

She has now won three of her six starts and goes into the Oaks (2400m) in peak order, according to her conditioner.

"Her work has been rock-solid. She's ready to run a big

race," James said.

"She's just thriving over here. I was very mindful that this was her first preparation and she's done a bit of travelling but she's handling it like a seasoned pro.

"She took two or three days to settle into her routine in Sydney but she's arrived in Brisbane and just hasn't missed a beat."

Track conditions at Eagle Farm were listed as a good 4 on Thursday but significant rainfall is predicted in the area which could lead to testing going for runners on Saturday.

"It's a bit of a risk having a Group One race meeting here as the first meeting since the track reconstruction," said James, who won the Oaks in 2000 with **Giovana (NZ)** (Blues Traveller) and produced **Melora (NZ)** (Sir Tristram) for a third placing two years earlier.

"They are forecasting rain and even when Romantic Maid had a run along here the other day there was a bit of kickback. I've really got no idea how she would handle it if the track did become rain-affected.

"But other than that there's nothing really against her. It's a good field but I'm pretty happy to have her and she'll be right in the mix."

Bred and raced by Judi Wanless, Romantic Maid would spell win, lose or draw after Saturday's race, James said.

"She's done everything we've asked of her for a first preparation. She'll only improve with experience and age, so from that standpoint, she's got it all ahead of her."

## HIGH OAKS HOPES FOR WESTBURY

estbury Stud will have at least two chances in Saturday's Queensland Oaks to add to their Group One haul this season.

Resident stallion Makfi will be represented by **Imposing Lass (NZ)** (Makfi) and **Zafiki (NZ)** (Makfi), if she gains a run off the ballot list, while Encosta de Lago's daughter Alaskan Rose is a graduate of the Karaka farm.

"Imposing Lass looks a top chance and if she got in and the rain came then Zafiki wouldn't be out of it -Robert Smerdon has a good opinion of her," Westbury's Russell Warwick said.

"We would love to have both fillies in the race – it would give us a strong hand as we also bred Alaskan Rose."

Imposing Lass and Zafiki are from the first Southern Hemisphere crop of Makfi, the sire of Gr.1 Australian Oaks winner **Sofia Rosa (NZ)** (Makfi).

"He only had 65 live foals and he's the only sire in Australasia at present to have two individual Group One winners (Marky Mark and Sofia Rosa) from his first crop," Warwick said. "He's

punching well above his weight."

Westbury Stud is owned by selfmade millionaire Gerry Harvey, of Harvey Norman fame, and is enjoying a stellar run of success including last weekend's Gr.1 Doomben 10,000 winner Music Magnate. "Gerry has had a fantastic season here. He has bred two Group One winners, Music Magnate and Sofia Rosa, along with Telepathic, Passing Shot, Red Striker and also Ichiban, who won a stakes race at Ellerslie last weekend," Warwick said.

#### Zasorceress to start in Oaks

**Zasorceress (NZ)** (Zabeel) will start in the Gr.1 Queensland Oaks (2400m) at Eagle Farm on Saturday.

A brave performance in the Group 3 Adrian Knox Stakes (2000m) during The Championships was the performance trainer Jason Warren needed to see, and while they missed a run in the AJC Oaks, the Zabeel filly gets her chance this weekend.

Zasorceress was still a maiden earlier in May, but she won a race worth \$14,000 over 1800m at the Gold Coast - enough to get her into Saturday's \$500,000 feature.

"She's always shown us she had good ability, but the penny just hadn't really dropped [until recently]," Warren said.

"We'll ride her a little bit conservatively on Saturday, and let her hit the line."

Warren said he was rapt with how Zasorceress had trained on, and the mileand-a-half wasn't a query in his mind.

Zasorceress was purchased by Warren in conjunction with bloodstock agent Cameron Cooke from Pencarrow Stud's 2014 NZB draft for \$320,000.

#### Alaskan Rose to tackle G1 Queensland Oaks

Mike Moroney will give **Alaskan Rose** (**NZ**) (Encosta de Lago) another shot at Group One glory before the end of her three-year-old season.

She completed her Queensland Oaks preparation with a midfield finish in The Roses at Doomben on May 21, a run described by Moroney as one of the better ones in the race.

"She got a pretty ordinary run in transit," Moroney said.

"She got run off the track at about the 700 metres when all the interference happened and was very wide on the turn.

"It was a pretty tough run but to her credit she's bounced through it really well.

"She's eaten well and hasn't taken any harm from it, so we'll press ahead."



Perfect Fit (NZ) (Elusive City)

#### Perfect Fit thriving in QLD

The Ken and Bev Kelso trained Group One winner **Perfect Fit (NZ)** (Elusive City) is thriving in Queensland and will be the Matamata trainers' first ever runner in Brisbane when she steps out in the Gr.2 QTC Cup (1300m) at Eagle Farm on Saturday.

"She's been here 12 days and she looks amazing," said Ken Kelso.

"She had a couple of weeks off after her Group One win at Te Aroha and she has had a trial at Cambridge just to make sure everything was alright and she has settled in well here at Caloundra.

"She's a Group One winner in New Zealand and the next step is to get some black type in Australia.

"Her main target is the Tatts Tiara in three weeks time," Kelso said.

Kelso is confident Perfect Fit will handle a rain-affected surface, but like many trainers is anxious as to how the newly refurbished Eagle Farm track will play.

"It's hard to line up the form and be confident over here. I remember we thought Bounding would win the Gilgai and we were very disappointed when she got beaten by some grey thing called Chautauqua," Kelso said.

#### Snapper takes on WFA en route to Qld Derby

**Snapper** (Shocking) will continue an unorthodox path to the Queensland Derby when the three-year-old tackles weight-forage company in the Gr.2 Eagle Farm Cup.

Snapper was a solid fourth to Col 'N' Lil (Bradbury's Luck) in a 2000m benchmark race at Doomben two weeks ago.

The gelding, by 2010 Melbourne Cup winner Shocking who stands at Rich Hill Stud, is 20th in the order of entry for the Derby but should make the field.

"It isn't the biggest field on Saturday and if he can pick up some prize money it might get him into the Derby," trainer John Morrisey said.

He had originally planned to run Snapper in a restricted-class race at the Gold Coast on Saturday but is worried about the weather.

"They are predicting heavy rain and I didn't want to take the chance of a washout. But even if both meetings go ahead I am leaning towards starting Snapper at Eagle Farm," Morrisey said.



Mackintosh (NZ) (Pins)

#### **Mackintosh confirmed for Derby**

Chris Waller has confirmed that the New Zealand-bred and owned **Mackintosh (NZ)** (Pins) will run in the Gr.1 Queensland Derby on Saturday week.

"We are very happy with the way that he has come through his winning run in the Grand Prix over the 2200m," he said.

"Having seen him come through the race and having a good look at his profile, we have no doubt that he will run the 2400m distance."

Waller had previously consulted with Mackintosh's New Zealand owners Lib Petagna, Tony Muollo senior and Tony Muollo junior about the option of switching to the Gr.2 Queensland Guineas over a mile.

#### Derby driven owner still as passionate as ever

Auckland businessman Mark Wyborn's desire to own a Derby winner is burning as brightly as ever.

"I'm absolutely passionate about it, it's the only race that matters to me – I'm a bit

one-eyed about it I'm afraid," the Auckland businessman said.

"I haven't won one yet, but hopefully I can do it soon. The problem with the Derby is that the horse only gets one shot at it.

He was also hopeful of his chances this year with **Provocative (NZ)**, the daughter of Zabeel he races with Robin Peel-Walker, but the Tony Pike-trained filly was forced out of the classic by injury.

#### Oliver back on Azkadellia

Damien Oliver will be reunited with the New Zealand-bred mare **Azkadellia** (**NZ**) (Shinko King) in the Gr.1 Stradbroke Handicap on Saturday week.

"Ollie will be back on board, he's got a great record on the horse and just seems to gel with her so we're rapt to have him back on," trainer Ciaron Maher said.

Oliver has ridden the daughter of Shinko King three times for two wins, including the Gr.1 Queen of the Turf Stakes, and a second. Last time out under Mark Zahra,

Azkadellia came from last to finish second in the Gr.1 Doomben 10,000.

"She needed a good strong hit out like that," Maher said. "I couldn't be happier with the way she has come through the run and Eagle Farm will probably suit her better as well."

#### Whakanui fillies chase Oaks win

Waikato's Whakanui Stud has a strong hand in Saturday's Gr.1 Queensland Oaks.

Tim Bodle's studfarm bred both Lookin At Lucky filly **Chabaud (NZ)** and Tavistock filly **Tavi Bay (NZ)**.

Trainer by Robert Smerdon, Chabaud is a Tasmanian Oaks winner who has gone on to finish fifth in Gr.1 Australian Oaks and last start won the Gr.3 South Australian Classic (2500m) at Morphettville, while Tavi Bay is a last-start Caulfield winner for trainer Henry Dwyer.

Both fillies are rated at \$13 in Australian markets.



Volpe Veloce (Foxwedge)

#### Richardson may be foxing with fast filly

Graham Richardson has no real confidence that exciting filly **Volpe Veloce** (Foxwedge) will handle a heavy track in Saturday's Listed John Turkington Forestry Castletown Stakes at Wanganui but he knows she has the class to win if she does.

The Matamata trainer is keen to give the Foxwedge filly her opportunity at stakes level as a two-year-old before she is turned out to prepare for three-year-old fillies races in the spring.

An impressive 2 1/2-length debut winner at Matamata in March, Volpe Veloce has handled wet tracks to Richardson's satisfaction in training but he admits he doesn't really know what to expect on raceday.

"Her work has been first-class and that's been on heavy tracks," Richardson said. <u>Full</u> story here.



Bounding (Lonhro)

#### Kiwi mares prove popular

New Zealand fillies and mares have been highly sought after at the Gold Coast sale in recent days, headed by Group One winner **Bounding** (Lonhro), who was sold to American interests, Stonestreet Thoroughbred Holdings, for \$1,900,000 to top the opening day of the sale.

Multiple stakes winner **Serena Miss** (NZ) (Iffraaj) changed hands for \$700,000,

with the Iffraaj filly purchased by Belmont Bloodstock Agency on behalf of Torryburn Stud.

Trained by Graeme and Debbie Rogerson, Serena Miss won the Gr.2 Matamata Breeders' Stakes as a two-year-old and added the Gr.2 Sarten Memorial this season. She also finished third in the Gr.1 New Zealand 2000 Guineas.

The Danica Guy trained Gr.1 Railway Stakes winner In **Style (NZ)** (Fast 'n' Famous) changed hands for \$440,000 while Gr.3 Taranaki Breeders' Stakes winner **Kisses** (**NZ**) (Iffraaj) fetched \$400,000.

Meanwhile Australian-trained New Zealand bred Group One performers Imperial Lass (NZ) (Tavistock) and Pasadena Girl (NZ) (Savabeel) were snapped up for \$650,000 and \$500,000 respectively.

New Zealand bred gallopers have won 16 of the 67 Group One races to date in Australia this season, or 23.8%.

Additionally, the dams of Australian bred Group One winners **Winx** (Street Cry ex Vegas Showgirl (NZ)), **Howard Be Thy Name** (Redoute's Choice ex Bellini Rose (NZ)), **Capitalist** (Written Tycoon ex Kitalpha (NZ)), Mongolian Khan (Holy Roman Emperor ex Centafit (NZ)), **Mourinho** (Oratorio ex Benevolent (NZ)) and **Stratum Star** (Stratum ex Purely Spectacular (NZ)) are all New Zealand bred, so it is not surprising that Kiwi mares are in vogue.

#### Too Rough earns Melbourne trip

Promising three-year-old **Too Rough (NZ)** (Postponed) will get the chance to prove himself in Melbourne after passing his first distance test at Doomben.

The \$32,000 first prize on Wednesday would have lifted Too Rough into the Queensland Derby field next week but trainer Bevan Laming said the gelding was not ready for top class just yet.

Too Rough appreciated a solid pace to finish powerfully to win by a short neck in the QTIS 3YO Hcp (2220m).

"He is a promising horse but he has wanted to over-race. Of course he hasn't been helped by drawing the outside barrier in just about all of his runs to date," Laming said.

"I think he can go to Melbourne where there should be some nice three-year-old races over a distance for him in June and July."

Too Rough was a graduate of Westbury Stud's 2014 Ready to Run sale draft where he was purchased for \$85,000.



First Serve (NZ) (Swiss Ace)

#### Another ace performance tipped from filly

**First Serve (NZ)** (Swiss Ace) is expected to give her extensive support crew further cause for celebration when she steps out at Riccarton today.

The three-year-old is unbeaten on the course with her only career defeat a runner-up finish behind the outstanding colt and dual Group One winner Xtravagant (NZ) (Pentire) in the Gr.3 Cambridge Breeders' Stakes.

First Serve will contest the Mid-Winter Christmas Races June 25 Handicap with Samantha Wynne, who has ridden the filly in all three starts, to take the reins again.

"Sam went back to Ireland while she was serving a suspension and one of the first horses she rode when she got back was First Serve and she said she couldn't believe how much she had developed since Te Rapa," said Michael Pitman, who trains the daughter of Swiss Ace with his son Matthew. #### Sam savours first career victory

Sam Weatherley will forever have fond memories of **Maddee Fae (NZ)** (Captain Rio) after the longshot provided him with the first winning ride of his career at Matamata on Wednesday.

"It's a great thrill, especially to get my first win on my home track - I'm stoked," he said.

Apprenticed to Lance O'Sullivan and Andrew Scott, Weatherley kicked the Ernie Griffiths-trained four-year-old clear on the turn and they waltzed home by four lengths.

The 16-year-old is from a racing family with his father Darryn a former jockey with 281 winners to his credit and his mother Lou is employed in an administrative role at Wexford Stables after working for former Matamata trainer John Sargent for more than a decade.



Anniesstar (NZ) (Zed)

#### **Trainer loses smart winter performer**

Gary Vile's winter prospects have been dealt a blow with a recurring tendon problem forcing the retirement of his stakes winning mare **Anniesstar (NZ)** (Zed), who will head to the breeding barn this spring.

"She broke down this (Wednesday) morning so that's unfortunately the end of her racing career," the Awapuni trainer said.

"These things happen, but it's a shame because she looked like she was in for another very good campaign."

Anniesstar had her third run back from a break in the recent Listed Rangitikei Gold Cup, in which the six-year-old finished a close second. Full story here.

#### Global thoroughbred operation to race in N7

The China Horse Club has purchased the multiple Group winner **Mime (NZ)** (Mastercraftsman), who will remain with

trainers Murray Baker and Andrew Forsman for her four-year-old career.

"She will be the first runner here for us," said the Cambridge-based Michael Wallace, the club's racing and bloodstock manager.

The China Horse Club's interests are widespread and they have wholly owned or part-owned international Group One winners including Australia (English Derby), Tropaios (Singapore Gold Cup) and Johannes Vermeer (Grand Criterium).

They also have interests in the multiple Australian top flight winners and now stallions Dissident (Sebring), Pride of Dubai (Street Cry) and Press Statement (Hinchinbrook).

Their New Zealand acquisition Mime has won four of her 11 starts, including the Gr.2 Sir Tristram Fillies' Classic and the Gr.3 Sunline Vase and she was spelled after finishing fourth in the Gr.1 New Zealand Oaks.

#### The Hassler sold

Group Two Championship Stakes winner **The Hassler (NZ)** (Shocking) has been sold and will do his future racing in Hong Kong.

Cambridge trainer Roger James confirmed the sale of the three-year-old Shocking gelding, who won four of 11 starts in his care.

"He's been sold to Hong Kong. Negotiations have been bubbling away for the last couple of weeks but the money is in the bank so it's all gone through now," James said.
