

BAKER STABLE READY **TO TURN STARS LOOSE**



Caulfield Cup winner Mongolian Khan will have his second run of this campaign in the Gr. 1 Ranvet Stakes at Rosehill tomorrow

urray Baker has a runner index for the weekend most trainers could only dream of. But as ever, the Cambridge trainer is taking what potentially could rate as yet another red-letter day in his decorated career all in his stride.

"We've got some good chances in some pretty good races but we're not carried away with it," said Baker, who trains in partnership with Andrew Forsman.

At Rosehill, Baker will saddle Caulfield Cup winner Mongolian Khan (Holy Roman Emperor) in the Gr.1 Ranvet Stakes (2000m), then a race later prepare last-start Gr.1 Futurity Stakes winner Turn Me Loose (NZ) (Iffraaj) for the Gr.1 George Ryder Stakes (1500m).

Back home, Baker and Forsman have Mime (NZ) (Mastercraftsman) and Coldplay (NZ) (Savabeel) as leading chances for the Gr.1 Wellfield New Zealand Oaks (2400m), while in-form filly Tomelilla (NZ) (Tavistock) tackles the Gr.2 Go Racing Syndications Wellington Guineas (1400m) and Saint Emilion (NZ) (Mastercraftsman) rates as a strong

winning chance in the Listed Lincoln Farms New Zealand St Leger (2500m).

Charmont (High Chaparral) and **Luna Rossa (NZ)** (Written Tycoon) contest support races, while at Te Rapa the stable will be represented by **Okanagan (NZ)** (Testa Rossa), **Del Rios (NZ)** (Rios) and **Elusive Gold (NZ)** (Elusive City).

But there's little doubt that the stable's spotlight is focused on Sydney, where Turn Me Loose and Mongolian Khan will bid to add to their already bountiful harvest of Australian stakes this season.

"Mongolian Khan has improved greatly. We're very happy with him," Baker said from Sydney.

"He trialled nicely last week. We just let him run around at Warwick Farm and he's not far off top fitness. He might need another run yet but I expect him to go a good race."

Should reigning New Zealand horse of the year Mongolian Khan race to Baker's satisfaction on Saturday, he could back up in the Gr.1 The BMW (2400m) at Rosehill seven days later.

A start in the \$A3 million Doncaster Mile at Randwick on April 2 awaits Turn Me Loose, who first takes on Winx (Street Cry), Press Statement (Hinchinbrook), First Seal (Fastnet Roc) and **Kermadec (NZ)** (Teofilo) in a vintage edition of the George Ryder.

"He's going well and we're very happy with the horse. I hadn't seen him for three weeks before I arrived in Sydney yesterday and he looks terrific," Baker said.

"But we're taking on a strong field - Winx, Press Statement, who's supposed to be the best three-year-old over here, Hucklebuck - and it doesn't end there. Providing he runs well, he'll be in the Doncaster."

Baker is banking on conditioning as his biggest asset as he prepares to confront New Zealand Oaks favourite **Sofia Rosa** (NZ) (Makfi) with his talented fillies Mime and Coldplay.

"Sofia Rosa will take some beating but both our fillies have trained on well and they have both got a good base fitness for 2400m. They have got the mileage under their belt."







MARSH EYES OAKS SUCCESS

tephen Marsh can't find fault with **Sofia Rosa (NZ)** (Makfi) going into Saturday's Gr.1 Wellfield New Zealand Oaks (2400m) at Trentham.

The Cambridge trainer has had three previous unplaced runners in the New Zealand Oaks but none have gone into the three-year-old fillies Classic with Sofia Rosa's credentials.

A horror fall, the result of clipping heels, in the Gr.2 Eight Carat Classic (1600m) at Ellerslie on Boxing Day remains Sofia Rosa's only defeat in New Zealand this season, having won twice - at Hastings and Ellerslie before Christmas.

She bounced back a week after the Eight Carat to win the Gr.2 Royal Stakes (2000m) at Ellerslie on New Year's Day and has since won the Gr.3 Lowland Stakes (2100m) at Hastings.

"She's done great. She's come through the Lowland perfectly and she hasn't put a foot wrong since," Marsh said.

"She's trained well for this and I can't fault the way she looks. She's got a good draw and everything looks in her

favour. It still won't be an easy race to win but if you look at the field two months ago and what it looks like now, it's certainly lost some of its depth."

Marsh rated fellow Cambridge filly Mime (NZ) (Mastercraftsman) as the hardest to beat for Sofia Rosa, who could have one further run this preparation in the Gr.1 Australian Oaks (2400m) at Randwick on April 9 should she perform and pull up to the trainer's satisfaction on her Trentham trip.

Marsh has a good stable representation at Trentham with Ruud Not Too (NZ) (Bernardini) and Glorious Beijing (NZ) (Per Incanto) slated for the Gr.2 Go Racing Syndications Wellington Guineas (1400m), What A Diva (NZ) (Pentire) set for the Listed Lincoln Farms New Zealand St Leger (2500m) and Santiago (NZ) (Towkay) down to run on the undercard.

At Te Rapa, the trio of Barbaric (NZ) (Pins), Procurement (NZ) (O'Reilly) and Oceania (NZ) (Pins) are on trial for the Listed New Zealand Bloodstock Finance & Leasing Sprint (1200m) at Hastings on April 16 when they contest Saturday's Team Wealleans 1200.

"That Hastings sprint would be a nice target for all of them. They are all nice sprinting types and Procurement especially, I'd love her to become a stakes winner before she retires," Marsh said.

Batman (NZ) (Falkirk) now calls Riccarton home and his form since joining Neill Ridley's stable has earned him a trip north to Trentham for the Direct Fish & Oysters Premier

The gelding has a win and four placings in six starts from his new quarters while his stablemate **Mulberry (NZ)** (Fully Fledged) is also in good form for the Fasttrack Insurance Premier after consecutive seconds at Riccarton and Wingatui.

"He puts in every start and this has been the plan for a month or two and the other one is going up as a travelling companion," Ridley said. "They will be both on their way home on Sunday." Full story here.

Bendigo Guineas test for Let Her Rip

A forecast for rain has Shaune Ritchie's confidence growing for Let Her Rip's tilt at Saturday's Listed Bendigo Guineas (1400m).

Scratched from last weekend's Gr.2 Kewney Stakes after she over-reached in training and took skin off a bumper, **Let Her Rip (NZ)** (Rip Van Winkle) goes into the Guineas off the back of a luckless ninth in the Gr.2 Angus Armanasco Stakes at Caulfield and with a luxury 54kg to carry.

"The Bendigo Guineas is a race that should suit her," Ritchie said.

"They are predicting thunderstorms and

rain which would be good because her best form has come on a wet track.

"Probably her best run this season was on a wet track at Te Rapa back in October. Xtravagant was third in that race and Rangipo fourth, so that's just an indication of what she's capable of in that going."



Azkadellia (NZ) (Shinko King)

Boss keen on Kiwi-bred

New Zealand-bred mare **Azkadellia (NZ)** (Shinko King) will have a Randwick mile specialist in the saddle when she tackles the \$A3 million Gr.1 Doncaster Handicap on April 2.

Glen Boss will take the mount on the Shinko King mare, who has just 50kg, and he will be bidding for a seventh win in the race.

"Glen rang me. He was really keen to ride her," trainer Ciaron Maher said. "I think her preparation has gone really smoothly."

Azkadellia was runner-up in the Gr.3 Bellmaine Stakes when resuming before she won the Gr.3 Mannerism Stakes and last time out she finished runner-up in the Gr.1 Coolmore Classic.

Tim Clark gunning for Albury Gold Cup win

Winning the Albury Gold Cup is definitely on jockey Tim Clark's wish list.

And the 29-year-old Sydney rider has a chance of realising his ambition when he rides Gai Waterhouse's **Hippopus (NZ)** (High Chaparral) in the \$170,000 race today.

An impressive all-the-way winner of the Canberra Cup, Windsor Park Stud graduate Hippopus again looks able to control the race from the front.

"We were able to pour the pressure on early and make it a true staying test, not just a sprint home," Clark said of the Canberra Cup win.

"That's the way he's best ridden."

The six-year-old gelding has had three runs back since a long injury-enforced lay-off.

Clark, who rides work for Waterhouse, has been assured by the trainer that Hippopus is fit and ready.

"The reports back from the stable have been real positive," Clark said.

"If anything he's improved again. He certainly hasn't gone backwards."

Staying future for filly by Shocking

The Murray Johnson-trained **Pure Pride (NZ)** (Shocking) impressed connections when winning at her second start over 1400m at Ballarat on Tuesday.

After jumping awkwardly she settled at the rear of the field before circling the field and cruising to win by just over a length.

"She's a nice horse. I rode her in her first start and we struck all sorts of trouble - it was a train wreck," said jockey Patrick Moloney.

"I've been waiting six months to get back on her, she's had a couple of little setbacks.

"She jumped ok but I just thought I'd leave her alone, they ran along a bit early. She came into it smoothly and when I asked her to extend in the home straight she really let go," said Moloney.

The three-year-old filly is from the first crop of Rich Hill Stud's Shocking whose progeny are relishing getting out over longer distances.

"She's a nice filly going forward and is only going to get better as the distance increases, "said Moloney.

"She's got a brilliant turn of foot and ran through the line today first-up over 1400.

"She could be an Australasian Oaks type of horse."

Hong Kong's champion sprinter **Aerovelocity (NZ)** (Pins) has arrived in Japan where he will bid to add to his collection of Group One honours.

The Paul O'Sullivan-trained son of Pins will attempt to defend his title in the Takamatsunomiya Kinen at Chukyo on Sunday week.

A last-start winner of the Gr.1 Centenary Sprint Cup at Sha Tin, Aerovelocity also has the KrisFlyer International Sprint at Kranji and the Hong Kong Sprint on his CV.

Green light for Pukekohe

Racing will return to Pukekohe Park next month after a successful trial meeting on the course this week.

Fifty-three horses went around in eight heats on Tuesday morning with positive comments from all participants giving the green light to the Counties Racing Club's meeting on Sunday, April 10.

"The track is great, it rode very well," leading jockey Leith Innes said.

Broodmare gem dies

Outstanding broodmare **Parfore (NZ)** (Gold Brose) has died at Segenhoe Stud in the Hunter Valley, New South Wales. She was 18.

The current New Zealand Broodmare of the Year is the dam of the Group One

winners Terravista (Captain Rio) and Tiger Tees (NZ) (Dubawi), the Group Two winner Ball of Muscle (Dubawi) and the multiple stakes winner Our Lukas (NZ) (Generous).

She is also the mother of the two-time Singapore Horse of the Year Super Easy (NZ) (Darci Brahma), who currently stands at Hallmark Stud.

A Kiwi-bred daughter of Gold Brose, Parfore is also a sister to the dam of the Group Three winner Mosse.

Bought by New Zealanders Mike and Christine Ryan for \$30,000 at a broodmare sale, Parfore leaves a colt foal by Rip Van Winkle and a yearling filly by Darci Brahma.

"My wife, Christine and I have been very privileged to have owned a broodmare such as Parfore," owner Mike Ryan said.

"We have owned racehorses for only 16 years and have had Parfore for 13 of those years, so losing her so suddenly has been very sad and difficult for us both."



Volkstok'n'barrell (NZ) (Tavistock)

All to be revealed after Doncaster Volkstok'n'barrell (NZ) (Tavistock) remains an outside chance to make two appearances during the Sydney autumn carnival.

The in-form four-year-old's principal target across the Tasman is the \$A3million Gr.1 Doncaster Handicap and his performance in the Randwick mile may earn him a return a week later for the \$A4 million Gr.1 Queen Elizabeth Stakes.

"If he went super in the Doncaster then

we would have to seriously contemplate that," said Donna Logan, who prepares the Tavistock gelding with Chris Gibbs.

A disappointing spring in Melbourne is a distant memory now for the connections of Volkstok'n'barrell, who have celebrated consecutive Group One domestic wins in the Haunui Farm WFA Classic and the New Zealand Stakes.

With the weights released before his return to top form, the gelding will carry an attractive 52.5kg in the Doncaster. Full story here.



Promise To Reign (Manhattan Rain)

Well-named filly ready for bold classic showing

Moira Murdoch is hoping for a regal result from an aptly-named filly in this Saturday's feature event at Trentham.

The Waiuku trainer will be represented by **Promise To Reign** (Manhattan Rain) in the Gr.1 Wellfield New Zealand Oaks with confidence in the three-year-old's classic chances fuelled by solid performances in each of her last three appearances.

Promise To Reign won a maiden mile at Te Rapa in January and she has subsequently made an encouraging impact at black type level with runner-up finishes in both the Gr.2 Sir Tristram Fillies' Classic and in the Gr.3 Sunline Vase.

"She's a very finely-made filly and she was never going to race as a two-year-old, even though she ran a couple of tidy trials," Murdoch said.

"She has developed a good deal and she's definitely bred to stay." Full story here.

Trainer relaxed about Derby jockey

Connections of **What's The Story (NZ)** (Savabeel) are in no rush to confirm a rider for their colt in the \$A2 million Gr.1 Australian Derby.

"It's easier to wait until after the Rosehill Guineas when the jockeys have sorted themselves out," co-trainer Stephen McKee said.

What's The Story had a quiet week after finishing runner-up in the Gr.1 New Zealand Derby and he will travel to Australia four days before the Randwick feature on April 2.

"He's got the base fitness and he'll have a couple of decent gallops before he goes over," McKee said.

Manawatu for Wyndspelle

Trainer Donna Logan has opted to set smart two-year-old **Wyndspelle (NZ)** (Iffraaj) for the Gr.1 Courtesy Ford Manawatu Sires' Produce Stakes (1400m) at Awapuni on April 2 instead of crossing the Tasman in the immediate future with the colt.

Logan, who prepares the son of Iffraaj in partnership with Chris Gibbs, had initially thought about a tilt at the A\$1 million Gr.1 Sires' Produce on the same day at Randwick following Wyndspelle's fast finishing second to Heroic Valour (Fastnet Rock) in the Gr.1 Diamond Stakes.

"He'll look to Awapuni now and he's screaming out for 1400m based on his run on Saturday," Logan said.

"Small fish are sweet and if he went well at Awapuni we can always go to Australia for the mile of the Champagne Stakes or the T.J Smith in Brisbane – there's options there."

Griante shooting for the stars

Group One-placed mare **Griante** (Good Journey) will attempt to open her account at the top level in The Galaxy at Rosehill on Saturday.

Third in last season's William Reid Stakes, she was unplaced but only four lengths from the winner when resuming in the Oakleigh Plate at Caulfield last month.

"We thought her run in the Oakleigh Plate was so good, admittedly running into a lot of trouble, that we thought her chance to win a Group One would be in a handicap," said trainer David Brideoake, who shares in the ownership with Auckland couple Brendan and Jo Lindsay.

Hayes' high hopes for Criterion

David Hayes enters the Ranvet Stakes confident about the chances of his two-pronged attack in the Group One race.

The Lindsay Park co-trainer will saddle **Criterion (NZ)** (Sebring) and Dibayani (Shamardal) in the 2000m race at Rosehill on Saturday.

Michael Walker, who rode Criterion to placings in the Cox Plate and the Melbourne Cup last spring, replaces Kerrin McEvoy after the five-year-old finished last in the Canterbury Stakes at Randwick on March 5.

Hayes said Criterion had improved his fitness and would appreciate a rise in distance.

"He looks well and I think he'll run much better," Hayes said.

Criterion has drawn an inside gate in the nine-horse field and Hayes is hoping it won't be a disadvantage tomorrow.

"It may not be the place to be with it being wet but he can have a nice run and pull out in the straight," he said.

"Hopefully he'll get clear galloping room and the track will be alright."



Perfect Fit (NZ) (Elusive City)

A Perfect result for Haunui Farm Perfect Fit's (NZ) (Elusive City) Gr.2

Westbury Classic win on Saturday was the ultimate result for Haunui Farm, with the Karaka-based farm not only having bred the winner but also racing her along with the Provincial Club Limited, Garry Madill, Margaret Duncan and James Orton.

The Ken and Bev Kelso-trained mare is now the winner of five of 10 races, having finished no worse than fourth in her other five starts, and is now being aimed at the Gr.1 New Zealand Thoroughbred Breeders' Stakes at Te Aroha in early April.

Perfect Fit is out of the top mare Fayreform (NZ) (Tights), which was raced by Haunui Farm, with Garry Madill who has been associated with the stud for over 30 years, and Margaret Duncan, whose late husband Ron was involved in the stud when they were based at Pukekawa in the 60's.
