

# CYLINDER BEACH HEADS STABLE **QUINELLA IN GUNSYND CLASSIC**



Impressive Doomben winner Cylinder Beach has the Gr. 1 Queensland Derby in his sights

ew Zealand Bloodstock Ready to Run Sale graduate Cylinder Beach (NZ) (Showcasing) delivered a perfect result for trainer Desleigh Forster when he headed a stable quinella in the A\$125,000 Group 3 Gunsynd Classic (1630m) at Doomben on Saturday.

Ridden by Michael Cahill, Cylinder Beach fought best in a tight finish and edged out stablemate Too Good To Refuse (Rothesay) by a head.

It was the first stakes win for the colt, who was bred by Tim Harrison and was put through the 2014 Ready to Run Sale by Te Runga Stud. He failed to meet his \$60,000 reserve that day, but he has now earned more than A\$150,000 for a large group of owners.

Cylinder Beach's jockey Michael Cahill said it had been a great training effort from Forster.

"Desleigh really should get a lot of credit," he said.

"To have three runners in a Group race and then quinella it is outstanding, especially as she has only a small team.

"I hope people realise the work that went in to getting Cylinder Beach to win first up at 1600 metres. It is the mark of a top trainer."

Forster believes Cylinder Beach should have nearly won the Group One J J Atkins Stakes last winter instead of finishing fourth to Press Statement (Hinchinbrook).

"Swap the barriers and we might have had a shot. But he was immature and I knew we had a real horse," she said.

"We were going to take him to Sydney for the Australian

Derby but he had a few set-backs and we decided to wait for the winter."

Cylinder Beach will now head to the Gr. 1 Queensland Derby with his next start likely to be in the Gr. 3 Rough Habit Plate in a fortnight.

#### Coffey gets the cream with Zebulon

Top young rider Harry Coffey continued his great record in Adelaide when he partnered **Zebulon (NZ)** (All American) to an impressive win in the \$100,000 Listed City of Adelaide Handicap to claim a riding double.

Making his first start for more than 15 months, Zebulon made up for lost time with a stunning four-length victory. The All American gelding raced well back in the field before taking charge with an impressive turn of foot. He raced away down the straight and left his rivals gasping in his wake, clocking 1:22.38 for the 1400 metres.

Zebulon has now recorded two wins and four placings in a career that has been restricted to just eight starts to date for trainers Peter Morgan and Craig Widdison. He may now be given the chance to compete in even higher grades during the upcoming Queensland winter carnival.

Zebulon was a \$60,000 purchase by Dean Hawthorne Bloodstock during the Select session of the 2013 New Zealand Bloodstock Yearling Sale Series where he was offered through the Lyndhurst Farm draft.





# BALHAM UNDERLINES HIS STAYING CREDENTIALS WITH TE RAPA VICTORY

comprehensive victory at Te Rapa on the weekend will see progressive galloper **Balham (NZ)** (Don Eduardo) head to his winter spelling paddock with a brace of wins under his belt and the promise that he will be a force to be reckoned with when the major staying races roll around next summer.

The five-year-old Don Eduardo gelding made light work of a 59.5 kilogram impost as he comfortably held out a stern challenge from Diesel (NZ) (Electronic Zone) and second favourite Private Hero (NZ) (Ekraar) in a driving finish to the Guild & Spence Electrical sponsored 2400 metre rating 85 event

Co-trainer Emma Haworth, who prepares the gelding with father David, was delighted with the performance although she admitted she had her doubts when rider Mark Du Plessis pushed the go button on his charge early in the run home.

"He hit the front pretty early in the run home and for a second or two I wondered whether Mark had gone too early," she said.

"I asked him about it when he came back in and he said he didn't want to be chasing hard when he was carrying such a big weight. He was very strong to the line so it was the right thing to do even if it did get the heart racing a little."

Although it took the son of stakes winning mare Fifty Fifty

(NZ) (Justice Prevails) eight starts to break maiden status after kicking off his career as a late three-year-old, Haworth believes the best of the gelding will be seen in the coming season.

"He's never really gone a bad race but just wasn't really strong enough in his first few starts to close out a victory," she said.

"He's got better and better each campaign and this time in he's been very good which is exciting when we look ahead to next season. He doesn't cope with the wet tracks so it's probably a good time to give him a decent break.

"He seems to thrive when racing over ground so we will be looking at those good Cup races with him. He has a lovely turn of foot at the business end of a race so if he can make further improvement over his break then he could be in for a very good summer." – NZ Racing Desk

## SILHOUETTE NOIRE PROVIDES PERFECT BIRTHDAY PRESENT

ormer southern mare **Silhouette Noire** (Dane Shadow) chose the perfect time to showcase her undoubted talent when she provided the icing on co-owner Charles Hall's 75th birthday cake with an upset victory at Te Rapa.

Hall and wife Anne-Marie de Spa sent their five-year-old Dane Shadow mare north in search of further black-type opportunities after meeting Cambridge trainer Lee Somervell during one of his visits to Riccarton with star galloper Addictive Habit. Silhouette Noire had won five of her first 22 starts from Terri Rae's Riccarton stable before arriving at Somervell's base earlier in the year.

"Terri had done a super job with her and she arrived in terrific condition," noted Somervell.

"She had her first two starts for me at Ellerslie and didn't really cope with going right handed for the first time. I think she will be okay going that way once she learns how to handle it but returning to her familiar left-handed way around was the key on Saturday.

"Her work during the week had been first class so I was confident she would run well although her price didn't indicate anyone else thought that way."

Punters certainly abandoned the mare on her disclosed North Island form with her \$40 plus tote price making her the rank outsider of the ten horse field. That counted for little as rider Trudy Thornton bided her time in midfield before producing a powerful home straight burst to score by a head from race favourite Bonniegirl (NZ) (Darci Brahma).

"It was a lovely ride by Trudy as she held her up before putting her in the race halfway down the straight where she was very strong to the line," said Somervell.

"We were pretty keen for her to perform well on Saturday as I have my eye on the Listed race at Rotorua over 1400 metres in a fortnight as her next challenge and I thought we'd need the form to make the field.

"That should be sorted out now and with Rotorua being left-handed I'm keen to get her there if she comes through this one well."

Somervell was pleased with the run of his other class

mare, Celebrity Miss (NZ) (Civics), who finished 6th in the Gr. 2 Travis Stakes behind impressive winner Rasa Lila.

"She just found it a little firm for her although she went a very pleasing race," he said.

"I had been hoping for some rain as I think she would have been right in it with a little moisture in the track. She pulled up well but I'm not sure what to do with her now as there's just nothing around for her."

Somervell also reported Addictive Habit (NZ) (Colombia) was doing well as he recuperates from a tendon tear suffered during a build-up towards a start in the Gr. 1 Doncaster Handicap during the recent Sydney autumn carnival.

# RYAN JIM BOOKS A RETURN TRIP TO HASTINGS WITH STUNNING VICTORY

xciting sprinting talent **Ryan**Jim (NZ) (Align) has booked his ticket to the Hawkes Bay Spring

Carnival next season with a stunning performance that saw him register his second career victory at Hastings on the weekend.

That is, however, on the proviso that trainer John Morell's phone doesn't ring with an offshore offer too good to refuse over the next few weeks.

Morell admitted he had fielded plenty of calls after Saturday's victory with the reality of selling the promising Align gelding a real prospect.

"I'm just a plain old dairy farmer and with the payout situation in that industry at present, coupled with what we race for here in New Zealand, we'd be mad not to look at what they are offering for him," he admitted.

"Mind you we're not going to give him away so if he doesn't get sold we know we have a pretty handy horse to take back to Hastings in the spring."

Morell went into Saturday's event with a degree of confidence after son-in-law Mark Phillips reported back following an impressive mid-week track gallop at Te Rapa.

"I said to Mark after he rode him during the week I thought he was the best mover we'd had in the stable for quite a while and that included his older brother Ryan Mark," he said.

"He agreed and said he had taken plenty out of his first run so we thought he'd go okay on the weekend.

"We were keen to see how he would handle the trip away and

whether it would be worth taking him back there in the spring. I guess he answered that although he was a little lucky to get a run in the straight.

"Hayden (Tinsley) rode him nicely and said he did it pretty well so if he's not sold then I guess we'll be heading back there with him."

Morell also reported that Railway Stakes winner Ryan Mark (NZ) (Thorn Park) was enjoying the first stages off a new preparation that will see him aimed at further Group One targets next season.

"He's been out at Kim Blair's place at Raglan beach for a week or so now and has been enjoying himself out there," he said.

"We're just going to take it slowly with him but he's kicking and bucking around the place so he must be feeling pretty good at this early stage."

### CONSISTENCY REWARDED AT HASTINGS

onsistent mare **Lady Zafira (NZ)** (Iffraaj) capped a string of minor placings with a gritty performance to register her fourth career win on the weekend.

The locally prepared mare was coming off the back of an unlucky run on her home track a fortnight ago and was confidently expected to perform well again despite the fact it was the five-year-old's first race over a distance greater than 1400 metres.

Trainer John Bary was keen to see his charge perform over the 1600 metre journey of Saturday's event as he looks towards potential Group level opportunities next season.

Those opportunities are now a reality with Lady Zafira handling the step up with aplomb as she held out her rating 85 rivals narrowly but well in the Livamol sponsored contest.

"She's a very handy mare who has only missed a cheque twice in 17 starts to date," he noted.

"The times she did finish out of the money were when she was getting over a muscle injury so she really has done an

excellent job for us.

"The plan is to get her some black-type for a future breeding career so that's what we will concentrate on from now. The opportunities can be a little limited if you're just an out and out sprinter but now she's shown the mile won't be a problem it does open up a much wider field for us."

Bary will wait to see

Consistent mare Lady Zafira scores narrowly but well on her home track at the weekend how the mare comes through her exertions before deciding on whether to give her one more run in this campaign or to head straight to the spelling paddock. If the former is the chosen option then the Listed Rotorua stakes on 14 May, a Fillies & Mares WFA contest over 1400 metres, will become her preferred target provided a suitably dry track is on offer on the day.

### MICHELLE SAYS HELLO RIGHT ON THE LINE

he second Leg of the Singapore Golden Horseshoe for two-year-olds saw a feisty **Hello Michelle (NZ)** (Minstrel Court) punch her way through to get up by the narrowest of margins in a three-way thriller on Sunday.

After travelling in the box-seat courtesy of a good gate, the Mark Walker-trained filly was angled out from the fence by jockey Alan Munro at the 300m to set sail after favourite Mystic Master (Snippetson) with longshot Deimos (NZ) (Deimos) joining the fray on the outside for a captivating end to the concluding stages of the \$90,000 Singapore Silver Horseshoe (1000m).

Sandwiched between the two, Hello Michelle kept digging deep and was the one who worried them out of it as she put her head down on the line when it mattered to win by a nose from Deimos with Mystic Master third another head away.

Sent out as the second favourite, Hello Michelle, a daughter of Minstrel Court – who incidentally was a speedy two-year-old for Walker during his training days in New Zealand – clocked 59.47 seconds for the 1000m on Polytrack.

Walker was proven right in his decision to ride Hello Michelle more quietly compared to her first run in the first Leg, the Kranji Nursery Stakes, when she was bustled up early to take the lead before floundering late to run fourth.

"We decided to ride her quiet today. She was used up too much at her first run," said the Kiwi handler.

"She has a great attitude and being by a Zabeel mare (Paixanito), she will get better over more distance."

Raced by the Synthetic Stable, Hello Michelle has taken her burgeoning stakes earnings past the \$50,000 mark with that early maiden victory.

# LEE THE MAN AS HE OPENS HIS WINNING ACCOUNT

second place to juvenile champion Super One (I Am Invincible) did once raise the hopes of **Lee Man's** (NZ) (Any Suggestion) connections about an early victory, but the wait has taken longer than expected, until the grey finally opened his winning account at his 17th start on Sunday at Kranji.

The Any Suggestion three-year-old raced among the cohort of 2015 two-year-olds that was completely obliterated by ex-Kranji trainer Michael Freedman's Super One, with his best run when he finished runner-up to the son of I Am Invincible in the IRT Juvenile Stakes (1200m), the third Leg of the Singapore Horseshoe Series.

His next runs were, however, nothing to write home about with just a few placings peppered amongst them. But a decision to drop the blinkers may have finally sparked his will to win in Sunday's opening event, the \$35,000 Class 5 Division

seems to have worked. I just told Joe to ride him the way he wanted and do his best," said trainer Leslie Khoo.

"I think he's a horse who needs more ground and that's probably the way I will go with him eventually."

With that maiden win finally on the board, Lee Man, who also has two seconds and one third to show for, has bumped his stakes earnings to the \$50,000 mark for the Lucky General Stable.

#### Rageese runs them ragged

THE Queensland winter carnival is likely to be the next stop for exciting three-year-old **Rageese** (Street Cry) after his effortless \$100,000 Listed HC Nitschke Stakes win at Morphettville.

Leading trainer Darren Weir appears to have revived another horse with huge potential, with the former Team Hawkes-trained colt maintaining his unbeaten record for Weir with a dominant victory by more than four lengths.

"The Queensland Guineas I think is the plan," Weir's Warrnambool stable foreman Jarrod McLean said. "He's a handy addition to the stable and he looks set for some nice races."

McLean said Rageese, who has raced at Listed level or better in eight of 12 starts, was thriving in his new environment away from the hustle and bustle of a metropolitan stable.

"A bit stale, maybe?" McLean said of Rageese's form turnaround. "City life might not have been working for him."

The win was great news for Cambridge based Windsor Park Stud who recently purchased a 50% ownership share in the exciting colt, who is a direct descendant of the champion racemare and Australian Horse Of The Year Emancipation.
