

PETERS LOOKING FOR BACK TO BACK OAKS



Western Australian Oaks winner First Impressions looks a strong chance in the Gr. 1 Schweppes Oaks at Morphettville tomorrow

eviathan Western Australian owner Bob Peters will have a two-pronged attack on Saturday's Gr.1 Schweppes Oaks (2000m) at Morphettville with Western Australian Derby winner Arcadia Dream (Domesday) and Western Australian Oaks winner First Impressions (NZ) (Rip Van Winkle).

Peters' colours were carried to victory in the Schweppes Oaks last year by star filly **Delicacy** (Al Maher), who like Arcadia Dream and First Impressions was prepared by trainer Grant Williams.

A daughter of Rip Van Winkle, a Champion miler by the staying influence Galileo, First Impressions is out of Group One Thorndon Mile runner-up Striker (NZ) (Van Nistelrooy).

Purchased by prominent West Australian bloodstock agent John Chalmers on behalf of Peters, First Impressions was a \$270,000 graduate of the Haunui Farm draft at the 2014 Karaka Premier Yearling Sale.

First Impressions wore bar plates last start in the Diggers' Cup, when she ran seventh against older horses, after she

was scratched from the Western Australian Derby because of a corn in her hoof.

"There was an abscess but it burst and everything is fine now," Peters said.

The Adelaide trip has had its hitches for both Petersowned fillies. Arcadia Dream and First Impressions have left feed and taken time to settle after a lengthy journey from the West. They flew from Perth to Melbourne and then travelled by truck for 10 hours to Adelaide.

"They have come right, but they didn't eat up as well as we thought they would," Peters said. "It is a big trip and both were affected by the length of the travelling."

Heavyweight jockey Glenn Smith retains the ride on First Impressions in South Australia after guiding her to victory in last month's Western Australian Oaks.

Peters said they had poured the work into the daughter of Rip Van Winkle.

"First Impressions needed the work because she missed that run in the Western Australian Derby."

New Zealand bred filly **Pasadena Girl (NZ)** (Savabeel) is clearly the highest rated filly in an open field, while young trainer Mitch Beer will be in search of a first Group One when he saddles **Jacqui's Joy (NZ)** (Real Saga), who began her career with Frank Ritchie.







KIWI FORM BEST GUIDE TO HOLLINDALE HOPES



Volkstok'n'barrell is ready to show his best in Saturday's Gr.2 A. D. Hollindale Stakes at the Gold Coast

onna Logan believes the domestic form of **Volkstok'n'barrell (NZ)** (Tavistock) is the true indicator to his chances of a successful Brisbane debut.

The Ruakaka trainer said no notice should be taken of the four-year-old's last-start failure when assessing his prospects for Saturday's Gr.2 A. D. Hollindale Stakes at the Gold Coast.

"Corey Brown who rode him in the Doncaster said he knew he was in trouble after he went about 200 metres. He just wasn't handling the track at all," said Logan, who prepares Volkstok'n'barrell with Chris Gibbs.

"He can handle soft tracks, but he doesn't like shifty tracks. That track on Doncaster day was no help to us."

Logan said the most accurate guide to Volkstok'n'barrell's hopes were his two previous home victories in the Gr.1

Haunui Farm Classic at Otaki and the Gr.1 New Zealand Stakes at Ellerslie.

"He was right back to his best form in those races and won both of them impressively," Logan said.

Volkstok'n'barrell arrived in Brisbane on Sunday and the son of boom stallion Tavistock had settled in well.

"He is used to travel these days and I am expecting a good run on Saturday," Logan said.

Volkstok'n'barrell, whose Brisbane target is the Gr.1 Doomben Cup on May 21, will be ridden by Blake Shinn.

The Murray Baker and Andrew Forsman-trained Sakhee's Soldier (NZ) (Sakhee's Secret) will also make his Queensland debut in the Hollindale in the hands of regular rider Matt Cameron. They were a fast-finishing fourth last time out in the Gr.1 Easter Stakes at Ellerslie.









THREE-STRAIGHT WARRNAMBOOL **CUPS FOR WEIR**

he victory of Master Of Arts (NZ) (Mastercraftsman) in the Listed Warrnambool Cup yesterday has given Darren Weir his biggest haul at the three-day carnival.

Weir opened with a quartet on Tuesday, had a double on Wednesday while Master Of Arts provided him with the second leg of a double on Thursday.

The victory was also Weir's thirdstraight Warrnambool Cup success after victories by Akzar (Selkirk) in 2014 and Tall Ship (Sea The Stars).

Ridden by Dean Yendall, Master Of Arts scored by a 1-1/4 lengths

from Vilanova (NZ) (Commands) with Swacadelic (Adlerflug) 1-1/2 lengths away third.

"These are the races you set horses for." Weir said.

"The jumpers, the Wangoom and the Cup are the main races and then you just run anything else that is around at the time in the other races.

"We had plenty of runners but at this carnival it's very hard to win."

Weir had three runners in Thursday's Cup with Master Of Arts the least fancied of the trio.

Master Zephyr (Shirocco) was sent out the \$3 favourite before finishing

fourth and Falago (Fastnet Rock) was seventh.

"It's great for this horse to win for Paul and Angela Fudge who are big supporters of ours," Weir said.

"Paul came up and had a look around and they ended up sending me a couple of horses.

"They have beautifully bred horses and deserve all the success they get."

Weir said Master Of Arts could return to Queensland this winter and be set for the Caloundra Cup at the Sunshine Coast.

Master Of Arts headed to Brisbane last year for the Gr. 1 Queensland Derby but had his campaign cut short by a knee problem after running third in the Grand Prix Stakes.

Top mare ready for feature sprint

Griante (Good Journey) galloped well between races at Mornington on Monday in preparation for a tilt at the Gr.1 Robert Sangster Stakes at Morphettville on

Part-owned by New Zealand couple Brendan and Jo Lindsay, the David Brideoake-trained mare followed a similar pattern when she had a race-day gallop at Moonee Valley before she won the Gr.1 The Galaxy at Rosehill in March.

"It's worked out really well to come to Mornington on a track that's got nice cushion in it and nice cover," rider Craig Williams said.

"She looks well, is very balanced and smooth and felt great the way she went."

Griante has drawn perfectly in gate three for Saturday's 1200 metre event.

Imposing Lass on Oaks path

Bjorn Baker may have a rising star on his hands in last start Sydney winner Imposing Lass (NZ) (Makfi) and he is hoping the daughter of Makfi will be seen at her best in the Gr.1 Queensland Oaks.

Baker, who has enjoyed a fabulous season, will run promising filly Imposing Lass in Saturday's Gold Coast Bracelet (1800m) as he plots a path towards the 2400m fillies feature on June 4.

"I really like Imposing Lass and I think she has a big future," Baker said.

"The filly has won three from four starts. She stepped up from provincial grade with a dominant first-up win at Warwick Farm but I think she was even more impressive in her most recent win at Rosehill.

"I am sure she will be an ideal Oaks filly because she is big and strong and she also has good tactical speed and she will put herself right there in a race." Full story here.

Cambridge yard chasing prime targets

Stablemates **Ugo Foscolo (NZ)** (Zacinto) and Seize The Moment (NZ) (Pins) give Stephen Marsh a genuine shot at an inter-Island black type double this weekend.

The talented two-year-old Ugo Foscolo will defend his unbeaten record at Te Rapa on Saturday while his more experienced stablemate will later step out over his favoured distance at Riccarton.

Listed Hamilton Vet Equine Stakes contender Ugo Foscolo won three trials before his Rotorua debut last month and, while he won as an odds-on chance would be expected to, Marsh had concerns.

"I rate him extremely highly and we went to the races thinking it was a dead track and it turned out it was heavy," he said.

"He didn't handle it, but he got the job done and I can't fault the horse. He'll have this run and then we'll pull up stumps – I'd like to think we can set him for the 2000 Guineas next season." Full story here.

Christchurch trainer Andrew Carston is hoping a decision to bypass New Zealand's two juvenile Group One races reaps stakesrace rewards for talented Jimmy Choux filly What Choux Want (NZ) at Riccarton on Saturday.

Carston will give What Choux Want her final start of the season in the Listed Berkley Stud Champagne Stakes (1200m), confident he has the filly in the right condition to finish her two-year-old campaign with a black-type win.

"I'm as happy as I can be with her going into this race. I thought it was the right option for her, rather than going to the Group One races that we'd target a Listed race at home. Full story here.

A wet track, blinkers and a gun ride from James Winks proved the difference as **Yesterday's Songs** (Henrythenavigator) took out the Listed Wangoom Handicap at Warrnambool.

After being slowly away, Winks hugged the rail and Yesterday's Songs relished the heavy track, coming away to beat last year's winner Royal Island (Dubawi) with Mirage (Hard Spun) in third.

Winks was instructed to take all the shortcuts - and he did - as the sometimes tough to catch Yesterday's Songs broke through for his first black-type success.

"I was a bit surprised I got there that easy, because as the day's gone on, the fence has been the place to be." Winks said.

"This time last year I think he ran in The Goodwood beaten a (few) lengths ... it's in him but I think the recipe for today's win was that he found the wet track and he loves it"

"He needs a wet track to show his best." trainer Mike Moroney's stable representative Greg Hoysted said.

Yesterday's Song was purchased by Paul Moroney from Curraghmore Stud's 2012 NZB yearling draft for \$160,000.

"She has had one trip away of five hours in a float so I'm hoping she copes well with the travel." James said.

To be ridden by Michael Rodd, James is hoping to earn enough prizemoney to qualify for the Gr.1 Queensland Oaks.



Street Smart (NZ) (Shocking)

Queensland hopes on the line

Success at today's Counties meeting will keep a Derby dream alive for **Street Smart** (NZ) (Shocking).

The three-year-old son of Shocking desperately needs cash in the bank to fund his future Group One aspirations and has the chance of a timely deposit when he tackles the Pukekohe Park 2100.

Street Smart has showed staying potential, but that hasn't translated into enough stake earnings to ensure safe entry into the major lead-up events to the Queensland Derby at Eagle Farm on June

"He's very well, but he does need to win this if he is going to go over to Brisbane," trainer Shaune Ritchie said. "The prize money is the big problem."

Street Smart was a debut winner in the spring and was turned out after he had raced greenly when eighth in the Listed BMW Salver. Full story here.

Makfi's fee increases

Dubawi's son Makfi will head the Westbury Stud roster in 2016 with his fee to be increased from \$17,500 to \$25,000 + GST after another excellent season.

Makfi, who shuttles from the Aga Khan's Haras de Bonneval in France, has been represented by the Group One winners Sofia Rosa (NZ) and Marky Mark from his first Southern Hemisphere crop.

Reliable Man (Dalakhani), a two-time winner at the top level, will again stand at \$15,000 + GST while the fee for Swiss Ace (Secret Savings), who has produced 10 individual black type performers, will rise from \$10,000 to \$13,500 + GST.

Redwood (High Chaparral) will remain at \$10,000 + GST and El Roca (Fastnet Rock), who was retired to stud last year, will stand at his introductory fee of \$7500 + GST. Postponed (Summer Squall) and Red Giant (Giant's Causeway) will both be available at \$5000 + GST.

Added incentive for supporters of II

Breeders will have an added incentive to support the Australian speed machine Il Cavallo (Choisir) who will serve his first season at Chequers Stud in 2016.

Il Cavallo's introductory fee has been set at \$3000 + GST, but with an extra bonus.

"We will cover the cost of entry into the New Zealand Bloodstock Pearl Series Bonus Scheme for any breeder who gets a filly," Fraser-Campin said.

Il Cavallo won four times at 1000 metres and once in record time at Sandown over 900 metres under the care of the leading Caulfield trainer Peter Moody. He also placed in the Gr. 3 Vain Stakes and was

stakes placed multiple times.

Il Cavallo's associate sire Battle Paint will stand at \$5000 + GST.

The Tale Of The Cat stallion has produced 27 individual winners from 48 runners at an impressive strike rate of better than 56 percent.

Wellfield fees announced

Wellfield Lodge today announced fees for their resident stallions Alamosa (NZ) (O'Reilly) and Road To Rock (Encosta De Lago) for 2016.

The Palmerston North stud has reduced Alamosa's fee to \$8500 + GST with a free return while Road To Rock will stand at \$4500 + GST with a free return.

"Whether it's to breed to sell or to race, our two stallions offer outstanding value for money," Wellfield's Bill Gleeson said.

"Both of them have proved they can leave Group One horses and they are succeeding in all our major markets. The statistics show how well they are both performing."

Kiwis jumping for joy with star Sydney horsewoman

Xtravagant (NZ) (Pentire) will be a notable absentee from the Queensland winter carnival.

The top colt has been sent to the paddock with the last-start Gr.3 Cambridge Breeders' Stakes winner to return for a Melbourne spring carnival campaign.

"He deserves a good spell and I have a super paddock reserved for him right next door to our other Group One winner this season, the unbeaten Heroic Valour," Te Akau principal David Ellis said.

Xtravagant has won five of his nine starts this season, including the Gr.1 NZ 2000 Guineas and against the older horses in the Gr.1 NRM Sprint.

Smart 2YO heads to warmer climes

Precocious youngster **Manolo Blahniq** (**NZ**) (Jimmy Choux) is in Queensland, but whether he makes an appearance during the winter carnival is yet to be decided.

The son of Jimmy Choux impressed in his brief career from Craig Thornton's stable and it was always the intention that the colt would do his future racing for Tony Noonan.

The Victorian trainer purchased Manolo Blahniq for \$115,000 at Karaka last year with the pre-sale plan of placing him with his long-time friend Thornton for his early education.

"He'll probably have a couple of trials in Queensland and it depends how he goes and then Tony will make a decision," Thornton said.

"If he's happy with the horse then he may run him there, but the main priority is Melbourne in the spring."

Australian focus for Ritchie

Shaune Ritchie will be shooting for an inter-state double in Australia on Saturday.

The Cambridge trainer has accompanied the black type-winning filly **No Pushover** (**NZ**) (Pins) to Queensland where she will run in the Listed Gold Coast Bracelet on Saturday while **Snow Secret** (**NZ**) (Sakhee's Secret) will be in action at Flemington.

"Snow Secret's in a Benchmark Handicap and she's probably our best chance," Ritchie said

"If she runs really well there is a Listed race, the Centaur Stakes, in Adelaide we would have a look at."

Fourth in the Gr.2 Wellington Cup in January, Snow Secret returned from a break to win over a mile last month and then finished third to Saint Emilion (NZ) (Mastercraftsman) in a middle distance open handicap. Full story here.

Walker booked for five rides at Flemington

Michael Walker will make his return from his latest injury setback with five rides at Flemington.

Walker hasn't ridden in a race for more than a month as he recovered from a head injury suffered in an accident at his home.
