PIKE LOOKING TO BOOST QUEENSLAND TALLY



The Tony Pike trained Sacred Star is ready to tackle the gun Queensland sprinters in tomorrow's Gr. 1 BTC Cup at Doomben

Buoyed by **Sacred Elixir's (NZ)** (Pour Moi) midweek success in his Australian debut, Tony Pike is looking to his star sprinter-miler **Sacred Star** (Flying Spur) to continue the stable's roll at Doomben on Saturday.

He will make his first appearance since winning the Gr.3 Darley Plate at Ellerslie in March when he steps out in the Gr.1 BTC Cup.

"Sacred Star's done really well, but it's a hot race and we'll have to wait and see how he goes against these top sprinters," Pike said.

"It's a very strong field and if he can run in the money we would be very happy and continue on the Group One path or we can always drop him back."

The \$A1.5 million Stradbroke Handicap, in which Sacred Star finished a luckless sixth last year, on June 11 is the loftier goal while the Gr.2 QTC Cup, also at Eagle Farm, a week earlier and the Listed Glasshouse Handicap at the Sunshine Coast on July 2 are easier options.

The stable's Queensland tenure got away to the perfect start on Wednesday when the two-year-old Sacred Elixir

carried topweight of 58kg to victory over 1400 metres at the Sunshine Coast.

“That was a good way to kick off and he’s got bigger targets coming up,” Pike said. “We’ve always had a pretty good opinion of him and he’s really strengthened up.

“He’s likely to head to the Sires’ Produce on the 28th – it looks a good race for him, even though it’s only 1350 metres, but they go pretty quickly around Doomben and that will suit him and set him up nicely for the J.J. Atkins over a mile at

Eagle Farm a fortnight later.”

The third member of the team in Australia is the Gr.1 New Zealand Derby winner Rangipo (Stryker), who will step out in Saturday week’s Gr.3 Fred Best Classic ahead of the Gr.2 Queensland Guineas on June 11.

“Provocative will be going over on Sunday as well and she’ll run at Ipswich next Wednesday and hopefully she’ll pick up enough prizemoney to get into the Queensland Oaks,” Pike said

BULLISH STOCK LOOKING TO ADD TO SIRE'S DERBY RECORD

The David Hayes and Tom Dabernig-trained **Bullish Stock (NZ)** (Tavistock) has a heavy burden to carry heading into Saturday's Gr.1 South Australian Derby.

Bullish Stock will be out to extend the superb record of sons of Tavistock in Derbys this season, following on from the VRC Derby triumph of **Tarzino (NZ)**, the ATC Derby success of **Tavago (NZ)** and the Hong Kong Derby victory of **Werther (NZ)**.

Bullish Stock fought strongly to the line when third to Derby rivals **Cool Chap** (High Chaparral) and **Etymology** (New Approach) in the St Leger (2800m) at Flemington on Anzac Day.

The gelding has been marked a \$26 chance and will start from barrier one with leading Adelaide jockey Matthew

Neilson in the saddle.

"He was wide the whole race in the St Leger and he hit the line strongly," Adelaide based stable representative Ben Hayes said.

"He can definitely stay. I think if he had a good run in the St Leger he easily could have been the winner.

"He's come to me very fit and I think he can run well.

"He'll probably be ridden in the forward half of the field. Barrier one isn't too bad for him."

Bullish Stock is one of three New Zealand bred runners in the South Australian Derby, with the Kevin Hickman bred and raced **Prince of Pagoda (NZ)** (Zabeel) and Western Australian filly **First Impressions (NZ)** (Rip Van Winkle) also set to take their place in the field.

RECORDS TUMBLE AT NZB NATIONAL WEANLING, **BROODMARE,** **AND MIXED BLOODSTOCK SALE**

The record breaking trend set during the Weanling Session of NZB's National Weanling, Broodmare and Mixed Bloodstock Sale continued through to the Broodmare Session at Karaka, which concluded on Wednesday.

The overall statistics tell a heartening tale of the state of the industry with receipts for the three day Sale totalling \$8,915,200, up \$4,830,100 (a 118% increase) on last year with clearance at 91%. The overall median price settled 188% up at \$8,000 (from \$2,775 last year) with the average at \$19,989 compared to last year's \$9,589.

Lot 263, an O'Reilly colt from the multiple stakes-winner in Singapore, Mexican Rose (NZ) (Volksraad), commanded the top price of the Weanling Session at \$185,000. Consigned by Hallmark Stud, the colt was secured by Dean Hawthorne who

was bidding on behalf of Kacy Fogden of Queensland-based Aquis Farm.

"Kacy came over and picked him out as the best colt in the sale and I think she was right on the money - he's a good investment being by a proven sire in O'Reilly," said Hawthorne.

"This is one of the strongest weanling sales I've seen and it's great for the industry," he continued.

Gordon Cunningham's Curraghmore Stud came out as the leading vendor at the sale for the 11th year running.

The Broodmare Session also posted big gains on last year's results.

Rosemont Stud's Anthony Mithen paid \$405,000 for Lot 464, Galaktika (NZ) (Thorn Park), the half-sister to Volkstok'n'barrell (NZ) (Tavistock) who carries the farm's distinctive red colours.

In foal to Tavistock (NZ) (Montjeu), Galaktika is carrying a three-quarter-sibling to the triple Group One winner and was consigned for Hong Kong-based owner Dominic Li by George and Maryanne Simon's Mana Park.

"With all things combined I knew Galaktika would be very popular here in this very buoyant market, but

she was the mare I really wanted to take home one way or another," said Mithen.

"We have a couple of nominations locked away to Tavistock and that is the obvious mating again this year but in time she has been bought to go to Tarzino who races in our colours."

"This is one of the strongest sales I've ever been involved with and in addition to our international buying bench it was brilliant to see our local breeders reinvesting in some quality mares," said NZB Managing Director Andrew Seabrook.

Cylinder Beach firing

Trainer Desleigh Forster has thrown out the challenge to interstate stables, warning they must bring their A-game to beat **Cylinder Beach (NZ)** (Showcasing) and **I'm Belucci** (Captain Sonador) at Doomben

Forster couldn't have been happier with the pair as they front up for the Group Three Rough Habit Plate on Saturday.

Sydney's three top stables have five runners between them in the Rough Habit with Chris Waller leading the way with three runners.

"They are among the best trainers in the world so you wouldn't be bagging any of their runners," Forster said.

"But my two have Group One form around them and that means the visitors will have to be right on their game."

Cylinder Beach was a close-up fourth to Press Statement (Hinchinbrook) in the Group One JJ Atkins Stakes last winter and he won his last start in the Gr.3 Gunsynd Classic

"Cylinder Beach is blooming," Forster said.

Brisbane may take precedence

In-form colt **Rageese** (Street Cry) may stay at home this weekend with a trip to Queensland in mind.

Raced by Windsor Park Stud with Sheikh Mohammed bin Khalifa Al Maktoum, Rageese is among the acceptances for Saturday's Listed Adelaide Guineas, but he could be kept on ice by trainer Darren Weir.

The Victorian trainer has the \$A1.5 million Gr.1 Stradbroke Handicap at Eagle Farm on June 11 as a target and victory in Saturday week's Gr.3 Fred Best Classic at Doomben would clinch a spot in Queensland's most famous race as the winner is exempt from ballot.

Rageese is unbeaten in two starts since joining Weir's stable, including a victory in

the Listed Nitschke Stakes at Morphettville last time out.

Hazzabeel raring to go

Trainer Dan Morton decided not to trial **Hazzabeel (NZ)** (Zabeel) on Monday and will go into the Gr.3 Roma Cup (1200m) at Belmont in Perth off a 950m trial at Lark Hill last week.

Hazzabeel showed good speed from the gates to lead around the bend and fought out the placings to finish third in his trial behind King River.

The son of Zabeel did not wear his usual race-day blinkers.

Paul Harvey, who resumes riding Hazzabeel in the Roma Cup, has an outstanding strike rate on the five-year-old, with four wins and two fifths from six rides.

"He needed the trial, but over 1200m with the blinkers on this Saturday, I am looking forward to going to the track with him," Morton said.

Hazzabeel is raced by Mt Hallowell Stud and has won six of 12 lifetime starts. Purchased as a yearling at the 2012 NZB Premier Sale, Hazzabeel will be first-up since finishing down the track in the Gr.1 Kingston Town Stakes which was run on a heavy surface.

Fascination Street adds intrigue to Rotorua feature

A **Fascination Street (NZ)** (Elusive City) win in Saturday's Listed Cuisine Classic Rotorua Stakes (1400m) would cap an already memorable week for syndicator Adrian Clark.

Clark, from Hamilton, wears several hats in the thoroughbred industry, among them managing the bloodstock interests of Nearco Stud's Greg Tomlinson and was delighted to sell every horse offered on his behalf at this week's National Weanling,

The banner result was the \$170,000 price tag on a Tavistock-Sentura colt sold through Curraghmore.

"It's been a great week. Our returns for Nearco have been well beyond expectations in keeping with the buoyancy of the whole sale. We sold every horse that we put through and that was very satisfying," Clark said.

Clark's attention now turns to the racetrack and he'd love to see Challenge No.1 Syndicate-owned mare Fascination Street seal successive wins in the weight-for-age fillies and mares feature. [Full story here.](#)

Hannam looking for substantial Cup return

Natural lightweight jockey Robbie Hannam can see the irony in him riding the topweight for Saturday's Gr.3 Campbell Infrastructure Rotorua Cup that has condensed weights much to the exasperation of several rival camps.

Hannam rides last-start Gr.3 Canterbury Gold Cup (2000m) winner **Authentic Paddy (NZ)** in the Arawa Park 2200m feature, the Lisa Latta-trained Howbaddouwantit six-year-old gelding allotted the 60.5kg topweight.

All but Bay Of Plenty Cup winner Storming The Tower (NZ) (Storm Creek) (54kg) and Listed Jakkalberry Classic winner Celebrity Miss (NZ) (Civics) (53.5kg) will carry the 53kg minimum, with jockeys Matthew Cameron, Craig Grylls and Mark Hills among those booked for rides at that weight.

"It's ironic, just one of those things," Hannam said.

"I can ride 53kg no problem and it's unfortunate for the heavier jockeys the way the weights have fallen. But I was always going to ride Authentic Paddy. He's a real favourite of mine and I'm looking forward to riding him again." [Full story here.](#)

Tavi Bay on trial for Qld Oaks

Henry Dwyer will use a familiar race to test the Queensland Oaks credentials of **Tavi Bay (NZ)** (Tavistock).

Dwyer has Tavi Bay in Saturday's The Jericho Cup in 2018 Handicap at Caulfield.

"It's the same race we won with Sonntag two years ago and he went into it off the back of a defeat in the country," Dwyer said.

"It was a similar purpose for him and he obviously measured up by winning that race, and then winning the Queensland Derby.

"You don't need to be a star to run well in a Queensland Oaks or Queensland Derby.

"So if she can run top three or four on Saturday and run like she's looking for a bit further, then it's probably worth going to Queensland with her."

Tavi Bay, by Tavistock who has sired the winner of the Victoria Derby, the ATC Australian Derby and the Hong Kong Derby this season, has won one of her five starts.

Dwyer says the cantankerous filly needs to step up from her recent third at Ballarat over 1600m.

He has applied blinkers.

"She has drawn wide but we would have gone back on her anyway," Dwyer said.

"I thought she was pretty plain last start when we went forward on her. But I think with blinkers on and ridden back, I think she's a better horse chasing."

Tavi Bay is a graduate of the NZB South Island sale where she was consigned by Fairdale Stud and she is raced by Brendan Tohill's Shergar Thoroughbreds.

Ipswich goal for smart filly

Provocative (NZ) (Zabeel) will head to Australia on Sunday and is likely to step out

in a three-year-old event at Ipswich three day later.

Trainer Tony Pike is hoping the Zabeel filly can snare the thick end of the \$A20,000 purse and boost her earnings to book a spot in the Gr.1 Queensland Oaks at Eagle Farm on June 4.

Provocative, whose Gr.1 New Zealand Derby-winning stablemate Rangipo (Stryker) will line up in the Gr.3 Fred Best Classic at Doomben on May 21, has two wins and two placings from her five starts.

Mitchell plotting late Queensland campaign

Tarissa Mitchell is keen to travel further afield with her Civics double act.

The experienced Cambridge horsewoman is getting the best out of two of the stallion's sons with **Call Me Royal (NZ)** and **Irish Call (NZ)** continuing to star for the training newcomer.

Mitchell enjoyed a successful southern venture with the stablemates after Call Me Royal won at Riccarton and backed up a week later to finish a close second in Saturday's Great Autumn Handicap after Irish Call had claimed the opening event on the card.

"They will be having a week in the paddock and they'll tell me when they're ready to go again," Mitchell said.

"I am looking at Queensland, but I'll be waiting until the carnival is finished and everybody else has gone home." [Full story here.](#)

Weir takes cautious route with Makfi's Raw Impulse

Darren Weir is doing his best to keep a lid on emerging talent **Raw Impulse** (Makfi).

The exciting import lines up in the Racing Photos Handicap at Caulfield on Saturday and is the \$1.40 favourite to keep his Australian winning run intact.

Raw Impulse scored at his Australian debut at Moonee Valley in March before backing up with a strong victory over 1800m at Caulfield on April 23.

Hugh Bowman rode the Australian Bloodstock-owned galloper to his Moonee Valley victory and predicted a bright future for the four-year-old while Brad Rawiller echoed those sentiments after his last-start win.

"We all had a talk after his last win and we came up with the common-sense route so

we'll just put him through his classes at this stage.

"It's more about looking towards the spring with him, if he's good enough."

Derby hero awaits Victoria-bound trainers

Trent Busuttin and Natalie Young have yet to confirm their departure date to Australia, but they will enjoy a Group One welcome shortly after they arrive.

The Cambridge couple will begin the 2016-17 season from their new base at Cranbourne and with a prime Melbourne spring carnival contender in residence.

Their Australian Derby winner **Tavago (NZ)** (Tavistock) remained across the Tasman to spell after his stunning win at Randwick last month and will be pre-trained before they take over.

"He's still out spelling and then he will be going to Leon and Troy Corstens' beach facility on the Mornington Peninsula for a month to six weeks work," Busuttin said.

"All going well we will be going over sometime in mid to late July and he'll join us when we get there.

"We've mapped out a programme back from the Caulfield Cup with the Turnbull Stakes and the Makybe Diva Stakes, but that can all be subject to change." [Full story here.](#)

Chance for mare to put things right

El Pistolita's (NZ) (El Hermano) poor performance at Te Rapa last time out still has Nathan Hanley searching for answers.

The capable mare beat only one runner home in the Gr.2 Travis Stakes and nothing has subsequently been found to be amiss with the five-year-old.

"We were pretty hopeful, but she went very ordinary and we can't explain it," said Hanley, who trains El Pistolita with his partner Kylie Whiting.

El Pistolita will be given an opportunity to turn her fortunes around when she runs in Saturday's Gr.3 Campbell Infrastructure Rotorua Cup.

"We've been thinking she deserves a break so she'll probably go out after this one," Hanley said.

Hanley has confidence in the El Hermano mare's two mile ability and is looking forward to her proving that next season.

"She can have six to eight weeks out after Saturday and then we'll have her back for the spring racing and the cups," he said.

Resilient Illuminati to relish quick back-up

Ben Foote is banking on a midweek trial paving the way for a first black type success for his tough mare **Illuminati (NZ)** (Keeper).

The Cambridge trainer produced the six-year-old to run second over a 1000 metres on her home track on Tuesday ahead of the Listed Classic Cuisine Rotorua Stakes on Saturday.

"Sam (Spratt) said she felt a million dollars at the trials and she'll improve with that run," Foote said.

"We just want to get some more black type with her and she's a really tough mare and if things go her way she can hopefully pull one off."

It will be Illuminati's first race day appearance for part-owner Foote since she re-joined his yard after a southern campaign with Terri Rae.

"She picked up a couple of Group placings so that was good," said Foote, who is considering sending the Keeper mare to Riccarton again.

"We could possibly send her to Terri to look at the Winter Cup, she was second in it last year so that could be a good race for her again, depending on her rating."

Carnival plans for Spoke To Carlo

Nigel Tiley won't be over-taxing his proven wet track performer **Spoke To Carlo** (Halling) this winter.

The Pukekohe trainer will be racing the European-bred gelding sparingly with the Hastings carnival later in the year in mind.

"We might look at the Winter Cup with him, but the way the seasons are going there may well be a wet spring," Tiley said.

"With a very late autumn, the winter could carry on through September and even October so we're thinking Hawke's Bay is a good option."

In the meantime, Tiley will pick and choose his targets and Spoke To Carlo is likely to make his next appearance in either the Listed James Bull Rangitikei Gold Cup at Awapuni on May 21 or in an open mile at Ellerslie a week later. [Full story here.](#)
