

VOLKSTOK'N'BARRELL PRIMED FOR DOOMBEN CUP



Volkstok'n'barrell will look to end a long run of "outs" for kiwi trained runners in tomorrow's Gr. 1 Doomben Cup

alented galloper Volkstok'n'barrell (NZ) (Tavistock) is ready to break a long drought for New Zealand in the Group One Doomben Cup.

Volkstok'n'barrell was having his first start since being well beaten in the Doncaster Mile when he came from near the tail of the field to finish third in the Group Two Hollindale Cup two weeks ago.

New Zealand-trained horses have won the Doomben Cup five times since it became a weight-for-age race in 1990, starting with Rough Habit's (NZ) (Roughcast) threepeat from 1991 to 1993.

But the last New Zealand-trained galloper to win the Cup was King Keitel (NZ) (Keitel) in 2001.

"We are overdue," trainer Donna Logan said.

The Ruakaka-based Logan was in Brisbane this week to supervise Volkstok'n'barrell and liked what she saw at trackwork ahead of Saturday's race.

"He really needed the hit out in the Hollindale as he got well back and had to make a long sweeping run," Logan said.

"The month between runs told at the end but I was very happy with the effort. In fact I was stoked."

Volkstok'n'barrell has bloomed since the Hollindale and Logan will be disappointed if her stable star doesn't race well.

"He is spot on. He has really tightened up and the track should suit him," Logan said.

Volkstok'n'barrell drew ideally in barrier five and Logan hopes he will be closer to the speed than he was in the Hollindale Cup. Logan and her training partner Chris Gibbs also have Melbourne spring Cups in mind for Volkstok'n'barrell who is by boom staying sire Tavistock.

The 2015 Rosehill Guineas winner, Volkstok'n'barrell hasn't won past 2000m but was placed in the 2015 ATC Australian Derby and New Zealand Derby at 2400m.

In-form New Zealand bred gallopers **Leebaz (NZ)** (Zabeel) and **Lady Le Fay (NZ)** (Thorn Park) also have strong hands in the competitive field of ten.

BULLISH MOORE HAS WERTHER ON TOP

erther (NZ) (Tavistock) is hunting another Group One success and trainer John Moore is confident Hong Kong's latest star has what it takes to snare the spoils in Sunday's HK\$10 million Standard Chartered Champions & Chater Cup (2400m), the season's final major and the third leg of the Hong Kong Triple Crown.

The four-year-old is on a hat-trick after exciting wins in the Gr.1 BMW Hong Kong Derby (2000m) and last month's Gr.1 Audemars Piguet QEII Cup (2000m).

On Sunday, Werther steps up to the mile and half realm for the first time since racing to a smart second in the Gr.1 South Australian Derby (2500m) a little more than a year ago. Moore believes the extended distance will favour the Tavistock gelding.

"I think the further he goes the better he goes because the way he relaxed with Hugh (Bowman) in the QEII the other day gave a good indication that he could go further than 2400 metres," Moore said.

Werther earned an international rating of 124 for his QEII Cup victory, in which he slammed the likes of Japan's 10-furlong champion Lovely

Day (King Kamehameha) as well as the re-opposing local big guns, the Caspar Fownes-trained Military Attack (Oratorio), the Tony Cruz-trained Blazing Speed (Dylan Thomas) and his own stablemate Designs On Rome (Holy Roman Emperor). Moore is pleased with Werther's form and wellbeing since then.

"Werther hasn't put a step wrong since his QEII win," he said. "His regular

trackwork rider reported that he's still in top form and the surface doesn't matter - he goes on whatever. He's versatile and he'd be the pick of my runners."

Werther heads an eight-strong field, which also features Hong Kong Derby runner-up Victory Magic (NZ) (Savabeel) and impressive Gr.3 Queen Mother Memorial Cup winner Ambitious Champion (NZ) (Zed).

Waller taking a punt

Champion trainer Chris Waller is taking a Group One gamble with the New Zealandbred and owned mare **Lady Le Fay (NZ)** (Thorn Park) in Saturday's Doomben Cup.

"She's going to stud this year, so we are just having a throw at the stumps so to speak," he said. "She's got plenty of blacktype next to her name. She's in good form, admittedly in easier races.

"She gets her last chance to perform in a Group One. She was placed fourth in a Group One during the Championships, so she deserves to be there, but she would be better suited if there is any rain around."



Rangipo (Stryker)

Derby winner in QLD debut

New Zealand Derby winner **Rangipo** (Stryker) makes his Australian debut at Doomben on Saturday in the Gr.3 Fred Best Classic (1350m).

"He should be OK fresh at 1350m in the Fred Best but he will be a lot better once he hits the Queensland Guineas at a mile," trainer Tony Pike said.

Despite winning a Derby, Pike believes Rangipo will be better suited over shorter distances and views the Gr.1 Emirates Stakes in the spring as an ideal long-term target.

"We'll just take him quietly through the Brisbane Carnival here and if he races well up here, then we'll probably give him a short break in Queensland and do a bit of work up here and get down to Melbourne for the spring."

Prince Of Penzance (NZ) (Pentire) is sure to create plenty of interest on one of South Australian racing's biggest days.

Saturday's meeting at Morphettville features the Gr.1 Goodwood (1200m), but the Cup winner will be stepping out in the Gr.3 R A Lee Stakes (1600m).

He will again join forces with his Cupwinning jockey Michelle Payne when he has his first start since the Flemington showpiece in November.

Prince Of Penzance headlines the 17 nominations for Saturday's set weights plus penalties race.



Vilanova (NZ) (Commands)

Beach helps Vilanova thrive for 3200m test

Simon Ryan's search for a hurdler could turn into a profitable exercise well before **Vilanova (NZ)** (Commands), who raced as Catalonia in New Zealand, is given his chance over jumps.

Ryan bought Vilanova at a tried-horses' sale for \$78,000 and the Warrnambool trainer came away with a stayer that almost landed his hometown Cup earlier this month.

With a jumps career now on hold Vilanova will run over the Melbourne Cup course and distance in the Listed Andrew Ramsden Stakes at Flemington on Saturday.

"If he's competitive at Saturday's level we might give the jumping a miss this season and keep him for races in Melbourne during the off-season.

Stable doubles its cup hand

Fraser Auret will present a mix of the proven and the promising in a two-handed bid for stakes honours at Awapuni.

The Marton trainer will attack Saturday's Listed James Bull Rangitikei Gold Cup with the accomplished black type performer **Thorn Prince (NZ)** (Thorn Park) and the up and coming **Aide Memoire (NZ)** (Remind).

"Thorn Prince had trialled well before his first-up run, but the firm track wasn't ideal for him," Auret said.

The Listed Taumarunui Gold Cup winner and multiple stakes placegetter was unplaced when resuming at Awapuni last month, although he was only four and a half lengths from the winner Gustavo (NZ) (Savabeel).

"I thought his run was better than it may have looked and he has done very well since – he won't be getting a firm track this time either," Auret said. <u>Full story here.</u>

The Cambridge trainer hasn't been surprised by the filly's perfect three from three record and he fully expects her to continue her impressive progress next season.

"She'll be even better with a bit more time and as a four-year-old we see her as a stakes-winning mare," said Baker, who prepares the daughter of Rip Van Winkle with Andrew Forsman.

A half-sister to Baker's ill-fated dual Group One winner Lion Tamer (NZ) (Storming Home), Let Me Roar was given a break after a successful debut at Rotorua last December and she has returned to win consecutive races at Pukekohe Park. **Full story here.**

Kiwi fillies stake Oaks claims

New Zealand's chances of classic success at the Queensland winter carnival have received a double boost.

The Cambridge pair of **Romantic Maid** (High Chaparral) and **Provocative (NZ)** (Zabeel) were successful at Randwick and Ipswich respectively on Wednesday to confirm the crossing of their paths in the Gr.1 Queensland Oaks at Eagle Farm on June 4.

Roger James was delighted to see his High Chaparral filly Romantic Maid deliver in a three-year-old event over 2000 metres.

"That will seal a trip to the Queensland Oaks and on that run she deserves that opportunity," James said." **Full story here.**

Harvard wins Hall over

Nick Hall is a fan of the New Zealand-bred three-year-old **Harvard (NZ)** (Shocking), who holds a nomination for next month's Gr.1 Queensland Derby.

The Melbourne-based jockey rode the son of Shocking to a six length maiden victory on the synthetic track at Geelong on Tuesday for trainer Ciaron Maher.

"He's a really nice staying horse and a big improver too, so you'll see him in some nice races in the future," Hall said.

"We really think he's a horse that's going to get beyond 2000m."

Bloodstock agent Phill Cataldo identified Harvard after he won a trial at Te Teko for Margaret Falconer.

Spindle bounces back

Talented two-year-old **Spindle (NZ)** (Pins) bounced back from a head-scratching performance last start to record an easy victory in the Tavistock Syndicate Owners 2YO at Ruakaka on Wednesday.

Raced by the Auckland Racing Club Winners Circle Syndicate No.1 and breeders Waikato Stud, Spindle finished last behind Ugo Foscolo (NZ) (Zacinto) in the Listed Hamilton Vets Equine Stakes at Te Rapa a fortnight ago.

"We still can't explain what happened that day," said Stephen McKee, who trains in partnership with Eddie Chippendale. "She was very disappointing and never raised a gallop and unfortunately it was in a stakes race.

"We put blinkers on her during the week and gave her a bit of a sharpen up and she's come back to form.

"She's a fit horse and before that race at Te Rapa her form was good."

"She didn't look like a horse that is ready for a spell just yet, so I will have a talk to the Waikato Stud team and Brent Cooper and see what they want to do." McKee said.

Mongolian Prince strikes in US

New Zealand bred galloper **Mongolian Prince (NZ)** (St Reims) provided a watershed moment for the developing Chinese Racing Industry when successful in a \$75,000 maiden race at Belmont on Sunday. Mongolian Prince, exported from New

Zealand as an unraced juvenile, had proven to be one of the better quality three-yearolds in China, where much of the form is not ratified by International Racing Authorities.

Recent quarantine changes have enabled horses raced in China to exit the country via the United States.

Mongolian Prince is raced by the Inner Mongolia Rider Horse Industry, who have enjoyed outstanding success in Australasia with the multiple Group One winner **Mongolian Khan** (Holy Roman Emperor) their flagship performer.

"The victory of Mongolian Prince will encourage a lot of racehorse owners in China to spend more on high-quality horses from overseas and ship them back to China," Mr Lang Ling of the Rider Horse Group said.

"Especially now that, if they are good enough, they can send them to the US to race or even further abroad once they have quarantined in the US."



Sakhee's Soldier (NZ) (Sakhee's Secret)

Cloud hanging over top galloper

The racing future of **Sakhee's Soldier** (**NZ**) (Sakhee's Secret) is in the balance following a rare injury suffered in his Australian debut.

The Murray Baker and Andrew Forsmantrained Gr.1 New Zealand Stakes winner pulled up sore after he had finished out of the money in the Gr.2 A.D. Hollindale Stakes at the Gold Coast.

"It looks like he's got a tear in the suspensory ligament of a hind leg, which is

very unusual," part-owner Alasdair Chisholm said.

"Murray has been training for 40 years and he said he's never had that happen before – obviously it's not uncommon in a front leg, but it's quite rare in a back leg.

"The vet who has been seeing him is overseas and he's back this week so we're waiting for him to assess things but whatever happens it will be a long period of rehabilitation, at least nine months.

"He'll be staying over in Queensland and even if he doesn't race again we have been very lucky to have had a Group One winner, he's done us all so proud."

Rayner eyes Mor success at Te Rapa Evan Rayner has collected his share of Waikato Hurdles trophies over the years, but has yet to snare one for the Waikato Steeplechase.

At Te Rapa on Saturday, the Wanganui trainer will attempt to set that record straight.

Rayner's previous Waikato Hurdles wins were with Star Count (NZ) (Star Wolf) in 1990 and 1991 and Van Winkle (NZ) (Yachtie) in 2007.

These days training in partnership with his daughter JJ, Rayner will saddle **Mr Mor** (NZ) (Corrupt) in Saturday's Warren Storm Lifebrokers Waikato Steeplechase (4000m), with regular jockey Charlie Studd booked to ride.

"It would be a nice one to win, but he's still on the way up," Rayner said. <u>Full story here.</u>

Offshore interests secure Group One mares

Group One winner **Platinum Witness** (California Dane) has been sold as a broodmare prospect.

"She's been bought by Japanese interests and she's gone to Arrowfield Stud in Australia," said Neville McAlister, who raced the daughter of California Dane with Lincoln Farms.

Platinum Witness won five of her 22 starts, including the Gr.1 New Zealand 1000 Guineas and she also placed at the elite

Gr.1 Diamond Stakes placegetter **Platinum Balos** (Bernardini) has been sold to Australian interests after injury prevented her from rediscovering her best form.

"She had two knee chips removed after the Sires' Produce and while she came back and won a couple of races she was never the same horse," McAlister said. "She's gone to Bell View Park in New South Wales."

Stakes Mission for 2YO

The Castletown Stakes at Wanganui on June 4 is on the radar for **Gingernuts (NZ)** (Iffraaj).

The Listed event became a goal for the two-year-old when he went one better at Hastings on Thursday following a debut second.

"He's as green as grass and there's a lot of improvement to come," co-trainer Jamie Richards said. "He's a nice horse on the way up."

Spell for Honey

Highly-regarded filly **Honey Rider (NZ)** (Pins) is likely to head to the paddock following her Hastings success on Thurday.

The Murray Baker and Andrew Forsmantrained Pins filly capitalised on a dream passage for a first-up victory on Thursday under rider Michael Coleman.

"She got all favours with a gun ride from Michael and there's a lot of upside to her," Forsman said.

"She's probably done enough now and we're looking forward to the spring with her. She's still very green and is a big strong, staying type of horse.

Top 3YO heading to Hong Kong

One of the country's leading three-yearolds has made his final appearance in New Zealand.

The Tony Pike-trained Raghu (NZ) (Showcasing) is currently enjoying a break before he furthers his career overseas, as was always the intention.

"He's owned in Hong Kong so he won't race here again before he heads up there," the Cambridge horseman said.
