ictorian based jockey Damian Lane is still a little confused on just how he managed to secure the ride on Saturday's courageous Australian Derby winner Jon Snow (NZ) (Iffraaj), who has now provided him with a Sydney stakes race double.

Lane made his first ride on the kiwi visitor a winning one

when he took out the Gr. 2 Tulloch Stakes a week ago before producing another gem of an effort to land the \$2m Gr. 1 Australian Derby in a slogging finish on Saturday.

"A few people have asked me how I got the ride and to be honest I don't really have a proper answer," he admitted.

"I was lucky enough to pick up the ride last week which

was just a right place right time thing and then lucky enough to stick with him.

"He's done a great job as have Andrew (Forsman) and Murray (Baker) to get him through the week in tip top shape."

Lane was full of praise for his mount who provided co-trainer Murray Baker with his fourth Australian Derby win in the last 10 years following on from Nom Du Jeu (NZ) (Montjeu) in 2008, It's A Dundeel (NZ) (High Chaparral) in 2013 and Mongolian Khan (Holy Roman Emperor) in 2015.

"His biggest asset is his ability to find a good rhythm and

then switch off in the running," he said.

"As soon as I got outside the leader I was able to put him to sleep. He just conserves as much energy as possible before you ask him for an effort where he comes up under you immediately."

The win also provided Lane with a second Group One victory in the last month on a New Zealand bred runner after he combined with Humidor (NZ) (Teofilo) to win the Australian Cup at Flemington on 11 March.

'Dor closed on Queen Elizabeth start

There will be a race within a race in the banner event at The Championships, next Saturday's Queen Elizabeth Stakes, but **Humidor (NZ)** (Teofilo) will not be at Randwick for it.

The former Kiwi gelding's trainer Darren Weir confirmed the Australian Cup winner and The BMW runner-up was already in the spelling paddock and would not be a part of the \$4 million event.

Most have conceded the 2000-metre Group 1 to Winx (Street Cry), but there is a \$780,000 second placegetter's purse up for grabs and while Weir conceded that was attractive, he ruled out bringing Humidor back into work.

"It's a lot of money, isn't it?" he said. "But he's in the paddock.

"He's done his job, he got the job done in the Australian Cup, and that was good enough for us.

"He's a good horse for the spring, so we're going to look after him."

HARLOW GOLD TO HAVE NEW RIDER FOR OAKS

arlow Gold (NZ) (Tavistock) will have a jockey other than Regan Bayliss for the first time when she bids to go one better in the ATC Australian Oaks than the Victorian equivalent.

Bayliss has ridden Harlow Gold in her 10 starts, including her second in last spring's VRC Oaks at Flemington, but was suspended for careless riding in an eventful finish to the Group One Vinery Stud Stakes in which Harlow Gold finished third.

Mark Zahra takes over on Harlow Gold in Saturday's Oaks (2400m) at Randwick and the filly shares the second line of betting with Vinery runner-up Nurse Kitchen (NZ) (Savabeel) at \$6.

Vinery winner Montoya's Secret (High Chaparral) has been treated after injuring a leg and is likely to be redirected to the Adelaide carnival in May.

New Zealand Oaks winner Bonneval (NZ) (Makfi) is the \$4.60 favourite to give Murray Baker and Andrew Forsman a second Classic in Sydney following Jon Snow's (NZ) (Iffraaj) Australian Derby win on Saturday.

Harlow Gold has also finished

third in The Vanity and fourth in the Australian Guineas on her way to the Oaks.

"I think she's right on track," cotrainer Tom Dabernig said.

"She handled the wet the other day and we know she runs the trip so you've got to think she's got a chance.

"We tried to set her for the Oaks. She was terrific in the VRC Oaks, it was just that tearaway leader (Lasqueti Spirit) who she couldn't peg back.

"I'd say, without seeing the final field, she would have to be one of the top three or four chances."

Harlow Gold will gallop on the

Randwick course proper on Tuesday and Dabernig said the filly had come through the Vinery well.

"I think she's improved," he said.

FULLY FUNDED RETURNS WITH A VENGEANCE

uality sprinter **Fully Funded (NZ)** (Fully Fledged) provided a minor upset on Saturday when he claimed the feature sprint at Ellerslie.

The gritty five-year-old hadn't been seen in the winner's enclosure for over 12 months and was returning to the track from a mid-summer break after jarring up badly when unplaced at the venue in early January.

Trainer Joanne Surgenor was hopeful of a better performance from her charge after enjoying some respite from the tough summer surfaces during his time away from the track.

"He is such an honest customer that his form over the summer was something I just couldn't work out," she explained.

"After he ran at Ellerslie in January we tipped him out as he jarred up very badly. I think that the hard tracks were what was holding him back despite him having good form on them earlier in his career.

"The wear and tear may have just been telling on him so we gave him a break and brought him back for the autumn

when there is a bit more give in the surfaces.

"We weren't sure how he would cope on Saturday as that is probably the wettest track he has raced on but as it turned out he just thrived."

Rated only an outside chance in a small but quality field for the 1200 metre open handicap, Fully Funded defied his odds to race clear in the closing stages of the event and score by an impressive two and a half lengths from pacemaker Passing Shot (NZ) (Swiss Ace) with Seventh

Up (NZ) (Shinko King) finishing well to nab third.

"That was great to see as he always gives you his best when he races so it was nice for him to grab another win," noted Surgenor.

"He was beaten a nose in the same race last year so I guess he got a measure of revenge as well. Everyone is just delighted and there are plenty of smiles around the place right now."

Surgenor hasn't confirmed the next assignment for her charge although she is considering an open 1200 metre event at Te Rapa on 29 April as a possible target.

to their partnership when promising mare **Pure Lorde (NZ)** (Darci Brahma) provided them with a winning start at Awapuni on the weekend.

In a hit and run raid on the premier meeting Parker was on hand to accept congratulations for the victory with Richardson content to watch on from his home base at Matamata.

"I did ask Gavin to head down there with the mare as I thought she would be a good chance and there is no better feeling than training your first winner," explained Richardson.

"Parksey is a great guy and is going to be a real asset for the stable. To get that first win on the board certainly takes the pressure off and hopefully it's the sign of good things to come.

"I've always thought that he would be the ideal person to bring into a partnership and when the opportunity presented itself I was delighted that we could get things up and running."

Although confident of a good run from Pure Lorde Richardson did concede the tricky track conditions on the day had caused him some concern before the race.

"She hadn't run for just on a month and had only had a very soft trial going into the race," he said.

"I did wonder if that might see her find it too tough in the closing stages but she was very brave and did a great job in a tight finish.

"She has a stack of ability but has taken time to strengthen up. Now that

> she is starting to get the hang of things she might be suited to something a little more ambitious while the tracks stay reasonably good."

With that in mind Richardson indicated a tilt at the Listed Hawke's Bay Gold Cup later this month was one option being considered for the mare provided she gained enough rating points from her latest victory.

SULTAN OF SWING READY FOR EASTER STAKES CHALLENGE

rogressive Cambridge galloper **Sultan Of Swing (NZ)** (Bachelor Duke) showed he
was ready to tackle his biggest challenge
to date when he continued on his winning way
at Ellerslie on Saturday.

The Bachelor Duke gelding made it four wins from just eight starts at northern racing headquarters as he dominated proceedings in the final stages to claim the Celebrating Chenille 1500. Expertly handled by apprentice Sam Weatherley, the four-year-old used good early speed to sit outside leader Prince Mambo (NZ) (Thewayyouare) before issuing a serious challenge as the pair entered the home straight.

Sultan Of Swing quickly assumed control and although hotly challenged in the last few bounds by race favourite Go Nicholas (NZ) (Danroad), he held his rival at bay to score in a handy 1.30.80 for the 1500 metre journey on the Dead 6 rated surface.

"He got the run of the race and with the apprentice claim it meant he was always going to be hard to catch," noted trainer Shaune Ritchie.

"He won in a similar fashion last time when he made all the pace so we decided that similar tactics could do the job and so it proved.

"He loves it at Ellerslie and when you can run the times like that from in front it does make you awfully tough to bowl."

Ritchie confirmed the Gr. 2 Manco Easter Stakes would be the next assignment for his charge although he did feel the horse was poorly placed due to the set weights and penalties conditions of the event.

"The Easter is the logical race for him but when he has to carry the same weight as a horse like Natuzzi, who has won nearly three times as many races, it does seem a little crazy," he said.

"It used to be a real art to getting a horse like our guy into those big handicaps on a light weight but the change to so many of our best races to these types of conditions has all but

negated that skill now."

Ritchie's attention will now turn to Sydney next weekend as his Australian Oaks candidate Devise (NZ) (Darci Brahma) gets set to make her way across the Tasman on Monday.

"Devise will fly over on Monday and we are hopeful of a top performance in the Oaks," he said.

"The New Zealand three-year-olds seem to have the measure of the Aussies in recent years and our biggest threat looks like being another kiwi in Bonneval. She got the better of us in the New Zealand Oaks so we would like to turn the tables on her this time."

The \$1m Gr. 1 Australian Oaks is one of the feature events on the second day of The Championships which will be held at Royal Randwick on Saturday. – NZ Racing Desk

BRONSTEEL CAPS TOP DAY FOR GRAY AND ANDREW

wapuni trainer Kevin Gray and his apprentice Holly Andrew enjoyed a cracking day out at their home base on Saturday when they combined to produce a premier day double.

Consistent performer **Undercover** (NZ) (Alamosa) got them off on the right foot when he out-toughed race favourite Akoya (NZ) (Bullbars) in the third race on the day's programme before Andrew produced a heady display on Bronsteel (NZ) (Handsome Ransom) to complete the winning brace just two races later.

Stepping up to rating 85 company after a convincing win at Trentham last month, Bronsteel indicated she was a mare going places as she dominated in the closing stages of a spirited contest over the 1550 metre journey.

Andrew made good use of the

mare's good barrier and light weight to settle handy to the pace before surging to the front approaching the home bend. Bronsteel responded well to her rider's urgings as she established a three length break early in the run and never looked like being caught despite a late burst from the well favoured Shadows Cast (NZ) (Per Incanto).

Gray was full of praise for the effort when questioned after the race.

"That's very satisfying here on my home track," he said.

"She's not a bad little mare this as she's come really solid of late. I've been waiting for her to show she needs a break but the racing hasn't hurt her.

"Maybe she's a little bit tough like me!"

Gray had more than one reason to celebrate the win of Undercover as

"He's been a lovely little horse who has hardly been out of the money. I wouldn't mind another one or two just like him.

"It's great to win a race on a day like this, Manawatu's biggest day."

Gray did admit he had some doubts about Undercover's chances after having not run him since late February.

"He was very fresh so I was just hoping his condition would hold out," he said.

"It looks like he might handle the wet tracks with winter coming as his mother did."

Undercover is the last foal of handy racemare Shy Belt (NZ) (Kingdom Bay) and a half-brother to prolific winner Megabelt (NZ) (O'Reilly) who was successful 11 times during his 63-start career.

CYLINDER BEACH FORM LOOKING GOOD FOR CUP



Trainer Desleigh Forster believes results from the weekend bode well for her charge Cylinder Beach as he heads towards the Toowoomba Cup

brilliant win by It's Somewhat (Dynaformer) in the Doncaster Mile has boosted Brisbane trainer Desleigh Forster's confidence about Cylinder Beach (NZ) (Showcasing) in the Toowoomba Cup.

Cylinder Beach had one run in Sydney beaten 2-1/2 lengths into seventh place behind It's Somewhat in the Group Two Ajax Stakes, and heads to Saturday's Toowoomba Cup (2000m).

"It's Somewhat has come out and won the Group One Doncaster so it isn't bad form for a Toowoomba Cup," Forster said.

"I just hope Cylinder Beach isn't given the grandstand by the handicapper."

Forster had been toying with the idea of starting Cylinder Beach in the Open Hcp (1600m) at Doomben on Saturday but decided against it.

"As it turned out he would have had to run on a wet track under a big weight," she said.

"The Brisbane Race Club offered me a chance to work him on the Doomben course proper which was much appreciated."

She sent Cylinder Beach to work with stablemate Sweet Red Wine (NZ) (Showcasing) over 1400m, with the pair quickening over the final 600m.

"Cylinder Beach was too strong for Sweet Red Wine but you would expect that. They broke 33 (seconds) for their final 600 metres so it was nice work," she said.

Forster is looking at the staying handicaps for Cylinder Beach during the winter carnival.

"I would like to get him out to the Brisbane Cup (2400m) and Saturday is a good way to start," she added.

PLACAIS GETS THE BEST OUT OF MY HORSE

rench jockey Olivier Placais was able to snap a mini run of outs when he steered **My Horse (NZ)** (Swiss Ace) to his first career win in the \$35,000 Open Maiden race over 1100m on Sunday.

Placais was one of five or six jockeys who flew off the starting blocks at the start of the new season, but while some kept up the momentum, he hit a bit of a speed bump in March, coming up with only one winner in that time,

The support has remained the same, though, but to him, it is a drop in the quality of rides that were the main cause for the recent slow-down.

But the Alwin Tan-trainer My Horse, a horse he has partnered from Day 1 at his six Kranji starts, finally brought the smiles back on Sunday.

The race itself was simple in its

execution. Jump well from the low gate (three) to take a sit behind leader Keystone (Exceed And Excel) before going for broke inside the last 300m.

It was a straightforward tactic that had been his racing pattern since his debut on 2 December only this time it bore fruit.

Placais was delighted he had finally hit a dozen wins, and more so for achieving it for an owner who has stuck solid for him.

"I'd like to thank the owner Andy Toh for putting me on this horse from the start. He never put another jockey on and I'm grateful for his support," he said.

"I've had not much luck in recent weeks, with a lot of close seconds. I haven't had a lot of good rides, but once I get on a good one, I can prove I can deliver the goods.

"I know My Horse well. I've been telling Alwin to drop the blinkers as he was racing too keen with that equipment.

"He's been racing more relaxed since, but we still had to tighten a few other screws to get him 100%. He is quite complicated but he does have ability."

With that maiden win, My Horse sees his stakes money earned leap to around the \$70,000 mark.
