ZAHRA SHAKES OFF ODEON DEFEAT

deon (NZ) (Zacinto)
was only a beaten
horse after an
unsuccessful protest on
Saturday, and co-trainer
Simon Zahra said despite the
defeat, it was all systems go
back to Morphettville for the
SA Derby in May.

Zahra was taking all the positives out of his Zacinto gelding's performance in the Listed Port Adelaide Guineas (1800m), despite the \$2.20 favourite being nosed out by the Phillip Stokes-trained Grand Chancellor (NZ) (Savabeel) - and seeing their protest fall by the wayside in the stewards' room.

It was Odeon's first defeat this prep after winning at Bendigo and Morphettville in March, and Zahra said given everything - especially the horse's immaturity - he

remains well on track for a Group 1 bid on May 13.

"He [Odeon] couldn't get out and going when he needed to. The winner [Grand Chancellor] got out and rolled and got going," reported Zahra.

"He got bumped up the straight, got taken off his line a couple of times, and they were five off the fence [before the alleged shift] and ended up on the rail.

"We were scratching our heads a little bit, but that's the verdict, you move on.



Odeon is still on track for the Gr. 1 South Australian Derby despite suffering defeat on the weekend.

"The whole idea of taking him to Adelaide was getting him out of the stable and trying to grow him up a little bit, he's still a bit immature in the head.

"He's on his way home now; we'll keep him here for a race at Caulfield in three weeks, and take him back for the Derby a fortnight after that.

"He come through the run well, he had a nice blow. He got a bit upset yesterday, but that's just his immaturity."

PERFECT RUN CONTINUES FOR LET ME ROAR



Let Me Roar makes it six from six with a dogged performance in her open class debut

he all-conquering Murray Baker & Andrew Forsman stable enjoyed a red-letter day on Saturday with a winning trans-Tasman Group One double to add to a brace of wins earlier in the day at Te Rapa.

Amongst those early Te Rapa victories was a game performance from four-year-old Rip Van Winkle mare **Let Me Roar (NZ)** who overcame her toughest test to date when she took out the Team Wealleans open 1400. It was the mare's sixth win from as many starts and will now see her step up to the elite level to tackle the Gr. 2 Manco Easter Stakes in a fortnight.

"It was a brave win as she drew the outside and was meeting a far better quality of horse than she has in the past," noted co-trainer Andrew Forsman.

"She is also a little better suited to going right-handed at this stage of her development so she did have a few factors against her. Class normally prevails though and she has a fair bit of that about her."

That class factor will be tested in the Manco Easter Stakes with Forsman keen to see her challenged at the top level.

"On what she has shown to date I think she is up to them however you never quite know until they tackle a race like the Easter." he said.

"She tends to handle most track conditions so we're not worried about that although she wouldn't start on a real bog."

While no further assignments have been planned for the mare, Forsman didn't rule out the possibility of a Brisbane winter campaign should she perform to expectations at Ellerslie.

Meanwhile the affable Cambridge horseman is still pinching himself about the results of the last seven days that saw the stable snare a Group One treble with Jon Snow (NZ) (Iffraaj) in the Australian Derby, Bonneval (NZ) (Makfi) in the Australian Oaks and Charmont (High Chaparral) in the New Zealand Thoroughbred Breeders' Stakes.

The win by Bonneval marked the first time a trainer had won both the Australian Derby and Oaks in the same year since Clarry Connors did it with Research (Imperial Prince) back in 1989.

"I guess the feeling is a little surreal at the moment as it is still taking time to sink in," he said.

"They don't just give Group One races away and for Murray to now have notched up 20 of them in Australia is a marvellous feat and one I'm proud to be a part of."

Forsman advised Bonneval would be on a plane home this

week where she would join Jon Snow in the spelling paddock.

"They will both go out for a spell now before we bring them back in June to get ready for a spring campaign," he said.

"I think one of the keys to success with both horses was the way they continued to improve and develop over the last few months. They are similar types in a lot of ways and if they can continue that progress in their next preparations then there is a lot to look forward to.

"Once they come back into work we will assess our options but you would think that the Melbourne Spring Carnival would be a logical target for them both."

EASTER STAKES NEXT CHALLENGE

FOR HIFLYER

xciting galloper Hiflyer (NZ) (Tavistock) has all but confirmed his bid for the Manco Easter Stakes at Ellerslie later this month after producing another effortless performance to score at Trentham.

The Peter Lock trained gelding followed up his eye-catching victory at Te Rapa last month with an equally impressive display as he dominated a disappointingly small field in Saturday's open 1600 metre contest.

Settled outside the pace by rider Johnathan Parkes, Hiflyer soon had his three rivals in trouble when he skipped clear early in the run home. Despite gawking around at all and sundry in the final stages the four-year-old

Tavistock gelding never looked like being caught as he registered his fifth win from 13 career starts.

"I was worried about the heavy track before the race as he's never been on ground like that before," admitted Lock.

"He's very fit though and we knew he was right up to the mark so with it only being a small field I was hoping he would cope with it. He dipped and dived a bit but seemed to get through it okay which gives me a lot of confidence to push on to Ellerslie."

Lock indicated a start in the Gr. 2 Manco Easter Stakes was now likely given Hiflyer had shown he could cope with heavy going.

"We will be having a meeting later in the week to make a final decision on the Easter but after this win it would seem a logical choice to line him up," he said.

"You just don't know what type of track you will strike but he's right at his peak and I don't think that run will have taken much out of him as they basically cantered around and then sprinted home.

"He travelled back to home base overnight and is in his paddock now looking bright and happy.

"Johnathan said he was all class and that gives you plenty of confidence.

"I've spent all my life trying to get horses to win a race and then a bloke like this comes along. It's quite scary but very exciting at the same time."

OUR ABBADEAN READY FOR TRAVIS TEST

romising mare **Our Abbadean (NZ)** (Lookin At Lucky) showed she was on target to tackle Group Two company at Te Rapa later this month when she gave her rivals weight and a beating over 2200 metres at the venue on the weekend.

Fourth at her most recent start in the Gr. 3 Cuddle Stakes at Trentham, Our Abbadean carried the equal top-weight of 59kgs as the highest rated runner in the nine-horse field on Saturday. Despite the hefty impost, the four-year-old mare and rider Opie Bosson showed their rivals a clean pair of heels as she dashed away in the home straight to record a comfortable 2 ¼ length victory.

"She's gone some really nice races, sometimes not had any luck, and it was the first time she's had a good draw," said Stephen Autridge, who trains the mare with Jamie Richards.

"She got a beautiful run and Opie said he couldn't believe how well she was going and that it was a very, very good win."

Autridge said that providing Our Abbadean came through the race accordingly, she could run in the \$100,000 Gr. 2 Travis Stakes on 29 April at Te Rapa.

"She loves Te Rapa, 2000 metres, shown she can carry a bit

of weight which she would have to do because it's weight-for-age for fillies and mares and of course the owners would love to get black type with her," he said.

Bred and raced by the Hawkins family the mare has now won four times and finished fourth or better in 11 of her 16 starts.

"It's great to be supported by breeders in the industry and the Hawkins family look to have a staying mare with a lot of promise on their hands,"

said Te Akau Racing principal David Ellis.

"They are terrific supporters of the racing industry and it's always a thrill to win races for them. They've had horses in our stable for a long time and they're a great family to train for.

"They have allowed Steve and Jamie to give her plenty of time to reach maturity and after finishing fourth in both the Douro Cup and Cuddle Stakes she certainly appears capable of black type, which is so important to breeders."

Ellis outlaid \$46,000 during the Select session of the NZB Yearling Sale Series earlier this year for Our Abbadean's half-sister, by Bullbars, that was offered through the Wentwood Grange draft.

BOSSON BRINGS UP WINNING TREBLE ON LEWIS CAROLL

opular Cambridge horsewoman Ngaire Fraser made a surprise confession after watching her promising galloper **Lewis Caroll (NZ)** (Darci Brahma) score in fine style at Te Rapa on Saturday.

Fraser had just produced the stylish Darci Brahma gelding for his fifth win from just eight starts, courtesy of a picture-perfect ride by Opie Bosson. It was Bosson's first ride on the four-year-old with Fraser admitting she had never met New Zealand's leading jockey before legging him aboard her charge.

"It was the first time I had met him and everyone told me you don't tell him what to do," she laughed.

"It was a great ride as I was a bit

frightened he might get trapped when he drew number one. He pulled him off the rails so we didn't get in that position so it was perfect."

Bosson made good use of the inside draw as he bounced Lewis Caroll to an early lead before handing up to former Hong Kong galloper Dancing Flames (Equiano). Taken off the fence to sit a length off the pacemaker, Bosson tracked the speed before issuing a challenge early in the run home. Dancing Flames refused to give in without a fight as the pair set down to a dour struggle with Lewis Caroll asserting himself just short of the winning post to score by a short neck.

"I've no idea where we will go next as we just take one day at a time," said Fraser.

"He's such a good horse so we are a bit lucky to have him."

The victory brought up a winning treble for Bosson who was successful earlier in the day on Our Abbadean (NZ) (Lookin At Lucky) and Love Affair (NZ) (Savabeel).

he Cambridge stable of trainer Stephen Marsh looks to have unearthed another exciting prospect in the form of two-year-old **Ardrossan** (Redoute's Choice) who made a winning debut at Pukekohe.

The stylish Redoute's
Choice colt had impressed at
the trials when he finished
second behind subsequent
Gr. 1 Sistema Stakes winner
Summer Passage (Snitzel)
before winning his second
trial at Rotorua. Sent out a
warm favourite in Sunday's
Fasttrack Insurance sponsored
800 metre dash he didn't
disappoint with a powerful
front-running display.

Handled perfectly by jockeys' premiership leader,

Danielle Johnson, Ardrossan jumped well from an inside barrier and was soon in front. Johnson cuddled the colt up rounding the home turn before she asked him for a serious effort as he shot clear of the chasing pack.

Eased down at the line Ardrossan was still three and a quarter lengths clear of his nearest rival, So Far Sokool (NZ) (Showcasing), who chased him bravely in the run home.

"He's a very nice colt who had only been beaten once at the trials and that one went on to win a Group One," noted Marsh.

"He's a beautiful looking horse, a lovely colt and he is certainly going

through the grades and right to the top.

"We'll probably give him one more run at Te Rapa on the 4th of May before we put him aside. He was bought with the aim of sending him to Australia so I'll just try to keep my grip on him for as long as I can."

A win by Ardrossan in the Listed Hamilton Vets Equine Stakes on the 4th of May would make it a winning treble in the race for Marsh who scored with No More Tears (NZ) (Darci Brahma) in 2015 before taking the event out again last year with Ugo Foscolo (NZ) (Zacinto).

Group One winner First Seal retired

Group One winner **First Seal** (Fastnet Rock) has been retired after a career which netted six wins from 21 starts and early bragging rights over Winx (Street Cry).

The star of her three-year-old spring, First Seal relegated Winx to second in both the Group Two Tea Rose Stakes and Group One Flight Stakes.

In the autumn she finished in front of Winx in the Vinery Stud Stakes when second to Fenway (High Chaparral), the fifth of five times she beat her home.

First Seal's three-year-old season earned her NSW Horse of the Year honours.

The Fastnet Rock mare was a graduate from the 2012 Premier session of the NZB National Yearling Sale Series where she was consigned through the Curraghmore Stud draft and knocked down to the \$700,000 bid of training legend Bart Cummings.

First Seal was raced by the China Horse Club and earned \$1.25 million prize money.
