CLASS GETS HANGER HOME



The penny appears to have dropped for talented three-year-old Hanger

rainer Roger James believes his promising threeyear-old **Hanger (NZ)** (O'Reilly) is finally starting to understand what the racing game is all about after he made it back-to-back victories when he took out the Fasttrack Insurance 1400 at Pukekohe.

The O'Reilly gelding has proven a frustration to his many supporters after taking seven starts to clear maiden ranks, but James was confident some hard work behind the scenes would pay dividends once the penny dropped with the horse.

"At home he's a horse that can run any sort of sectionals," he said.

"The key is that he's relaxing now as we've done a lot of work with him.

"He can now use that sprint he has when we need it rather when he wants to."

James had been concerned about the Heavy10 track on offer and was relieved to see Hanger handle the conditions well enough to register the victory.

"I wouldn't think he was completely at home on it," he said.

"I don't think he is well suited by these sort of tracks, but he just has an abundance of ability.

"He's not a big strong horse but he has the makings of a good horse going 1400m-1600m in future seasons."

Hanger is out of Gr.2 Kewney Stakes (1400m) winner Do Ra Mi and races in the familiar colours of new Cambridge Stud owners, Brendan and Jo Lindsay.

James' fears about the ability of stable star Sherrif (NZ) (High Chaparral) to cope with the heavy track conditions

proved well founded with the High Chaparral gelding struggling to produce his lethal finishing burst as he battled into a well beaten fifth when contesting the Gr.2 Valachi Downs Championship Stakes (2100m) later in the day.

Ugly Warrior scores again at Sha Tin

Ugly Warrior (NZ) (Swiss Ace) took his record to four wins from five starts with an effortless win for rider Zac Purton in the Class 3 Age-Friendly City Handicap (1200m) on dirt at Sha Tin on Saturday.

The Me Tsui-trained son of Swiss Ace justified his status as even-money favourite, racing clear for a two and three-quarter length victory over Michael Freedman's Elite Boy (NZ) (Align).

"He was good again," the rider said. "He won it at the start today, he broke much cleaner and he was there pretty comfortably. The only other strong chance, Elite Boy, was unable to get in from the gate, he covered ground and that was the story.

"The form around Ugly Warrior is strong, through the likes of Pick Number One (NZ) (NZ) (Darci Brahma). They will probably clash again and then they will soon run out of races, but that's life as a dirt horse in Hong Kong."







BLUE BREEZE STEPS UP AT PUKEKOHE

romising stayer **Blue Breeze**(NZ) (Bullbars) gave his higher rated rivals a start and a comprehensive beating when he took out the opening event at Pukekohe on Saturday.

The Alan Morley trained four-yearold had impressed when winning on a good surface at Te Aroha a fortnight earlier with Morley noting at the time he was a horse that was only just starting to come into his own.

With a lack of options available to the rating 69 graded galloper Morley took the punt to start him against the open handicappers in Saturdays 2200m contest and he proved his

trainer's judgement to be spot on as he romped to a five and a half length victory in the hands of regular pilot Sam Spratt.

Spratt had Blue Breeze travelling easily at the rear of proceedings for most of the race as former Gr.1 Sydney Cup (3200m) winner Gallante (Montjeu) set a true pace at the head of affairs. Allowed to travel into contention approaching the home turn, Spratt angled the Bullbars gelding into the clear with 300m to run where he quickly put paid

Blue Breeze ploughs through the mud at Pukekohe for an emphatic victory to his rivals before coasting to the winning post for a hollow victory.

"He's a very versatile horse and it was a gutsy run," said Spratt.

"He just flies through the wet ground and he just thrived in it out there.

"He went from a pretty firm track last time to a very heavy track this time, so it was a really good run."

Morley admitted the horse had provided him with a real quandary as he looks to the future for his charge.

"I was going to put him out for a spell after he won at Te Aroha," he said.

"By the Monday he was yahooing around his paddock and carrying on so

we thought we'd give him another one.

"Now he's done this so who knows where from here.

"I just hope the handicapper doesn't give us too much weight now as there's not much of him."

KITAYA LOOKS SET FOR PROFITABLE WINTER AFTER UPSET VICTORY

hostly grey gelding **Kitaya** (Lawman) relished
the testing underfoot
conditions as he sprang a minor
upset in the feature sprint at
Pukekohe on the weekend.

The former European galloper arrived in New Zealand last winter after a lengthy stint in Hong Kong and proved a model of consistency without securing a victory in a ten-start campaign. Allowed to freshen up while the hard tracks of summer prevailed, the Danica Guy trained eight-year-old resumed with a promising showing on his home track at Matamata last month before tackling Saturday's rating 85 Haunui Farm 1200.

Expertly handled by three-kilogram claiming apprentice Rebecca Scott, Kitaya lobbed along in midfield before issuing a strong challenge early in the run home. After establishing a break on his rivals Kitaya fought

strongly to hold his rivals at bay by a length and three-quarters at the line.

"I was pretty confident with him," said Guy after the race.

"We took the three kilos off him as I knew the track would be wet. His work has been great and he deserved that today."

Guy was quick to praise the effort of Scott who registered her seventh career victory and fifth for the season with a capable performance.

"He tries very hard every time he goes around but he needs things to go his way," she said.

"She rode him beautifully and quiet.

"She didn't dig him up too much and he had something in the tank for the finish."

It was the fifth career victory for Kitaya who has now accumulated over \$370,000 in stakes earnings.

KHIMAR WAR PUTS FIRST WIN ON THE BOARD FOR SWEET ORANGE

peedy two-year-old **Khimar War (NZ)** credited former Highview Stud stallion, Sweet Orange with his first New Zealand winner when he dominated his rivals over 1000 metres at Riccarton.

Out of the stakes placed mare Flame Of Atlanta, Khimar War had impressed when running third on debut last month and was well supported to improve on that performance in Saturday's contest.

Allowed to find his feet in the early rush for positions,

Khimar War closed quickly on the pacemakers early in the home straight before bursting clear inside the 200m mark to win as he liked from Hapi Ella (NZ) (Coats Choice) and the fast finishing Miss Curious (NZ) (Nom Du Jeu).

"He's a very exciting horse and he's not just a two-year-old," said trainer Lance Robinson.

"He's really surprised me with what he's shown as we only really ran him for education, but he's just kept getting better and better."

While Robinson is eyeing a start in the Listed Berkley Stud Champagne Stakes (1200m) at Riccarton on 5 May as the season finale for his charge, he is quick to admit he is looking forward to the gelding's three-year-old campaign with relish.

"We're under a bit of pressure whether to run him in the two-year-old final or turn him out," he said.

"It's a black-type race so we probably need to back up in a fortnight, but I just can't wait until he turns three.

"I said to Jacob (Lowry) to ride him a wee bit quiet as I only wanted to see him finding the line.

"He showed his true worth and I'm just rapt as I think I have a really nice three-year-old on my hands."

Khimar War was a \$30,000 purchase from the Highview Stud draft during the Select session of the 2017 NZ Bloodstock National Yearling Sale. He is from the first crop of Gr.1 Hong Kong Classic Mile winner Sweet Orange who stood at Highview for three seasons before relocating to Australia for the 2017 breeding season.

BOSS BACK TO WINNING FORM AT TRENTHAM

romising three-year-old **Boss (NZ)** (Towkay) shrugged off a mediocre performance at Awapuni at his last start to register his second career victory when he took out the opening race over 1400m at Trentham on Sunday.

The Towkay gelding was well supported in a strong threeyear-old line-up at Awapuni after an impressive maiden victory at Hawera, but faded in the run home to finish midfield behind the impressive local galloper Ozil (Denman).

Punters were prepared to overlook that effort and their confidence was well placed as the Otaki galloper gave his five rivals windburn in the concluding stages as he dashed away to win comfortably from race favourite Beauden (NZ) (Bullbars).

Co-trainer and part owner Johno Benner was straight forward about his feelings regarding the gelding's last-start

performance.

"We were pretty sour leaving the course at Awapuni as we do have a huge opinion of the horse," he said.

"He's nowhere near the finished article and coming here today he paraded sensationally before the race so I was pretty happy." Benner was also open in his opinion about the horse's future prospects.

"To be honest he will either be sold or spelled," he said.

"That's where it lies.

"As long as he pulls up well we will make a call after that.

"It was great though to get the day off to a start like that."

PEREGRINE FALCON PROVIDES EARLY PRESENT FOR JOCKEY

Fledged) was given a wide berth by most, but jockey
Koh Teck Huat made the most of his only ride of the day to pick up an early birthday present on Sunday.

The Singaporean rider turns 35 on Tuesday, on which day he is also booked for one solitary ride, but with winners few and far between, he thought he might as well toast to Peregrine Falcon's win at \$162 in the \$20,000 Countofmontecristo 2017 Stakes, a Class 5 race over 1400m, in case he is unsuccessful on the actual day.

"It's nice to get an early birthday present, more so when it's my first winner for the year," said Koh.

"If I can win on the actual day, it's even better, but I'll take it now, thank you very much."

Koh has never been aboard at any of the Fully Fledged seven-year-old's 49 starts - which produced only two wins before - but took on board Khoo's feedback at the mounting yard and harboured a silent hope he could spring an early birthday surprise for himself.

"Leslie told me he has been working well and I thought I'd try and ride him positive, which seems to work for him," he said.

"From the wide gate, I had to go forward, anyway. He took a while to

get the lead, but everything went well after that.

"The other two horses (King Cross and Zahir) came to challenge in the straight, but he kept kicking."

Koh, who honed his craft as an apprentice jockey with Singapore nine-time champion trainer Laurie Laxon, may not be the most fashionable jockey at Kranji, but he has been seen working hard with more trainers of late, especially after one of his main supporters Tan Hor Khoon retired in March.

"I'd like to thank Leslie for the support. Hopefully today's win will bring me more rides from not just him, but also from other trainers."

GOOD CATCH NO MORE A BRIDESMAID

fter four seconds from as many starts, **Good Catch** (NZ) (Falkirk) finally shed his maiden status with a gutsy win in the \$85,000 Debt Collector 2016 Stakes, a Restricted Maiden race over 1000m on Sunday.

Taking full advantage of his barrier No 2, the New Zealand-bred threeyear-old by Falkirk had little trouble settling into his customary leading role in the 12-horse field.

Backed down again with confidence (\$13 favourite) Good Catch looked to be on the bridle and doing things easy at the head of affairs, but the acid test would be when the pressure comes pouring on him. Would Good Catch get caught again like at his last four runs?

The one shaping up as the party-pooper this time was the well-tried debutant Miss Dusty (NZ) (Reliable Man) when she came bursting out of the pack to lay down the law at the 200m.

But it was written Good Catch was not going to settle for second best for a fifth time on Sunday. Well rated by his regular partner Nooresh Juglall, the Titanium Racing Stable-owned gelding kept finding to hit the line strongly and comfortably hold Miss Dusty at bay by half-a-length.

Nobody was as relieved as winning trainer Ricardo Le Grange as he headed down to the winner's circle accompanied by the happy entourage from Titanium Racing Stable headed by Jeffrey Soh.

"He's run four times second, but in his defence, it was behind some smart horses," said the South African handler.

"It was 50/50 if I'd bring him back to 1000m today, you're either a genius if it works out or a dill if it doesn't, but luckily it's paid off.

"Jeff has been very patient with this horse and it was a strong positive ride from Nooresh as well. It's also great to win on a big day like today."

Now that Good Catch has got rid of his bridesmaid tag, Le Grange can now look at raising the bar for the horse who has brought up the dozen for him this year.

"I think he'll go further now that he's got that first win out of the way," said Le Grange. "He is bred to go further, and conservatively, he could go over 1400m on turf."

Four seconds already under the belt had already put \$65,000 in the bank for Good Catch, but with that first hurrah, his account has now hit the \$110,000 mark for Soh and his partners.

KOKTOYS WITH GUINEAS PLANS AFTER TERRIFIC WIN

rainer David Kok has the Singapore Guineas locked in for **Terrific (NZ)** (Thewayyouare) following his authoritative win in the \$45,000 War Affair 2014 Stakes (1600m) on Sunday.

The Singaporean trainer thought the Thewayyouare three-year-old needed to win the Class 4 Non Premier event to enhance his eligibility for the third and final Leg of the Singapore Three-Year-Old Challenge which will be run on May 26 with a \$1 million purse for the first time.

And there is little doubt the impressive way the \$26 shot came off his cosy run in the box-seat at the 300m to power home would have Kok filling out the race nomination form right away.

Favourite What's New (NZ) (Casino Prince) did look the goods when she found daylight at the 200m, but Terrific was on the day a shade too good. Arguably, Cliff Brown's daughter of Casino Prince did not enjoy the same favourable circumstances as the winner after beginning wider out to settle in the rear division in the bumper 14-horse field, but take nothing away from Terrific, who had to muster just as potent a kick inside the last furlong to come up trumps.

Kok said the horse he also owns had it all to do last time out when he encountered a rain-affected track, but back on a firmer surface, was able to showcase his true potential.

"He didn't look comfortable in the heavy downpour at

his last start (closing fourth to Za'eem in a similar Class 4 Non Premier race over the mile)," said Kok.

"But he had things his way today, he got the run of the race from barrier No 1 and he lengthened up well once he got the gap.

"I think he should have enough rating points to qualify for the Guineas now. I didn't enter him in today's Classic as I think the 1400m is too short for him.

"I bought this horse in New Zealand myself. At the time, I didn't think he would be anything special, even if you always hope they do turn out that way.

"I definitely didn't have the Singapore Guineas in mind for him then, but look, the race is still over one month away, let's see how he pulls up first."

Duric jumped off with a rave report on Terrific, but as the leading jockey at Kranji, he could probably see a happy headache coming his way on May 26.

"I jumped off and told David not to get a rider for him in the Guineas yet, but I'm not sure myself," said the Singapore champion jockey. "David thinks he's a Guineas horse, and I think he should really have a throw at the stumps with him.

"He was drawn to run in the perfect spot today. I had one of the favourites, Alan Munro's horse (Lim's Revent) on my outside, and once he peeled him off, he rolled off and I got the split.

"He's got such a gorgeous action, big strides, and I think he's got a bit of class about him, too."

With that second win and one previous third place earned second-up, Terrific has now chalked up in excess of \$80,000 in stakes earnings for Kok.
