LATTA LOVING CHRISTCHURCH RAIN AHEAD OF WINTER CUP

Nobody likes unloading a truckload of horses in pouring rain, but Awapuni trainer Lisa Latta was only seeing upside in the chore.

Latta has seven runners engaged for Saturday's Riccarton meeting and travelled them down overnight Wednesday, the float arriving at the track at 5.30am on Thursday.

Latta will saddle the favoured pair of **Platinum Command (NZ)** (Red Giant) and **North And South (NZ)** (Strategic Image) in Saturday's Gr.3 eStar 119th Winter Cup (1600m) at Riccarton, both mares at their best on deep tracks, hence the trainer's delight with the Christchurch rain.

"It was pouring down as they were unloading the truck this morning and to be honest, we were pleased to hear it," Latta said.

TAB bookmakers have Platinum Command as a \$4.60 favourite after wins at her last two starts, while North And South shares \$6 second favouritism with Lochan Ora (NZ) (Towkay), a winner of his last four starts.

A winner of two of her seven starts at Riccarton, Platinum Command gained her first open class win in the Whyte Handicap at Trentham last start, scoring by six lengths to seal favouritism for the Winter Cup.

"She's in terrific form. The only real worry with her is it's been three weeks between races and she's shown she goes best on the back-up," Latta said.

"But she gets in with a nice weight and she looks great, so we think she should go well."

Platinum Command has won four of her six starts on heavy tracks, while North And South, who was a beaten favourite in last year's Winter Cup on a slow track, has won seven of her 16 starts on heavy going.

"North And South worked really well on Monday morning. She just doesn't like those gluey tracks and that's why we're

welcoming the rain with her. She's best when the tracks are loose," Latta said.

"I'm really happy with both of them and by all accounts they've both travelled down well, so here's hoping anyway."

Ruettiger favourite to take Aurie's Star

Consistent sprinter **Ruettiger (NZ)** (Duporth) is the early favourite to add further black type to his record at Flemington.

The Lee and Anthony Freedman-trained sprinter is the top choice in Saturday's Group Three Aurie's Star Handicap over the straight 1200 metres.

At his most recent start Ruettiger took out last month's Listed All Victorian Sprint Final over Saturday's course and distance.

He holds favouritism over Beirut (Lonhro) and Sooboog (Snitzel) who are both listed as runners in the Group Three Spring Stakes at Morphettville on Saturday.

It is expected Beirut will run in Adelaide where Jacob Rule has been booked to ride while a decision is pending on where Sooboog starts.

Mare's performance to dictate future path

Gwynethanne's (NZ) (Handsome Ransom) lone appearance at the Riccarton carnival will determine the stakes performer's future.

The daughter of Handsome Ransom earned a trip to Christchurch for Saturday's Gr.3 eStar Winter Cup with a last-start victory.

"We'll see how she goes and she'll come home and then it will be for the syndicate that owns her to decide if we press on or not," trainer Karen Zimmerman said.

The seven-year-old has been a loyal servant of her Otaki yard with seven wins and included in her 10 minor placings is a runner-up finish in the Gr.2 Travis Stakes behind Lauren Tate (NZ) (Pins) and a second in the Listed Manawatu Anzac Mile.

More recently, Gwynethanne finished third behind Winter Cup rival Justlikeyasister (NZ) (Gold Centre) at Awapuni and then headed north to Te Rapa where she accounted for the black type winner Biologist (Danehill Dancer).

"It's a Dead 6 down at Riccarton at the moment, but I know there is rain in the forecast and she wouldn't like anything

worse than a Slow 9," Zimmerman said.

Kelly McCulloch, who won on the mare last time out and was aboard in the Travis placing, rides Gwynethanne.

Mare gets nod in close call

When asked if he could split **Hasselhoof (NZ)** (Tavistock) and **Valley Girl (NZ)** (Mastercraftsman) ahead of their resuming runs on Saturday, co-trainer Chris Gibbs marginally favoured the latter.

The high-class stablemates will clash in the Harcourts Optimize Group Open at Ruakaka to kick start campaigns aimed at much loftier targets.

"They are pretty much on a par, but if I had to choose one it would be the mare," said Gibbs, who prepares the duo with Donna Logan.

"She might be a touch more forward because she is the one that is a definite runner in the Makfi. We looked at trialling them, but the tracks have been too miserable."

A decision on the spring direction that Valley Girl, who hasn't raced since she ran sixth in the Gr.1 Australian Oaks, will take will be made after the August 27 feature at Hastings. [Full story here.](#)

Ryan Mark ready for return

Ryan Mark (NZ) (Thorn Park) returns to a favourite stomping ground this weekend as the Group One winner prepares for another crack at elite company racing at Hastings later this month.

Railway Stakes hero Ryan Mark, whose

deeds have earned him a Champion Sprinter of the Year nomination, is unbeaten in two starts at Ruakaka and he kicked off his spring campaign at the Northland racetrack last season with a trial win over multiple Group One winner Volkstok'n'barrell (NZ) (Tavistock).

Taupiri owner-trainer John Morell has opted for Saturday's Harcourts Optimize Group Open as Ryan Mark's starting point for his six-year-old season in preference to tackling the Gr.2 Lisa Chittick Foxbridge Plate (1200m) at Te Rapa a week later. [Full story here.](#)

McCullum claims win on debut

A horse named after former New Zealand cricket captain Brendon McCullum made an auspicious debut at Tauranga on Wednesday.

McCullum (NZ) (Shinko King), prepared by Ralph Manning at Cambridge and bred and raced by former high-profile jockey Gavin McKeon, his wife Emma, Steve Cross

and David Read, overcame a slipped saddle in running to make a winning debut in the Ultimate Motor Group 1200.

McCullum had won two trials, at Te Aroha in December 2014 and at Cambridge in May last year, and overcome fractures that had kept him from making his debut until now.

Stable apprentice Zy Nor Azman dealt with the slipped saddle well and was still able to urge his mount to the line to win the first race of the new gallops season.

"When the saddle slipped forward I just tried not to panic," Nor Azman said.

"It's so great to win the first race of the season for my boss Mr Manning and my mentor Gavin McKeon," he said. "I'm so happy about that."

Southern Icon ready for Foxbridge test

An impressive trial win at Te Teko on Tuesday showed **Southern Icon** (Big Brown) to be ready for the biggest challenge of his career.

Trainer Alan Tait believes the five-year-old can measure up in Group One company, but he will have to produce a bold performance at Te Rapa on Saturday week for the chance to prove his quality.

"His next race will be the Foxbridge Plate and he has to win or run in the first three to guarantee a start in the Makfi," the Matamata horseman said.

Southern Icon's free-wheeling style has seen him unbeaten in his last four starts and his trial win was achieved in similar fashion.

"He just jumped and led like he does – he's used to doing it that way," Tait said. "Mentally, he's more mature now and we've always thought he was pretty smart.

"He doesn't have to be in front, but he's just got that much speed and he can run time – we think he can make the next step up."

Stars out to play at Te Teko

Murray Baker and Andrew Forsman's spring hopes gained momentum at the Te Teko trials on Tuesday.

The Cambridge trainers stepped out a

number of Group One contenders with the Australian-bound **Saracino (NZ)** (Per Incanto) impressing in his 1000 metre open heat win and an effort mirrored by the quality filly **Luna Rossa (NZ)** (Written Tycoon).

The former placed in two of his three two-year-old appearances and gave a game front-running account of himself when third behind Luna Rossa in the Gr.1 Manawatu Sires' Produce Stakes.

"He holds nominations in Melbourne and races like the Caulfield Guineas roll around quite quickly," Forsman said. [Full story here.](#)



Power (Oasis Dream)

Powerful start for stallion

Cambridge Stud shuttle stallion **Power** (Oasis Dream) has made his presence felt in Europe and he's made a bright start in New Zealand with a trial winner at Te Teko.

The Graeme and Debbie Rogerson-trained Gift Of Power (NZ) easily won her 600 metre heat on Tuesday in the hands of Craig Grylls.

Out of the Group One performer Capital Diamond (NZ) (Lucky Unicorn), the filly is likely to make her debut at Ruakaka on September 10.

Power has produced 10 winners in Europe including Peace Envoy, who has been successful in the Gr.3 Anglesey Stakes and the Listed Rochestown Stakes.

Ocean Park colt makes an impact

Brendon Hawtin was well-satisfied by the efforts of several junior members of his stable at the Te Teko trials on Tuesday.

At the top of the list was a colt by Ocean Park (NZ) (Thorn Park), the first of the former New Zealand Horse of the Year's progeny to step out, who won his 600 metre heat.

"To be fair, I haven't put a lot of pressure on him and from day one he showed he's got the goods," Hawtin said.

"He's had a couple of jump-outs and it's no surprise that he's won this.

"If he gets home and comes through everything well then I will probably keep him going for one of the first two-year-old races – either Wanganui or Ruakaka."

NZ pedigree to the fore

A filly with strong New Zealand ties has opened her account in Ireland.

The John Oxx-trained Nonetheless, a daughter of Fastnet Rock and the three-time Kiwi stakes winner Twinkling (NZ) (Star Way), recently won over 2400 metres.

"It's nice to see the breed is shaping up on the other side of the world as well," said Linda Laing, who trained Twinkling with her father Royce Dowling.

"She was shipped to Ireland and had a Cape Cross filly that didn't do a lot - it was a late foal. Then she had another Cape Cross colt, slipped to Azamour and the Sea The Stars colt died at birth. This is the next one."

Lucia Valentina trials strongly at Gosford

Queen Elizabeth Stakes winner **Lucia Valentina (NZ)** (Savabeel) has finished second in a barrier trial after flashing home from last.

Andrew Gibbons eased the Kris Lees-trained Lucia Valentina to the tail of the field before going wide on the turn, allowing her to let down strongly to run second in a 1000m-heat at Gosford on Monday morning.

It was Lucia Valentina's second trial in the lead-up to spring, with Lees aiming her at the Cox Plate.

Super Savabeel scoops the pool

Waikato Stud have made another clean sweep of the stallion titles.

The Matamata farm has dominated the awards in recent times and it was more of the same in a highly satisfying 2015-2016.

Savabeel (Zabeel) was the star of the show by claiming the Grosvenor Award for the New Zealand sires' premiership and the Dewar Award (champion NZ-based sire by Australasian progeny earnings) and the Centaine Award (champion NZ-based sire by global progeny earnings).

"Savabeel has done a wonderful job world-wide," stud principal Mark Chittick said.

"At home, he's been outstanding with the likes of Group One winners Kawi and Sound Proposition and in Australia his daughter Lucia Valentina has always been at the top level.

"The way she won the Queen Elizabeth Stakes was fantastic and, interestingly, Savabeel has also produced six two-year-old stakes winners.

"He's extremely versatile and, once again, the way his yearlings sold at Karaka showed that the Australians love him."

Bliss glad he took a punt on Keano

A chance sighting of a for sale advertisement on an auction web site convinced New Plymouth horseman Jeff Bliss to go back into the stallion business.

He didn't have any intention of replacing Eighth Wonder (NZ), a son of Zabeel who died pre-maturely last year, at Sentry Hill Farm until he spotted the availability of the well-related **Keano (NZ)** (Pins).

"I wasn't going to bother about another stallion and then I saw him on this site in Australia and we bought him," Bliss said.

"He's beautifully-bred and he would be the quietest horse you would ever come across. I can do his feet in the paddock without putting a lead on him.

"He stands 16.1h and is from a blue blood

family. He's a lovely horse."

Bliss was more than satisfied with the welcome Keano, who stands at \$2000 + GST, received after arriving in Taranaki last year.

"Travel Wise and the maiden Ice Cold will run there as well," said Peard, who has been associated with the stable for more than two decades.
