## KINGSGUARD UPSETS AT ROSEHILL

Former kiwi galloper **Kingsguard (NZ)** (Rip Van Winkle) upset the applecart when he scored over 1400 metres at Rosehill on Saturday.

Raced in New Zealand as His Majesty, the now five-year-old had shown plenty of ability in his first six starts, including running second to star galloper Xtravagant (NZ) (Pentire) at Ellerslie, before being sent across the Tasman by his owners, Windsor Park Stud.

Placed in the care of the Hawkes Racing team and with a name change to Kingsguard, the Rip Van Winkle gelding has

now won four of his 13 Australian starts and looks to have furnished into a potential stakes performer given his most recent success.

"He had shown us plenty before he went across to Sydney especially with that run at Ellerslie where he pushed Xtravagant hard," noted Windsor Park manager and co-owner, Rodney Schick.

"He has had a few niggles and issues to work through which has held him back a little but this preparation looks

like being his best now he seems to be over those problems.

“Michael (Hawkes) rang me on Saturday and said he was confident of a big run and his judgment was spot-on.

“He got smacked over the head by a whip at the 100 metre mark when he was pushing into a gap so it was a pretty gutsy performance.”

While Schick couldn't be in Sydney to celebrate the victory, he was sure his brother Johnny and a bunch of his friends who share in the ownership of the horse would definitely have made up for him.

“He raced for the Stud when he was running in New Zealand but when we sent him to Australia we asked my brother whether he had anyone who might want to get involved,” he explained.

“Johnny got a few of his friends interested and they came

on board. He's now won four for us so you couldn't ask for a better experience for those guys.

“At this stage, he will be kept to racing in his grade but if he continues to improve then a start in a stakes race later in the season is a definite possibility.”

## NEWS IN BRIEF

### Night's Watch successful in Australian debut

Promising former New Zealand galloper **Nights Watch (NZ)** (Redwood) opened his Australian account on Sunday with a narrow victory over 1200 metres at Bendigo.

The four-year-old Redwood gelding was one of the favoured early candidates for last season's Gr. 1 New Zealand Derby after a win on debut at Ellerslie from the Peter & Dawn Williams and Paul Richards stable. Put aside after a further three runs saw him fall out of Derby contention, Night's Watch was transferred to the Warrnambool stable of leading Victorian trainer Darren Weir for his future racing.

Settled nicely in midfield by rider Mark Zahra, Night's Watch made his move approaching the home bend as he scouted wide to put himself in a challenging position. Despite racing erratically in the run home he made up good ground to snatch victory from front-runner Duke Of Nottingham in the shadows of the winning post.

Weir was encouraged by the performance despite the narrow margin of victory and some wayward behaviour.

“He probably didn't look that impressive today but watching the race he did a fair bit wrong during the run as well as before the start,” he noted.

“I think the run will do him a lot of good as it will bring his manners into line a little bit and there's still a lot of upside to him.

“Although he didn't win by a big margin he was always going to win.

“Where he ends up I'm not too sure but I am sure he will be winning better races than today.” – NZ Racing Desk

# COLE TARGETS SECOND GROUP ONE UPSET

A stress-free outing at Friday's Avondale trials has Byerley Park trainer Steven Cole convinced his stakes placed juvenile **Ohceedee (NZ)** (Power) is ready for an ambitious three-year-old campaign that has a Group One goal as the main target.

The rangy Power gelding finished off nicely to run second in an open 1000 metre heat as he prepares for his campaign opener at Te Rapa this coming weekend. The run thrilled Cole who hadn't expected his charge to be happy in the testing track conditions that prevailed on the day.

"I didn't think he would really handle that type of ground so all I was looking for was a tidy effort where he did things under his own steam," he said.

"As it turned out he missed away a little but then got going and ran home nicely to be beaten a short margin without being asked for a serious effort.

"Alysha (Collett) came back in and confirmed he didn't handle the track at all but she said he felt fantastic and had strengthened up nicely from his two-year-old campaign."

Ohceedee was placed twice from four starts as a juvenile including an eye-catching performance to finish third behind the highly rated Haussmann (NZ) (Pour Moi) in the Listed Great Northern Foal Stakes.

"We put him away after his last run at Ellerslie as he had done plenty for his first preparation," advised Cole.

"We initially had thoughts about the Karaka Million but when he didn't qualify we decided to take things slowly with his three-year-old year in mind.

"Since then the plan has been to try and get him to the 2000 Guineas as he appeals as the ideal type for the big, roomy Riccarton track.

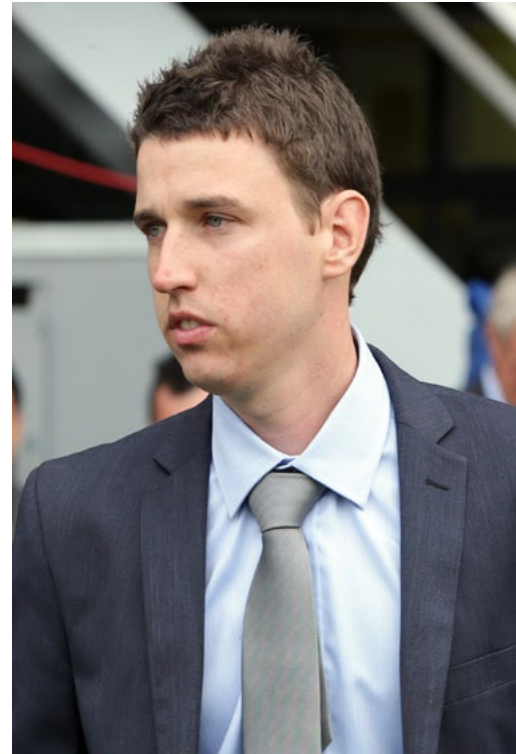
"He will go to Te Rapa for the three-year-old 1100 metre race and, depending on how he goes, he will then run again at Ruakaka a fortnight later.

"The Hawkes Bay Guineas would be his first big test if he is going as well as we think he can and then on to Riccarton after that."

Although in just his third full season as a trainer, Group One success is no stranger to Cole who prepared Dukedom (NZ) (Bachelor Duke) to score in the 2016 Levin Classic at Trentham. The Bachelor Duke gelding was subsequently sold to Hong Kong with Cole now looking to add further elite level success from his Byerley Park base.

"We've got seventeen in work now with a really nice mix of two and three-year-olds along with a couple of older horses," he said.

"Beyond Dispute is one of our

three-year-olds that won a race last season and looks ready to progress from that. He went nicely in his trial on Friday and is getting ready for a race at Ruakaka as well.

"Creative Genius is another who trialed well without being asked for a serious effort. He will be going to Ruakaka on the 29th of August and then to the last day at Hawkes Bay.

"Like most trainers we are pretty excited about what lies ahead over the next few months and I can't wait to get some of our young ones on the track and racing."

# NGATIRA GOLD OFF THE CANVAS FOR KNOCKOUT VICTORY

A stirring contest in the open steeplechase at Te Aroha was finally settled in favour of the Samantha Logan trained **Ngatira Gold (NZ)** (Gold Centre) when the promising chaser held out a desperate bid by Thenamesbond (NZ) (China Cat) in the closing stages of Sunday's event.

Having just his second start over the bigger fences after winning on debut at the venue last month, Ngatira Gold and rider Aaron Kuru sat behind a steady pace set by the leading trio of Mr Kanton (NZ) (Ishiguru), Thenamesbond and Nells Belle (NZ)

(Istidaad) who took turns in front during the early stages of the race.

Things started to get serious with 1200 metres to run as Thenamesbond succeeded in putting enough pressure on his rivals to split the field up. By then Kuru had Ngatira Gold trucking along nicely in fourth before dashing to the lead with two fences to negotiate.

The anticipated victory suddenly came into doubt as Thenamesbond began to claw his way back into the fight along with Mr Kanton and Noah Jon (NZ) (Traditionally) who was

running on resolutely. A bungle at the last fence nearly cost the Logan runner victory however he picked himself up to out-duel Thenamesbond in a torrid last 100 metres to score by a long head at the post.

Logan cut a relieved figure as she welcomed last year's Great Northern Hurdle placegetter back to scale after the race.

"That got a bit messy in the end but he will learn from that," she said.

"He's the type of horse who can sometimes throw it away but he loves steeplechasing and he just toughed it out today."

"I'll have a talk with the owners but if he comes through the race

well then we will look at the Pakuranga Hunt Cup at Ellerslie next."

Kuru was thanking his lucky stars after nearly coming to grief at the last fence on the enigmatic performer.

"Full credit to Sam and the team as he's taken to this steeplechasing game really well and has a future there," he said.

"I was quite lucky that Thenamesbond mucked up the last as well but I knew I had the horse, it was just really whether he wanted it or not.

"He can go to Ellerslie now and be competitive just as long as he wants to do it."

Earlier in the day the Graham Falconer trained El Corby (NZ) (Istidaad) thrust himself into contention for the remaining Ellerslie hurdle features this season when he dug deep to score his third win from just 4 starts over the smaller fences in taking out the main hurdle race on the programme.

# MIGHTY ME ON THE MONEY **AT PUKEKOHE**

Local galloper **Mighty Me** (Choisir) capped a run of tidy performances of late when he defeated a handy field of rating 75 rivals over 1200 metres at Pukekohe on the weekend.

The lightly raced seven-year-old had been thereabouts in all five runs in his winter campaign to date without managing to snare a victory. That frustration ended on Saturday courtesy of a determined effort from the Choisir gelding and rider Sam Spratt as the pair staved off all challenges down the long Pukekohe home straight.

Spratt had positioned her charge outside the leader throughout and took over as the field straightened for the run home. Spratt judged things to a nicety as she fended off her nearest rival in Lady Pinot (NZ) (Starspangledbanner) within sight of the post before holding out a determined late bid from Its A Kinda Magic (NZ) (Tiger Prawn) by a long head at the line.

Trainer Joanne Surgenor was full of smiles as she celebrated a victory that she had thought may have been thwarted by the heavy track conditions.

“He fought hard today as I didn’t think he would get through it,” she noted.

“I was a little bit worried but Sam rode him a treat to sit outside the leader and box on nicely.”

Surgenor admitted she had been worried when the horse had veered out slightly with 200 metres to run and brushed with Lady Pinot.

“He really dug in as he got a bump but kicked on again,” she said.

“He had been going some excellent races as he had some really bad draws and had been wide all the way. Today from the draw I thought he might get it easier and have something left in the tank.

“Hopefully now it is onwards and upwards.”

Mighty Me is owned by well-known thoroughbred identity Peter Walker who is also part of the team that races classy sprinter Fully Funded (NZ) (Fully Fledged) from Surgenor’s Ardmore Lodge base. Mighty Me, who was a \$31,000 purchase by Walker from the Hallmark Stud draft during the 2012 Select sale at Karaka, has now won three of his sixteen starts.

# CATARINA THRIVES IN TESTING CONDITIONS

Testing conditions that saw lengthy margins amongst spread-out fields throughout the day played nicely into the hands of Matamata mare **Catarina (NZ)** (El Hermano) as she proved too tough for her rivals over 2100 metres at Pukekohe on Saturday.

The Tony Gillies trained six-year-old had demonstrated her affinity for the heavy winter surfaces when successful at her home track in late July and she showed that aptitude once again as she dominated in the closing stages of the rating 75 contest.

Handled confidently by leading rider Michael Coleman, Catarina bided her time towards the rear in the early stages before improving steadily to be within striking distance with 600 metres to run. Coleman urged the mare to the front halfway down the straight from where she kept her challengers at bay to score by just over a length at the line.

Gillies was quick to acknowledge the strength of his charge when questioned about the performance.

“This is her ground as she wants the wetter the better,” he advised.

“She’s pretty genuine and given she gets the ground conditions we always thought she had a future.

“As long as the tracks stay like this she will be suited. I’m not sure where

to go next but it is likely she will line up again in a fortnight.”

The victory continued a run of success for her sire El Hermano who enjoyed a winning double after Worthiswaitngold (NZ) took out the last race on the programme. Worthiswaitngold was ridden by Jason Waddell who made it two wins from just the two rides after scoring earlier on Suliman in his first day back from an injury enforced lay-off.

# SAIMEE A RELIEVED MAN AS HE SADDLES FIRST WINNER AS TRAINER

Five years ago, Saimee Jumaat bringing up win No 1356 would have not had anyone batting an eyelid.

The former eight-time Singapore champion jockey was a regular visitor at the Bukit Timah and Kranji winner's circle, boasting a Group-riding record unmatched by any locally-groomed rider.

But since booting home his 1355th winner in 2012, it's been a long time since the 42-year-old had seen his name up in lights – until Sunday in a modest \$35,000 Open Maiden

Division 2 race over 1200m – but as a trainer this time, that of a horse named **Shoquet (NZ)** (Showcasing).

Granted a trainer's licence and boxes on July 1 he has come close a few times (three seconds from 22 runners), but finally tasted victory with his 23rd runner, Shoquet for one of his biggest supporters, the Al-Arabiya Stable.

Forever the discreet man, there was no loud celebration at the winner's enclosure, just a beaming smile that spoke volumes about his state of mind at that priceless moment. He even missed the opportunity of posing with his first winner as a trainer, busier answering the questions from the media.

Sheer relief was his first reaction more than anything else.

"The expectations have been so great, especially with my record as a jockey. To be honest, it's more of a relief I've finally got my first winner as a trainer," said the now-bespectacled Saimee.

"I'm lucky to have good owners to support me and send good horses to my yard. I'm also happy I got my first winner for Al-Arabiya who is one of the biggest owners at my yard.

"Now that first winner is out of the way, I hope the winners should be able to follow up now. The horses are racing well and there is no reason the others won't follow suit.

"It's also great to have Oscar Chavez riding my first winner. We had a great rivalry and I could not have trusted a better jockey as he's been a good jockey for so long and he continues to ride so well."

A four-year-old by Showcasing, Shoquet trialed in New Zealand before coming to Singapore where he had shown decent form before exploding onto the scene second-up at Kranji.
