VILE TWO-HANDED IN MANAWATU CUP BID



Quality stayer Jacksstar will be looking for an improved effort in Saturday's Gr.3 Hotel Coachman Manawatu Cup

Gary Vile is happy with his hand for Saturday's Gr.3 Hotel Coachman Manawatu Cup (2200m) at Awapuni. The Palmerston North trainer will saddle 2016 Cup winner **Jacksstar (NZ)** (Zed) and last year's Listed New Zealand St Leger (2500m) winner **Rock On (NZ)** (Road To Rock) for the feature and expects both to make their presence felt.

"I'd think both will be very competitive, especially with a bit of rain around. A rain-affected track won't hurt either of them," Vile said.

Jacksstar is building up well in his summer campaign, having spent 17 months on the sideline after suffering a serious tendon and ligament injury when running third in last year's Gr.1 Auckland Cup (3200m).

He had gone down a nose in the Gr.3 Wellington Cup (3200m) prior and both of those races figure on Vile's target list this preparation.

"It was a really good run here last time. Every run, he's got better but that last run had a lot of merit," Vile said.

"The short course is no help for him and the step up to 2200m suits him better. He's coming back really well, though he still might need another one before he shows his best. His ultimate aims are the Wellington and Auckland Cups.

"Cameron Lammas is back on him this weekend and he knows him well. He should go a good race."

TAB bookmakers have Jackstar at \$17 to win the Manawatu Cup, with Rock On at \$33 in a market headed by Glory Days (NZ) (Red Giant) at \$2.80.

"Rock On is coming to hand just as well. He's in fantastic condition but he just needs a big course like Trentham now. But I do expect him to go well on Saturday too."

“GUTTED” KAY FOCUSES ON NEXT CHALLENGE

Sylvia Kay is planning on leaving Awapuni on Saturday in a happier place than she was departing Trentham on Captain Cook Stakes day.

The Levin trainer was bitterly disappointed after **Dolcetto (NZ)** (Per Incanto) was held up behind the weakening leader Mauna Kea (NZ) (Per Incanto) on the turn in the Group One 1600m feature and was unable to get clear running room for the remainder of the race.

To make matters worse, Dolcetto's stablemate **Sylvester (NZ)** (Road To Rock) was denied a clear run in the Chalmers Handicap (2500m) and was also unplaced.

Kay will look for better luck with the pair when Dolcetto tackles the Gr.2

Kamada Park Manawatu Challenge Stakes (1400m) and Sylvester contests the Gr.3 Hotel Coachman Manawatu Cup (2200m) on Saturday.

“You have days like that. Only one horse can win a race. You just have to suck it up and move on,” Kay said, reflecting on the Trentham meeting.

“Dolcetto got carted back just as he was starting to make a run. Jason [Waddell, jockey] said he was absolutely full of running but had nowhere to go. I was pretty gutted after that because he could have won that race with an ounce of luck.

“The horse is really well. He was a bit naughty in the gates before that race but hopefully they will put him in last and he won't do that again.”

A winner of eight of his 19 starts, including four from just five starts at Awapuni, Dolcetto has won seven races on tracks rated slow or worse.

TAB bookmakers opened Dolcetto at \$10.50 in a Manawatu Challenge Stakes market headed by Ocean Emperor (NZ) (Zabeel) at \$2.60 and Wyndspelle (NZ) (Iffraaj) at \$4.50, but Kay felt her charge was well placed for a compensation win.

“He's got to make amends for what happened at Trentham,” Kay said.

“We've had a lot of rain and he handles a rain-affected track. Weight-for-age suits him too because it's hard lugging the 60 and 61 kilos around. He's a strong horse but it's not easy when those other horses only have 54 to carry.”

Kay was also pleased with Sylvester going into the Manawatu Cup, in which TAB bookmakers had him as a \$46 outsider in a market headed by Glory Days at \$2.80.

“He's always running on really well. He always tries his best but he just needs to strike the right tempo. He always relaxes in his races and he'll be running on well,” said Kay, who has yet to decide on upcoming starts for Dolcetto and Sylvester.

“There's the Wellington meeting coming up so there's plenty coming up but I haven't really looked past Saturday.”

KARAKA GRADUATES LAND FIVE AT CAULFIELD

With just over a month until the New Zealand Bloodstock National Yearling Sales, the benefits of buying in New Zealand were on show at Caulfield on Wednesday with five of the eight winners being graduates of the Karaka Sales.

Trainer Brent Stanley will take advantage of the summer off-season in a bid to build the profile of his Caulfield winner **Cryptic Jewel (NZ)** (Savabeel).

Stanley has always felt the Savabeel mare, who was having her fifth start in Wednesday's Ladbrokes Plate (1440m), was above average but had been thwarted by immaturity, both mentally and physically.

The mare delivered on her promise under Craig Williams in racing to a 1-1/4 length win.

While believing Cryptic Jewel to be better than Saturday city grade, Stanley won't be rushed in aiming too high, too soon.

"I wanted to get this maiden out of the way then we'll go through the grades," he said.

"This time of year it gives mares of her ability the chance to string a few together and build a profile for later on.

Cryptic Jewel was well supported to start the \$3.20 favourite and while Stanley was expecting the victory he didn't want to be over-confident.

"She was still growing into herself last campaign, a typical Savabeel mare, and she just took time to come right," Stanley said.

“But she did some good things in her first preparation for where she was mentally and she’s come back this time and has been impressive every time she’s been asked to do something.

“There’s plenty of upside to her and hopefully there’s a few more wins for her during the summer.”

Cryptic Jewel was a NZ\$300,000 purchase from the New Zealand Bloodstock National Yearling Sales from the draft of Westbury Stud.

The colours of syndicator Wylie Dalziel were carried to victory by **Royal Performance** (Camelot) over 1440m in the opening race for Ciaran Maher & David Eustace. The son of Camelot, who was purchased for NZ\$100,000 from the draft of Hallmark Stud, finished runner up in his only other start to date.

The David and Ben Hayes and Tom Dabernig-trained **Ocean Deep** (NZ) (Ocean Park) also sported Dalziel’s white and royal blue spots to win over 1440m and notch her third career victory from seven starts. The daughter of Ocean Park was bought for NZ\$65,000 from the draft of Waikato Stud.

Ex-pat Kiwis Trent Busuttin and Natalie Young sourced three-year-old colt **Blinder** from Karaka and the son of Snitzel lived up to his name when winning his second race from four starts.

A NZ\$300,000 purchase from the Lyndhurst Farm draft at the Ready To Run Sale, Blinder relished the step-up to 1440m.

Rounding out the program was promising staying three-year-old **Tavistock Dancer** (NZ) (Tavistock) for Caulfield trainer Mick Price.

The son of Tavistock, who was bought by Price for NZ\$260,000 from the draft of Cambridge Stud, made it two wins from two starts and the gelding looks a Classic prospect.

“He’s a typical New Zealand-bred staying type,” Price’s foreman Mick Nolan said.

“Before he trialled there was no big rap on him. He trialled and he was okay and then he went to Kilmore and won, which probably looked an ordinary maiden on paper, but his trackwork since has been excellent. He has improved out of sight.

“I was a bit worried about the track with the rail out, but he showed with a bit of class you can overcome some difficulties in life.

“A lot of those staying horses are dumb things early and they’re backward. It’s just like some footballers who don’t hit their peak until they’re 25.

“He’s got a nice future. When he gallops he has got a beautiful big flowing action, which is a good sign for a stayer.”

Chance To Dance (Teofilo)

Cups campaign ahead for Chance to Dance

Thoroughbred syndicator Fortuna have experienced a stellar season-to-date with Group One-winning mare Melody Belle (NZ) (Commands), but the return of another top-class horse has Fortuna Director John Galvin just as excited.

Multiple stakes winner **Chance to Dance** (Teofilo) made a pleasing return to the racetrack at Awapuni last month for trainer Jamie Richards, after a ten-month absence through injury, placing behind Beefeater (NZ) (Alamosa) over 1500m.

"It was one out of the box really," Galvin said. "He had ten months away from the track and starting over 1500m I thought it was a very encouraging run. It has set him up pretty nicely for our ongoing plans. [Full story here](#)



Xpression (NZ) (Showcasing)

Awapuni a stepping stone towards Group One

Group One performer **Xpression (NZ)** (Showcasing) will contest the Hyslop Plumbing 3YO Premier (1400m) at Awapuni on Saturday ahead of a tilt at Group One glory next month.

The Guy Lowry and Grant Cullen-trained filly ran third last-start in the Gr.1 New

Zealand 1000 Guineas (1600m) at Riccarton and while disappointed with that run, her connections are looking for redemption in the Gr.1 Levin Classic (1600m) at Trentham on January 12.

"Her run in the 1000 Guineas was disappointing," Lowry said. "It was okay, she learnt a lot, but you always like to win. [Full story here](#)



Grunt (NZ) (O'Reilly)

Grunt among the entries in All-Star Mile

Trainer Mick Price is hoping **Grunt's (NZ)** (O'Reilly) record at Flemington will help him become one of the popular horses with the voting public and he can gain a start in The All-Star Mile.

The inaugural All-Star Mile will be run on March 16 carrying prize money of \$5 million with 10 of the places to be determined by on-line voting which opens on January 21, six days after nominations close.

Grunt is a dual Group One winner over the All-Star Mile course and distance winning the Australian Guineas last autumn and the Makybe Diva Stakes in the spring.

He hasn't raced since finishing down the track behind Winx (Street Cry) in the Turnbull Stakes at Flemington in October.

"The All-Star Mile is tailor-made for him," Price said.

"His record over a mile at Flemington is outstanding so there was never any doubt that we would be entering him for the race.

"It's difficult to predict how it will play out in the first year, but I'm hopeful he'll win enough votes to get into the race.

"He has the right profile and form lines, so if people are being objective rather than subjective and voting for the horse they think can win the race, then I'd like to think he'd be pretty close to the top of the list.

"Maybe we'll just have to start a campaign that if you vote for Grunt, you can come to the stable and give him a pat."



Mi Blanco (NZ) (Cape Blanco)

NZ-bred treble at Happy Valley

Paul O'Sullivan always suspected he would make a slow start this season but the booking of Joao Moreira for **Mi Blanco (NZ)** (Cape Blanco) in race one worked out perfectly as the five-year-old relished a strong pace.

O'Sullivan reports that he has "a stack of new horses ready to go" and is set to be much busier than normal at morning trials in the next week or two.

Good Fit (NZ) (Encosta de Lago) proved a fine servant to the Michael Chang stable until joining Frankie Lor last season and continued to pay his way with his seventh Hong Kong success in race three.

Zilong's (NZ) (Shocking) win in race six provided another example of how a change of stable can help a horse return to peak form.

The five-year-old had shown promise without winning on several occasions when trained by O'Sullivan but got off the mark on just his second run for Peter Ho with a strong-galloping performance under Dylan Mo.

Te Akau double up at Ruakaka

Jamie Richards took his tally to 49 wins for the season with a double at Ruakaka on Tuesday.

Prise De Fer (NZ) (Savabeel) justified his race day favouritism taking out the Interislander Summer Festival Jan 5 Maiden (1400m).

"It was a lovely ride by Opie (Bosson)," Richards said. "He's still a little bit immature, but a progressive horse that we think can take the next step and we'll give him a chance to contest the better three-year-old staying races and see how we get on."

A race later **Weaponry (NZ)** (Declaration of War) followed up his debut win in November with victory in the Seasons Greetings Rating 65 (1400m).

"He won well at Rotorua, where he did a few things wrong and still won, but I was pleased to see Opie ride him a bit further back on Tuesday," Richards said.

"He got him to relax, and I thought he closed off really well. He only just won, but that's probably the best way to ride him because he can pull up if he gets to the front too soon."



Charm Spirit

28 winners for Charm Spirit

Windsor Park Stud stallion Charm Spirit continued his upward trajectory with a flurry of first-crop two-year-old winners in the northern hemisphere this week including a metropolitan double at Deauville.

On the eve of returning to England from his southern hemisphere base, the triple Group One winner extended his tally of individual two-year-old winners for the season to 28, placing him in second position by both individual winners and prize money to No Nay Never (Scat Daddy) - who has 29

winners - on the European First Season Sires' list.

Charm Spirit was also recently represented by his first southern hemisphere two-year-old Group performer when the Murray Baker and Andrew Forsman trained filly Aretha (NZ) debuted for third in the Gr.2 Wakefield Challenge Stakes at Trentham following two trials wins.

Charm Spirit has 24 yearlings catalogued for sale at New Zealand Bloodstock's National Yearling Sales next month.



Danzdanzdance (Mastercraftsman)

Ruakaka stars please in exhibition gallop

The Chris Gibbs and Michelle Bradley-trained pair of **Danzdanzdance** (Mastercraftsman) and **Hello It's Me (NZ)** (Darci Brahma) pleased their connections with their exhibition gallop at Ruakaka on Tuesday ahead of further black-type targets this summer.

Danzdanzdance was impressive last-start when winning the Gr.1 Captain Cook Stakes (1600m) fresh-up at Trentham, while Group Two winner Hello It's Me was disappointing with her unplaced run in the Gr.3 Counties Cup (2100m) last month.

"All is going well (with Danzdanzdance), I'm really happy with her," Bradley said. "She pulled up really well after Wellington, she was only down four kilos, which is nothing, she's put that back on already. I was extremely happy with her work on Tuesday.

"Hello It's Me is going really well, we are looking at the Rich Hill Mile (Gr.2, 1600m) on New Year's Day and her work was good on Tuesday with Danzdanzdance, I'm happy with both of them."

Meanwhile, the Gibbs and Bradley team unearthed a potential Gr.1 Vodafone New Zealand Derby (2400m) contender when Lumberjack (NZ) (Redwood) strolled to victory in the Coresteel Maiden (1600m) at Ruakaka on Tuesday.

The son of Redwood sports the colours of Australian syndication group OTI Management, who have previously enjoyed good success with the progeny of the Westbury Stud-stallion including stakes winners Night's Watch (NZ) and Romancer (NZ).



The Good Fight (NZ) (High Chaparral)

Ritchie in for The Good Fight

Cambridge trainer Shaune Ritchie is excited heading into the Christmas-New Year period with his in-form racing team.

Heading that list is High Chaparral four-year-old **The Good Fight (NZ)** who recorded his second career win from eight starts in the Pathways - The Immigration Specialists Premier (2400m) at Te Rapa on Saturday.

Ritchie has a lot of time for the gelding, who he purchased out of Rich Hill Stud's 2016 New Zealand Bloodstock Premier Yearling Sale draft for \$300,000, but said he still has a bit of maturing to do. [Full story here](#)

Classic assignments ahead for Mohaka

Dual stakes-placed filly **Mohaka (NZ)** (Nadeem) will return to the Hawke's Bay stable of trainers Guy Lowry and Grant Cullen in the coming weeks in preparation for Classic targets this autumn.

The Nadeem three-year-old finished unplaced in the Gr.1 New Zealand 1000 Guineas (1600m) last-start, after placing in her previous four starts, and her connections said she can be forgiven for that run.

"Mohaka is still spelling. I'd say the track wasn't in her favour that day in the Guineas and it was probably one too many (races for her)," Lowry said.

"She's likely to come back in within the next few weeks and we'll probably aim at some of those staying races in the autumn for the three-year-old fillies."

Bostonian ready for Railway

Smart Cambridge galloper **Bostonian (NZ)** (Jimmy Choux) is heading in the right direction as he prepares for the Gr.1 Sistema Railway (1200m) at Ellerslie on New Year's Day.

Trainer Tony Pike gave Bostonian an exhibition gallop between races at Te Rapa on Saturday and was pleased with his hit-out.

Ridden by Vinnie Colgan, Bostonian was timed to run the final 800m of his work in 47.72 and the last 600m in 34.83.

"He's thrived since his fresh-up run," Pike said.

"His coat wasn't through when he ran in the Counties Bowl, but he's come on a lot from that and he looks really well.

"He enjoyed his day out and had a nice hit-out. It was perfect leading into the Railway."

Bostonian has won seven of his 10 starts and he is unbeaten in his last four appearances.

He picked up a hat-trick of wins during a Queensland winter campaign last June and after a good spell he was an impressive fresh-up winner of the Listed Counties Bowl (1100m) at Pukekohe late last month.

Colgan has been Bostonian's regular rider this campaign and he gave Pike a glowing report after the exhibition gallop.

"Vinnie said he was relaxed and felt good," Pike said.

Pilley rides first winner in NZ

Visiting British jockey Patrick Pilley secured his first win in New Zealand when piloting Bridal Veil (NZ) (Niagara) to victory in the NZB Insurance Pearl Series Race (1400m) at Matamata on Wednesday.

The 21-year-old apprentice jockey, who has won 54 races in Britain, is working for winning trainers Michael Moroney and

Pam Gerard alongside his partner Hayley Ashcroft.

Pilley has only been in the country for a couple of weeks and he said it was great to get the breakthrough win.

"I've placed a few times, seconds and thirds, but it's nice to get my head in front," he said.

"I've been with Pam for a few weeks now and she's given me good opportunities, so I'm grateful."

Gerard was glowing in her praise of Pilley after the win and said she is enjoying having him in her stable.

"He's a great boy and he rides super," she said. "I can't believe he's struggling to get outside rides at the moment, but hopefully people will jump on the bandwagon now and he'll get support.

"He is a little bit taller and a bit heavier, so it restricts him a little but he's a very, very good rider."

Calder making himself at home

Eight months since moving back to New Zealand from Macau jockey Andrew Calder has quickly re-established himself as a strong addition to the Kiwi riding ranks.

Calder, who spent seven years riding in Macau, has won 15 races since his return in May, including one at Group Two level.

"I'm staying with my father-in-law, Richard Collett, so I've been riding work for him and showing up to every trial and race meeting in the northern area and slowly building up contacts," Calder said. [Full story here](#)



Grant Cooksley

Cooksley outed

Veteran rider Grant Cooksley will take no part in the busy Christmas-New Year racing period after being suspended for 16 race days following an incident at Ruakaka back on November 16 which resulted in a fall.

Cooksley admitted a charge of careless riding in that he permitted his mount So Glorious to shift inwards early in the home straight when insufficiently clear of Shafiq Rusof's mount Boundtobehonored which clipped heels and fell, with Tantalising, ridden by Danielle Johnson being brought down as a result.

While both horses escaped injury, Johnson, who was third on the national jockeys' premiership at the time, suffered multiple fractures to her collarbone, while Rusof suffered fractured ribs.

Cooksley will be able to resume riding after the conclusion of racing on January 8.

NZ Group One target for True Excelsior

Multiple stakes placegetter **True Excelsior (NZ)** (Exceed and Excel) will be aimed at the Gr.1 JR & N Berkett Telegraph (1200m) at Trentham on January 19.

The New Zealand-bred daughter of Exceed And Excel is prepared in Victoria by Leon and Troy Corstens and finished third behind Smart Coupe (Smart Missile) at Flemington last Saturday over 1100m.

Twice Group Three-placed, True Excelsior finished fourth to Shoals (Fastnet Rock) in the Gr.1 Sangster Stakes (1200m) back in May.

The Savabeel four-year-old is the granddaughter of four-time Group One winner Ethereal (NZ) (Rhythm) and the half-sister to dual Group three-winning mare Eleonora (NZ) (Makfi).

Bred and owned by Sir Peter Vela, Supera has won four of her nine starts and her

Auckland TBA show support for Vance

Earlier in the week injured jockey Maija Vance and her faithful dog Toro visited Haunui Farm, where the Auckland branch of the New Zealand Thoroughbred Breeders' Association presented her with a cheque for just over \$7,800.

The Cambridge jockey suffered extensive injuries after a fall at Rotorua on September 16.

"I have some feeling in my right leg, but at this stage none in my left," Vance said.

"I can stand and walk with the (walking) frame, but my brain has to tell my left leg what to do, that's why it is braced so it stays upright.

"I am making good progress, and our house is now all set up with ramps and things to cope with the wheelchair."

Vance said she uses the wheelchair if she is going to the shopping mall or longer distances, but prefers the walker, however this week she is undergoing further surgery and will be wheelchair bound for the following four weeks.

The Auckland branch of the NZTBA, along with Head Office and Dunstan Nutrition contributed to the fund to help with Vance's rehabilitation.
