BOOK 3 CLOSES TOP-CLASS WEEK AT KARAKA 2018



Lot 1210, the colt by Showcasing that topped the Book 3 Sale at Karaka

n a solid day of trading at the Book 3 session, the new format at Karaka 2018 has delivered a remarkable sales-week. With a steady buying bench, and 72 fewer lots catalogued than last year's Festival Sale, 113 lots sold for a turnover of \$1,537,750. With a healthy clearance rate of 84%, the median held at \$10,000 and the average settled at \$13,608.

"Whilst the average was slightly down on last year's third catalogue, the median remained the same," NZB's Managing Director Andrew Seabrook said.

"The highlight of today's Sale was the 84% clearance rate, which equals the record 2008 Festival Sale, and rounded off a fabulous week of selling."

The week's trading provided growth with all key figures the highest seen in a decade. Total receipts for the Sales Series were \$97,017,750, representing an average of \$106,379 across 912 lots sold (81% clearance) at a median of \$75,000.

Taranaki nursery Grangewilliam Stud earned bragging

rights from the Book 3 session when they sold the top-priced yearling and finished as the leading vendor by aggregate.

The Showcasing colt was consigned at Lot 1210 and is out of the winning mare Sahara (NZ) (Keeper) who is a half-sister to stakes winner Arica (NZ) (Anziyan). Hong Kong's Southern Bloodstock, and second leading buyer, set the benchmark of the day when Hallmark Stud's Mark Baker (as agent) went to \$68,000 to secure their one and only purchase.

The sale-topping colt bolstered the overall results for Grangewilliam Stud with 14 yearlings sold turning over \$252,000.

"It's been a great result, we certainly had a nice draft," Mark Corcoran of Grangewilliam Stud said.

"The Showcasing colt was by the right sire – he had another stakes winner yesterday and he can't do anything wrong.

"It was pleasing to see nice fillies selling well. We had a Proisir filly, a Reliable Man filly and a Zacinto filly that all sold very well."

Brighthill Farm featured twice in the leading tables. They finished as the second leading vendor by aggregate with 12 yearlings sold for \$119,000, while their resident sire Dalghar – who sired 2018 Karaka Million 3YO Classic winner Scott Base (NZ) – was the leading sire by aggregate turning over \$117,500 across 10 lots.

Cambria Park closed the top three vendors with six yearlings for a total of \$104,000.

Providing the highlight lot today was Haunui Farm's proven sire Showcasing (Lot 1210). With four lots sold for an average of \$28,250, he leads the sires by average table (with three or more sold). The promising Waikato Stud resident Ocean Park

has come in second on the table with four sold at an average of \$26,375, and the South Island-based Pure Champion – who stands at Willow Glen Stud – rounded out the top three at an average of \$24,000 across three lots sold.

Amongst the leading buyers was Kiwi trainer Lisa Latta who settled on three yearlings for receipts totalling \$66,500 and Marton-based trainer Fraser Auret who acquired four lots for \$63,000.

Making one gallant purchase for \$65,000, Joseph Waldron secured the second highest price today with the Ocean Park colt (Lot 1236) out of Haunui Farm's draft. The Karaka-based operation also sold another two yearlings from their draft averaging \$29,167 and concluding the Book 3 session as leading vendor by average (with three or more sold).

CANTERBURY RAIDER SNATCHES DUNEDIN GOLD CUP



Progressive stayer Pendleton races clear to score her biggest career win to date

Pendleton (NZ) (Rip Van Winkle) came of age at Wingatui on Saturday when she downed her mainly older rivals with a dominant performance to take out the Listed Fire & Mechanical Contracting Dunedin Gold Cup (2400m).

The lightly raced four-year-old was having just her ninth start, and first run since a win over 2100m at Timaru in late December, when she stepped up to tackle stakes company for the first time in the time-honoured contest.

Racing in the distinctive gold colours and navy blue cap of her owner, Valachi Downs Stud principal Kevin Hickman, the Rip Van Winkle mare enjoyed an economical trip in the early stages of the race as leading rider Samantha Collett settled her nicely beyond midfield.

Collett got moving on Pendleton with 900m to run as she looped the field to join issue on the point of the home bend. Kicked to the front by Collett, the mare was resolute to the finish as she held out a stern challenge

by fellow Canterbury raider Aspen Lass (NZ) (Alamosa) to score comfortably by more than two lengths at the line.

Co-trainer Shane Kennedy, who prepares Pendleton with partner Anna Furlong, was delighted by the performance after taking the gamble to tackle the black-type event.

"She's very promising and has progressed quickly over the last twelve months," he said.

"She only won her maiden in October so to take out a race like this at

just her ninth start is a top effort.

"She won well over ground at Timaru, so we had a look around to see what was coming up that would suit. There wasn't really anything as we didn't want to go to the West Coast circuit, so we took a punt for this one.

"She had a trial in January to keep her up to the mark and today she showed what she is capable of, courtesy of a very heady ride by Sam Collett."

Furlong indicated that he was looking further afield with the mare before she went for a winter break.

"I was having a chat with Jonathan Scully from Valachi Downs last night and we think a race like the St. Leger at Trentham next month would suit her," he said.

"We're mindful of not over-taxing her as I think she won't be at her best until she turns five, so if she does go to Wellington she would most likely go for a spell after that.

"She's an exciting prospect."

The victory proved a tonic for owner Kevin Hickman who suffered the misfortune of having to retire multiple Group One placegetter Savile Row (NZ) after the Makfi entire suffered a paddock accident on Friday.

The day got even better for Hickman when consistent performer Los Cabos (NZ) (Mastercraftsman) picked up her second career victory with a win over 1600m in the last race on the card, in the process giving winning rider Samantha Collett a treble.

Iffraaj connection key for Fraser-Campin

An established connection with Haunui Farm stallion Iffraaj was strengthened further for Cambridge-based trainer Mark Fraser-Campin on the final day of the New Zealand Bloodstock National Yearling Sale at Karaka.

Fraser-Campin outlaid \$30,000 for Lot 1119, a colt out of Tale Of The Cat mare Estelle (NZ), who was presented through the Woburn Farm draft.

The colt features Gr.1 Levin Classic (1600m) runner-up, Le Choix (Choisir), in his pedigree while he also traces back to outstanding Australian juvenile Dance Hero (Danzero) who won the 2004 edition of the Gr.1 Golden Slipper (1200m).

"We are members of the Iffraaj syndicate that stand him at Haunui Farm," said Fraser-Campin.

"We also owned and raced Kisses, who was a fabulous mare that won eight races, so we know a fair bit about his progeny.

"This is a nice, strong colt who will need a little time, which we are prepared to give him."

BAKER BAGS BOOK 3 SALE-TOPPER

allmark Stud boss Mark Baker continued a great sale for the progeny of Haunui Farm stallion Showcasing when he set the day's benchmark figure during the final session of the New Zealand Bloodstock National Yearling Sale at Karaka.

Acting on behalf of a Hong Kong based client, Baker outlasted a number of serious contenders to secure the athletic youngster for a final bid of \$68,000 from Matamata trainer Andrew Scott, who was the underbidder.

"There wasn't much petrol in the tank as I definitely had the staggers," said Baker when asked if he had been prepared to bid higher.

"He is a lovely colt, just a wonderful mover with a great temperament.

"We saw him yesterday and he made a real first impression."

The colt will now head back to Hallmark Stud for further development before any decisions on his racing future will be made.

Out of a race winning Keeper mare, the colt was consigned by Whanganui based Grangewilliam Stud, who had earlier sold a Zacinto filly, Lot 1219, for \$32,000 along with a Zed colt, Lot 1094, for \$24,000.

The colt headed off Lot 1236, an Ocean Park colt from the Haunui Farm draft that sold for \$65,000 to Te Awamutu trainer Joe Waldron, for the honour of the day's top price.

Waldron, who prepares another Ocean Park galloper in Gr.1 Vodafone New Zealand Derby contender, **Flying Feet**, admitted he had been desperate to buy the colt.

"He's just a quality horse who looks like a real three-yearold that might even run at two," he said.

"I've got a really nice Ocean Park in the stable in Flying Feet so I'm hoping he can follow in his footsteps.

"I've bought him on spec, so I've got to get him out there on social media to get him sold. If we could win the Derby with Flying Feet then he will look a very cheap horse."

Pitman continues family connection

The performance of promising juvenile Thunder Bay (NZ) (Niagara) has encouraged trainer Michael Pitman to extend the family connection at Karaka on Sunday.

Niagara filly Thunder Bay has made a flying start to her racing career with three-runner-up finishes in her first three starts including one at stakes level. Making the results even more impressive is the fact that two of those runs were behind Karaka Million (1200m) winner Avantage (Fastnet Rock) with the other behind Al Hasa (NZ) (Exceed And Excel), who placed second in the Karaka Million.

Pitman identified Lot 1092, the Niagara colt as one the one he wanted from the Book 3 sale and completed the deal when he went to \$25,000 to secure the colt from the Mapperley Stud draft.

"Michael had a good look at the colt on Friday and told me he was keen on him," said New Zealand Bloodstock representative Jim Bruford, who was bidding on behalf of the Riccarton conditioner.

"He really loves the older sister and the people who race her had asked him if they could be involved again if he bought the younger brother.

"I think they've just got another lovely horse."





GINGERNUTS ALMOST READY TO COME HOME TO NZ

riple Group One winner

Gingernuts (NZ) (Iffraaj) is
nearing a return home to New

Zealand three months after suffering a
serious injury at Flemington.

Gingernuts fractured a pastern on the way to the barriers for the Group One Emirates Stakes at Flemington on November 11.

He had surgery to correct the break at the University of Melbourne Veterinary Clinic at Werribee before being transferred to the nearby King's Park Equine Clinic. In early December he had a major setback when infection set in around the site of one of the screws in his leq.

After continued therapy,
Gingernuts is almost ready to go
home much to the delight of his many
owners who are part of a Te Akau
Racing syndicate.

Te Akau announced his impending homecoming on Twitter.

"GINGERNUTS' - are you ready for this??!! We sure are - we've dreamed about the day we could tweet & say to Jerry's army of supporters - JERRY IS COMING HOME!! Later next week - we are beside ourselves with joy!!! Yes he is now an honorary Australian with all that care #jerrylove" Te Akau said.

The winner of the New Zealand Derby in March last year, Gingernuts also won the Rosehill Guineas in Sydney in the autumn and added the Windsor Park Plate to his Group One record in September.

He will continue his rehabilitation in New Zealand with no indication yet whether he will race again.

SHILLELAGH TO RUN IN C F ORR STAKES



Classy mare Shillelagh will return to the track in the Gr.1 C F Orr Stakes this weekend

hile excitement builds for the return of champion Winx (Street Cry), her stablemate **Shillelagh (NZ)** (Savabeel) will bid for a second Group One victory in Melbourne in the C F Orr Stakes (1400m).

Winx will run in a barrier trial at Rosehill on Monday ahead of a possible defence of the Gr.2 Apollo Stakes (1400m) at Randwick on February 17.

Trainer Chris Waller is expected to confirm after the trial which path Winx will take with drama surrounding her jockey Hugh Bowman who needs to have two suspensions reduced on appeal to be back for the Apollo.

Shillelagh won the Group One Kennedy Mile at Flemington on November 4 and has had two barrier trials to get her ready

for Saturday's C F Orr Stakes at Caulfield where she will take on a quality field including last year's winner Black Heart Bart (Blackfriars).

"Shillelagh will run in the Orr with Michael Dee who won on her at Flemington to ride," Waller said.

"She is a good fresh horse and was unlucky when she raced at Caulfield last spring."

The mare came from near last in the Group Two Tristarc Stakes (1400m) on October 21 to run third, beaten less than a length, behind Global Glamour (Star Witness) and Cool Passion (Not A Single Doubt).

SERGEANT BLASTS BACK TO WINNING FORM

short break over the busy Christmas racing period has worked the oracle for handy sprinter-miler **Sergeant Blast (NZ)** (Darci Brahma).

The consistent five-year-old hadn't been seen at his best during a disappointing spring after showing immense promise in his earlier campaigns that included a victory in the Douro Cup (1600m) at Trentham.

Trainer Sam Lennox put the Darci Brahma gelding on the easy list for a few weeks in an effort to spark him up. The move delivered handsomely as he returned with a vengeance to down a small but competitive field over 1600m at New Plymouth on Saturday.

"It has been frustrating but there's nowhere to hide in this grade," said Lennox.

"He was racing against some really strong horses through the spring, when you look at what won those races, and he wasn't quite there.

"We gave him a break but you always wonder if you've done the right thing as sometimes they don't come back.

"He obviously had a few little issues but we're on top of them now."

Lennox admitted he had some concerns after his planned pre-race tactics went out the window early in the contest.

"We planned to be handier, but he's got a new habit of playing up in the gates," he said.

"He did again and missed the kick

badly. As it turned out it was a perfect spot to be in as he travelled up nicely with a bit of speed on.

"On the corner I thought we were a huge chance as I was pretty confident we had him right to return."

There was an early sensation in the race when the second favourite Scrutinize (NZ) (Savabeel) dipped shortly after the start and dislodged rider Michael McNab. Nothing appeared amiss with the Te Akau Racing runner as he galloped freely with the field for the remainder of the race, while McNab was shaken but unhurt by the incident.

YEARN READY FOR TE RAPA RETURN

rogressive mare **Yearn (NZ)**(Savabeel) is in fine fettle as she waits to make her return to the track at Te Rapa on Tuesday.

The Savabeel four-year-old is fresh off a short time-out following a disappointing showing in the Gr.2 Rich Hill Mile (1600m) at Ellerslie on New Year's Day.

"We're not too sure just what went wrong with her at Ellerslie," said trainer Karen Fursdon.

"I don't think it was the track, although it was very wet, as it just may have been one of those things.

"She is a mare that had done a lot in a very short period of time and it just may have caught up with her on the day."

Fursdon is confident she has the four-race winner back on the right track as she prepares to tackle a small but select line-up in a rating 85, 1400m contest.

"She's been working up well and I think she is fairly forward to resume," she said.

"I guess my only concern is one or

two will have race fitness on their side, but I still expect her to acquit herself well.

"Safely through the race we will make a decision on where we go from here, but her main aim will be the Group One at Te Aroha."

Fursdon was referring to the Gr.1 Fiber Fresh New Zealand Thoroughbred Breeders' Stakes (1600m) that will be run as the feature race at Te Aroha on 7 April.

NOWYOUSEE REDEEMS HIMSELF IN RDA CUP

Dictating terms from the outset in the \$80,000 RDA Cup (1100m), the son of O'Reilly never gave any anxious moments to the punters who decided that his \$7 odds were still better than bank interest.

The only moment

Knight (Duke Of Marmalade)
came issuing a challenge
inside the last furlong, but
the Titanium Racing-owned

galloper kept finding to rally home with one length to spare.

At his previous start, which was his first 2018 run coming off his undefeated campaign last season when a winner of two from two, Nowyousee was beaten for the first time in a Class 3 race over 1200m.

Le Grange did not blame the horse for not seeing out the trip. He blamed himself.

"I'm not convinced the horse doesn't get 1200m. I blame myself for his run at his last start," said the South African handler.

"The horse was a bundle of nerves in the parade ring that day, he was too fresh. We've put more work in him for his next start and it's paid off.

"A massive thank you to Jeff Soh and his father for their support. I was devastated after the last run, but they told me not to worry as these things happen. "It's not easy for these young horses to give weight to older horses. He is a very smart horse.

"Obviously, we've thought about the 3YO series for him, but I'd like to put him on grass first as we still have a bit of time."

The first Leg of the Singapore Three-Year-Old Challenge is the Singapore Three-Year-Old Sprint (1200m) on March 30.

With a record reading three wins and one second from four starts, Nowyousee has now seen his prizemoney bumped up to the \$130,000 mark for the Titanium Racing Stable.
