FESTIVAL SALE **ROUNDS OFF KARAKA 2017**



Lot 1132 - the Super Easy colt who topped the NZB Festival Sale prices when purchased for \$90,000

New Zealand Bloodstock's Festival Sale concluded the National Yearling Sales Series with pleasing results in terms of clearance and the day's top price.

In total 157 horses sold for a clearance rate of 78% with the top price of \$90,000 the highest price paid in the session since 2013. The total traded was \$2,332,000 (down from \$3,020,200 last year) for an average of \$14,854 (down from \$16,065 last year) and the median dropped from last year's figure of \$12,000 to equal 2015's figure of \$10,000.

"It was pleasing to see the Sale end up with 78% clearance and to have buyers from Australia, Hong Kong and Singapore stay on,"

"We also have some new initiatives domestically with the likes of the New Zealand Chinese Jockey Club that could grow to be quite considerable contributors to the industry" said New Zealand Bloodstock Managing Director Andrew Seabrook.

Purchasers of the day's highest priced Lot, the New Zealand Chinese Jockey Club bid to \$90,000 to secure Hallmark Stud's Super Easy colt at Lot 1132 from the winning O'Reilly mare Astrogal. Destined for the Donna Logan and Chris Gibbs stable, the group's CEO Alan Fu is pleased with how the concept has been received.

"There's been interest from the local Chinese community to invest in racehorse ownership for some time but the general perception out there was that it's a very expensive sport."

"We've put a lot into changing that perception, educating people and answering their questions."

"Syndication has made racing horses more accessible and our members like the idea, the lifestyle and the community we've created."

"When we showed the colt to investors today, he was quickly fully syndicated."

"We hope the Super Easy colt can be a Karaka Million horse and earlier in the Sale we also bought into a Power colt with David Ellis."

Paul Moroney Bloodstock outlaid the most in the Festival Sale, spending \$171,500 on four Lots including colts by Redwood and Roc de Cambes and fillies by Dalghar and

Showcasing with fellow local agent Phill Cataldo outlaying \$131,000 for five Lots. Victorian-based trainer Paddy Payne was the most active of the internationals with five Lots bought for \$113,000 and his top price paid being \$55,000 for an imposing Shocking colt at Lot 1179.

The session's leading vendor was Haunui Farm who traded 12 horses in total for \$193,000 including a top price of \$40,000 for Lot 1241 to Hong Kong-based Tartan Meadow Bloodstock.

Off the back of some pleasing results throughout the week, Little Avondale Stud and their resident sire Per Incanto topped the vendor and sire by average tables at \$40,833 and \$28,500 respectively. Stu Hale secured their leading price, purchasing Lot 1308 for \$42,500 with the colt being from the speedy, stakes-placed juvenile Silk Spur.

The final result for Karaka 2017 saw \$82 million traded, down 2% on the previous record breaking edition. The average remained steady at \$86,973 versus last year's \$88,042. The median declined to \$50,000, \$5,000 less than last year's record and \$5,000 more than in 2015. The clearance rate was an encouraging 78%, up from 75% in 2015 and down slightly from 2016 (80%).

PINHOOK POTENTIAL FOR DALGHAR COLT

A return to Karaka in November is well on the cards for a stylish Dalghar yearling that made an instant impact during the last day of selling at the NZB National Yearling Sale series on Sunday.

Consigned through the Long Acre Lodge draft as Lot 1212, the grey colt is from Groom Dancer mare Icy Reception. The colt hails from the extended family of Gr. 1 Galaxy Handicap winner Snowland (Snippets) along with the speedy Snippetson (Snippets) and multiple French stakes winner Myboycharlie (Danetime).

The colt captured plenty of attention during his time in the ring with the winning bid placed by Regal Farm principal Shane Crawford who outlaid \$70,000 to secure him.

Crawford, who had been active during the Select session

Crawford admitted that buying had been tough at the Sale series this year.

“As usual the really good types are well sought after and tough to buy,” he said.

“Unfortunately there just not enough of those horses here which has limited our options a bit.”

The progeny of the Brighthill Farm domiciled stallion Dalghar have been well sought after during the week with a top price of \$220,000 being paid by Sydney trainer Anthony Cummings for a colt offered as Lot 348 from the Brighthill Premier Sale draft. Cummings also went to \$100,000 to secure Lot 685, a grey colt offered by Brighthill during the Select Sale.

of the sale, was pleased to secure the colt as a likely prospect to return for the annual NZB Ready To Run Sale of Two-Year-Olds later in the year.

“He was a lovely type from a stallion that seems to be doing the business with his early crops,” he said.

“I saw him earlier in the week and he was a real stand-out. He was probably an expensive buy for the Festival sale but I think he was well worth it.

“He looks an ideal type for the Ready To Run sale as do the other yearlings we have bought this week.”

I AM A STAR TO RESUME IN G2 RUBITON STAKES



Group One filly *I Am A Star* resumes with a run at the Cranbourne trials today

Group One-winning filly **I Am A Star (NZ)** (*I Am Invincible*) will step out in a Cranbourne barrier trial today in preparation for her return against older horses in the Rubiton Stakes five days later.

Trainer Shane Nichols said *I Am A Star* would resume in Saturday's Group Two Rubiton Stakes (1100m) at Caulfield, with Craig Williams to ride.

"She's going well. She looks far better now than what she did in the spring," Nichols said.

"She's strengthened up, her work has been good.

"The Rubiton is a nice kick-off for her with 53.5 kilos to launch into a preparation that will involve possibly some trips to Sydney and back to Melbourne and even maybe Adelaide at the end of the preparation."

He said with a long campaign ahead, *I Am A Star* would not be fully wound up for the Rubiton in which she could come up against superstar sprinter *Chautauqua* (*Encosta De Lago*).

"She's coming into the preparation sound, well and in very good condition," Nichols said.

The trainer has pencilled in the Angus Armanasco Stakes (1400m) against her fellow three-year-old fillies as the likely second-up run before either the Australian Guineas or a trip to Sydney.

The Robert Sangster Stakes in Adelaide at the end of her campaign is also among her options.

While the Angus Armanasco is the likely second-up run, Nichols hasn't ruled out keeping the filly to sprints if she fires first-up.

"It is possible if she happened to run really, really well in the Rubiton, she may have a sprinting campaign," he said.

I Am A Star has won four of her nine starts including the *Quezette Stakes* and *Myer Classic* last spring.

She is entered in an 800m heat for three-year-old fillies today.

TE AKAU PROSPECT READY FOR CUP CHALLENGE

Lightly raced stayer **Hushed (NZ)** (Don Eduardo) indicated he was progressing nicely towards his main summer mission with a comfortable victory in the SVS Hamilton Cup (2000m) at Te Rapa on Saturday.

The Stephen Autridge and Jamie Richards trained gelding, who holds a nomination for the Gr. 1 Barfoot & Thompson Auckland Cup (3200m) next month, held out a late charge from favourite Von Tunzelman (NZ) (Zabeel) to earn his sixth career victory from just 15 starts.

The six-year-old opened his latest campaign with a win over 1400 metres at Stratford on New Year's Eve with Richards a little worried about the gap between runs before Saturday's contest.

"I thought the last 100 metres might find him out today with a month between runs and up to 2000 metres," he said.

"He handled it well and I'd say he's got an exciting future in front of him."

With the Gr. 2 Go Racing Syndications Avondale Cup (2400m) likely to be the gelding's next assignment, Richards and the Te Akau team had been keen for the gelding to show he would be comfortable at the higher level.

"I thought he stepped up and raced like a proper Cups horse today," he noted.

"He showed good natural gate speed and took a sit when Opie (Bosson) asked him to.

"Now he has a couple of runs under his belt I don't think it will be a problem to step up in distance. He's a lovely big, scopey horse by Don Eduardo and I think he's going to enjoy the mile and a half and even a bit further."

There was some controversy to the final result when both Francis Drake (NZ) (Tavistock) and Arrow In The Sand (NZ) (Fast 'N' Famous) were declared late scratchings in the event

when an incident involving the pair at the barriers opened prevented them receiving a fair start. – NZ Racing Desk

EARLY PRESENT FOR RITCHIE AT TE RAPA

Popular Cambridge horseman Frank Ritchie received an early anniversary present on Saturday when **Miss Dalghar (NZ)** (Dalghar) landed her second win from just three starts in the NZB Insurance Pearl Series sponsored rating 65 1400 metre event.

Ritchie and wife Colleen celebrate their fiftieth wedding anniversary this coming weekend, a fact made public by several races sponsored in their honour on the Te Rapa programme during the day. In a fitting result the Ritchie trained Dalghar three-year-old filly confirmed the promise she had shown when winning at the venue last month with another comprehensive performance.

Settled beautifully in the trail by apprentice Brendan Hutton, the filly lobbed along nicely behind the speed before being asked to extend into a gap early into the run home. The response was immediate as she burst

to the lead before cruising to the line to win comfortably by three quarters of a length at the post.

Ritchie was feeling on top of the world as he made his way through a throng of well-wishers to speak to media after the race.

"It's a big day for us with the family, except for Craig who's still in Sydney, all here so we've had a lot of support," he said.

"The owners of this horse have been owners of mine for 40 years so it increases the joy we're feeling right now."

Ritchie admitted he had been confident before the race although a little nervous if things didn't pan out in their favour.

"If she'd run last there weren't enough places for me to hide," he joked.

"She drew one and I knew coming up from 1200 to 1400 metres she could

sit a bit handier than last time.

"Brendan gave her a nice ride and she does have a turn of foot. We were aware that her main rivals were likely to get back in the run so if she was handy they would have had to come home in a pretty quick time to catch her."

The race was also a triumph for Hutton who registered the 100th win of his career on the filly.

"It's a great feeling and I'd just like to thank everyone who's helped me along the way, especially the Ritchie family who've supported me like I was their own son," he said.

"She's very smart and in her element today. She got to the line very strongly."

MCPHOEBE SET FOR BOLD PERFORMANCE

Otaki trainer Johno Benner is convinced his promising three-year-old filly **McPhoebe (NZ)** (Makfi) is ready for her biggest challenge when she tackles her older rivals in the Te Power Rapa Wairarapa Thoroughbred Breeders Stakes (1600m) at Tauherenikau today.

The Makfi filly is coming in to the contest off the back of an unlucky run for fifth in the Gr. 3 Wellfield Desert Gold Stakes where she was finishing on strongly after getting well back from an outside barrier.

Benner was delighted with that performance and believes a better draw this time could make all the difference for his charge.

“She went massive in the Desert Gold and we were thrilled with the run,” he said.

“She jumped well but had to go back and with the slow pace they set she really didn’t have any business finishing as close as she did.

“She was four wide trying to get into the race and never stopped trying in the run home so all in all you couldn’t be disappointed with the effort.”

Despite winning over a sprint trip twice as a juvenile, Benner believes the filly will be best suited by more ground as she matures.

“She used to rip and tear into it as a two-year-old which meant she was never going to get past 1200 metres,” he explained.

“This season we’ve tried to get her to settle in her races and it seems to have worked the oracle. She was

very good winning first up after settling midfield and then went a cracker for second at Trentham when she came from the back again.

“We’ve got her nominated for the Oaks in March so you want to see her running on strongly in her races and she has done just that recently.”

Benner knows the filly faces a stiff challenge in tackling the older mares but feels the opportunity to gain some valuable black-type is too good to pass up.

“It won’t be easy as there are some tough mares lining up against us but we do have plenty in our favour including the weight advantage and great draw she has received,” he said.

“I’d expect her to take up a prominent position if she jumps well and I’m hoping she will be right in the finish if things go her way.”

NEW GROOM SWEEPS **CLEAN WITH ONE RIDE**

The wedding gift may have come one week late, but just-married jockey A'Isisuhairi 'Harry' Kasim still greeted Sunday's win aboard **Hiko Yunikon (NZ)** (Lucky Unicorn) as another welcomed blessing to his newfound status.

The former two-time Singapore champion apprentice jockey tied the knot with fiancée Jannah on January 28, a doubly auspicious day given it was also the first day of the Lunar New Year.

With no honeymoon yet planned for the young couple, the Kelantan-born 31-year-old went straight back to work on Monday, taking four rides, with two third placings as his closest to taking his marital bliss to another

level.

With decent chance Hiko Yunikon his only one booking at Sunday's meeting, A'Isisuhairi did not let that one bullet go begging. The \$17 chance was always in an ideal spot in fifth spot on the rails, less than three lengths off pacesetter Super Big (Badge Of Silver) before improving around the weakening leader as they rounded the home turn.

Super Joy (Northern Afleet) would not let him slip away as he stuck on well on his outside, but Hiko Yunikon reigned supreme as he went on to post a three-quarter-length victory. The winning time was 1min 6.69secs for the 1100m on the Polytrack.

"I just got married and it's a great

feeling. It feels like I'm starting a new life," said A'Isisuhairi.

"Maybe it's the new responsibilities, but I just feel like I have an even greater confidence to go out there and win more races now.

"That was my only ride of the day, but sometimes it's not about the quantity but the quality. The right horse came along and he was in the right race.

"I rode him at his last two starts and he was down in class today. Things just worked out perfectly for him."

Raced by the Perpetuals Racing Stable, Hiko Yunikon was recording his fourth win in 32 starts, but his first under this name and his first for Mok. The Lucky Unicorn five-year-old used to be known as Best Nine when prepared by Alwin Tan.

HIGH FIVE FOR NOVA SWISS

Champion trainer Alwin Tan summed **Nova Swiss (NZ)** (Swiss Ace) up as “classy” after the bold three-year-old brought his unblemished record to five wins from as many starts on Sunday.

“I have only one word to describe him: Classy,” said Tan.

“He’s won five from five now. Only classy horses do that.

“I have no doubt in my mind he has a brilliant future here at Kranji. But he needs to prove himself in better races from now on.”

Tan has pencilled in the Group 2 Merlion Trophy (1200m) on March 5 as the race that would definitely cement that “classy” status further.

“I will run him in the Merlion Trophy. I think it’s the ideal first test in a Group race for him,” he said.

“Then of course, there is the Singapore Three-Year-Old Challenge to look at. I think he’s looking for more ground, but he has not raced on turf yet and that is still a question mark.”

The Singapore Three-Year-Old Challenge is made up of three Legs run over 1200m, 1400m and 1600m, but all run on turf, which Nova Swiss has yet to step over.

Manoel Nunes, who has been aboard at all five wins, also waxed lyrical about the son of Swiss Ace when he dismounted, but said he had to keep an eye on Speedy Dragon (Safe In The USA) in the home straight, to prevent any last-minute surprise.

“He’s a lovely horse and is a good Polytrack performer. Today, he was travelling beautifully and he was too good for them,” said the three-time Singapore champion jockey.

“I was just a bit surprised when I saw Speedy Dragon was

right on my inside in the straight. He’s a very good Polytrack horse and I just wanted to make sure he did not sneak up on us.

“My horse was just too good. I think he is a horse who is getting stronger and stronger.”

With that fifth win, Nova Swiss has now taken his earnings past the \$210,000 mark for his owners.
