DERBY ASSAULT WELL ON TARGET FOR BAKER FORSMAN TEAM



Vodafone New Zealand Derby candidate Mongolian Legend gets a timely win at Te Rapa

A potential five-pronged attack on the \$1million Vodafone New Zealand Derby is still on the cards for the powerful Murray Baker and Andrew Forsman stable after Saturday's results at Te Rapa.

The Cambridge stable lined up two of their Derby prospects on the weekend with the Inner Mongolia Rider Horse Industry owned **Mongolian Legend** (Fastnet Rock) enhancing his prospects of a start in the Group One classic

with a gritty victory over 2100 metres in the last race of the day. Stablemate Jon Snow (NZ) (Iffraaj) showed he was also still very much in Derby contention when he battled gamely to the line to finish less than 4 lengths from Volkstok'n'barrell (NZ) (Tavistock) who took out one of the day's Group One features, the Herbie Dyke Stakes (2000m).

Baker was a happy man as he reflected on the performances of his two runners.

“Jon Snow was very brave but probably just needed some rain to show his best,” he reflected.

“He sticks really well and didn’t give it away in what was a pretty hot field.

“Mongolian Legend is a horse with a lot of potential so I was pleased to see him get the win which is only going to help him as he makes progress in this campaign.

“He’s a colt who can take his mind off the job at times, which you saw on the weekend when he did a few things wrong, so hopefully he will learn a little more from the run.”

Saturday’s Gr. 2 Retina Specialists Avondale Guineas will see the remaining three Baker/Forsman Derby contenders line up as they build to the blue riband event at Ellerslie on 4 March.

“Mongolian Wolf, Highlad and Camino Rocosco will all start in the Avondale Guineas,” advised Baker.

“We’re very pleased with them all though Highlad is one who could do with some easing in the track.”

Baker was also thrilled with the performance of multiple Group One winner Turn Me Loose (NZ) (Iffraaj) who finished a courageous second in Saturday’s Gr. 1 CF Orr Stakes at Caulfield.

“He went a beauty to finish second behind a high class horse in Black Heart Bart,” he said.

“He stumbled away at the start which didn’t help but I was delighted how he fought so well after making all the pace following his trouble at the barrier.

“He’s a five-year-old now so he takes a bit of racing to get fully fit so I’m hoping he will be spot on for the Futurity in a fortnight.”

Turn Me Loose will look to make it back-to-back wins in the Gr. 1 Futurity Stakes (1400m) when he tackles the event at Caulfield on the 25th of February.

GULLIVER CONVINCED SHADOW FOX CAPABLE OF A WINNING MILE

Despite finishing midfield in his first attempt at elite company in last month's Thorndon Mile at Trentham, Stratford trainer Steve Gulliver is convinced his stable star **Shadow Fox (NZ)** (Keeninsky) has what it takes to win over 1600 metres at the highest level.

The lightly raced six-year-old was back in the winner's circle on the weekend when he once again led all the way to capture the Carters Ashhurst Pohangina Cup at Woodville. Sent out a warm favourite the Keeninsky gelding never gave his five rivals a look in as he set up a solid pace in front before easing clear in the run home to score by three lengths in a smart 1.23.01 for the 1400 metre journey.

Gulliver, who part owns the gelding along with breeder Alistair Murdoch, acknowledged there was one main mission leading into Saturday's contest.

"We said all we wanted was a Cup to drink from on the way home and that's what we got," he joked.

"Seriously though it was good to see him bounce back as he had a pretty tough run at Trentham. He had to work overtime to get the front that day from a wide draw and I think that really told on him at the business end."

Gulliver is keen to see his charge step up to a mile again in top company as he is a firm believer the horse can cope with the extra distance.

"Plenty of people are saying he won't get a mile but I reckon he will,"

he reiterated.

"He's still learning the game as he's only had 13 starts now. When he first went to the races I used to cringe a bit as he was just all over the place with his action even though he won his first two starts.

"He's just got better with time and I think with some more ringcraft about him he can handle a mile in the top grade."

With that in mind Gulliver is keen to plot a course to the Gr. 2 Manco Easter Stakes (1600m) at Ellerslie on 22 April to test his theory.

"I've got the Easter in mind for him so it's just a matter of working out how we get there," he said.

"He goes well fresh so we might try and find a race for him up there in the next month or so and, if he handles going right-handed, we'll take him back for the Easter in April."

PERSEVERANCE PAYS OFF FOR TALENTED MARE

Supporters of the well favoured **Romantic Maid** (High Chaparral) were breathing a sigh of relief as the promising mare finally secured a deserved victory when taking out The Edge 97.8FM sponsored rating 85 mile at Te Rapa on Saturday.

The Roger James trained four-year-old had been desperately unlucky at each of her previous three runs and for a split-second it looked like history would be repeated as she was blocked when searching for a gap in the concluding stages of the contest.

This time fate played in her favour as rider Danielle Johnson found clear air at the 150 metre mark which allowed the mare to put paid to her challengers with a devastating turn of foot.

Johnson, who was having her first ride on the daughter of High Chaparral in this campaign, was the first to admit she had some dark thoughts when looking for space in the home straight.

"At the 400 I could hear Roger cursing my name," she laughed.

"It was going to be like a horror film if she didn't get up and win. She's a promising mare though and at her last few runs she's been luckless.

"She got that luck today and she's been dominant."

James also cut a relieved figure when questioned about the performance.

"That was a pretty deserved win as anybody who'd seen her previous three runs would have seen she's been unlucky," he said.

"I thought she was going to be unlucky again but full credit to Danielle as she had a plan B and managed to secure the right run before the mare did the rest."

James acknowledged he had thought of his charge as a potential stayer in her early days but had revised that opinion in this campaign.

"I did give her the opportunity at further than a mile last year but at the end of the season I said she was probably a 1600-2000 metre horse," he advised.

"We had a little hiccup at the beginning of the week so we were a bit nervous going in to this run. I just hoped that she would be okay on the firm track as she had only worked on the plough at home.

"Provided she comes through the run she will back up in the Taranaki Cup as I do think there is a big race in her somewhere."

The Gr. 3 Platinum Homes Taranaki Cup is the feature event on the card at New Plymouth this Saturday.

LATE DASH GETS ODISHA HOME AT TE RAPA

A stunning finish from near last by promising mare **Odisha (NZ)** (Darci Brahma) saw her claim victory in emphatic fashion at Te Rapa on Saturday.

The Nigel Tiley trained four-year-old had produced a similar effort at the track back in December however she was one of the forgotten runners in the Distinction Hamilton Hotel sponsored 1400m event as punters installed last start Ellerslie winner Break My Stride (Zoffany) as a commanding favourite.

That favouritism looked well justified as Break My Stride enjoyed a lovely trail throughout the early stages of the race before angling into the clear to make his challenge at the top of the home straight. As the field fanned out across the track it became obvious the favourite was struggling to reel in the pacemakers and a grandstand finish was on the cards.

Just as local runner Thatsforsure (NZ) (Tavistock) was being hailed the winner at the 100 metre mark, Odisha and rider Michael McNab found the gap two off the fence and flashed up late to nab the victory.

Tiley was quick to acknowledge a heady ride by McNab. "Michael rode her really well," he said.

"He knows her well and he knows what she is capable of doing so it was a good effort."

The performance has Tiley looking ahead to next season with the mare who he believes will only get better with age.

"She's got a bit of breeding as she's a half sister to a Group

One winner," he noted.

"By Darci Brahma she's only going to get better with age.

"I think a mile is not going to be any issue for her and with another year on her, it will do her the world of good."

Tiley was referring to injury plagued galloper Historian (NZ) (Choisir) who finished runner-up to Jimmy Choux (NZ) (Thorn Park) in the 2011 New Zealand Derby before capturing a Group One double in 2013 with the Thorndon Mile at Trentham followed by the Zabeel Classic at Ellerslie later that year.

WALKER GIVES MAJOR TOM HUGE COMPLIMENT

Trainer Mark Walker paid **Major Tom (NZ)** (Darci Brahma) a huge compliment when he described the Sunday winner as “above average” following his sizzling victory in the \$65,000 Initiation race over 1400m.

Already knocking on the door for a while, the Darci Brahma three-year-old left his 11 rivals reeling when a saloon passage presented itself at the top of the straight.

Lengthening up under Shafiq Rizuan’s urgings, Major Tom opened up to a commanding break and by the 200m was well clear as he went on to hit the line 1 ¾-length clear of the fast-finishing newcomer Chalaza (NZ) (Road To Rock) with Mr Exchequer (NZ) (Savabeel) boxing on well for third place another 2 ¼ lengths away. The winning time was 1min 22.86secs for the 1400m on the Short Course.

Major Tom, whose final quote was \$10, has been a steady improver at his first three starts, especially the last one when he stormed home for second in a Restricted Maiden race over 1400m three weeks ago.

“He’s a promising horse who has kept improving with every run, especially when he will get over a mile,” said the 2015 Singapore champion trainer.

“He is well above average, and I will now run him in a Novice race over 1400m.

“The Three-Year-Old series is something I have in mind for him, but he will skip the first Leg and go for the second Leg instead.”

Walker was referring to the Singapore Three-Year-Old Challenge which kicks off with the Group 3 Singapore Three-Year-Old Sprint (1200m) on March 26 followed by the Group 2 Singapore Three-Year-Old Classic (1400m) on April 14 and the Group 1 Singapore Guineas (1600m) on May 14.

The race he has pencilled in for Major Tom next is a Novice race over 1400m on March 12.

Shafiq said the race became a simple formality the moment he had the leading duo in his sights from a long way out.

“He drew one and had an ideal run behind the two horses. When they came off the rails, he just quickened through for a very easy win,” said Shafiq.

“It was my first time riding him in a race but I know him well as I rode him at his first barrier trials last year, and he always showed ability.”

Raced by the Fortuna NZ Racing Stable of John Galvin, Major Tom is a three-year-old by Darci Brahma out of the Spinning World mare Spin ‘N Grin.

LAKE HUKA KEEPS LAXON **HAPPY BACK HOME**

English jockey Alan Munro seems to hold the key to getting the best out of **Lake Huka (NZ)** (Guillotine) after he produced him with a well-timed run to clinch the \$60,000 Class 4 Division 2 race over 1400m on Sunday.

In the three times the pair combined between June and September last year, they hit paydirt once, at their first partnership which came in a Kranji Stakes D race over 1200m.

The winning styles between then and Sunday were almost identical. Switch off at the rear only to have the last crack inside the last furlong.

With winning trainer Laurie Laxon still back in his native New Zealand, the job of talking up Lake Huka's latest success was left in the good hands of his assistant-trainer Shane Ellis.

"His last two runs (eighth and seventh but not all that far behind the winners) were better than what it looked like on paper," said Ellis.

"We stepped him up to 1400m again and he hit the line good. There was a good tempo to the race and that helped him get home first.

"Munro has a good record on him and he rode him a treat again today."

While Ellis said the genuine tempo seemed to suit the Silver Fern Racing Stable-owned gelding, Munro said he had to contend with a lack of pace early in the race.

"There was not much speed early, and he ran relaxed at the back," he said.

"He showed a good finish to win and that was exactly what he did at his last win with me. He suits me a lot this horse."

A five-year-old by Guillotine, Lake Huka has now brought his record to four wins and five placings from 24 runs for stakes earnings in excess of \$170,000 for his owners.

GILT COMPLEX MAKES WINNING LOOK SIMPLE

After **Gilt Complex's (NZ)** (Gold Centre) last win came over 2200m last November, a drop back to 1400m looked on the sharp side, but the New Zealand-bred showed his versatility with a brilliant

win in the \$80,000 Class 3 race on Sunday.

The Gold Centre five-year-old was even considered a Singapore Gold Cup hopeful last year, but unfortunately missed the cut.

Trainer Cliff Brown has since given the Graham Mackie-owned galloper a break only to bring him back for this race, which he eventually claimed by storming right on the outside under new partner Michael Rodd to defeat the better-fancied Skywalk (NZ) (Battle Paint) by three quarters of a length at lukewarm odds of \$69.

The victory brought up Brown's 400th winner at Kranji since he

relocated from Narbethong, Victoria in 2007.

"He's a lovely horse (Gilt Complex). We put him away after his last run and he has come back stronger," said Brown.

"I haven't planned anything for him yet, but he'll win a good race one day."

Rodd said the best way to approach the race was to treat it as a mile.

"I made it more of a mile race and it's paid off," said the Australian jockey.

"It was a smart field, but he's also been racing against better horses before. He's a quality horse.

"I thought the weight difference

between him and Skywalk (2.5kgs) would make it tough for us, but he dug deep and went past Skywalk quite well."

Gilt Complex now boasts a handy record of five wins and five placings from 17 starts for stakes earnings that have now shot past the \$270,000 mark for Mackie.
