SPEEDSTER HAS THEM CHASING SHADOWS AT TRENTHAM



Shadow Fox and Robbie Hannam are lonely as they hit the line at Trentham

Tearaway tactics saw promising sprinter **Shadow Fox (NZ)** (Keeninsky) spread-eagle his rivals at Trentham on Saturday as he cantered to an effortless four and a half length victory in the Central ITM Premier open sprint (1400m).

The six-year-old was perfectly rated by rider Robbie Hannam who sent him straight to the front from barrier rise. Hannam had him pinging along at a constant speed that saw the pair several lengths clear of their nearest

pursuer throughout the contest. Slipped a little more rein on straightening Shadow Fox lengthened nicely to streak away as he won untouched in 1.23.00 for the 1400 metre journey.

The victory made it back-to-back wins for the showy Keeninsky gelding after he resumed with a victory at Otaki following a lengthy break away from the track. The lightly raced gelding was having just his eleventh career start for trainer Steve Gulliver who

has shown plenty of patience with his charge after a change of heart early in his career kept him in the stable.

“We nearly had him sold but we decided to keep him,” he explained.

“He’s just needed time more than anything although he had a lung infection last year which cost us a couple of races.

“He’s a pretty good horse.”

Gulliver was playing his cards close to his chest when questioned about the immediate prospects for his charge.

“He’s pretty quick but we don’t really have anything in mind for him,” he said.

“We weren’t actually going to line him up and wait for Cup day but with only six or seven starting we thought we’d have a crack.”

Amazing Kids dominates in Hong Kong

Former New Zealand galloper **Amazing Kids (NZ)** (Falkirk) took out the HK Gr. 3 Bauhinia Sprint Trophy (1000m) at Sha Tin on Sunday. Raced under the name Cousin Colin the five-year-old Falkirk gelding was successful in one of two New Zealand starts from the Lisa Latta stable before his sale to Hong Kong. Now trained by John Size the gelding has proved a model of consistency having won six of his sixteen Hong Kong starts along with a further seven placings.

Handled expertly by Joao Moreira, Amazing Kids settled well off the early pace before unleashing a devastating burst that carried him to an easy one and a half length victory in a rapid 55.90 for the 1000 metre contest.

Amazing Kids was having his first start since finishing a creditable 4th behind Aerovelocity (NZ) (Pins) in the Gr. 1 Longines Hong Kong Sprint (1200m) back in early December.

Ridden a treat by apprentice Jordan Nason, the bonny grey mare bowled along at the head of affairs as her five rivals left her alone in front. Things started to get serious as the small field thundered towards the home turn with the majority fanning wide to make their challenge.

Nason was cool, calm and collected as he asked the mare to quicken and she responded gamely as the threats came. Breaking Dawn (NZ) (Gold Mine) and the late finishing Sierra Beel (NZ) (Savabeel) both looked likely but

Maid Of Steel pulled out plenty as she staved the pair off to score by just on a length.

The win made it three in a row for the Guillotine mare who has now won seven of her 24 career starts.

“It was a good ride by Jordan as he took the pace right out of the race,” acknowledged Wayne Pike, who was representing his son on the day.

“He didn’t go hard on her and they set it up for him really.”

Pike acknowledged there was an element of good fortune in the victory

after the racemeeting was postponed from earlier in the week.

“It was lucky there was a break as we weren’t going to come,” he said.

“She’s had two weeks between races which was great. She’s a good little mare.”

GEAR CHANGE WORKS THE ORACLE FOR KOLONEL KEV

Consistent customer **Kolonel Kev (NZ)** (Darci Brahma) returned to winning form at Trentham on Saturday when he upset the favourites in a small but select field in the Merial Ancare Premier 1600.

The five-year-old gelding was scoring his fifth career victory off the back of two handy placings following a disappointing campaign at Riccarton during New Zealand Cup Week back in November. Trainer Lisa Latta was looking for answers after those out of character performances and found them with a gear change for his most recent appearances.

“When we took him to Riccarton he went pretty bad down there,” she noted.

“He was sort of making a bit of a gargling noise when pulling up so we put the tongue tie on him for the last two and it has really improved him.

“We also knew we had to ride him a bit quieter and get him off the bridle. He didn’t draw well so I just said go back and ride for a bit of luck.”

Rider Jonathan Riddell, who was scoring the first leg of a winning double for the day, followed those instructions to the letter as he sat back last in the six strong field for most of the journey. Showing an abundance of patience, Riddell waited for a gap to appear one off the fence in the run home before driving his mount through to contest the finish.

Kolonel Kev showed plenty of fight as he held out the challenges of race favourite Beefeater (NZ) (Alamosa) and northern visitor Irish Call (NZ) (Civics) to score by a head at the line.

Riddell was a satisfied man after the race.

“He’s been a little disappointing but he does have plenty of ability,” he said.

“You’ve just got to switch him off and look for that late run as he puts in that way.

“They went a bit of a canter but that’s what you get in small fields.”

The victory took Kolonel Kev’s career prizemoney past the \$150,000 mark for owner Kevin Pratt who races the gelding under his Kamada Racing banner. A full brother to the gelding will be offered as Lot 827 from the Pencarrow Stud draft during the Select session of the upcoming National Yearling Sale Series at Karaka.

SYDNEY VICTORY PERFECT TIMING FOR LOCAL STALLION



Little Avondale stallion Per Incanto

The breakthrough victory for former Group One winning juvenile Dal Cielo (NZ) (Per Incanto) in Sydney on Saturday couldn't have come at a better time for his sire **Per Incanto** (Street Cry).

The Little Avondale Stud based stallion has enjoyed an outstanding start to his career with his first three crops producing 62 winners from just 133 runners. Amongst his star

performers are Dal Cielo who captured the Gr. 1 Diamond Stakes as a two-year-old, Saracino (NZ) who took out the Gr. 2 Foxbridge Plate earlier this season, leading Singapore galloper Magnum (NZ) and the exciting Hong Kong based Baba Mama (NZ).

However Little Avondale principal Sam Williams knows it is performance in the competitive Australian market that is a key component of the

demand for a stallion's progeny. The victory by Dal Cielo has delighted him as Little Avondale put the finishing touches on their offerings for the annual National Yearling Sale series that kicks off at Karaka later in the month.

"The win has really given me a buzz as it is just neat to see him getting back on the track and into winning form," he said.

“He was the star juvenile of his year in New Zealand which really helped to put Per Incanto on the map.

“It also meant a big decision for his owners when he started his three-year-old season as they were also all involved in Per Incanto. They knew if he could go to Australia and perform over there it would be a massive boost for Per Incanto as that Australian form is the benchmark for so many of our international buyers when it comes to sale time.

“They took the punt and campaigned him there but nothing really went right for him. He ended up being sold and has had the two starts now for Kris Lees with that win being a just reward.”

Williams is upbeat about the prospects for Per Incanto as the countdown to Karaka begins.

“Per Incanto is simply flying at the

moment,” he said.

“I think he’s had something like six winners in the last week and 29 individual winners already this season. That places him third on the general Sires premiership, behind only Savabeel and Darci Brahma, as well as being second to Savabeel in the three-year-old category.

“That’s pretty good company to be in and all the more remarkable off a \$4,000 service fee at that time compared to the other two that were both around that \$30,000 mark at a similar stage of their careers.”

Little Avondale will offer 15 Per Incanto individuals through their draft over the six days of the Karaka sale with Williams particularly impressed by the fourth crop of their sire.

“This year his yearlings seem to have followed the pattern of his first crop,” he advised.

“They are a deep brown in colouring, very well muscled and very scopey.

“There are some very lovely types but if I had to pick a couple out it would be most likely one of the colts in the Premier sale and another from the Select sale.

“Lot 426 is a half to Manawatu Cup winner Jacksstar and is cracking individual while Lot 638 is a full brother to the promising Fibonacci.

“Those are two that have caught my eye but overall we are very pleased with our draft and we are really looking forward to buyers getting a chance to see them all at Karaka.”

The annual New Zealand Bloodstock Yearling Sale series commences at Karaka on Monday the 30th of January.

MORE IN STORE **FOR ROCK ON**

The Gary Vile trained **Rock On (NZ)** (Road To Rock) confirmed his reputation as a stayer on the rise as he produced a devastating late burst to score a convincing victory at Trentham on Saturday.

Beautifully handled by rider Jonathan Riddell, Rock On was tardily away in the BJW Motors sponsored 2300 metre event but soon recovered to sit just beyond midfield in the early stages of the contest. A muddling speed saw a number of contenders take their chance in front with the numerous lead changes conspiring to shuffle Rock On to the rear of the field.

Angled to the outer on the point of the home turn the Road To Rock gelding wound up beautifully as Riddell timed their final charge to perfection to score handsomely by a widening half length margin at the post.

Vile admitted he had his doubts about the win when his charge was shuffled back at a vital stage.

"I have to be honest I was a bit nervous around the 600 metre mark as he hadn't moved on him," he admitted.

"But he must have known he was going alright!"

The four-year-old gelding has been a work in progress for Vile for quite some time with the Awapuni based mentor taking a cautious approach with him as he works through the grades.

"I've pulled him out of the Wellington Cup as while I think physically he is okay, to mentally go two miles at the moment would just be a little too much," he said.

"He's only a four-year-old but if everything goes right he'll be back here for the Summer Cup and then we'll see from there.

TERMS OF REFERENCE PROVIDES VORSTER WITH FIRST WIN FOR LE GRANGE

Jockey Barend Vorster was rapt he put his first winner for Ricardo Le Grange on the board on Sunday.

The two men have been behind a glut of winners - probably around 500 from his overall haul of 708 winners - during the Patrick Shaw era where Vorster was the No 2 (behind the likes of Johnny Geroudis, Mark du Plessis and Robbie Fradd) and then No 1 rider in the last five years since he relocated from South Africa to Singapore in 2003 and Le Grange was Shaw's assistant-trainer from Day 1.

But **Terms Of Reference's (NZ)** (Per Incanto) win in the \$60,000 Class 4 Division 2 race over 1200m was Vorster's first

win for Le Grange as a trainer in his own right.

After Shaw decided to take a 6 ½ month-sabbatical leave, Le Grange has stepped up to take the helm, with two winners already registered on January 2, both ridden by Nooresh Juglall, who shared the bulk of the Shaw rides with Vorster.

Vorster, who turned 40 on December 31, has not been left out of the scoresheet into the New Year either, with the Laurie Laxon-trained debutant Aotearoa (NZ) (Sakhee's Secret) opening his 2017 account on Friday, but saluting for Le Grange bore a special meaning to him.

"It's good to get one win under the belt for Ricky," said Vorster.

"This horse has a bit of class on his side, and today, he was down in class, but he was shouldering a bit of weight (57kgs).

"It looked like he would win easily at the top of the straight, but the weight difference was a factor. Still, he fought on very well!"

Le Grange was full of praise for the effort.

"Great ride by Barend, and it's also great for the owners Bernard Kantor and Mark Yong," said Le Grange.

"The horse was back in Class 4 and the drop back in distance also helped him. We also put the blinkers back on him and it's done the trick."

A New Zealand-bred by Per Incanto, Terms Of Reference was posting his fifth win from 26 starts for stakes earnings that have now tipped over the \$260,000 mark for the BM Stable.

SONG NOT ASKING FOR THE MOON AS DERBY TARGET SET

Emerging stayer **Song To The Moon (NZ)** (Savabeel) did his Singapore Derby aspirations no harm with a gutsy winning performance in the \$60,000 Class 4 race over 2000m at Kranji on Sunday.

Prepared by first-year trainer Ricardo Le Grange, the Savabeel four-year-old was given a ground-saving run on the rails at the rear by Nooresh Juglall before being launched for his run as the smallish seven-horse field bunched up around the home turn.

Popped the question at the 300 metre mark Song To The Moon dug deep to collar the pacemaking Glorious Prospect (NZ) (Alamosa) in the concluding stages. Class prevailed as Song To The Moon held him at bay by a short head.

Both Le Grange, who was at a training double having scored earlier with Terms Of Reference (NZ) (Per Incanto), and Juglall saw plenty of merit in Song To The Moon's gallant win.

"He's getting better and better as he races over a bit of ground," said Le Grange.

"He scored a very nice win and he could be a Derby prospect for us. Well done to the Jubilant Racing Stable."

Juglall, who later brought up a riding double with the Leslie Khoo-trained Shuying Xiaoxiao (NZ) (Guillotine) in the next race, agreed

that there was plenty of upside to Song To The Moon's win.

"He's a nice up-and-coming stayer and he proved it at his first win over 2000m today," said the Mauritian jockey.

"With the big weight, he showed plenty of guts to win as the other horse is not easy to get past.

"It's a double for the stable, and a big thank you goes to the owners and Ricardo."

Song To The Moon has now taken his stakes earnings past the \$110,000 mark for Mr Joshua Tan's Jubilant Racing 3 Stable.
