## AUGUST EDITION UPSETS IN KARAKA CUP



*August Edition upsets in the feature event at Ellerslie*

The husband and wife training partnership of Shaun and Emma Clotworthy caught their rivals unaware when they produced **August Edition (NZ)** (Alamosa) to win the Collinson Forex Karaka Cup (2200m) at outside odds on Sunday.

More known as winter performer when the tracks are at their deepest, the Alamosa mare had shown she could perform on a better surface when successful at Ellerslie two starts ago. The five-year-old followed that up with a highly creditable performance for sixth in the Dunstan Feeds Stayers

Championship Final on New Year's Day before tackling the feature event at Ellerslie.

Central Districts rider Rosie Myers was having her first ride on the mare and produced a peach of an effort to claim victory. Settled nicely in midfield by Myers, August Edition relaxed nicely before improving into a challenging position behind the leaders at the 600m mark. The mare followed Top Prospect (NZ) (Swiss Ace) through a gap on the inside shortly after straightening to issue her challenge before outstaying her rival in the run to the post. Top Prospect held second in a

driving finish with race favourite Charles Road (Myboycharlie) third after racing a touch erratically in the home straight.

“She kind of surprised us three runs back and ran the distance and liked the harder track which was something we didn’t think she would do,” said Emma Clotworthy after the race.

“We thought she might like the firmer track again and her work with stablemate Diesel was very good, so she deserved a shot at this.

“It tends to be one day at a time with her so it’s great for the owners as it has taken a lot of hard work to get her here. I’m just rapt that today she could pull it off.”

The victory continues a winning role for the Byerley Park conditioners who produced Diesel (NZ) (Electronic Zone) to win the \$100,000 Dunstan Feeds Stayers Championship Final (2200m) on 1 January.

Mana Park will offer a half-brother to August Edition, by boom sire Tavistock, as Lot 385 during the Book 1 catalogue at the upcoming NZB National Yearling Sale series that commences at Karaka on 28 January.

# AVANTAGE ERRATIC BUT IMPRESSIVE IN ELLERSLIE VICTORY

Unbeaten filly **Avantage** (Fastnet Rock) gave her rivals a start and a beating in an impressive performance at Ellerslie on Sunday.

The royally bred Fastnet Rock filly was slow away in the NZB Insurance Pearl Series Race (1200m) with rider

Opie Bosson having no option but to ride for luck as the combination settled last in the seven-horse field. Bosson had a lapful of horse approaching the home bend as he angled between runners before making his challenge at the 300m mark. Avantage quickly responded and raced up to co-favourite Spanish Whisper (Lope De Vega) as the pair set down to fight out the finish.

Despite veering out in the last 100m Avantage held too many guns for Spanish Whisper as she gained the ascendancy to record her third victory from as many starts.

"It was probably a blessing in disguise with her missing the start as she ended up in a lovely spot," said co-

trainer Jamie Richards, who prepares the filly with Stephen Autridge for the powerful Te Akau Racing team.

"She was here for a good educational day out and she will take a lot of improvement out of it."

Already confidently tipped as a leading prospect for the rich Listed Karaka Million (1200m) that will be run at Ellerslie on 27 January, Richards believes the filly has plenty of improvement in her for the event.

"She had a good look at the winning post, so she will definitely improve with the outing," he said.

"We might tinker around with a little gear adjustment on that but she's a lovely filly that David (Ellis) bought at Karaka, who is now three from three.

"It's very important for our stable to have these horses performing as we lead into this year's sale."

Avantage was a \$210,000 purchase for David Ellis from the Oaks Stud draft during the Premier session of the 2017 NZB National Yearling Sale. The victory takes her stakes earnings to \$41,620 and lifts her into second place on the order of entry for the \$1m Karaka Million (1200m).

Stablemate Pinot Grey (NZ) (Burgundy) also moved one place up the qualifying ladder for the Karaka Million with her third placing enough to see her currently sitting 13th on the order of entry with the fourteen highest stakes earners guaranteed a start in the event. – NZ Racing Desk

# XBOX WIDE AWAKE FOR ELLERSLIE WIN

Laid-back character **Xbox (NZ)** (Niagara) proved he was wide awake and on the job when he upset predictions at Ellerslie.

The three-year-old Niagara gelding has a stable reputation for taking life at his own pace at home but once he sights a racetrack the competitive juices come to the fore.

"A couple of the staff have said to me that they thought he was sick because he was asleep in his box," said trainer Graham Richardson.

"That's all he does at home, sleep.

"He's just a genuine horse who relaxes in his races. He can really accelerate and you saw the real Xbox today."

Despite finishing second to Spring Heat (More Than Ready) two starts ago in the Gr. 3 Bonecrusher Stakes (1400m) Xbox was only moderately favoured for Sunday's 0800 Horsevets 1500 (1500m) contest with Gr. 1 New Zealand 2000 Guineas placegetter Ever Loyal (Sebring) sent out a dominating favourite in the event.

After jumping nicely, rider Trudy Thornton allowed Xbox to settle quietly in the trail behind pacemaker Dashper (NZ) (Redwood) who had Ever Loyal

racing keenly on his outer throughout. Thornton angled to the outer of the favourite to make her run in the home straight and quickly gained the ascendancy as Xbox put a winning break on the field.

Chased hard by Mighty Power (NZ) (Power) and Mongolianconqueror (NZ) (Ocean Park) in the closing stages, Xbox held out all challenges to hit the line one and three-quarter lengths to the good of that pair with Ever Loyal battling on into a well beaten fourth.

"We may look at the Waikato Guineas now as this gives us a bit more confidence," said Richardson.

"He's not really bred to go over ground, but he relaxes so nicely he deserves a chance."

The Gr. 2 Warren Storm Lifebrokers Waikato Guineas (2000m) is the feature event at Te Rapa on Tuesday 6 February.

# AKOYA CONFIRMS TRENTHAM AFFINITY WITH GRITTY VICTORY

**S**peedy mare **Akoya (NZ)** (Bullbars) confirmed her liking for the roomy Trentham track when she made it two wins from as many starts at the venue on Saturday.

Prepared by Stephen Marsh at Cambridge, the four-year-old Bullbars mare sat three-wide on the pace throughout before dashing away to claim victory in the El Cheapo Cars Premier (1200m).

Twelve months earlier she had displayed blistering speed to score easily over 1000m at the corresponding meeting however Saturday's contest tested her mettle far more as she overcame a tough trip in transit to score a dogged win.

"She had a pretty tricky barrier draw today and with a little bit of pace on early I didn't want to overdo it, but I ended up being caught out three-wide," said rider Danielle Johnson after the race.

"There was only one corner we had to go around though so that was a blessing.

"She missed the kick at her last start where she got back and hit the line well. Today she made the jump and has gone well."

Trainer Stephen Marsh, who celebrated a significant milestone just 24 hours earlier when Firefly (NZ) (Savabeel) provided him with his 500th training victory when successful at Matamata, admitted he had been nervous about the mare's barrier draw before the race.

"We were very worried about the wide draw as when they draw out like that it is hard on a front-running horse," he said.

"She's jumped well and she's showed how tough she is. She has a really good form-line with four wins now from 9 starts and has been unlucky a few times as well.

"She's just a tough little mare who tries very hard."

Marsh will now consider the options available for his charge who he believes is best suited to the shorter sprint trips.

"She is ideally a 1000m-1200m mare, so we'll just pick and choose where we go from here," he said.

"That's her second win down the chute so we might try and find

something down here for her. We'll just play around and maybe try and find some black-type for her."

Marsh went within a nose of making it two wins on the day when promising stayer Felaar (NZ) (Ekraar) was edged out by Makdanife (NZ) (Makfi) in a thrilling finish to the fifth race on the programme.

# EAGLE BAY MAKES UP FOR ELLERSLIE DISAPPOINTMENT **WITH TRENTHAM VICTORY**

**P**rogressive galloper **Eagle Bay (NZ)** (Faltaat) eased any disappointment his connections may have been feeling about missing a run at Ellerslie on New Year's Day when he scored handsomely in the last race at Trentham on Saturday.

The Faltaat five-year-old was denied a start at Ellerslie when persistent heavy rain on the day led to the abandonment of the last race on the programme due to unsafe track conditions. The Aidan Schumacher trained gelding more than made amends on Saturday as he dealt to

his rating 75 rivals in convincing fashion over 1600m.

Despite dominating most pre-race discussions Eagle Bay was a noted drifter on the tote as punters installed Waikato raiders King's Cross (NZ) (Shinko King) and Legramor (NZ) (Commands) as the favoured combination for the contest. Those who kept the faith on Eagle Bay were well rewarded as rider Rosie Myers produced a copybook performance to have her mount within striking distance throughout before making a winning move shortly before the home turn.

With key rivals Legramor and King's Cross pocketed against the rails, Myers whipped around the outside to have Eagle Bay challenging for the lead as the field straightened for the run to the finishing line. Asked for a serious effort at the 300m mark, Eagle Bay extended nicely to dash away from his nearest chasers and register a class two-length victory.

"He's only lightly raced and the further he goes the better he gets," said Myers.

"He's just a grouse horse who does exactly what you ask him to do."

Myers admitted to plenty of pre-race confidence after the gelding's previous performance had seen him flash home late to run third at Awapuni.

"I got a little too far back last time which you can't do there these days," she said.

"I was pretty happy when he jumped away today, I knew he would be very competitive from there."

A half-brother to useful performers Olivia Mary (NZ) (King's Chapel) and Zorralli (NZ) (Librettist), Eagle Bay has now won three of his 8 career starts for just over \$50,000 in stakes earnings.

### Paris Rock impresses again



Lot 507 – the Charm Spirit-Que Sera filly offered by Curraghmore at the upcoming NZB National Yearling Sale series

Curraghmore graduate **Paris Rock (NZ)** (Rock 'n' Pop) followed up her winning debut on Boxing Day with another impressive win at Ballarat on Sunday.

The Henry Dwyer-trained three-year-old was ridden by Damien Thornton to an easy 3.75-length victory, indicating she has a bright future.

"That was a very good win," said Thornton. "I committed murder in front, they left me alone and we had an easy time. I just let her go a little bit quicker from the 500m so they didn't get to me and she was always going to win."

"She gave me a nice feel and I think she's a filly with plenty of promise."

"There's still improvement, she's going to get better. I don't know a lot about the breed but they've got a nice one here."

Paris Rock, bred by Curraghmore and David Butler, is from the first crop of Waikato Stud-based sire Rock 'n' Pop out of the multiple race winning and stakes placed Daggars Drawn mare Que Sera.

A half-sister by Windsor Park Stud's Charm Spirit will be offered by Curraghmore as Lot 507 in Book 1 of the New Zealand Bloodstock National Yearling Sale Series beginning on January 28.





# MR DUJARDIN'S BARNSTORMING WIN OPENS FREEDMAN ACCOUNT

**T**rainer Lee Freedman thought he would have to settle for second best again when favourite Foresto (Excelebration) was swamped inside the last 200m on Sunday, but debutant **Mr Dujardin** (NZ) (High Chaparral) came with a storming run on the outside to hand him his first 2018 winner.

The Australian Hall of Fame trainer has had a frustrating start to the new season with five placings from 12 runners.

But at least Freedman knew the horses were running well, and it was with a certain optimism that he saddled Foresto in Sunday's \$20,000 Open Maiden race over 1600m.

That confidence grew even further when the Thai-owned Excelebration three-year-old hit the front at the top of the straight, after coming off a perfect trailing spot outside leader Cape Lincoln (NZ) (Cape Blanco).

Given his full head by Boss, Foresto was being hailed as the Freedman opener, but to the camp's dismay, he shortened up as the winning post came within his sights. Down the middle, Ace Harbour (Harbour Watch) gathered him in rather easily. But that was also the moment Freedman realised he might after all break his duck when the less-fancied Mr Dujardin, who had come from last, started to lengthen up on the outside.

In one fell swoop, the Oscar Racing Stable-owned High Chaparral three-year-old sprouted wings to go and score a sensational one-length win from Ace Harbour with Foresto third another half-a-length away. The winning time was 1min 36.26secs for the 1600m on the Long Course.

"I thought Foresto was home! The other horse finished like a shot, maybe that's the best way to ride him," said Freedman.

"Laurie Laxon owns a share in him. I actually told Laurie he would be better off in New Zealand on soft ground as we don't have enough distance races here, like a mile or 1 ¼ miles.

"It's a bit of a surprise he won first-up. He won on the mile today, but he definitely needs longer."

# SMOKIE SATELLITE SPINS O'HARA TO DRIVING SEAT FOR FIRST TIME

Low-profile trainer John O'Hara played down his rise to the top of the ladder after bolter **Satellite Classic (NZ)** (Pins) handed him his fourth win in only four meetings this term, but was obviously still pleased with the way his horses are running on super at the minute.

O'Hara had an ordinary season last year with 20 winners from 342 runners to finish in the lower end of the premiership ladder, but quite surprisingly, his yard has come out firing on all cylinders in 2018.

And to add another dimension to the unexpected purple patch, all his four winners were far from being top elects in their respective races.

O'Hara said it was the first time he has ever been in that lofty spot, but laughed off any notion he could stay there for much longer with all the big guns only warming up at this early stage of the year-long season.

"It's nice to be on top but I may not even be in that spot by the next race!" said the Singaporean handler, totally aware there are three other trainers on three wins snapping at his heels, namely Steven Burridge, Cliff Brown and Michael Clements who all boast better firepower under their barn roofs.

"But it's a great start to the year, very encouraging. I haven't changed anything to my training, we are working as hard as ever, and we are reaping the results.

"For today's winner, Satellite Classic, it was a lucky win. He has not shown much in five starts, but I know he has ability even if he is still very green.

"I wanted to put a senior jockey on just to educate him, and we were lucky to get Vlad Duric.

"They went hard early and they duly compounded in the end."

Indeed, the Pins four-year-old was barely in the picture for a top-three finish when he swung for home with around six lengths to make up on race-leader Make U Famous (Tale Of The Cat), but once Duric pulled the whip on him, he started to reel in his opponents one by one.

At the 100m, Swift Embrace (Love Conquer All) was the one who looked like he would come out tops in a three-way battle with Make U Famous and Dontlookdownonme (NZ) (Henrythenavigator), but Satellite Classic finished the best on the outside to settle the issue, finishing in advance of Swift Embrace by half-a-length with Make U Famous third another neck away.
