NEW TERRITORY FOR MANA PARK AT KARAKA 2018

Well known racing commentator George Simon admits that he and wife Maryanne have been thrown in at the deep end a little as they prepare to submit their first draft to the annual NZB National Yearling Sale at Karaka.

The popular Cambridge couple have prepared eight yearlings under their Mana Park banner which is more commonly associated with excellence at the annual NZ Ready To Run Sale for two-year-olds.

Mana Park presented their first Ready To Run draft in 2005 with triple Group One winner Turn Me Loose (NZ) (Iffraaj) and exciting three-year-old Demonetization (All Too Hard) just two of the high-class individuals to have been sold by the Simons in the past decade.

However, since making the decision to make their Yearling Sale debut this year Simon admits he has found the requirements for the sale vastly different than what he has been used to in the past.

“It has been a real eye-opener for me as the two preparations are just so different,” he said.

“With this sale you do everything required from day one whereas with the Ready To Run you really only have the horses for a month after they have breezed up.

“We have had some good people helping us out but it’s Maryanne who has done most of the work.

“All I can really say is that I’m glad that one of us knows what she is doing!”

Simon is quick to pay tribute to his wife who he met in the late 1980’s when speaking at a function in Te Aroha.

“Maryanne is a remarkable horsewoman who I think doesn’t get the credit she deserves when it comes to what she has achieved over the years,” he said.

“Of course, I may be a little biased but when you look at our results it is pretty much down to Maryanne.”

The Mana Park brand first began in 1999 when the couple bought the mostly bare block of land at Matangi that they now call home. Development of the property began in earnest when Simon returned home to New Zealand in 2001 after a stint commentating in Singapore.

“When we first bought the property it basically had an old shed and a cow-shed on it,” said Simon.

“We have built it up from scratch to the facility we now have which we’re very proud of.”

While Simon has been feeling a little out of his depth during the yearling preparation he finds it hard to hide his excitement with the sale less than a week away.

“I guess it’s about now that things start to really ramp up with the horses heading up to Karaka and the build-up in its

final stages,” he said.

“We have been buoyed by the feedback we have received about our draft from the buyers who have been to see us at Mana Park already.

“From what we can gather they are all happy with the horses we have to sell but the proof will be in the pudding when the hammer falls.”

Amongst their eight-strong draft is the full sister to 2015-16 New Zealand Champion Sprinter and Middle-Distance horse, Turn Me Loose, with Simon hopeful the filly will sell well.

“I guess the fact that we own the sister to Turn Me Loose makes me lean towards her as one of our star lots but that is also based on the feedback we have had about her,” he said.

“She has a wonderful pedigree and is a superb individual who has really caught the eye when she has paraded at home.”

Yearlings by proven sires Iffraaj (5) and Tavistock (2) make up the majority of the eight-strong draft. Of the five yearlings by Iffraaj, four are out of Danehill mares, with that cross producing five stakes winners to date including Group One winners Turn Me Loose and Chriselliam.

“We also have a lovely Foxwedge colt who is another who has attracted plenty of attention,” said Simon.

“While we have our expectations, we are also very realistic about our draft and we will meet the market wherever we can, just as we do at the Ready To Run sale each year.

“The hardest part now is the wait for everything to get underway as I’m like a kid at Christmas, I just can’t wait.”

TENACIOUS 3YO MAINTAINS PERFECT TRENTHAM RECORD

Strong-willed filly **Gift Of Power (NZ)** (Power)

produced another show of determination on Saturday to maintain her unbeaten record at Trentham.

The three-year-old made it four straight on the course when she carried topweight of 58.5kg under champion jockey Chris Johnson to triumph in the Printlink Premier (1200m).

“She’s got a mind of her own and a lot of ability to go with it,” Johnson said.

“She jumped well and I wanted to sit second and not lead, but she wanted to go to the front and she found a good kick.”

Gift Of Power got her own way and coasted in front before seeing off the challenge of the stakes performer I Got You (Hard Spun) for the eighth win of her 11-start career.

“She’s very determined and her record speaks for itself,” Johnson said.

Trained by Graeme Rogerson with his wife Debbie and his granddaughter Bailey, Gift Of Power is by Power out of the Group One performer Capital Diamond.

She was bred by Cambridge Stud,

who have retained an ownership interest and they will also be offering her half-brother (Lot 88) by Per Incanto at the Book 1 Sale at Karaka on January 28.

Immediate plans for Gift Of Power are uncertain with her trainers to make a decision in the coming week.

“We’ll see how she comes through this, but we don’t want to overdo it,” Bailey Rogerson said.

“There are races here and in Australia for her, we’ll wait and see what happens.”

STAKES CHALLENGE NEXT FOR IMPRESSIVE TRENTHAM WINNER

A comprehensive victory at Trentham on Saturday has set progressive mare **Darscape Princess (NZ)** (Darci Brahma) on a path to higher honours.

The Darci Brahma four-year-old notched her third career victory and second in succession when she comfortably closed out a handy field of rating 75 rivals in the Wellington Seamarket Premier (1400m).

While she still has a way to go to match the efforts of her elder sibling Sensible Princess (NZ), who won five races in her latest campaign including the Gr. 2 Auckland Thoroughbred Breeders Stakes (1400m), the performance indicated she won't be disgraced in stronger company.

"She ran fifth in the Eulogy Stakes as a three-year-old where she jarred up quite badly, so we've just taken our time with her," said trainer Fraser Auret.

"She was good first-up and I thought quite dominant last start although the fifty days had me a little worried as she can race a little bit erratically when she is fresh."

Auret was referring to the break between runs for the mare who had last been seen winning at Otaki in early December. Those fears were allayed as the mare produced a powerful finish to dominate the closing stages of the contest and confirm to Auret she is ready to tackle stakes company at her next assignment.

"I thought if she could measure up here and do a good job I would look at the Wairarapa Breeders Stakes for her," he said.

"We thought in an ideal world we would be heading for that race so if she can get the points that's where she will go."

The Listed Wairarapa Thoroughbred Breeders Stakes (1600m) is the feature race at Tauherenikau on 6 February.

Auret nearly had double the reason to celebrate on Saturday when handy stayer Alinko Prince (NZ) (Alamosa) finished close-up in third in a driving finish to the Gr. 3 Wallaceville Estate Castletown Wellington Cup (3200m).

SUPERA OPENS HER ACCOUNT WITH TE RAPA VICTORY

Royally-bred filly **Supera (NZ)** (Savabeel) put a disappointing debut performance behind her when she opened her winning account at Te Rapa on Sunday.

The younger sibling of dual Group Three winner Eleonora (NZ) (Makfi) and four-win mare Sopraffina (NZ) (High Chaparral) had finished well back at Taupo on debut after a tardy start extinguished any winning chances she may have had. The headstrong Savabeel filly was on her best behaviour this time though as she bounced nicely from an inside barrier to settle handily behind the early pace for rider Cameron Lammas.

Lammas angled Supera off the fence at the 300m mark to issue a strong challenge to pacemaker Walkin' By (Denman) before drawing clear to win comfortably by two lengths from race favourite Beauden (NZ) (Bullbars) in the maiden 1200m contest.

Co-trainer Ken Kelso, who prepares Supera at Matamata with wife Bev, was pleased at the reversal of fortunes for the filly who he admitted could be quite a handful off the track.

"She got a bit wound up at Taupo with everything that was going on and played up badly in the barrier," he said.

"She didn't have a lot of luck in the straight either where she got held up a bit.

"She's a filly that has taken a lot of making as she's hard work but has always had a lot of ability.

"She gets herself in a bit of a tiz, but she's got it so once she's had a few starts I think she will settle down."

Rider Cameron Lammas was of a similar opinion, especially about the cantankerous nature of the filly.

"I think I earned my riding fee getting her down to the start," he said.

"She jumped well although I used her up a little to get a position. Once I asked her she just went whoosh.

"I think she's going to develop into a nice horse."

Bred and raced by Sir Peter Vela, Supera is a granddaughter of his dual Caulfield and Melbourne winner Ethereal (NZ) (Rhythm).

FLYING FEET ON NZ DERBY PATH

Te Awamutu trained three-year-old **Flying Feet** (Ocean Park) presented his credentials for a tilt at the Gr. 1 Vodafone New Zealand Derby (2400m) in the best possible

fashion at Te Rapa on Sunday.

The Ocean Park youngster produced an eye-catching late run to out-finish his rivals in the closing stages of the 1400m contest to secure his maiden victory at just his second start.

The win was all the more impressive as the gelding dwelt at the start while he also overcame a somewhat wayward run in the home straight to snatch the three-quarter length victory.

"That was very impressive today, especially as he was tardily away" said trainer Joseph Waldron after the race.

"Luckily the speed was on in front which gave him a chance to get home well, although he still wanted to do things a bit wrong, so there's improvement in him."

Waldron expects his charge to take the next step over more ground as he aims him at a start in Ellerslie's blue riband event on the first Saturday in March.

"He's bred to run 2000m-2400m, so we'll take him home and look after him then see where we go from here," he said.

"He holds a nomination for the Derby, so the progression is to give

him a run over a mile next. We should be able to find something suitable in the next fortnight and if he goes well we will press on from there."

Leading rider Opie Bosson was suitably impressed with the run despite the horse making a mess of the start.

"He jumped in the air and we had to go to Plan B," he said.

"He's a lovely horse though and still very green but I do think he has a bright future."

WIDE AWAKE READY FOR BREAK-OUT PERFORMANCE

The powerful Te Akau Racing team will attempt a hit and run mission at Woodville today when eccentric performer **Wide Awake (NZ)** (Savabeel) tackles the Bambyr's Water Treadmill Woodville Cup (2100m).

Wide Awake will be the only member of the Matamata operation in action at Woodville with co-trainer Stephen Autridge hopeful the Savabeel gelding can give the team a perfect winning record for the day.

"I think it's time for this horse to step up and produce the sort of performance we think he is capable of," said Autridge.

"He has been a little unlucky along the way however, he probably hasn't quite lived up to his reputation as yet.

"He gets the right opportunity at Woodville to make a statement so that is what we will be looking for."

A \$150,000 purchase by David Ellis from the Premier session of the 2015 National Yearling Sale, the son of four-time Group One placegetter Kay's Awake (NZ) (Towkay) has won two of his 12 starts. Autridge is of the belief that a step up to a middle distance is what the four-year-old has been looking for.

"I think it has just been a maturity thing with him so now that he is getting stronger he appeals as the type that will thrive over a bit of distance," he said.

"His last run at Hawkes Bay over a mile was good as he hit the line strongly, so I don't see the step up to 2100m as a problem."

Meanwhile Autridge, training partner Jamie Richards and the whole Te Akau Racing team are gearing up for a massive day at Ellerslie on Saturday where they will saddle up leading contenders in a number of the feature events.

New Zealand Two Thousand Guineas winner Embellish (NZ) (Savabeel) looks likely to start a warm favourite in the Listed Karaka Million 3YO Classic (1600m) while Melody Belle (NZ) (Commands) will tackle the Gr. 3 Mongolian Khan Trophy (1200m). The Listed Karaka Million (1200m) for the two-year-olds could see Te Akau provide more than a third of the field with Avantage (Fastnet Rock), Al Hasa (NZ) (Exceed And Excel), Sword Of Osman (NZ) (Savabeel) and Pinot Grey (NZ) (Burgundy) guaranteed a start with Irish Cream (NZ) (O'Reilly) also a chance to make the final field.

"All of the team are ready to go for Ellerslie, so it is a very exciting time," said Autridge.

"We will have final gallops on Tuesday but at this stage we are very pleased with the team. Of course, we will need luck to go our way, but we are going in with some live winning chances which is really all you can ask for."

AURIC BARN COMES UP WITH ANOTHER SPECIAL

Broodmare Always Special (NZ) (Stravinsky) is proving to be just that for trainer Shane Baertschiger and the Auric Stable.

Most Favorite (NZ) (O'Reilly), the Stravinsky's mare's fifth foal for the dynamic duo, made a smart winning debut in the \$85,000 Restricted Maiden race over 1100m on Sunday.

Before Most Favorite, Just Nini (NZ) (Pins), Simple Pleasures (NZ) (O'Reilly), Jelly Bean (NZ) (Darci Brahma) and Custard Cream (NZ) (Pins) were older siblings rolled out from Auric's Jerry Sung's breeding barn and they have all won at

least once at Kranji, with Most Favorite's full-brother Simple Pleasures even singled out by Baertschiger as "the best horse" he has ever trained.

"Simple Pleasures was the best horse I even trained. Unfortunately, he was a bleeder and he only had a short career here (two wins from six starts)," said the Australian trainer.

"He was beaten a short head by Stepitup in the first Leg of the 3YO series (Singapore Three-Year-Old Sprint in 2013). Jelly Bean is also a good mare, and they have all been bred by Jerry.

"Always Special has been a good broodmare for Jerry. She is getting on now, she's 20yo I think and may have a rest and come back next year."

Breeding trivia aside, Baertschiger is hoping good genes won't lie again and Most Favorite will turn out just as good as Simple Pleasures, if not even better.



"He was a bit of a handful when he came to us. Matty (Kellady) has done all the work on him, and he's done a good job on him," said Baertschiger.

"From Day One, he showed a lot and he won very well today. He can only improve as he gets more racing experience."

FREEDMAN PLEASED MR CLINT CAN HOLD HIS OWN AGAINST OLDER RIVALS

Promising three-year-old **Mr Clint (NZ)** (Power) is fast becoming one of trainer Lee Freedman's personal favourites after he downed a rather handy field in the \$60,000 Class 4 Premier race over 1400m on Sunday.

Giving a little nod to veteran trainer Bruce Marsh, the Australian mentor said he was told by his learned friend it was quite a feat for a three-year-old to beat older rivals so early in their career in Singapore.

Drawn off the track, the son of Power did not enjoy the most auspicious of trips plying a path outside the leader Mr Mosa (NZ) (Alamosa) for Craig Grylls from the start, but sheer grit saw him outspurt his eight rivals inside the last 300m.

"Bruce Marsh, my mentor here, told me it is difficult for a three-year-old to beat older horses at this time of the year," said Freedman, not without some cheek.

"He also ran very good time, so it's

all good for the 3YO series coming up.

"He had a bad draw and he wore blinkers for the first time. I told Craig to ride him like he was the best horse.

"I don't think that's quite the way to ride him, but he's won and that's the most important."

The Kiwi jockey was delighted he was able to recombine with the horse he rode and gave the Australian Hall of Fame trainer his first Singapore winner last September.

"I rode him like he was the best horse in the field," said Grylls.

"He jumped really good and he travelled good coming into the straight. The challenges came on the outside, but he dug deep and hit the line real hard."

Never worse than third in five starts, Mr Clint was bringing up his second win which has edged his takings even closer to the \$100,000 mark for the Oscar Racing Stable.
