WELL DONE WINS FIRST SINGAPORE DERBY FOR KOK



Well Done produces an irresistible burst to capture the SGP Gr. 1 Emirates Singapore Derby

The well-named **Well Done (NZ)** (Falkirk) showed that all the pre-race doubts about his ability to run out a strong 2000m were totally unfounded when he conjured up a blinding turn of foot inside the last 100m to record a pulsating win in the \$1.15 million SGP Gr. 1 Emirates Singapore Derby (2000m) on Sunday.

The Falkirk chestnut was as convincing as any when he won the Group 1 Patron's Bowl (1600m), the second Leg of the Singapore Four-Year-Old Challenge of which the

Derby is the third and final Leg, three weeks ago, but most thought he had things his way with a soft run on the rails.

Though third at his only one attempt over the 1 ¼ mile, most were unsure if he would have the same turn of foot with another quarter-mile to cover, even if his barrier No 4 presented itself as a good ally.

Jockey Michael Rodd probably gave connections and those who took his \$29 odds reasons to breathe better

when he was able to find the fence, settling worse than midfield while expected frontrunner Time Odyssey (Jet Master) rolled to the lead before throwing out the anchors in the backstretch.

The first two-thirds of the race had gone to plan well enough for Well Done, but things looked dicey upon straightening as the 16 horses fanned across the track jostling for the best run to the winning post. Well Done was momentarily held up for a run as he ran into dead ends behind horses, but that predicament was made worse when Majestic Moments (NZ) (Darci Brahma) had the race shot to pieces when he stormed away to a two-length break at the 300m.

But once Rodd eased him towards a gap down the middle of the track, the chase was on as the purring engine was finally let loose as he proceeded to overturn the margin. With only 100m left to run, many still thought the winning post would come too early for Well Done, but the game galloper really motored home inside the concluding stages to eventually collar Majestic Moments close to home and score with three-quarter-length to spare.

Rockfast (Fastnet Rock), who drew first blood when he circled the field from the 800m to sweep to the lead around the home turn, peaked on his run to still finish a creditable third another 1 ½ lengths away.

Kok, who was capturing his third Group 1 was struggling

for words at the winner's circle.

"Winning the Kranji Mile was such a big day for me, then the Patron's Bowl was even more special as unlike Cash Luck, Well Done was my horse from Day One, I've groomed him from unraced to what he is now," he said.

"But to win the Derby today, I would say, that tops it off, especially as I have only around 20 horses in my stable.

"It's clearly my biggest day as a trainer, I've had many sleepless nights before the race, and tonight, I won't be able to sleep again, it just hasn't dawned in yet.

"My only worry was the distance, but when I saw Michael put him on the rails and switch him off, I was very confident. Even when he had nowhere to go in the straight, I knew he would run on once he found the gap."

Besides taking his overall earnings past the \$1.1 million mark for Goh of the Well Done Stable with that seventh win in 17 starts, Well Done also picked up a bonus of \$50,000 for winning two Legs of the Singapore Four-Year-Old Challenge.

DA QIAN SHI JIE WINS INAUGURAL NEW ZEALAND BLOODSTOCK CUP

The New Zealand and Chinese racing industries broke new ground today with the inaugural running of the RMB500,000 New Zealand Bloodstock Cup (1800m) at Korchin in Inner Mongolia, a race that lived up to expectations and was won in scintillating style by **Da Qian Shi Jie (NZ)** (Keeper).

The new three-year-old race is a joint venture between NZB and Mr Lang Lin of the Inner Mongolia Rider Horse Club.

Da Qian Shi Jie was the highest rated runner in the field, having won one of his two previous starts, and he proved his superiority with a breathtaking performance.

Ridden by the New Zealand jockey Alysha Collett for trainer Yu Jiankang, Da Qian Shi Jie raced in midfield before surging forward approaching the home turn and soaring clear. It turned into a one-horse race down the straight as Da Qian Shi Jie opened up a winning margin of more than five lengths in a dazzling display.

Little Bolt (NZ) (No Excuse Needed) finished second ahead of

Meet By Chance (NZ) (Buffalo Man).

Da Qian Shi Jie was bred by Don Edwards and Margaret Fife. He is by Keeper out of the Blues Traveller mare Pearla (NZ), dam of winners Theruler (NZ) (Viking Ruler), Odin (NZ) (Viking Ruler), Rubee (NZ) (Keeper) and Blue Wagon (NZ) (Keeper). Da Qian Shi Jie was withdrawn from the 2015 Festival Sale.

Runner-up Little Bolt was bred by Kim and Terry Grant and was offered at the 2015 Ready to Run Sale by Cypress Point Stables. Rider Horse China purchased him there for \$25,000.

The day's racing was also a triumph for Brent Gillovic's Highview Stud who bred three winners on the day

MCKAY DOUBLES HIS LUCK AT RUAKAKA

With the locals dominating proceedings at Ruakaka on Saturday it was left to Matamata trainer Peter McKay to strike a blow for the visitors as he produced a winning double on the day.

Promising two-year-old Barcelo (NZ) (Alamosa) opened his winning account with a comfortable display over 1000 metres however it was three-year-old filly **Lucky's Revenge (NZ)** (Darci Brahma) who created the biggest impression with an effortless victory over 1200 metres later in the day.

Unsung since finishing well back in stakes company during the Auckland Cup Carnival in March, the daughter of six race winner Santangelo (NZ) (Lonhro) dealt to a handy

line-up of intermediate sprinters as she held out the late charge of Hunapo (NZ) (Elusive City) to record her third win from just six raceday appearances.

McKay admitted he was keen on the filly's chances leading into the contest despite a four month absence from the track.

"I've always had an opinion of this filly but we've tried to be patient with her as she is only going to get better as she gets older," he noted.

"She put together two nice wins before we decided to take a shot at black type with her at Ellerslie but she just wasn't herself that day. Some of my horses picked up a virus around that time and she was very listless for a week or so after the run so I'm sure she was one who was affected by it.

"We tipped her into the paddock and she had a good break which did her the world of good and she has made good progress since she has been back in work. It's always tough taking on the older horses but I thought she would be hard to roll with the right run and that's how it panned out."

Raced in the familiar blue and white hoops of owner Sir Peter Vela, the Darci Brahma filly will return to Ruakaka later

in the winter before McKay puts her spring campaign plans in place.

"I'm going to give her one more in her grade back at Ruakaka in August and then we will look at her options for the spring," he advised.

"At this stage the options include the Group Three 1400 metre on the last day at Hawkes Bay or maybe another quick break before taking her fresh into the big sprints during New Zealand Cup Week.

"She is going to be at her peak as a four-year-old so we have time to plan the best option for her as I have no doubt she has the quality to be very competitive against the top grade."

SEA KING SWIMS TO THACKERAY WIN

New Zealand galloper **Sea King (NZ)** (Shinko King) caught outsider Nishiazabu (Ice Point) late to claim the \$100,000 Thackeray Quality Steeplechase (3450m) at a wet Warrnambool on Sunday.

Nishiazabu, from the South Australian stable of Kevin and Heather Frew, ran some race as the extreme outsider, stringing out the seven-strong field along with the Eric Musgrove-trained Zataglio (NZ) (Savabeel).

But Nishiazabu just ran out of gas late as he tried to cause an almighty upset, as Plumpton trainer Patrick Payne took out another jumping feature this season - having also seen Angelology (NZ) (Coat's Choice) win the Australian Steeplechase at Sandown in May, after No Song No Supper's (Song Of Tara) Grand Annual Steeplechase heroics at the 'Bool.

"He's a Grand National Hurdle winner in Australia [in 2014]. He's got a feature race record in New Zealand," said winning hoop Steven Pateman, who rode a double, of Sea King.

"He's brilliantly prepared by the best trainers in the world - Kevin Myers and Patrick Payne.

"Very grateful that the owners brought him back over, looking forward to the rest of the season and hoping we get similar conditions."

Pateman earlier saluted aboard **I'll'ava'alf (NZ)** (Lucky Unicorn) for local trainer Patrick F Ryan Jnr in the Prince of Penzance (NZ) (Pentire) colours. I'll'ava'alf was formerly prepared in New Zealand by Matamata trainer Karen Fursdon, who won six races with him before he was transferred to his new Australian base.

The day's other feature saw another 'Bool trainer on top, with the Symon Wilde-prepared **Gold Medals (NZ)** (Elvstroem) taking out the \$100,000 Kevin Lafferty Hurdle (3200m).

"He's building a really good record over jumps," Wilde said post-race.

"He can do it all, in heavy ground [or dry]. I think he was second in the Terang Cup this year [on a Good3], so he's mixing jumps with flat racing and he's loving it.

"Hopefully something like the Galleywood [would be our target] next year if we could build his rating."

WEATHER WILL DICTATE LIEFTING TEAM FOR WELLINGTON

A tidy performance at the Ellerslie trials on Tuesday has handy winter galloper **Joey Jonz (NZ)** (Starjo) primed for his tilt at Saturday's Whyte Handicap (1600m) at Trentham however it is the weather that will dictate his travelling companion on the trip south.

The Rudy Liefting trained galloper scored comfortably over 1000 metres on Tuesday and will head into the Trentham feature in good fettle after being freshened following a lacklustre display over 2100 metres at his last start.

"He just hasn't coped with the big weights he's carried in his last two runs so we thought we'd drop him back and set him for Trentham where we can get an apprentice claim for him," advised Liefting's wife Megan when discussing the stable's prospects.

"Rebecca Scott rode him nicely in the trial and he ran home strongly so we were pleased by that and he is ready to run a good race."

The Liefting's will be keeping a watchful eye on the Wellington weather during the week as they decide which of their high quality jumpers in Just Got Home (NZ) (Storming Home) or Danza Lad (NZ) (Woodbury Lad) will trek south to contest the Wellington Hurdles.

Just Got Home, who took out

the Hawkes Bay Hurdle at his last start, will be suited by a better track whereas Danza Lad prefers a deeper surface as he continues a preparation aimed at the Hospitality New Zealand Canterbury 127th Grand National Hurdles at Riccarton next month.

"Just Got Home needs the sort of track we struck at Hastings last time as he just can't cope with the big weights on a really heavy track," explained Liefting.

"If it looks settled and the track isn't going to be bottomless then he will go down for the race but if it is wet all

week then Danza Lad will go instead.

"He is far more suited to the really heavy stuff and will get into the race on the minimum which will also be a big assist. His main mission is the Grand National Hurdle at Christchurch so this would be a nice race for him on that path."

Danza Lad created a huge impression with an effortless victory at Te Aroha when making his hurdle debut and looks an exciting prospect for the remaining feature jumping events this season.

ZARTAN BACK TO HIS BEST AT AWAPUNI

A positive front running ride and the return to his preferred track conditions saw freewheeling stayer **Zartan (NZ)** (Zed) make his way to the winners circle for the first time in his current preparation on Saturday.

The rising seven-year-old had put together an impressive record around this time last year when he strung together four wins from five starts before his form tailed off during the spring. The gelding had failed to flatter during his initial few starts this time in but a gritty runner-up finish at Waverley a week ago signalled he was returning to somewhere near his best.

Sent straight to the front by apprentice Madan Singh, Zartan set a solid tempo as he had his rating 85 rivals strung out chasing him throughout the entire 2100 metre journey of the day's opening event at Awapuni. Despite getting tired towards the finish Zartan still had enough in reserve to comfortably hold out the challenge from northern visitor Permessio (NZ) (No Excuse Needed) who chased him gamely in the run home.

Trainer Kylie Little was delighted with the win and the performance of Singh who matched the efforts of senior rider Johnathan Parkes at the gelding's last start.

"He was superbly ridden by Johnathan at his last start and Madan has carried on the good work today," she said.

"He loves the sort of track he's struck out there. It looks quite loose and that's what he needs to show his best."

The victory was also a boost for Singh who has struggled for rides of late but made the most of his opportunity on Saturday.

"He was pulling quite hard so I just let him roll along and he travelled nicely for me," he said.

"I tried to use the weight advantage I had with my claim as he only had 51kgs. I tried to get a break on them on the turn and the light weight was a big help to my horse."

Little, who prepares a small team from her Opaki base nearly made it a double with Sir Kingwood (Excites) finishing a gallant third in the open handicap 1400 metre contest later in the day.

LIM'S DASHING MAKES WINNING LOOK EASY

Lim's Stable's racing manager Mick Dittman saw a bright future for **Lim's Dashing (NZ)** (Darci Brahma) in the wake of his impressive win in the \$75,000 Hello Amsterdam Stakes, a Novice race over 1400m on Sunday.

The former top Australian jockey was particularly taken with the way the Darci Brahma three-year-old has acquitted himself in only three starts that have now yielded two wins and one second.

"He just had two starts before today. At his last start, he had an outside barrier and did it tough," said Dittman, who was more than happy to oblige at the post-race reactions duties with trainer Stephen Gray currently away on vacation in Canada.

"He gave so much weight to the two-year-olds and he was caught wide, and I think that was what stamped his class.

"The horse he beat on that day (Mystic Master) is not the best two-year-old but he's not a mug either.

"Today, he had a lovely run for Danny (Beasley) and the way he quickened up tells me he can go further. He's a pretty smart horse for the future."

With that second win in only three starts, Lim's Dashing has now taken his stakes earnings past the \$90,000 mark for connections.

PENTAGON FINDS THE LINE WITH MORE IN STORE

Trainer David Hill predicted a better future for **Pentagon (NZ)** (Ekraar) next year even after he gave his 13 rivals no chance of a look-in on Sunday.

The English handler said the Ekraar three-year-old took out the \$65,000 Hello Paris Stakes, an Initiation race over 1400m, on raw ability, and will show his real potential once he learns what racing is all about.

With the naked eye, it looked like Pentagon, who boasted only one second place in five outings, had the racing caper down pat,

though – straight on the bunny from barrier No 1, allowed a breather midrace, before putting daylight on the rest by a widening margin – 4 ½ lengths from Moment Of Justice (Daliapour) with Lethal Weapon (NZ) (Makfi) third another length away.

Hill said the \$47 shot was hard to gauge in trackwork as he can be a “dumb” horse, but he was not without an engine.

“He’s a very ignorant horse. He doesn’t know what he’s doing,” he said.

“We can’t get an idea how he works as he doesn’t like the Poly. On the way he won on grass today, maybe he likes grass better, time will tell.

“But he had a good barrier today and that helped as he did show good gate speed in a couple of his races. I can put

him away now. I think he’ll be a much better horse when he matures and can think better, right now he’s not doing that.”

Thunder Down Under to Waller

Champion trainer Chris Waller has taken charge of New Zealand colt **Thunder Down Under** (Street Sense) who will have one start for the stable as a three-year-old before season's end.

"He will have a barrier trial at Rosehill on Friday and then run at Canterbury on the 23rd," Waller said.

"He is a lovely big colt with some good form.

"We will get him ready for some middle distance races."

Thunder Down Under had 17 starts in New Zealand for trainer Stephen Ralph including a Group Three third in the Bonecrusher Stakes in September last year.

Ralph had hoped to get him to the Queensland Derby but he finished fifth in a Group Two race marred by a fall which gave Thunder Down Under no chance to run into the top two and earn enough to get into the Classic.

Thunder Down Under was given a short break and has come to Waller on the back of two 1600m-wins at Ellerslie and Ruakaka.

Ralph, a part-owner of Thunder Down Under, said the prize money in Australia was a major factor in sending him across the Tasman to Sydney's leading trainer.
